meeting. "Le Cafe has made a sincere effort and I think Mr. Moraco and Mr. Serba will run a very fine business."

Moraco has said that Le Cafe's patronage has been slipping because beer and wine have not been available with the restaurant's French cuisine. Moraco maintains that Le Cafe's future depends on the availability of beer and wine.

About 10 Le Cafe supporters testified in favor of the restaurant's continued success including Karen Wat-

son, a Grosse Pointe Shores resident who initiated the petition drive.

Watson urged the council to give Le Cafe owners Serba and Moraco "the gift of survival by giving them the license they need."

Other supporters testified in favor of the character of Le Cafe's owners and called the restaurant an asset to the community.

The council's other fears were calmed when City Attorney George Catlin said that approval of Le Cafe's application would not violate the

city's tavern license ordinance because the Circuit Court had ordered the council to hear the application.

The vote was five to two in favor of Le Cafe's request. Opposition was from Councilmen John Sabol who said "we should not have a proliferation of liquor licenses" and Thomas Fahrner who refused to explain why he voted no.

Le Cafe owner Charles Moraco said he felt "on top of the world" as he accepted congratulations from supporters after the hearing. Co-owner Ronald Serba said there is a 45-day waiting period before the state issues Le Cafe's license.

The Woods is currently appealing the Circuit Court decision that interpreted the tavern license ordinance to mean more than one application could be reviewed. However, Attorney Catlin said the outcome of that appeal will not affect Monday's council decision.

The dispute over LeCafe's application apparently will not happen again since the council can merely deny any more applications submitted to it, according to Councilman Dan Grady.

Also, the revised tavern license ordinance proposed for the August ballot was designed to clarify the ambiguous language in the original ordinance which caused the Le Cafe controversy, Catlin said.

'80 Graduates

Fewer than 100 of the 1,000 students graduating from North and South High Schools will leave Michigan for college.

That trend is dramatically reversed at Grosse Pointe's major private high school, University Liggett. The majority of the 86-member class of '80 at ULS will travel for college—many to the east coast. Only about 16 recent graduates plan to attend Michigan schools, according to ULS Director of College Placements Muriel Brock. The rest scatter to such schools as Dartmouth, Georgetown, Brown, Middlebury, Vanderbilt and Notre Dame, according to Ms. Brock.

The difference in price between Michigan and many out-of-state schools is substantial, and South's Hanson thinks that has a lot to do with most students' choice to stay close to home for college.

"Midwest public universities run about \$4,200 a year, the eastern schools about \$8,000 to \$10,000. That's a big difference, and I don't personally believe an undergraduate education at one of the 'ivy league' schools is that much better than at University of Michigan, for example," Hanson said.

Neighbors Battle over Alley

dents involved in the alley dispute. It was brought before the council again at a public hearing last week.

Mary and her neighbors were at the meeting, each giving reasons why the fence should or should not be installed.

The residents of the alley would like to see the fence put down the middle, connecting it with their backyard fences, something the council did consider six months ago.

Last year, letters sent to the 12 residents indicated that 50 percent

were in favor of vacating the alley while 50 percent opposed the idea.

RESIDENTS ON Wayburn, including Mary, don't want any portion of the alley.

"Many of my neighbors are just too old to take care of any more property.

"Everyone wants it on Maryland, give it to them. The council made its decision last year and that should have been the end of it," Mary said.

City Manager John Crawford said the council can legally vacate the alley without the residents' permission.

"We are just trying to be cooperative with the residents right now, but it's really up to them."

The city manager said he would like to see the alley vacated and a fence installed down the middle.

The council is expected to decide on the future of the alley at its meeting Monday night.

As for Mary and her neighbors, they don't agree right now what to do with their no-man's land, but they do agree it's frustrating, and it may mean a long hot summer before anything is resolved.

She also landed the role of Alma in "The Music Man" and made an appearance in "Inherit the Wind," both at the Alger Theatre.

Her new role is a waitress in the play "A Promise Broken," giving her a chance to break away from musicals and do some serious drama. Written by Detroit's Phil Awada, the play deals with the problems, prejudices and pressures of young people today.

While one may have the talent, Lila says, luck is an important factor in getting good roles.

"IF YOU DON'T fit the picture the casting director has in mind, there's no way you are going to get it. This is where luck comes in. Being in the right place at the right time."

Be it musical or drama, Lila finds she doesn't have to spend a lot of time preparing for a role. As she puts it, "I just get up on stage and I'm that person. Lila Miller doesn't exist any more."

The Indiana born and raised actress has lived in the Detroit area since 1957 and in Grosse Pointe in her Kerby road home since 1967. She spent five years in Rochester, N.Y., as well, where she did solo singing work and took voice lessons from Chase Baromeo, a former soloist with the Metropolitan Opera and head of the voice department at the University of Michigan.

"When I moved to Detroit, I kept on singing, which is something you can practice at home and is compatible with raising a family. One singing

job led to another and that's how I got where I am today."

Although Lila decries the youth-oriented approach to casting ("If I'm willing to work, why can't there be parts for character actresses?") she sees that attitude changing somewhat and is encouraged with the status of local theater in Grosse Pointe.

She sees more touring companies coming to this area and thinks the Punch and Judy's plans for live theater are "terrific."

Before Punch manager Tom Shaker announced his intentions of staging live theatre productions, Lila says, the only place for performers to work on the east side was the Alger Theatre. Everything else was either in Dearborn, Birmingham or downtown. She's hopeful Grosse Pointe theatergoers will support Shaker's efforts.

"People in Grosse Pointe have to start going to the Punch and Judy for recreation, instead of thinking they can't have a good time unless they go downtown to the Fisher," she says.

"A lot of it is just status. However, I've always felt an awful lot of good things are in your own backyard."

Lila, who spends her days with her husband John and an American Eskimo Spitz dog named Duchess, intends to lend her support to local theater the only way she knows how—by just continuing to act.

"I've got the time and an understanding husband, who knows what it means to work at something you like," she says. "I have absolutely no intention of stopping acting. I intend to do it until I drop."

he felt "very good" about the ruling. She gave us a quick decision," he said. McCauley said this paves the way for his group to file an appeal with the Michigan State Court of Appeals.

The attorney feels confident his group will win its appeal with the state court because "we're right on the facts and on the law."

He was referring to a state law which mandates the last decennial census be used to draw up charter districts unless it is inappropriate for apportionment.

Of the 27 districts, the five Pointes comprise District I, from which nine candidates have filed for the one charter commissioner position. They are Democrats Irma J. Allen, Anita Jordan McIntyre, Jane E. Stevens and Edward R. Wilson; and Republicans Randy Dufour, Barbara Gattorn, Leonard C. Jacques, Karen J. Kosky and Ann O'Hara.

However, due to a restraining order attorneys from the western Wayne County group obtained against the county clerk's office, those candidates, along with candidates from

the remaining 26 districts, may not be put on the August 5 ballot.

THAT ORDER stopped county clerk James Killeen from getting charter commission candidates on the ballot and from distributing and proofreading ballots. Last week Killeen said if his office could not get absentee ballots to local city clerks by June 17, county election officials would be in violation of state law.

However, he said this week that if his office showed it was acting in good faith, that deadline wasn't necessarily binding. Although he said there was no way he could get all the necessary work done by June 17, there is still a chance to get the question of a new charter on the August 5 ballot.

The only thing that could stop the issue from making that ballot would be a restraining order from the state court. At press time, McCauley said the western coalition would press for such an order at the same time it files its appeal or Judge Borman's decision.

The western Wayne County communities, prior to filing their lawsuit, had approached the five Grosse Pointes in search of support. The City, Shores and Woods all supported the concept of the lawsuit, but only the City shelled out money to prove it.

City Manager Thomas Kressbach said the council decided to contribute \$331 to the lawsuit because council members felt apportionment ought to be based on current population fig-

ures since representatives from out-county groups would be "more responsive to our needs" if they are drawn from districts based on the 1980 rather than 1970 census.

"We don't like the delaying aspect of it (the lawsuit) but I don't know how you can get around it," he said.

SHORES VILLAGE Manager Thomas K. Jeffris and Woods City Manager Chester Peterson stated their respective councils had voted to support the lawsuit although no official action was taken by either group and no money was pledged.

John Crawford, city manager of the Park, indicated his council did not go along with the request for support.

"Other than a delaying tactic, I don't see what it will accomplish," he said.

"Personally, I don't see where it makes that much difference — one more person, one more seat? I think it will affect the downriver communities, but I don't think it will affect us and I don't think we should share the costs of any lawsuit."

The Park's position is based on demographic studies which show that use of the 1980 census will not result in a great lot of change, with Detroit losing one district and the rest of Wayne county gaining one.

Andrew Bremer, Farms city manager, said the council in his city has taken no action for or against the lawsuit.

The "Energy Answermobile" is transported by truck and contains its own electrical generating system and fuel supply for heating and general lighting.

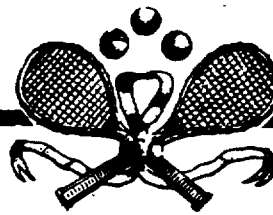

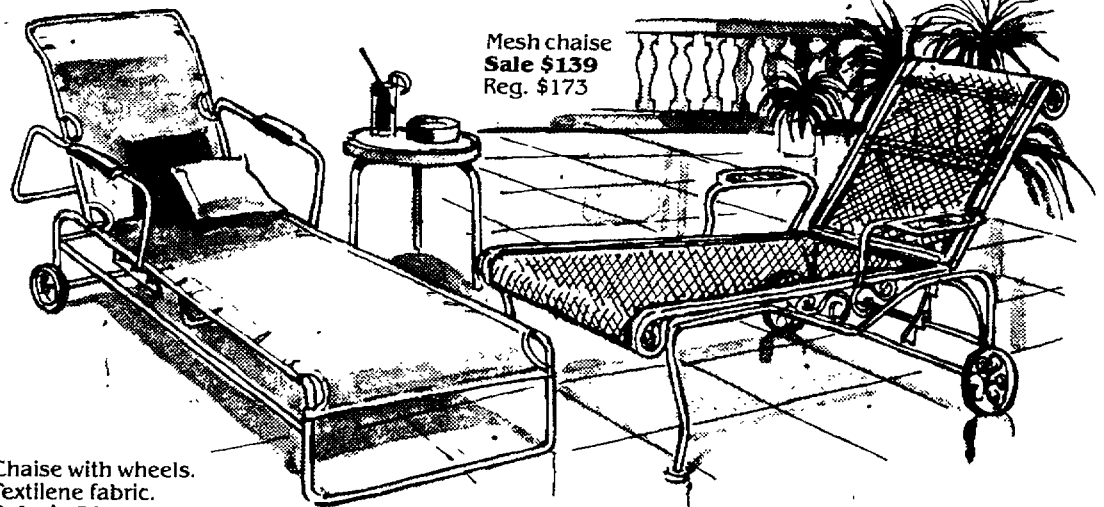

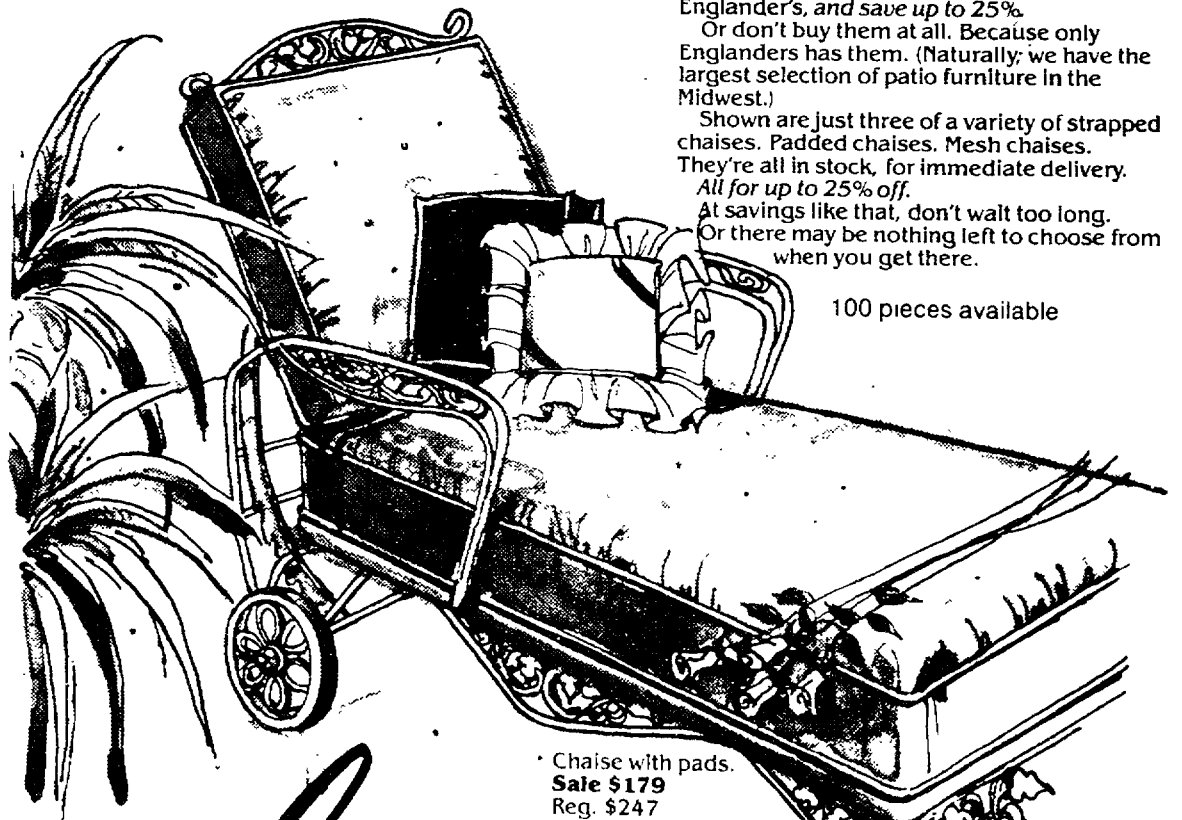

News Around the Clock

The Cable TV Connection

This is the third of a series of articles explaining the services soon to be offered by Grosse Pointe Cable TV.

Cable viewers in the Grosse Pointes will soon be able to see veteran commentator Daniel Schorr reporting live from the White House, and live on-the-spot coverage of major news events from around the world, all day and all night.

The news is now doled out in small doses on television in 30-minute blocks. That will change. The Cable News Network (CNN) will change it with round-the-clock continuous news coverage via satellite from all over the world.

Based in Atlanta, the network is the brainchild of Ted Turner, investor and well-known sporting figure.

At the heart of CNN's 24-hour schedule will be a two-hour, prime-time news show, with top reporters delivering solid in-depth journalism.

This extensive report will call on the resources of CNN bureaus in Washington, New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Houston, Miami, Atlanta and important world capitals.

Senior correspondent Daniel Schorr will anchor the Washington desk.

Schorr has received such accolades as the prestigious "First Amendment Award" and several "Emmy" awards. His greatest fame is as a reporter. The Washington Post called him "the toughest and best reporter in television news." In the New York Times, William Safire said, "He may be the best television newsman in the field today." And author David Halberstam believes he is "an old-fashioned print journalist—too serious, too talented, and too aggressive for television." But CNN thinks Daniel Schorr is just what contemporary television needs.

Joining Schorr will be the celebrated news team of Rowland Evans and Robert Novak, with probing reportage and perceptive commentary on the meaning behind the stories. And for complete coverage of the Washington beat, the bureau will include 10 other veteran reporters.

CNN's financial coverage will include live reports from Wall Street throughout the day, plus closings, reviews, and wrap-ups around the clock. In addition, viewers can count on current analysis of commodity and money markets, late-breaking developments and significant trends.

CNN will wind up the business day with a 40 minute Executive Suite interview featuring important newsmakers and analysts from the financial world. And because business is more than a matter of facts and figures, CNN will present commen-

tary and analysis by former Secretary of the Treasury William E. Simon.

Throughout the news day, national and international events will be looked at from the woman's point of view with the participation of two of America's most stimulating political personalities—Bella Abzug and Phyllis Schlafly.

On the Lighter Side, CNN will bring subscribers entertainment angles, from trends and travel to good, old-fashioned gossip. Popular psychologist Joyce Brothers will offer her perspective on our lives and the world we live in. Concerning matters culinary, actor-dancer-designer Geoffrey Holder will reveal another side of his artistry, with personal, creative tips for the gourmet.

At 7:40 p.m., CNN will kick off its prime time report of the day, summarizing what's happened and warming up for the evening's events. Then, at 11 p.m., a 40-minute program will cover all the sports news in detail. Pre-emptive bulletins throughout the day will keep viewers informed of late-breaking sports stories, and sports will play an important part in hourly general news updates.

CNN will also give cable subscribers the latest odds on the day's sports cards. Completing the sports day will be a 2 a.m. wrap-up of West Coast activities.

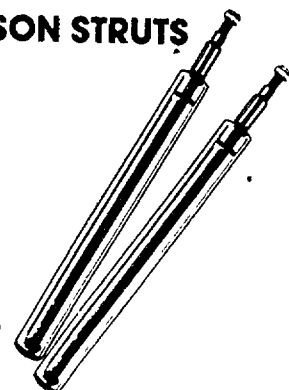

Bagel boys make the rounds

Some people are accustomed to finding milk or juice on their front door steps each morning, but two young local men are greeting residents with something a bit more unusual—bags of fresh, warm bagels.

Mike Levitt, 18, and his 16-year-old brother Dan pull themselves out of bed every other Sunday morning at 6:30 a.m. to begin what they say is the "best job we can think of."

The idea of a bagel beat began four years ago when the Levitt family lived on the west side of Detroit. The Levitts now reside on Westchester road.

"Each week we went down to the local bakery to buy bagels and heard of someone who was doing the same thing that we are doing now," Mike says.

"I had a paper route then and said

to myself there must be a better way to make money."

The novel idea of delivering bagels door-to-door in Grosse Pointe spread word-of-mouth to a few friends and now the boys say their customer list reaches 125. They only deliver up to 70 orders at one time, however.

On Sunday morning, Mike and Dan pick up the bagels from the New York Bagel Baking Company in Ferndale, pack them in bags and deliver them in the family station wagon.

"Our father is getting worried because the salt from the bagels is beginning to rust out the car," laughs Mike.

It takes about five hours to complete deliveries, Dan says, beginning in Grosse Pointe Park and heading out to St. Clair Shores.

"We used to deliver bagels every week, but we had to cut down to every other week because of the fuel problem."

Mike and Dan contact their customers on Friday to get orders for the

weekend delivery. Customers can have their choice of raisin, salt or onion bagels at \$2.25 dozen.

The bagel entrepreneurs say they have no serious problems with their customers, although some would appreciate a little cream cheese, please.

"A few times we have had complaints about squirrels getting into the bags and carrying away the bagels," Mike says.

Customers do get a special treat on holidays when Mike and Dan slip green bagels into the bags for St. Patrick's Day or a wreath-like bagels at Christmastime.

Mike, an engineering student at Michigan Tech, also works with the Wayne County Road Commission.

Dan, a student at South High School, is going to be in the bagel business for "at least two more years," he figures.

"It's the best job I can think of. It's really easy and doesn't take that much time."

Shores Budget Up 8 Percent

A budget calling for close to \$2 million in expenditures was approved by the Shores village council at its June 17 meeting.

This year's budget is set at \$1,986,981, up 7.8 percent from \$1,842,697 spent last year. Most of that money is expected to be raised from property taxes.

While the mill rate of 15.95 is down from 17.75 in 1980, a jump in the State Equal-

ized Value (SEV) factor for the Shores of 1.80 from 1.48 means that residents as a whole will pay \$173,764 more in taxes over last year, an increase of 14.46 percent.

Applied to a home valued at \$34,000, this year's mill rate coupled with the increased SEV factor, yields a tax bill of \$976.14. That same home last year had a tax bill of \$893.18. As approved by the council, homeowners in the Shores will be paying \$82.96 more in property taxes, a 9.2 percent increase from last year.

The rest of the budget money will be raised from water receipts — \$325,000, state returned taxes — \$117,450 and other revenues — \$178,600.

Increased expenditures this year will come from Public Works, up 20 percent, Water and Sewers, up 18 percent, Sanitation, up 16 percent, Public Safety, up 9 percent, Fringe Benefits, up 12 percent and Buildings and Grounds, up 5 percent. Down this year are Parks and Recreation by 8 percent and Insurance by 19 percent.

Churches Re-enact Historic Festival

A hall at the bishop's palace in the southern German city of Augsburg was the scene of a historic event on a hot and humid June 25, 1530. Followers of Martin Luther from Brandenburg, Saxony, Hesse and several cities had come to Augsburg to confess their Christian faith to the emperor Charles V in a document entitled "The Augsburg Confession."

In order to reach the ears of several thousand listeners who had to stand outside the hall, they enlisted the services of a Wittenberg lawyer, Dr. Christian Beyer, who reputedly had a loud voice. In spite of Dr. Beyer's "loud" two-hour presentation, the emperor slept because he did not understand German.

This scene will be re-enacted at a special "Festival of Reconciliation" being planned by the members and clergy of St. Paul Lutheran Church and St. Paul Catholic Church in the Farms, at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 25, at St. Paul Church at Lothrop and Chalfonte.

The program will have a simple format including hymns, common prayer, interpretive narration, and a dramatization in costume of the first reading of the Augsburg Confession 450 years ago.

The planners of the program are Sandy Fisher, Ann Wallace, Sr. Betty Flaherty, and Msgr. Francis X. Canfield from St. Paul Catholic Church and Pastor Ken Lentz, Regina Gersch, and Frank Firmschild from St. Paul Lutheran.

The ecumenical study committee which includes representation from Christ Church Episcopal will host a reception following the program. Planners from Christ Church include the rector, Rev. Robert MacGregor, and Pat Horn.

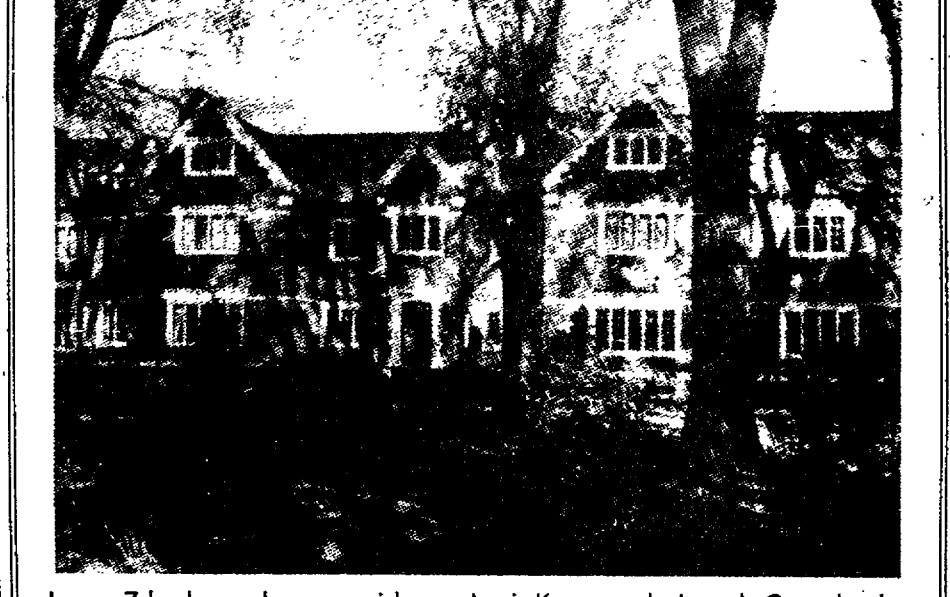

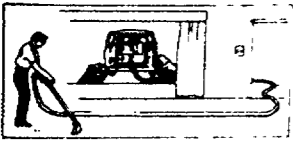

Diabetes on the Rise Throughout the State

Diabetes is on the rise in Michigan. That's the assessment of Jim Racine, president of the Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation.

Racine claims there are 213,275 diabetics in the state of Michigan, with 36,300 in Detroit alone, and predicts an additional 23,100 cases in the state this year.

Racine, along with 300 other volunteers attended JDF's 10th annual international conference in Washington, D.C., June 3 to 8. Noted researchers, government officials, diabetic patients and their families met to discuss research advances, new techniques in diabetes care, research appropriations and other related issues.

The Juvenile Diabetes Foundation, a voluntary health organization with 123 chapters throughout the nation, has contributed \$7 million to support research to prevent devastating complications of diabetes, and ultimately to find a cure for the disease.

"During the past 18 months, diabetes research has resulted in five major advancements," said Racine.

- Established a causal link between a specific virus and juvenile diabetes, a development which holds out hope of vaccine at some future time.

- Developed a miniature, battery-powered pump, worn externally, which feeds a continuous supply of insulin to the diabetic.

- Accomplished bacterial production of human insulin

using recombinant DNA technology.

- Located possible genetic markers for diabetes which may make it possible to identify some high-risk candidates before they develop the disease.

- Transplanted insulin-producing pancreatic cells in laboratory animals.

"Clearly, diabetes research funding is a sound investment which is paying off," said Racine. "However this year's proposed federal budget would provide for the funding of only 20 to 30 percent of approved research grant applications, compared with a funding rate of as high as 60 percent five years ago. In effect, we would be going backwards instead of forwards."

Diabetes currently affects 10 million Americans. Of these, 1.5 million are juvenile diabetic, dependent upon daily injections of insulin to stay alive.

Diabetes is the leading cause of blindness, and a major cause of heart attacks, kidney disease gangrene and strokes. The incidence is rising by an annual rate of six percent. Three hundred thousand lives are lost to diabetes each year.

Park Sponsors Aug. Tree Sale

The Grosse Pointe Park Beautification Commission will conduct a tree sale for Park residents. The orders must be placed at the Municipal Building with payment by August 8. Trees will be picked up at 3 p.m., November 8 at Three Mile Park.

The trees offered are disease resistant, tolerant of city conditions, relatively fast growing, will give dense shade, reach a height of 50 to 80 feet and with the exception of the Crimson King, have excellent fall color.

The Greenspire Linden is offered for \$20.40, the Emerald Queen Norway Maple for \$15.60, the Green Mountain Sugar Maple for \$24, the Skyline Locust for \$16.80 and the Crimson King Norway Maple for \$24.

The trees should be planted on the owner's property. The city government is continuing its existing program of planting larger and more expensive trees in the easement.

When planting trees any questions about the location of gas, water, and sewer lines can be answered by calling the city at 822-5020.

The trees will be in good condition from a reputable nursery. The Beautification Commission cannot guarantee the trees. Written instructions for the proper planting, care, and maintenance of the trees will be given.

For those Park residents who want to buy trees but will be unable to plant them themselves, arrangements with the Boy Scouts have been made to plant trees for a reasonable fee.

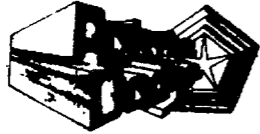
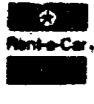

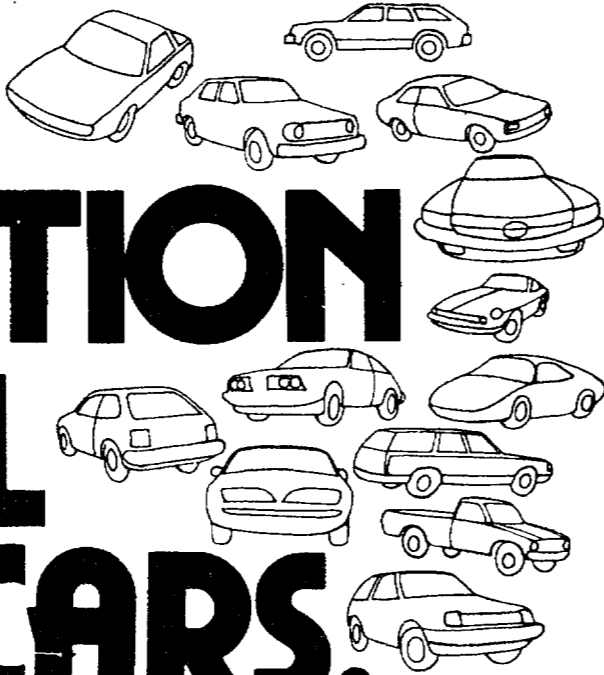

April Home Sales Up, Resale Activity Down

The median price of existing homes exceeded in the U.S. \$60,000 in April for the first time in history, said Dr. Jack Carlson, executive vice-president and chief economist of the National Association of Realtors.

"The median price of an existing home in April rose \$900 to \$60,400, 10.4 percent higher than a year earlier, at a time when consumer prices were increasing by 15.9 percent," Carlson said. "Thus far in 1980, home prices have been appreciating at a rate slower than the rate of inflation."

In Grosse Pointe the median price of homes in April was \$106,400, up 29 percent over a year ago.

Carlson said that existing home sales declined another 12 percent in April to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 2,420,000 units. "This is the lowest level in nearly five years."

The slump in activity continues to be nationwide, with April sales off 5.6 percent in

the Northeast, 8.2 percent in the South, 15.4 percent in the North Central and 19.6 percent in the West, Carlson said.

Since the start of the slump 17 months ago, resale activity has fallen 40.4 percent, Carlson noted, "with the major portion of the decline occurring since October, 1979, when tight credit policies were initiated to counter inflation."

Mortgage interest rates during most of April were hovering about 15 percent, Carlson added. As a result, the April figures on sales do not reflect how the market is reacting to the sharp reduction in mortgage interest rates.

"These lower interest rates," he continued, "should stabilize the resale market and set the stage for a recovery in sales of existing properties."

Preliminary estimates indicate some rebound in resale activity in May, but all of the figures are not yet in, Carlson added.

Detroit Journalists Will Honor Nedzi with Award

Retiring U.S. Rep. Lucien Nedzi (D-13th District) will address the Detroit Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists during an evening in his honor tonight at the Detroit Press Club.

Nedzi will speak to the society on the nation's state of affairs and world trouble spots threatening global peace following dinner at 7 p.m.

The society also will present Nedzi with a Distinguished Service Award at the program.

A society spokesman said Nedzi was selected for the honor because "When a public official is deserving a well-earned salute for having admirably served the people then it should be made public."

As a member of Congress, Nedzi consistently worked for reforms in campaign spending, election procedures, Congressional ethics and reorganization, according to the society.

Nedzi was first elected to Congress in 1961 and announced he will not seek reelection this November after 19 years on Capitol Hill.

WDIV to Give Scholarships

WDIV Channel 4 will be accepting applications for Post-Newsweek Stations (PNS) Scholarship Awards through September 30, 1980.

The station has made a total of \$4,000 available for the 1980-81 school year. The amount will be divided among a number of awardees and may be used solely against tuition, fees and books.

According to William L. Ford, Vice President and Station Manager of WDIV, the PNS Scholarship Program exists to support training and educational opportunities in broadcasting. The program is open to any student enrolled full-time in an accredited institution of higher learning who is majoring in journalism, communications and broadcast-related fields.

The applicants should be classified as "juniors" or be of the equivalent status when the scholarship commences in October, 1980.

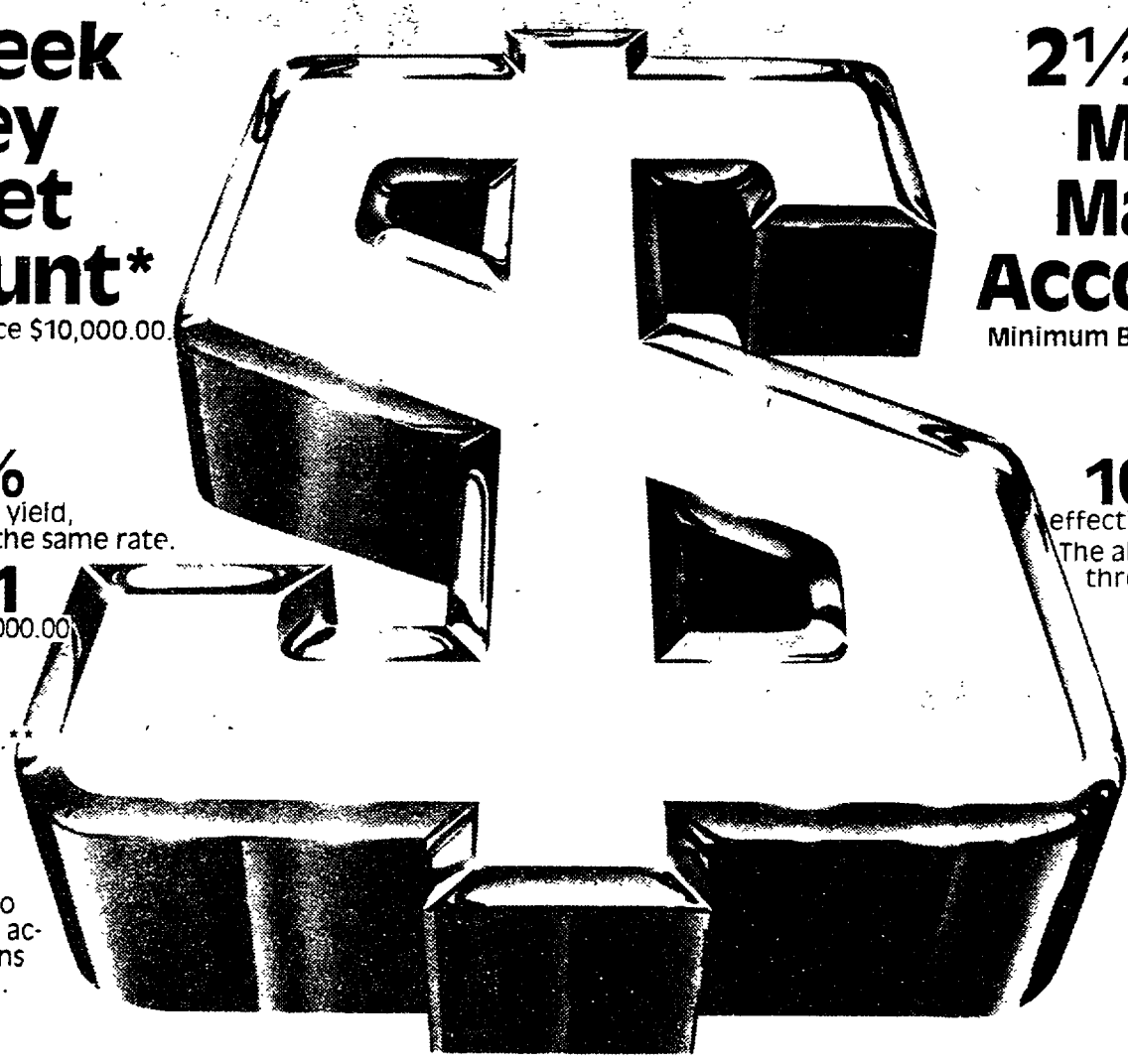

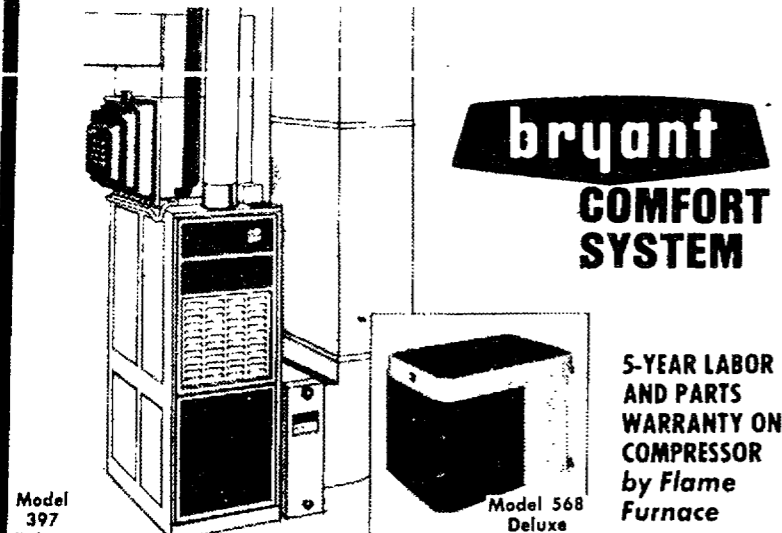

Free State Campgrounds Are Open for Summer Fun

Michiganians weary of wrestling with rising prices and economic hard times can still find something for nothing at 22 free campgrounds in the northern Lower and Upper Peninsulas, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

Auto Club has compiled a list of 13 national and nine state forest facilities where campers can stay free for up to 15 consecutive days.

Offering only the bare essentials for both tent and trailer users, the facilities, averaging 11 sites each, are tranquil alternatives to larger parks.

All campgrounds listed are either on lakes or streams and have vault toilets. Each, except the hike-in and water-access sites in the Sylvania Recreation Area near Watersmeet in the Upper Peninsula, has water.

There are campfire grills and tables at all campsites. Campers can enjoy lake swimming at two campgrounds, canoeing on rivers or lakes at three and hiking on state or federally maintained trails at three others.

Anglers can fish for trout, panfish, walleye or northern pike in lakes or rivers at 21 campgrounds. Six of those offer boat launch ramps and boat rentals are available at a seventh.

UPPER PENINSULA — Sylvania Recreation Area, Ottawa National Forest, four miles west of Watersmeet, then four miles southwest on County Road 535.





As far as they're concerned, Lorne Greene is the man who sells dog food on television. They never saw *Romance*, you see... or *Sixty Minutes* or, (back up a bit, now), Ed Sullivan. Those programs were shown on Sunday nights.

And every Sunday night, for the past 19 years, Gust and Doris Jahnke have been busy.

When Gust Jahnke arrived in Grosse Pointe in December, 1970, to serve as church administrator at Grosse Pointe Memorial Church, he and his wife were asked by the Church Session to try to begin a group for single persons, ages 20 to 40, similar to the groups they had sponsored at Westminster Church of Detroit and Westminster Church of Buffalo, N.Y.

while Gust and Doris were their sponsors. But to begin a singles group from scratch was something else again. Who would come forth to be the leaders? Would anyone come forth at all? What name would they choose, how would they work up a mailing list, where would they find, and how attract, outstanding speakers?

The Jahnkes squared their shoulders, held their breath and plunged in. By contacting many churches in the area, asking ministers and priests for names of single persons in the 20 to 40 age group, a list of potential leaders was developed. From that list, about 40 persons showed up at Grosse Pointe Memorial Church in March of 1971 to begin organizing for the fall.

Half of that original group dropped out as soon as they realized it would take months of preparation before the first meeting could take place. But those that remained went to work. Hard.

They combed their high school annuals for names, looked up addresses in phone books and came up with a mailing list. They selected a name: Phase I, to denote the first phase in their new lifestyle as single young adults.

And when 180 singles showed up at Memorial Church for Phase I's first Sunday night speaker in September, 1971, they knew they had a winner.

Since that time, Joe Hudson and Doug Fraser and Richard Austin and Mennen Williams and Vic Caputo and Charley Manos and psychiatrists and sports announcers and hypnotists and clergymen and acupuncture demonstrations and hair stylists and square dances—even yoga—have composed the interesting, varied programs that give Phase I its outstanding reputation.

Other groups for singles have since been formed in the area, but none offers the weekly programs enjoyed by so many. With the exception of July and August each year, Phase I has been THE place to be on Sunday nights for over 900 singles per year.

Phase I begins its 10th year with 65 to 85 persons attending each Sunday night program meeting. Phase I also sponsors a variety of social functions; these, too, are very well attended.

As for the Jahnkes . . . well, after attending over 35 weddings of couples who met at Phase I, Gust and Doris stopped keeping count. But the wedding invitations keep coming, and those and the baby announcements have a way of reminding Phase I's sponsors how their church-oriented group has affected the lives of countless young adults.

Through the years, certain experiences stand out. There was last summer's picnic at a park near Buffalo, a reunion attended by 125 members of the singles group Gust and Doris sponsored during the 60's. The Jahnkes were the guests of honor.

There was the invitation from Pointers Ed and Alice Gordon, inviting the Jahnkes out for the evening a few weeks after they arrived in town. That turned out to be a surprise reunion of couples who had met at the Detroit Westminster Church singles group while the Jahnkes were its sponsors.

There is the yearly Christmas party of former Phase I members, who enjoy getting together with their families to celebrate Phase II, or Phase III, in their lives.

But most enjoyable of all, for Gust and Doris, is the chance to meet a half-dozen new singles every Sunday night. Television can't begin to compare with that.

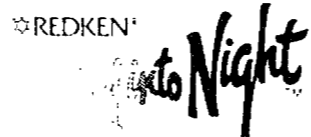

When members of the Association of Concert Bands of America met in Burlington, Vt., this spring, Helen Rowe, public relations director for the Detroit Concert Band headquarters...

Ms. Rowe acted as surrogate for Dr. Leonard B. Smith, DCB music director, who could not attend the Burlington conference because of prior guest conducting commitments in South Carolina.

She was aware that prior ACBA conferences had been held in eastern and south eastern cities, and that some members favored a west coast site for 1981.

"But there I was with all that irresistible, colorful material provided by the Metro-

politan Detroit Convention and Visitors Bureau... what finally cinched it for Detroit was the fact that Dr. Smith, who will begin his term as president of the ACBA in January, offered members an opportunity to attend a rehearsal as well as a concert by the Detroit Concert Band."

ACBA's membership, including representatives of adult community and professional concert bands throughout the United States, Canada, Australia and Jamaica, plus instrument manufacturer, music publisher and recording company representatives, were intrigued by the opportunity to witness live Smith's rehearsal techniques.

They want to see the unique encore books, assembled over many years by Smith, that enable the DCB to grant encore requests at a moment's notice, and to salute visiting digni-

On June 11, Richmond combined six hits and nine (Continued on Page 30)

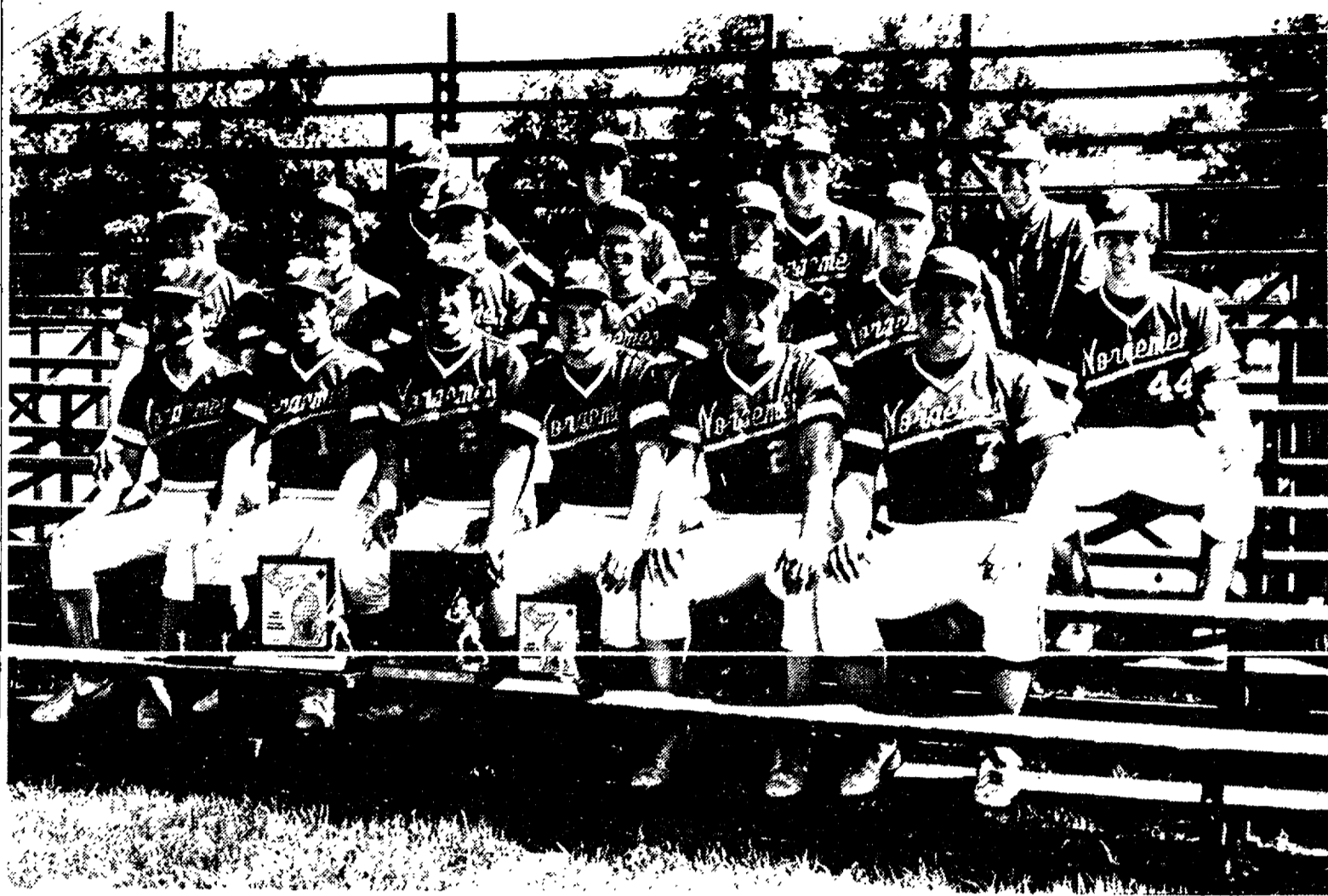

Boys Win State Title

North High baseball coach Frank Sumbera described it this way: "It was everything you could ask for in a championship game. It was an exciting battle all the way that was won with a dramatic extra-inning grand slam."

It was also everything a Norsemen fan could ask for, too, as the green-and-gold of North bested Wayne Memorial High School and Royal Oak Kimball in two games Saturday at Wyandotte to win their first State Baseball Championship.

Four teams were hoping to win the state title by winning two games at the tournament. In the semifinal games, Royal Oak Kimball downed Muskegon Mona Shores, 5-4, and North shut out Wayne, 2-0.

Junior Bill Babcock hurled his second consecutive no-hitter in the game against Wayne. Prior to that contest, he threw another in the regional semifinal versus Detroit Northwestern.

North scored its first run after Al Lucido and Matt Costello singled. Lucido was called out on a double steal, and Bob Brown drove in Costello with another single. They added another in the fifth inning when John Vens walked, was sacrificed twice and scored on a wild pitch.

The Norsemen and the Royal Oak Knights started the final game 45 minutes later and it was North which started the scoring. Tom Shook and Babcock each drove in runs, and wild Kimball throwing also helped North collect three by the end of the first inning. Kimball came back with one in its half of the first.

In the bottom of the third, Dave Kopf hit a three-run home run for Royal Oak to give the Knights a 4-3 lead, which stood for three more innings.

Babcock led off the sixth for North with a double, and Scott Young sacrificed him to third. Keith Schatko at- tempted a suicide squeeze

bunt, but the throw to first went wild and Babcock scored. Costello followed with a double to drive in Schatko and give North a 5-4 lead.

Kimball tied it up in the bottom of the inning. With Babcock coming in to replace starting pitcher Shook, the Knights scored one run on a walk and a triple. When neither team could break the tie in the seventh, the game went into extra innings.

The Knights threatened in the eighth by leading off with a double. However, North catcher Mike "Zeke" Seagram picked the runner off second which Coach Sumbera described as the "turning point of the game."

It apparently ignited the Norsemen for the ninth inning. Babcock opened with a single. With the infielders playing close for a bunt, Young slugged the ball past the third baseman for another single. Schatko moved both runners up with a sacrifice bunt, and Lucido walked to load the bases.

Costello stepped up and became the man of the hour by blasting a grand slam home run, sending the North side into ecstasy. The Knights rallied for one run in the bottom of the ninth, but it wasn't enough as the game ended and Norsemen fans rushed onto the field to congratulate the team and see the trophy presentation.

The final score was 9-6.

Sumbera cited the performances of Costello (3-for-6 with five RBIs), Babcock (4-for-5), Seagram (who picked off two runners and drew three intentional walks), and Shook (who pitched five good innings).

He also singled out junior pitcher John Hackett. "He came into the game in the last inning to face a hard rain and a determined Royal Oak team. He gave a gutsy performance."

Babcock, an "All-State" selection, picked up both wins to raise his record to 14-0 with an 0.19 earned run

average. He also broke a North record with 125 strikeouts in a season, made possible by fanning 14 in the final two games.

The team finished with an overall record of 29-4. The 29 wins is the most in Michigan this year. "Twenty-nine is a lot of wins, but they're a great group," commented Sumbera.

"A lot of players were talking of the state title before the season started. They went like a race horse—wire to wire—number one all the way."

Financial Benefits of Preserving Business

People have been renovating and living in historic houses for some time, but lately the preservation bug has bitten business owners who are rehabilitating historic commercial buildings. Rehabilitating "certified historic structures" can bring tax breaks to business owners under provision of the 1976 Tax Reform Act and the Revenue Act of 1978 which expand the benefits of previous laws, says The Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants.

Warehouses, factories, office buildings, stores and other business structures including hotels are eligible for tax credits if they are listed in the national Register of Historic Places or are located in a registered historic district. Apartment buildings and single-family residences generally do not qualify, although they may be eligible if converted to business use.

To qualify for special tax treatments business owners must do renovation work that will improve the usefulness, extend the life or aid in preserving historic property.

Such rehabilitation may include the replacement or the addition of plumbing, wiring, heating and cooling systems, flooring and partitions. Cost of expanding the building or of acquiring the property itself cannot be included when figuring the tax credits say the CPAs.

For income tax purposes the Internal Revenue Service will let the owner of a certified historic business structure deduct rehabilitation expenses over a five year period as long as the expenses are incurred before June 15, 1981.

Instead of this "rapid amortization" a business owner also could claim a larger deduction for depreciation over a shorter period

AAA Advises Seasonal Car Maintenance

Driving this summer could be a breeze if motorists take some preventative maintenance steps now, reports Auto. mobile Club of Michigan.

"A vehicle that has survived winter and spring driving conditions may need a mechanical checkup," said Robert Tellier, Auto Club's acting manager of Emergency Road Service.

"Taking the time to prepare the car for the warm days ahead will result in better gas mileage and possibly prevent expensive repairs later," Tellier said.

"While the car's owners manual remains the best guide for recommended maintenance, owners of older cars or cars with considerable mileage should be aware that their vehicles may need more frequent attention."

Auto Club offers the following guidelines for seasonal maintenance that apply to most passenger cars:

• Points, plugs, fuel and air filters, condenser, ignition wires and engine timing should be checked and cleaned, replaced or adjusted as part of a routine tuneup.

• Engine oil should be replaced with proper grade summer weight or a multi-grade oil. The old sludge-filled oil filter also should be replaced.

• Check coolant level in the radiator and its strength with a hydrometer (an inexpensive tool available at most auto or discount stores). The coolant level can be checked visibly on autos with overflow tanks. Check for cracks or holes in the cooling system hoses.

• Battery should be checked for fluids and charge. Clean any corrosion on battery cables with baking soda and water.

• Tires should be checked for proper pressure and tread wear. If the car is pulling to one side, have the wheel alignment and shock absorbers checked.

• Lubricate the car to help guard against corrosion of vital parts from moisture collected during the winter and spring.

• Check these engine fluid levels: automatic transmission, master brake cylinder, power steering and windshield washer reservoir.

• Check the tension of all drive belts and look for fraying. Press your thumb on the middle of the belt, if it gives more than a half-inch, have it tightened or replaced.

• Inspect windshield wiper blades and replace if necessary.

• Turn on all headlights and turn signals to insure proper working order.
