# Homes for the Retarded-A Tough Issue Heads for Grosse Pointe

Tony is 22 years old. He is also mentally retarded. He lives with his parents, who are getting on in years. The question they face is what will happen to their son when they are no longer able to care for him?

For years, state institutions were the answer. The last few years, however, have seen the increasing popularity of the residential group home concept.

In Grosse Pointe, the Association of Retarded Citizens has been considering such a home for several years. It recently appointed a sixmember committee to study possibility of a group home in this area.

According to committee member Bruce Maters, the main purpose of the group home is to assume the role of community living for retarded people who have lived in a family situation all their lives.

"I don't know if you've ever been to an institution, but after seeing one, you know group homes are the only answer," he says.

Warehouses

Fellow committee member Virginia in an institution.

Knoblauch agrees. She calls the institutions "warehouses" and says they're not able to provide humane care for their charges.

"Institutions are entirely inappropriate. Normal sized family units are much more able to meet personal, emotional and physical needs," she

Maters says that traditionally families have wanted to hide their mentally impaired relatives and a general community feeling that they should be put away has been the

That all began changing about eight or 10 years ago, he says, when the concept of mainstreaming became popular. Since then, there has been an increasing effort to fit these individuals into schools and hospitals and to teach them the necessary skills to become worthwhile members of society.

Tied into all this effort is the concept of placing a small number of mentally impaired people in group homes to sustain a normal, family type atmosphere they wouldn't get

Maters says the committee is in the developmental stage at present and indicated he and the other members are primarily looking for ex-

He states that the biggest problem for those wanting to start group homes is gaining community acceptance. In many instances people agree in principle but say "don't put it next to me.'

#### Community Support

Educating the community as to what retarded people are really like is the first step in finding approval for the group home concept. Maters says the group is making plans for talking to clergymen, local governments, civic groups and is thinking of sending out a survey to get a cross-section of community feeling.

Knoblauch says the type of education that's needed should be informative and deal in concepts. She stresses a number of needs that should be gotten across to the public:

- · A need for the mentally impaired to be considered human beings.
- A need for the community to

adopt zoning that permits a group home on the basis it is a family unit.

- A need for the public to be aware of the difference between mental illness and mental retarda-
- A need for professional people; physicians, psychologists, social workers and lawyers to understand the issues involved with the mentally impaired so they can be effective advocates for their rights.
- A need to let the public know there are already a great many mentally impaired in Grosse Pointe.
- A need for the families of the mentally impaired to get themselves ready for the group home concept. Parents over 60 who have taken care of a retarded person all their lives will find it hard to let go. It's important for the sake of the mentally impaired person that someone else gradually assumes responsibility for them while their parents are still
- A need for the mentally impaired themselves to be made ready to go into a group home.

The biggest need, though, at least for the moment, is to educate people as to the type of person the mentally impaired are. Maters says the major differences between them and ordinary people is one of IQ. He adds the retarded realize they are different and that is a cause of great concern for them.

#### Community Support

"They're very sensitive," he says. "And retarded people are really cool. They don't share peer group pressures like normal people. They're not all hung up on what they should be. They are extremely trusting and giving and very eager to please."

Carol Matyniak, another committee member, says it's fun to be around them and feels she gets a different perspective on life from that con-

"They enjoy things simply for what they are," she explains.

Matyniak wants people to know that the mentally 'impaired can be useful, productive members of society. She says they really look forward to getting a job and getting out into the community,

Knoblauch says the retarded are their own best promoters and praised the special program at Poupard for helping prepare them to join society by building social and pre-vocational

#### Property Values

One fear that some communities have concerning group homes is that they tend to decrease surrounding property values. The committee insists this isn't the case.

Knoblauen cited a study conducted by Princeton University on the neighborhood property impact of group homes in 42 communities in the state of New York. The study was prepared for the State Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Dis-

Results from the study indicated there was no evidence of neighbor-"saturation" --- over-representation of the retarded within any given type of community or city.

# City Leaders Seek Court Resolution

Getting Grosse Pointe's five, independent city governments to agree on anything has never been an easy task. But that's just what the state legislature has demanded they do this month to clear the way for passage of local district court legislation.

There's not much doubt in anyone's mind that a district court is coming — soon. "The handwriting is on the wall. We can't save our municipal courts, says Farms Councilman Lloyd

But many questions remain: How many judges will sit over the Pointe's first "court of record?" In which city will it be located and who will pay for necessary construction?

#### Two Different Bills

There are now two bills in Lansing dealing with the issue —, and they are two radically different proposals. The Senate has approved Sen. John Kelly's proposal calling for two judges to serve the five Grosse Pointes. The House judiciary committee passed a version calling for only one judge.

The committee also threw the issue back in the laps of the cities by insisting they come up with a unanimous resolution by May 13.

To meet that deadline, Woods Mayor George Freeman has taken the lead and called a meeting for April 29 in his city hall for representatives from all five cities.

Woods Takes Charge

The Woods' new leadership role on the issue represents a marked change

# To Tan or Not to Tan, in Salons

People spend hours attaining and perfecting them. Some travel great distances to obtain one. For many, they are a source of pride and status. Others say they just make them feel

It's the wonderful and until recently, elusive, tan. In the past one had to rely on unpredictable sun lamps or venture to temperate climes to main-

tain a healthy-looking bronze hue all year round.

That's not true anymore, as the growing popularity of tanning salons attest. The FDA estimates there are approximately 1,000 such places in the country, with more opening up every day. It's the quick and easy way to brown up and the public has been responding in droves.

In Grosse Pointe, there are two locations where you can get an indoor tan: Tan Unlimited, which is part of Hair Unlimited, and Leon's Hairdressers, A husband and wife from the City have plans to open one up in the Farms.

Leon Sehoyan, owner of the hairdressing salon, has a standup tanning booth in his building and according to his receptionist, averages about 15 customers a day, not including the

#### For Beauty

Coupled with the rapid growth of the tanning business, however, is the concern on the part of the medical community of the adverse effects of too much tanning.

Dermatology at Temple University in Philadelphia, says it has been known for the past 80 years that if a person is exposed to the sun long enough and often enough, premature aging of the skin and skin cancer can develop.

won't show up after only a few visits. It's a cumulative process, he says, and the dangers aren't apparent until 15 to 20 years in the future.

He says there is considerable concern on the part of medical experts for the huge proliferation of suntan parlors across the country. That concern is based on the fact that people

who rely on the sun for a tan are exposed a small number of months each year, as opposed to someone who uses a tanning salon all year round.

"It's a real problem and one we're concerned about. People who use these are taking a calculated risk. They should be made aware of the long-term hazards. Unfortunately, you can't legislate intelligence," Urbach

Hammel says the key to avoiding damage to the skin is control. He says if the tanning is done as a gradual process, there's no problem. He claims

# Le Cafe Wins A

Efforts by one of the Pointe's most elegant restaurants to obtain a beer and wine license were kept alive last Friday when a Wayne County Circuit Court judge ruled that a Grosse Pointe Woods ordinance is "poorly worded" and does not clearly reflect the city's policy for granting tavern licenses.

The judgment answered a suit filed by Le Cafe Français which contended that its application for a liquor license should be considered by the Woods' council because the ordinance doesn't limit the issuance of only one

- The council interpreted the ordinance to mean it was authorized to issue only one license which it chose to award to another Woods restaurant-Da Edoardo on Mack and Cook.

At that time, Le Cafe owner Charles Moraco called the decision a "travesty" citing the fact that he and Le Cafe's supporters had initiated the petition drive which placed the tavern license question on the ballot in November. At an emotional, special council hearing in January, some citizens and councilmen said they felt both Le Cafe and Da Edoardo should receive tavern licenses. Owners of both restaurants say that the continued success of their businesses depends on the availability of beer and wine with their specialty menus.

One License? However, the council decided that Da Edoarado was the preferred ap-

As it appeared on the ballot, the ordinance read "do you favor the adoption of an ordinance : . . to provide that the City Council of Grosse Pointe Woods . . . may approve or signify its approval of the issuance of a tavern license . . ."

Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Neal Fitzgerald ruled that the council's interpretation of the words "a tavern license" to mean "one license" was wrong and that the wording was ambiguous.

"You caused the ambiguity yourselves. You correct it," Fitzgerald said to Woods' attorney George Catlin referring to the city's use of the unclear wording on the ballot.

"The whole thing is a question of the policy of Grosse Pointe Woods," added Fitzgerald.

The court's ruling opens the door for the Woods' council to consider Le Cafe's application on its own merits not as an application in competition with another application for one available license.

#### Must Clarify

According to Woods' attorney Catlin, the court ruling doesn't mean the Woods' council has to issue a tavern license to Le Cafe. Rather it must clarify its interpretation of the ordinance, which it could do in a number of ways. Catlin said.

One way is to appeal the court decision and stand by its previous de-

Opposition to debedding from the public and hospital field has been almost universal since December and has influenced the state Legislature to re-examine the intent of the debedding law.

Cottage has maintained one of the most visible anti-debedding campaigns. Vasse said Cottage will continue to seek relief from debedding by influencing powers outside the planning bureaucracy-namely the Legis-

Rules Overturned Vasse said that Cottage's efforts

have been aimed at bringing constructive changes to the state guidelines and criteria on which the debedding plan is based. There is currently a void in the books where the 1980 state debedding guidelines and criteria should be since the Legislature's Joint Committee on Rules overturned the 1980 guidelines in March. The absence of guidelines leaves the debedding plan's implementation in

New guidelines will be proposed by the state's Office of Health and Medical Affairs based on the findings of the pending legislative investiga-

In addition to those uncertainties, last week's final plan approval also contained modifications which may have implications for all Detroit-area

CHPC's final plan recommended that the 159 beds at Detroit's Metro-

pitals be exempt because they serve the members of a health maintenance organization (HMO)-a health care delivery program that stresses pre-

However, SHCC approval was based on the requirement that the 159 exempted HMO beds eventually be cut from other hospitals so that the debedding plan hits the state mandated bed-cut target of 2,467 for southeastern Michigan.

"The disturbing thing to me was that the SHCC was not specific as to where the beds will be restored," said Vasse of Cottage. He added that all of the Detroit area's 76 hospitals may be burdened with extra cuts so that the HMO hospitals can be exempt.

SHCC directed local health planners at CHPC to determine how their plan will redistribute the exempted beds during the second year of the debedding program.

been strongly opposed to a conversion to district courts and representatives had refused to join early discussions of the proposal last fall and

But it is probably inevitable that the Woods will figure powerfully in the shape of the new court. It's likely that voters in the city will dominate any Pointe-wide election for judge because of the city's preponderance of population. There also is a strong possibility that a new court building - if necessary - will be built in the Woods because of the ample lot that surrounds its city hall.

That seems to be causing some concern among council members in other cities.

Park Councilman Douglas Graham summed it up. 'If we have one judge it's going to be elected by the Woods and we're going to end up building a court house and that will probably end up in the Woods as well."

The Farms' Lloyd Semple agreed: "It does seem to be a problem."

Funding a Big Concern

"A two judge system (the senate bill) might relieve that dilemma but it also would be more expensive to operate. Most of the cities now seem to be most concerned about the money it will take to operate this court. I think that is more important than the

Most council members seem to agree that a one judge system, as proposed in the house version of the bill, is

preferable because it will keep costs to a minimum.

Site Still a Question

They are far from agreeing, how ever, on where to locate the court and many are hoping a kind of "circuit riding" arrangement can be worked out using existing court facilities. That kind of system might at least postpone the need to construct a central court facility.

Rep. Dennis Hertel, co-chairman of the House Judiciary Committee, said he has agreed to hold off House action on the legislation until after the April 29 meeting in the Woods.

Timing is critical, according to both sides. Joe and Carol Cappy, who are crying to open a tanning salon in the Farms, say the tanning process has to be done with common sense.

"Ten minutes is the maximum amount of time," says Mrs. Cappy. The biggest problem you have with hese things is people want to stay inder the bulbs longer. You have to be firm. If they're going to argue with me, I don't want their business.'

Her husband says the controversy urrounding the salons is due mainly .o their being new. Anytime a new jusiness springs up, he says, no mater what type of business it is, it's ound to create a lot of press.

The Cappys say that these days, here's hardly anything you can do hat's not harmful.

The dangerous effects of exposure ire caused by the ultra-violet wave length known as UV-B. This same wave gives a tan which offers protection from the sun. Some salons use UV-A, which gives a tan, but no protection.

Need Safeguards

Dermatologists have been using UV-A waves for years for skin disorders, but always in controlled situations in conjunction with other reatments for acne and psoriasis.

The FDA is concerned with ensurng that salons establish proper safeguards. According to Bill Rados of he FDA several regulations will go nto effect May 7. These are: mandaory use of goggles to protect the eyes, warning signs to let users know he long-term risks and timers with ettings of no more than 10 minutes. Ie said the FDA will be sending out ield officers in the next 90 days to make sure salons are meeting these requirements.

"We think with the proper controls we can protect people from severe burning," he said. "However, there is no way to prevent against long-term dangers of skin aging and cancer."

The FDA also wants salons to have certain screening guidelines established to protect people on medication and fair-skinned people who burn easily. The tanning operations in Grosse Pointe have such screening safeguards, with potential customers filling out questionnaires to deter-

The study claims that group homes are generally consistent and compatible with neighborhood properties in type and size of structure and were usually better maintained than the surrounding homes.

Group home function is generally not conspicuous and its residents aren't usually visible or noticeable from the street. With respect to the impact of these homes on surrounding property values, the study showed that communities with group homes had the same increase or decrease in market prices as in areas without such homes.

The study also stated that immediately adjacent properties to group homes did not experience property value decrease and the homes' establishment did not generate a higher degree of property turnover.

A Long Process

The actual founding of a group home has to be a careful, step-bystep affair, according to Maters. First, one has to form a non-profit corporation and then petition the IRS to get charitable foundation status in order to receive monetary bequests as tax write-offs.

Next, an application to the Department of Social Services must be made to obtain a license to operate the home. The department would also help plan where to locate the home, the number of residents, and how to

At the same time, Maters says, the local zoning authority must be approached for permission to buy or construct a home. He said it is important to show the zoning board that quality people are involved and

that there is considerable community

support. Assuming all goes well with the zoning board, there remains the question of financing. Maters says one can go to the Michigan State Housing Development Authority to provide the mortgage money, go the conventional mortgage route or apply to the Department of Mental Health for the

money. In preparation for these steps Maters says the committee is talking to people who presently own group homes, to state agencies and to a builder who specializes in developing group residences.

According to Maters, there are rougly 60 active members in the Grosse Pointe Association of Retarded Citizens, a good number of which have mentally impaired children of their own. The association is looking for people who will lend their time and efforts to help out and welcomes local organizations' support as well.

The Jaycees and Kiwanis groups have been helpful in the past and Maters feels there are a good many more groups willing to lend their efforts.

"We hope to involve the community enough so that the group home becomes a source of community pride," he says. "If you look at the ones that have failed, it's because the people behind the house tried to

"Most successful group homes are those that have involved the entire neighborhood, where everyone's happy with it. I'm optimistic about our chances. The whole concept of helping the mentally retarded is finally catching on," he added.

### St. John Helps Clergy Deal With Cancer

Sixty-eight clergy people from throughout the Detroit area are participating in the Eighth Annual Ministry to Cancer Patients Seminar at St. John Hospital on Detroit's east side.

Directed by Dr. John Burrows, Chief of Oncology at St. John's, and Fr. Lawrence DuCharme, Director of Pastoral Care, the seminar is directed at helping the clergy better understand cancer and its effects on patients and their families.

The Woods' Community Tree Advisory Commission has arranged to purchase 200 trees through Project Re. Tree sponsored by State Sen. John Kelly through the Community Resources and Assistance Center for participating neighborhood groups on the east side.

The trees are four to six in the spring, Rice said. feet tall, about one inch in diameter, have bare roots. and were grown in a nursery in the Detroit area. The five dollar price tag is one dollar to provide philosophical and above the nursery cost which is necessary to cover the cost of ordering and distribution by the city.

The trees are still quite : bargain at that price since comparable trees bought at a nursery would cost about 12 dollars, according to Jean Rice, Woods' Tree Commis-

Rice added that the trees available through the Project Re-Tree are bought in quantities and may be unevenly branched or not perfectly shaped. "But a lot of people don't care about that," she added.

Trees must be ordered with a special order form available at the Woods' city hall main desk on April 21, and must be paid for when ordered.

Order forms cannot be taken home for use later. All the day of distribution.

Trees will be delivered early May 10 and distributed by the Tree Commission from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the parking lot behind the Woods' Police Department, Trees should be planted promptly.

Rice said this is the first year that the Woods has participated in Project Re-Tree which is a community initiated and implemented prosist school administrators in gram that has planted 2,000 trees during the last three years attempting to reach its goal of reforesting the east side.

Rice, who has formal training in gardening and land-scape design, said Re-Tree offered Silver Maples last year which are "probably the worst" trees for urban development because of their large, weak branches and fast growing roots which can choke water lines. At her suggestion, the project's developers sought out trees more suitable to urban environment.

This year, the program offers 100 Red Buds which are not approved street trees but make good ornamental trees because of their unusual branching effects, Rice said. Because Red Buds are somewhat frail, they would

Every author encounters tion. some problems in getting his or her book to the marketplace but few, if any, authors have had as many frustrations as Grosse Pointe author J. Patrick Wright.

Pat Wright is author of the You Can See General Motors, (Caroline House, 1979), which was published in No-

vember, 1979. On A Clear Day began in 1975 as a collaboration between Wright, formerly Detroit bureau chief for Business Week and John Z. De Lorean It was to be an account of De Lorean's 17 years at General Motors which he left in 1973. De Lorean, who had a well deserved reputation as a maverick among top automobile executives, proposed to Wright the idea that a book about GM from an insider just had to be written.

Wright started to work. PLAYBOY PRESS was contacted and agreed to publish the book. The completed manuscript, based on 35 to 40 hours of taped interviews and documentation which De

Each state that offers a program for gifted children dent has exceptional ability? has to determine then how "Gifted" is a complicated much or how little of the definition of the Office of student is advanced to the the Gifted and Talented it will adopt. Each state writes into law, or its state board of education adopts, a definition of a "gifted and tal-ented" child to be used within its borders.

In 1978, the North Carolina State Department of Education surveyed other state departments of education to find out what criteria were being used to identify gifted children. Thirty-seven state departments responded indicating the use of a combination of criteria as shown in the following summary: 23 states use group IQ scores; 30 use individual IQ scores; bile manufacturing company. talent in the visual or per- 30, achievement tests; 25, forming arts, And, some grades, 27, "product/demonstrated" talent; 25, creativity test scores; and 23, behave ioral checklists or scales.


Some states also allow local school systems to establish dual criteria - different criteria for "advantaged" children (enough food, adequate housing, etc.) and for "experientially or educationally deprived" children.



Thus, failure to satisfactorily meet one criterion will not keep a child out of a gifted program.

Obviously, there is no easy solution to the problem of identifying gifted children. In subsequent articles we will explain our definition of gifted and talented and how those students are identified in our schools.


