

HENRY KISSINGER will go to Paris in mid-May to meet with North Vietnam's Le Duc Tho in an attempt to patch up the deteriorating Vietnam cease-fire agree-ment. The meeting between the two will be their first since Kissinger visited Hanoi in February. William Sulli-van, assistant Secretary of State and former Paris negotiator, will meet this Friday Nguyen Co Thach, with North Vietnamese foreign minister, for initial consultations paving the way for Kissinger's visit. The special meeting was called after an estimated 185 residents jammed the council chambers seeking a solution to the slippery condition of the docks. After an hour of discussion, a committee was formed of Woods Boat Club members and non-members to seek definite action. A "state of emergency" apparently existed because some residents had their boats in dry dock and had to get them out by May 1. With the suspension, they were unable to use the docking facilities.

ORDINANCE NO. 58

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GROSSE POINTE PARK BY ADDING NEW SECTIONS, 9.119, 9.120 and 9.121 OF CHAPTER 47B, LARCENY, OF TITLE IX, POLICE REGULATIONS, OF SAID CODE.

THE CITY OF GROSSE POINTE PARK ORDAINS:

Section 1.-Chapter 47B, Larceny, of Title IX, Police Regulations, of the Code of the City of Grosse Pointe Park is amended by adding thereto Sections 9.119, 9.120, and 9.121, the same to read in their entirety as follows:

Section 9.119-Receiving or Concealing Stolen Property No person shall buy, receive, or aid in the concealment of any stolen, embezzled or converted money, goods or property knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled or converted.

Section 9.120 - Presumptions

Any person being a dealer in or collector of any merchandise or personal property, or the agent, employee or representative of such dealer or collector who fails to make reasonable inquiry that the person selling or delivering any stolen, embezzled or converted property to him has a legal right to do so, shall be presumed to have bought or received such property knowing it to have been stolen, embezzled or converted. This presumption, may, however, be rebutted by proof.

Section 9.121 - Conviction For Larceny Not Essential In any prosecution for the offense of buying, receiving or aiding in the concealment of stolen, embezzled or converted money or other property it shall not be necessary to aver, nor on the trial thereof to prove that the person who stole, embezzled or converted such property has been convicted. Section 2. - This Ordinance shall take effect on May

15, 1973.
