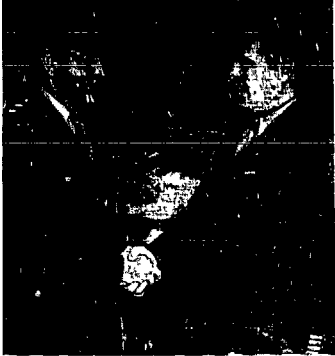

Alfred Groves of 10911 St Paul avenue, has received official communication revealing that his son, MAJOR ROBERT J GROVES was awarded the Citation for the Legion of Merit by command of General Eisenhower.

Groves was advanced to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel almost immediately after the Citation which credited him with being principally responsible for the preparation of The Ordnance Standard Operating Procedure for Continental Operations. Due to his excellent foresight brilliant grasp of the problems involved and his untiring perseverance Major Groves accomplished the work in time for it to be of inestimable value to the fulfillment of the Ordnance mission. During this time he was a part of the group known as the Forward Echelon.

Veteran with 121 Combat Missions Gets Silver Star

A 12TH TACTICAL AIR COMMAND FIGHTER GROUP Germany Capt. John E Brink of Grosse Pointe Park was awarded the Silver Star for gallantry in action last month. He is a pilot with the 8th Fighter Group P-47 Thunderbolt outfit of the 12th Tactical Air Command known as Lee's Lieutenant. The citation stated in part, that Captain Brink led a flight of four P-47 aircraft in an attack upon an important ammunition dump near Milan Italy. Displaying great courage and superior leadership he directed an accurate attack that destroyed eight buildings in the target area. Then despite intense ground fire he led strafing passes on the target. His bullets caused an explosion in an ammunition warehouse directly beneath him and the flying debris caught his aircraft crippling it. Despite this damage he reformed his flight and continued in the attack, leading repeated strafing attacks on the targets in the area destroying or damaging four motor transports two JU 88 aircraft, and a large boat.

VICTORY GARDEN NEWS

Fall gardens can substitute to a large extent for spring gardens when many Michigan gardeners were unable to plant because of cold wet weather.

Among the vegetables that can be seeded in summer for a fall garden are carrots, radish, bagas, turnips, head lettuce and gail green onions.

Full crops should be planted only in a well prepared seed bed. Crust should be allowed to form over it two weeks before the seedlings are up.

Better stands and growth take place if the garden is covered. These can be wooden boards paper or grass clippings to retain what moisture is in the ground.

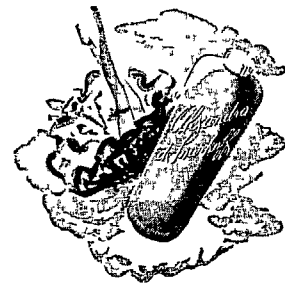

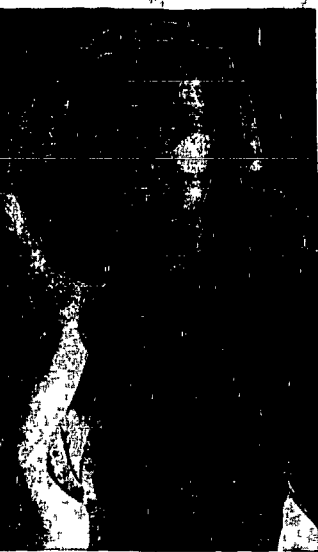

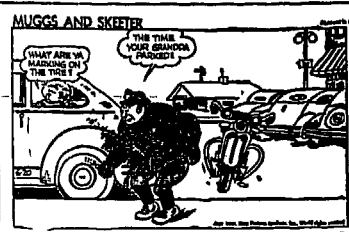
