All the rubber hoses in the engine compartment should be checked now and then. They all get hairline cracks that come with age. But beyond these, if the hose is swollen or feels mushy, it should be replaced before it bursts while you are on the road. Remember to change hoses, however, only when the engine is cold. If you are replacing only the upper hose, remove the radiator cap and open the petcock at the bottom of the radiator. Drain two quarts of coolant into a container, and then replace the hose. To replace the lower hose you must fully drain the radiator and partially drain the engine block.
