The new program is a response to women's increasing struggles to meet their own needs while remaining responsive to the needs of others.

"Many people-many women, in particular - believe that they do not have control of their own lives," observes the instructor, Dorothy Mon-goven, a Woods resident and marriage counselor, "and The bride-elect, a Grosse worse: that they can never Pointe North High School have control.

"Many women have been trained not to take responsibility for themselves, to allow others to make decisions for them, waiting for another person or an outside influence to come along and make their life better.
