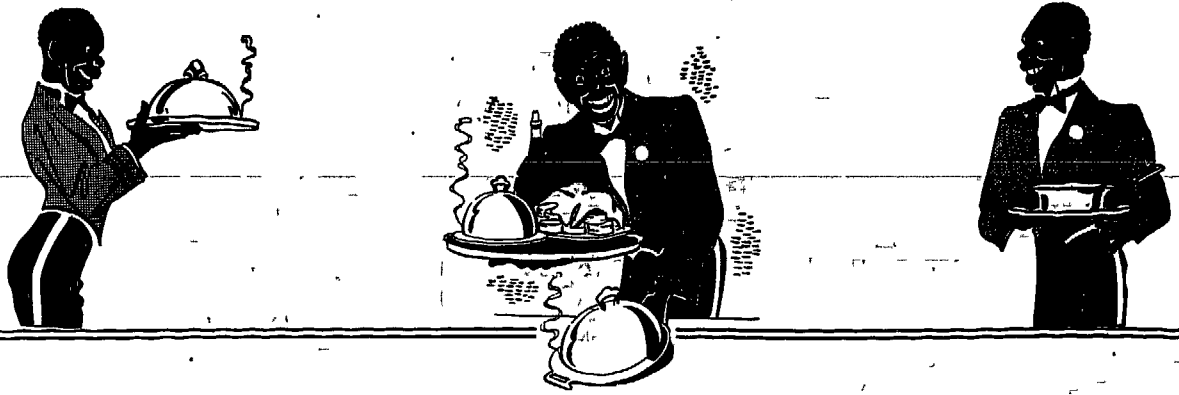

Highway Employees of City Studying Council's Report

Recommendations Concerning Sick Leaves Ready to Be Adopted As Soon As Men Give Their Approval

City Councilmen Mack and Waterfall, who were named on a committee to make an examination of the sick leave arrangement in the new setup between the Highway employees and the City, brought in their recommendations Monday night. It provides for two weeks sick leave each year.

The experience shows in this type of work that the average duration of the sick leave is not more than two weeks. The duration of the compensation insurance would be a year.

The proposal does not apply to these two weeks. Councilmen Mack and Carpenter strongly opposed any other arrangement which would permit the employee to take time off for sickness and in addition therein have two weeks vacation all at the expense of the City.

Mr. Carpenter did not pursue the issue further but thought the employees should have an opportunity to examine the committee's report. He stated positively that his function was only to obtain an agreement that was satisfactory to the employees. If they were satisfied with the provision he would be satisfied.

The report was turned over to the committee of the employees and unless serious objections are raised by them it will be adopted immediately by the council. The disposition of this matter will remain the last obstacle to putting the whole agreement between the City and its employees into effect.

Its municipal plant would have to be enlarged and then land might have to be bought back at greatly advanced costs. An entire block frontage in the heart of the city is a possession of potentially great value for future growth.

The license was conditionally granted dependent upon the proprietor agreeing to such closing hours as the Chief of Police might indicate.
