VOLKSWAGEN GENER-AL MANAGER Toni Schmuecker told a group of shareholders that VW and Chrysler Corporation might venture into a joint effort to build engines in the United States. Mr. Schmuecker, however, firmly denied any intention to buy Chrysler, re-ferring to a recent "Automotive News" article that stated VW is trying to purchase the financially-troubled automaker. A Chrysler vice-president confirmed plans with VW on the joint engine production. At present, VW supplies Chrysler with 300,000 engines a year for its Omnis and Horizons.

Friday, July 6 VICE-PRESIDENT WAL TER F. Mondale was suddenly summoned to Camp David by President Jimmy Carter where the two discussed the controversy over Mr. Carter's decision to cancel a major energy speech Thursday evening. 

A Park youth who pled guilty to manslaughter in the shooting death of his father has received a sentence of eight to 15 years for the charge.

The maximum sentence for manslaughter is 15 years.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

#### OF

THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF THE

CITY OF GROSSE POINTE FARMS, A PUBLIC CORPORATION

The Articles of Incorporation are signed and ack-nowledged in duplicate by the incorporators for the purpose of forming a public economic development corporation pursu-ant to the provisions of Act No. 338 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended.

#### ARTICLE I

#### NAME

The name of the economic development corporation is THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF THE City of Grosse Pointe Farms ("Corporation").

# ARTICLE II

### PURPOSE

**PURPOSE** The Corporation is organized and incorporated as authorized by and pursuant to Act No. 338 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended ("Act"). The purpose for which the Corporation is created to perform essential public purposes as an economic development corporation in accordance with the Act, as the Act may be amended from time to time, in-cluding particularly: to alleviate and prevent conditions of unemployment; to assist and retain local industries and commercial enterprises to strengthen and revitalize the economy of the City of Grosse Pointe Farms and of the State of Nichigan; to provide means and methods for the encourage-ment and assistance of industrial and commercial enterprises in locating, improving, maintaining, repairing, furnishing, equipping, and expanding in the City of Grosse Pointe Farms; to encourage the location and expansion of commercial enter-prises to provide needed services and facilities of the commercial enterprises more conveniently to the City of Grosse Pointe Farms;

which they are appointed is either abandoned or, if under taken, is completed in accordance with the project plan, at which time each such Director shall cease to serve.

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation, beyond that necessary for the retirement of indebtedness or to implement the public purposes or program of the City of Grosse Pointe Farms, shall inure to the benefit of any person, firm or Corporation, other than the City of Grosse Pointe Farms, except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation affect-ing one or more of its purposes. No member, officer or director of the Corporation nor any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Section 3. Salary. Directors shall serve without salary, but may be reimbursed their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties, and may receive a per diem of not more than \$50.00.

# Section 4. Public Meetings. The meetings of the Board of Directors shall be public.

Section 5. Reappointment; Vacancy. A Director whose term of office has expired shall continue to hold office until his or her successor has been appointed with the advice and consent of the City Council. A Director may be reappointed with the advice and consent of the City Council to serve additional terms. If a vacancy is created by death or resignation or removal by operation of law, a successor shall be appointed with the advice and consent of the City Council within thirty (30) days to hold office for the remainder of the term of office so vacated.

Section 6. Removal. A Director may be removed from office for cause by a majority vote of the City Council.

#### ARTICLE V OFFICERS

Section 1. The Board of Directors of the Corporation, by an affirmative vote of a majority of its members shall elect as the officers of the Corporation, a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson, a Secretary and a Treasurer. Any two offices other than the office of Chairperson and Secretary or Chair-person and Treasurer may be held by the same person, but an officer shall not execute, acknowledge or verify an instru-ment in more than one capacity if the instrument is required to be executed by more than one officer. The officers shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at its annual meeting and shall hold office for a term of one (1) year and thereafter until his or her successor is elected and quali-fied, or until death, resignation be removal, provided that i've first officers shall be elected at the first meeting of the Board of Directors. The officers shall be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties.

Section 2. Chairperson. The Chairperson shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation. The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Directors, shall have general and active management of the business of the Corporation, and shall see that all orders and resolutions of the Board are carried into effect. The Chairperson may execute with the Secretary or any other proper officer authorized by the Board of Directors, all hands, notes, mortgages, conveyances and other instruments which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors, by these Articles, by the Bylaws of the Corporation of hy statute to some other officer or agent of the Corporation. He or she shall be ex-officid a member of all standing committees, and shall have and exercise such by the Board. the Board.

#### ARTICLE 111

#### POWERS

The Corporation ".all be a body corporate with powers to sue and be sued in any court of the State of Michigan. In furtherance of its purpose the Corporation shall have all of the powers which are now or may hereafter be conferred on corporations organized pursuant to the Act and future amendments to the Act, including all powers nec-essary to carry out the purpose of its incorporation and all powers incident theretc, and including but not limited to the following powers to:

a) construct, acquire by gift or pur-chase, reconstruct, improve, maintain, or repair Projects (as the word "pro-ject" is defined in the Act) and acquire the necessary lands for the site there-for:

b) acquire by gift or purchase the necessary machinery, furnishings, and equipment for a Project;

c) borrow money and issue its revenue bonds or revenue notes to finance part or all of the cost of the acquisition, purchase, construction, reconstruction, or improvement of a Project or any part thereof, the cost of the acquisition and improvement of the necessary sites therefor, the acquisition of machinery, furnishings, and equipment therefor, and the costs necessary or incidental to the borrowing of money and issuing of bonds or notes for such purposes;

d) enter into leases, lease purchase agreements, or installment sales con-tracts with any person, firm or corpora-tion for the use or sale of a Project; e) mortgage a Project in favor of any lender of money to the Corporation;

f) sell and convey a Project or any part thereof for a price and at a time as the Corporation determines; and

g) lend, grant, transfer, or convey funds as permitted by law, but subject to applicable restrictions affecting the use of such funds.

ARTICLE IV

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SOLND OF DIRECTORS Section 1. Directors. The Board of Directors of the Cor-poration shall consist of not less than nine (9) persons, not more than three (3) of whom shall be an officer or employee of the City of Grosse Pointe Farms. The Mayor and any member of the City Council may serve on the Board of Directors. Each of said additional Directors shall serve as Directors of the Corporation until the Project for

Section 3. <u>Vice Chairperson</u>. The Vice (Chairperson shall perform such duties as are delegated to him or her or by the Chairperson and shall, in the absence or in the event of the disability of the Chairperson, perform the duties and exer-cise the powers of the Chairperson. The Vice Chairperson shall perform such other duties as the Board of Directors shall perform. shall prescribe.

Section 4. Secretary. The Secretary shall be the recording officer of the Corporation, and shall attend all meetings of the Board, record all votes and the minutes of all proceed-ings in a book to be kept for that purpose and shall perform like duties for the standing committees when required. The Secretary shall give, or cause to be given, notice of all meetings of the Board of Directors, and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall keep in safe custody the scal of the Corporation, and when authorized by the Board, affix the same to any instrument requiring it, and when so affixed it shall be attested by his or her signature or by the signa-ture of the Treasurer. ture of the Treasurer.

Section 5. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have custody of the corporate funds and securities and shall keep full and accurate accounts of receipts and disbursements in books belonging to the Corporation and shall deposit all and other valuable effects in the name and to the credit of the Cor-poration in such depositories as may be designated by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall disburse the funds of the Corporation as may be ordered by the Board, taking proper vouchers for such disbursements, and shall render to the Chairperson and Directors, at the regular meetings of the Board, or whenever they may require an account of his or her actions as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the Gorporation. The Treasurer shall give the Corporation a bond, if required by the Board, for the faithful performance of the duties of his or her office and for the restoratio. to the Corporation, in case of death, resignation, retire-ment or removal from office, of all hooks, papers, vouchers, money and other property of whatever kind in his or her Corporation. Corporation.

Section 6. Removal. An officer may be removed by an affir-mative vote of a majority of the Directors, with or without cause, whenever in the judgment of the Board of Directors the best interests of the Corporation would be served.

Section 7. Vacancy. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors at any meeting for the unexpired portion of the term of the office.



# **Boat Safety** Is Explored

"Ahoy, all weekend admirals and crews. To prevent scuttling your weekend fun this summer, don't forget the importance of boating maintenance," warns the In surance Information Institute.

An unsafe boat can cause accidents which can result in death. infury and property damage

The increasing popularity of boating was marred by 6,529 boating accidents in 1979, which resulted in 1,321 deaths, 1,761 injuries and more than \$12.3 million in property damage, according to the U.S. Coast Guard.

In Michigan, the Coast Guard reported 428 accidents, 73 deaths and 183 injurics. The property dam-ages amounted to \$341,900. The Office of Boating Safety receives notification of 95 to 100 percent of all annual boating related fatalities, but only four to 10 percent of those accidents that involved injuries or property damages were reported.

All boaters are urged to make a list for checking the boat's fuel, electrical and steering systems before embarking on an excursion on the state's waterways, says the institute. Connections, fastenings, protective casings and other parts of the boat should be expertly checked. The hull and drain plugs Braves, 26-10, on a home also should be checked for run by Sean Hoye and a leakage.

One of the essential parts of the boat to check is its flotation devices and life preservers. Materials used to construct boats insure that the boat will stay afloat in the event the vessel capsizes. Therefore, if a boat capsizes, its crew should stay with the vessel for quick rescue and to avoid drowning, the institute warns.

All boat owners should know the load capacity of their vessels and observe the limit. Some limits are measured in terms of weight and others in terms of the number of people aboard. One should also take into consideration the weight of the gear, (ice chests, picnic baskets, fishing tackle, skis, et al.), on board the boat.

Some of the newer boats have a plaque attached to indicate their capacity. When in doubt, contact the local retailer, the manufacturer or the local Coast Guard Auxiliary, (or comparable lake patrol authorities), for advice.
