

Admitting the proposal was 'a unique situation" and that Teleprompter wouldn't make as much as it could ership, which is common, he pointed out that the firm, on the other hand, was only putting up 25 percent of the capital,

"We are selective in the franchises we apply for," he said, adding Teleprompter wouldn't have tried for each city separately. "We think the proposal is outstanding and we're prepared to begin construction as soon as we gain a franchise from the communities.'

A quick decision on the matter was urged by both Mr. Rickel and Mr. Reece so that construction of the cable system could be concluded early next year.



# Dear Fellow Parents

We in the Grosse Pointe Hockey Association would like to invite you and your child to come spend a delightful winter with us. Our association provides winter programs for kids, is dedicated to kids, and is all about kids - who play a game on ice called hockey.

This letter to you is tell you something about our programs and how to register for them. The following are answers to questions that are most often asked;

# Who can play?

Any youngster age 5 or older. (Note: Very mature 4 year olds have played in the past, but the earliest recommended age is 5.) Girls too? The writer's daughter player her first season last year, and enjoyed it so much that she's been waiting all summer for the new season to begin this fall.

# How do we register?

Come with your child (or children) to the Grosse Pointe Community Rink's Community Room (next to Austin High School on Mack Ave.,) on either of:

Saturday, September 8 9 am to 12 noon, or Saturday, September 15 9 am to 12 noon

To register you MUST bring each child's birth certificate and registration fee. For the first player in a family the fee is \$40., the second is \$25., etc.

# What happens after registration?

Players are divided into age group "Divisions," the youngest of which are called "Mites," (we use funny names,) for kids age eight and under. The Division Director will then provide you with a schedule of "introduction" ice hours which your child should attend. The "ice" hours are used for a general introduction into the program, general skating instruction, and finally for a basis upon which a fair distribution of players onto individual teams can be made.

# Will my child get a fair and even chance to play?

In the G. P. H. A. every player in every Division is GUARANTEED equal game time: The rules require that each team be divided into three "lines" of players. The "first line" must include the five strongest players on the team, who MUST play against the five strongest players on each opposing team. The "second line" consists of the next five strongest players who must play against the similar "second line" of each opposing team. The "third line" consists of the balance of the team, who MUST play against the "third line" of each opposing team.

Each period of a game is divided into three sections. At the end of each section a buzzer stops the clock, and the "lines" change. Each line plays each period. After the three game periods end, each line has played a third of the game. In this way, every player participates equally and alike.

# Where, when, how often?

Most practices and games are held at the Grosse Pointe Community Rink, others are held at Liggett Rink on Cook Road. Over the season, Mites and "Squirts" (another funny name - for 9 and 10 year olds,) skate about an average of three to four hours a week, games and practices included.

Younger kids are of course given priority consideration for "ice" hours. Mites, for example, may practice during weekdays at 5 or 6 pm, but never later than 7 pm. Weekend games, when scheduled, are generally in mornings.

# My child has never skated

The vast majority of new registrants each year have never skated before. Previous skating experience is not necessary and not a prerequisite. The G. P. H. A. emphasis is on teaching skating. The gradual and subtle introduction of a game (hockey) to play while on ice skates is generally used to build skating confidence through introducing a stick and a ball-like object, (puck) thereby building hand-eye-foot coordination. At first, all players realize that almost nobody can stand up long, let alone skate. Its fun for them and no more than they expect.

# What equipment does my child need to have?

The G. P. H. A. provides team uniforms which include team jerseys, hockey pants, and long hockey stockings. You will need to provide: helmet with attached faceguard, hockey gloves, mouth guard, shoulderpads, elbow pads, shin pads, protective cup, skates, hockey sticks, and a garter belt (to hold his socks up..) A note on skates: With properly fitted skates that are not broken down, your child will learn quickly. Have them fitted for his or her present foot size, not to grow into in the future.

# What about supervision coaching and safety?

All on-ice activities are supervised. Coaches are selected, approved, and reviewed by the G. P. H. A. coaches review board. Most are fathers of players who previously served as assistant coaches in the past. All coaches, like all officials in the G. P. H. A. are volunteers, generally parents of players, or interested and enthused adults who enjoy working with kids,

Bodychecking is not permitted in youth hockey until "Peewee" age (here we go again,) 11 and 12. Earlier ages are taught skating and general skills of the game, as it should be.

Safety is surprisingly good in youth hockey. This year is expected to be the fifth consecutive year in the G. P. H. A. without a serious injury.

# What are the costs involved?

The writer's daughter's monthly ice expenses last season averaged less than \$24.00 per month. This can vary among teams, and can be reflected by sponsorships, donations, yearbook ad sales....all effecting cost reductions.

# Is it fun for parents?

When your child goes on the ice in his or her first game, when the puck drops for the first face-off, the odds are that every player on the ice will fall down. You'll never believe it, and you'll be unable to stay away from then on. But more, you'll meet many new people and form lasting friendships through this unique thing we all have in common - little kids hockey.

At 7:00 pm on Wednesday, September 12 we will have a question-answer-demonstration session at the Grosse Pointe Community Rink. If you are interested, please come join us. We'd like to have your child, and your family, come spend the winter with us.

He had his business and home in The Woods from 1938 to 1958, and ultimately moved to Memphis, Mich., and Marine City, where he currently lives with his wife, Mildred, of over 40 years.

Today, the Aghassians are both in their mid-70's and are living on fixed incomes, including social security, which he said he hates, while still harboring a dream of having a restaurant with the liquor license.

Even now, he still contemplates legal action against The Woods for alleged wrongs he felt he has suffered, while being told by the Liquor Control Commission, (LCC), a license will be put in escrow until he finds a place.

Ironically, Mr. Aghassian, who has had many years of restaurant experience as a waiter and owner of the Early American Roadside from 1939 to 1946 in The Woods, followed by the Early American Restaurant from 1946 to 1956, said his family was worth around \$200 million in the old country but this was lost during the Tur-kish Massacre in 1916.

Last week officials in the Department of Management owned corporations, and Budget reduced their revenue estimates for the upcoming fiscal year and adopted a wait-and-see attitude on the question of cutting back our recently adopted \$4.6 billion budget.

The revenue estimates will probably be cut one percent, or about \$50 million, Although this is a preliminary figure which may be revised, it makes passage of the grants and transfers bill and remaining budget bills -

tougher.

We still have not agreed on how to fund the \$38 million home heating assistance program, whether by an inor by a tax on checks, credit card transactions and other negotiable instruments.

Department of Management and Budget projections indicate that the state will receive less revenue from income tax withholding, sales taxes and the single business tax. Continued double digit inflation, weaker than anticipated automobile sales and the large OPEC oil price increase contributed to the detimates.

The state has proposed to sell \$500 million in short term notes because there is not cash to cover school aid. revenue sharing and college appropriations as the fiscal year begins, according to budget officials.

Even though the economic news is uncertain, there are positive factors which indicate that our position is stronger than it has been in the past and there is reason for optimism.

Our economy provided 139,000 new jobs in the past year, For the first time in history, 4.06 million men and women were employed in Michigan last month and it was the third consecutive 10 cents and soft drinks, five month in which employment

We have smaller inventory ULS to Host buildup than we did prior to the 1974-75 recession and there is less overbuilding in housing. The outlook for exports and capitol investment has improved and the auto-mobile industry is better equipped to meet the demand for fuel efficient cars than it was four years ago.

Adult Service Centers is currently celebrating 25 years of service to the elderly and mentally handicapped of metropolitan Detroit, and Mickey has been with it all those years: as a volunteer since the agency's inception as Senior Centers, Inc., in 1953, as executive director for 15 years.

She has been a National Council on Aging board member since 1972, serving on several of its committees, including Public Policy, and has testified before Congress for NCOA and the needs of older people.

For the past four years, she has chaired the NCOA Advisory Committee for its National Endowment for the Humanities Grant, the program providing a new experience in the humanities for some 33,000 older people in over 400 senior centers in 45 states.

As vice-president, Mickey will also serve on the NCOA committee planning for the 1981 White House Conference on Aging.

She remains a member of the Michigan Commission on Services to the Aging, appointed in 1971 by Governor William G. Milliken and confirmed by the State Senate, and continues to be active in numerous organizations working on behalf of both the elderly and mentally impaired adults.
