# Cable TV turned on in Shores

It Robert Palmer is any indi-cation of how folks in Grosse Pointe Shores will take to cable TV, the system is assured of a long and successful future.

"It's a lot of fun," says Palmer, who lives on Lakeshore road, "My picture's clearer, and there's no flickering lines like when I had my antenna."

Palmer is among the 49 Shores residents who have subscribed to the system offered by Cox Cable Communications, the company the Shores Council awarded a cable franchise to last June.

WESTON CROFT, general manager of the Cox cable branch in the area, says work in the northern end of the Shores down to Hampton road is nearing completion. Salespeople have been canvassing homes in that area for the last couple of weeks and have signed approximately 69 percent of the people they've talked to.

Past that point, however, the company is waiting for approval from the Wayne County road commission to finish the job. Croft says about 10,000 feet of underground cable has to be laid along Lakeshore, which is a county jurisdiction road. The road commission requested a survey of Cox's complete cable plans before that work could start.

Croft says the county acted "very quickly" on the plans, sending them back to his engineers with a few minor revisions to be made. The plans are now back with the commission, and Croft is waiting for final permission to go ahead.

Once that permission is granted, he said, work on the section will take about three weeks to complete. In the meantime, the company will install another 10,000 feet of underground cable not under the county's jurisdiction in order to save time.

As each section in the Shores is energized, residents will receive a card notifying them that salespeople will soon be out to their neighborhoods. Homeowners are approached three times within one month period to see if they want cable.

What Cox is offering those homeowners is a 26-channel system with several more to be added in the fall. Included in the basic package will be all the stations emanating from Detroit—Channels 2, 4, 7, 20, 50, 56 and 62. Channel 9 from Windsor will be carried as well.

INSOMNIACS WILL be glad to note that 13 of the channels will run 24 hours a day. Two of those channels will be primarily news content. Channel 12 is United Press International's Video News, beamed by satellite from New York. Channel 13 will offer news, sports and financial information. Another channel will provide up to the minute local weather readings, as well as continuous forecasting from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administra-

For those who don't get enough sports on Saturday and Sunday afternoons, channel 15 will carry the Entertainment and Sports Programming Network. Billing itself the "world's leader in sports coverage," ESPN offers amateur, professional, national and international sporting events of every description.

In addition, a double feature channel featuring live coverage of the U.S. House of Representatives during the day will carry live sports events from Madison Square Garden in the evenings.

# There is no time for sightseeing as international visitors watch GOP

Anyone who plays even the slightest attention to what goes on in Detroit knows the national media has descended upon the Republican convention like an invading army. What people might not realize is that the international media is also quite interested in the two-week event as evidenced by representatives from four different nations who are staying as guests with Grosse Pointe families.

According to Gretchen Hitch, executive director of the International Visitors Council of Metropolitan Detroit, the organization handling the living arrangements for the four men, they are here primarily to record what goes on at a major presidential convention.

All four are visiting the U.S. as guests of the government under the Interational Visitor Program, which

is under the jurdisdiction of the U.S. commentator of radio Cairo's "Voice International Communication Agency.

"They are here as observers and reporters," says Hitch. "They have tickets, and are on the convention floor late afternoons and evenings. They'll get involved with it and find out what it's like. They won't have much free time.

What free time they do have will be limited to the morning and early afternoon hours. The families they are staying with say they have plans to use that time to show their guests around the Grosse Pointe and Detroit

# Gandelot Wins Top School Board Post

unseated an incumbent school board president in a decisive victory at the polls two years ago, was himself named to the top post on the board at the trustees' annual meeting Monday evening.

He will be joined in leadership of the school system for the 1980-81 year by new Vice-President Dorothy Kennel, Secretary Catherine Brierly and Treasurer Joan Hanpeter. All four were unopposed for their positions and were elected unanimously.

Gandelot, 36, said the schools must be prepared to face some tough issues in the coming year including the possibility of a reopening of the metropolitan Detroit busing case in federal court and the system's continuing decline in enrollment.

"We're going to start looking for additional ways to deal with that decline, and it won't be easy," the new president said.

in 1978 by a better than 2-1 margin over incumbent John Bruce. He campaigned aggressively against what he called excessive administrative spending in the schools, and a school board decision to issue bonds for a new industrial arts building at South High without taking a general vote.

Mrs. Kennel is serving her second year on the board and Joan Hanpeter her ninth. Mrs. Brierly was appointed to the board last December and elected to the post last month.

Three recently elected Board members, Mrs. Brierly, Mrs. Hanpeter and Roger Mourad were officially sworn in at the Monday evening meeting and the trustees also picked school attorneys, banks and major insurance carriers-not without some dis-

The board re-appointed the firm Hill, Lewis, Adams, Goodrich and general legal counsel and agreed to increase its fee for the service from a rate of \$50 to \$70 per hour-a substantial discount for the schools over the firm's standard rate for other clients, according to Superintendent William Coats.

The Michigan National Bank of Detroit won the bid for the multi-million dollar tax anticipation notes the schools need to get through the first part of the year, Michigan National will buy \$7 million in notes at an average interest rate of 5.75 percent, and National Bank of Detroit will take the remaining \$4.9 million in notes at a higher rate of 6.10 percent.

The two banks are splitting the award because Michigan National chose to bid on only \$7 million of the total \$11.9 million needed. According to School Board policy, Michigan National will also be awarded the school system's large General Operating Fund accounts for deposit. Those accounts have been with National Bank

Attorney Jon Gandelot, who of Detroit, and bank officials are reportedly not pleased with the impending transfer.

> The School Board attorney George Stevenson, of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, said the National Bank of Detroit is legally bound by its bid on the notes.

He opposed a routine financial recommendation because it allowed withdrawals from school savings accounts to be authorized by school administrators-without the signature of the school board treasurer.

# **U-Michigan** Gandelot was elected to the board 1978 by a better than 2-1 margin Coats job

The University of Michigan Board of Regents in Ann Arbor is expected to vote today on a recommendation offering Grosse Pointe Superintendent of Schools William Coats a full professorship in the university school of education.

Coats, who has been Grosse Pointe's superintendent for four years, was recommended for the job by school of education Dean Joan Stark, according to a spokesman for the university. Coats was awarded his PhD from U-M in 1966.

Coats said he can't respond to questions about his willingness to accept the new job until he sees the final offer later this week.

The appointment is slightly unusual in that Coats would not be expected to assume full duties at the university until the beginning of the 1981 academic year, according to Wono Lee, assistant director of information services in Ann Arbor. Coats would be asked to serve as a consultant for the coming academic year to effect "a transition in Grosse Pointe public schools," according to

Coats, in an interview Tuesday, stressed that even if he accepts the offer, he will remain with Grosse Pointe full-time for one more year.

Coats was recently awarded a oneyear extension to his contract in Grosse Pointe that puts the duration of his agreement through 1985. The superintendent came to the Pointe from Kalamazoo in 1976 and also was offered a job as head of Memphis, TE, public schools in 1978. He declined that offer, however.

#### Survey favors GOP win which usually soak up campaign dol- mary to run its course.

The primary election is just three weeks away, and for the first time in two decades 14th District Republicans apparently have the potential to threaten the Democrats' hold on the disttrict's Congressional seat, according to a survey commissioned by the GOP.

The telephone survey done in May of 300 registered voters was commisstoned by the local, state and national GOP to determine the probability of a Republican winning the Congressional seat in the heavily Democratic 14th District, which includes the Pointes, Harper Woods, East Detroit, Warren, Centerline, Hamtramck and part of Detroit's East Side Democrat Lucien Nedzi, who plans to retire this fall, has represented that area in Congress since 1961

The survey shows that when asked which party could solve the problems of inflation, strengthening national defense, shrinking federal government, improving foreign relations, unemployment and the energy crisis, respondents favored Republicans over Democrats by slight margins,

AGAINST THAT background, political experts say that the absence of an incumbent candidate and gubernatorial and legislative contests

lars from the national party, increases the Republican's chances.

In addition, the survey has determined that the key to winning the district lies in a candidate's ability to win support from the older, ethnic, Catholic Democrats that comprise almost half the district.

Some Republicans believe that Grosse Pointe Shores resident and former WJBK-TV broadcaster Vic Caputo has that key Caputo's Italian-Catholic background coupled with his high-degree of TV-induced name recognition is the kind of appeal that could win him the support of crossover Democrats.

Caputo's recent campaign appearance with Sen. William Roth (R. Delaware) at Hamtramck's Polish-American Century Club indicates that he is after the important ethnic-Democrats' votes

But so far, Caputo has not caused any excitement among party leadership, which three weeks ago declined to endorse him or any other candidate before the primary election and in doing so turned away financial and staff assistance from the nattional party

The party's official reason for not endorsing a candidate was to follow party tradition of allowing the pri-

SOME REPUBLICANS favor another Grosse Pointer, John Lauve, over Caputo. With 10 years of political activity in the district, Lauve has built some support in the district.

He also has 10 years with the Cadillac Motor Company in the quality control department, which he says gives him expertise in solving prob-

Lauve said he believes that it is time for a change in federal government and is building his campaign on anti-Democratic rhetoric.

While the survey indicates that both Lauve and Caputo may have the political climate in their favor, they still face formidable opposition from the Democratic counterparts-State Rep. Dennis Hertel and Sen John Kelly

The next two weeks should contain some interesting political activity as all the candidates make their final bids to win the nomination on August 5.

Other Republican candidates include Detroiter John Cunningham, Mark Wise of Harper Woods and Margaret Tenerowicz Hamtramek.

Other Democrats include Walter Gajewski, Helen Irving, Larry Rocca, Henry Schebor, Richard Kuszmar



The work being done at the Leader Dogs for the Blind school means a lot to people like Margaret Smith. Joshua makes it possible for her to live independently. But he is much more than a tool or a guide. Joshua is a





Margaret laughs as she tells him that if he steps on the impatiens she will swing him around her head by his tail. It is obvious as Joshua gambles around the yard and Margaret follows him with her ears, that there is a special bond between these two.

Margaret seldom leaves Joshua by himself. She says he is a one-person dog and mopes if she leaves him with friends for more than a few

It may be possible that Joshua has a sense of humor Margaret tells of how when they were out walking one day Joshua led her in an unusually wide circle around a sprinkler.

"Joshua hates water," she said, "I told him that he was being silly, the sprinkler wouldn't hurt him."

"So the next sprinkler we came to, he led me right through the edge of it, I got soaked. I reached down and he was completely dry. He led me at just the right distance so that only I would get wet."

Leader dogs are exempt from the laws that bar animals from places like restaurants. Unfortunately not everybody is aware of that exemption Margaret has occasionally had to explain to restaurant proprietors that they cannot exclude Joshua.

"Some people are very good about it. I have had

Some developing trends may reduce the cost of college education even more. The student population is decreasing and many colleges are streamlining curriculums to cut expenses. There are more work study programs available which allow students to pay their way through school. There also is increasing emphasis on living at home and local community colleges are beefing up curriculums to handle increased enrollments.

More companies are providing financial aid for children of their employes in the form of scholarships and low interest loans. And finally, the federal government may come up with some future tax incentives for families strapped with college tuition costs.

In addition to outright grants and scholarships based on need, CPAs say, there are many sources of low interest college loans. The federal government offers loans at seven percent with no ceiling on family income. Students can borrow repayment doesn't begin un-

Although you may qualify for considerable aid there will undoubtedly be a portion of the expense you will have to provide. If you are serious about sending your children to college, start planning and saving when the child is born or by the time he is in kindergarten.

If you start to save \$50 a month when the child is eight, even at 5.5 percent, it will add up to \$8,000 when he is 18 years old. Use term savings accounts with higher interest rates, say CPAs, and increase the amount along with the annual rate of in-

Custodian or trust accounts earn interest and provide a tax benefit. If such an account is opened in your child's name, he will pay the tax on any interest or dividends over \$1,000 a year at a lower rate than you would. When the child reaches the age of majority, however, he controls the money, so consider this when planning. Are you willing to give the money to him if he chooses not to go to college?

In the same vein you could make an interest-free loan to your child and he could invest the money and pay tax as much as \$2,500 a year and on the earnings at his lower tax rate. Giving your child appreciating stock which he could sell to pay for college is another idea. His tax on any capital gain would be less than yours, CPAs say. iod. 



# rime | ime for senior citizens

Quietly working since 1979, is a group called SOC: Seniors Onward for Change. Their purpose is to ascertain what the needs and desires are of older citizens residing in Grosse Pointe and Harper Woods and then to do something about them.

To this end, members of an SOC Task Force and representatives of other groups concerned with senior citizens recently gathered at a luncheon meeting at the Grosse Pointe War Memorial to discuss what progress had been made and what might be done in the future.

Louise TeWalt, SOC's president, expressed the reasons for organizing the

"The public has a mistaken idea that older people in the Grosse Pointes have no problems. This is based on the notion that everyone who lives here is affluent. That is not so. There are older residents here who are living on limited incomes. Coupled with inflation, they have many of the same problems that older citizens in other areas face.'

"As it is elsewhere, there are other problems besides financial ones," Mrs. TeWalt said. "There are health problems, mobility problems—people who can't get around as well-and there are transportation problems—people who can no longer drive—plus social needs, people who just want companionship.

In order to gather information on the concerns and needs of residents over 60 years of age in the Grosse Pointe and Harper Woods area, a questionnaire was designed. A total of 1,490 questionnaires were sent out. SOC members also went to homes and interviewed selected seniors and met with several senior clubs who filled out the questionnaires.

It was interesting to note that many people who were still employed responded that they were concerned about their own futures and were anxious that services would be available when they were needed.

A large number who answered said they owned their own home and lived alone. Fifty-four percent described themselves as physically inactive. They also expressed a desire to stay

in their home and have help to

SOC is currently sponsoring a project on minor home repairs and chores supported through an annual grant to the Grosse Pointe Harper Woods area by the Wayne County Office of Program Development and Coordination. This involves such tasks as the repair of leaky faucets and toilets; repair of windows and screens, replacement of base plugs and wall outlets; repair or replacement of concrete or brick stairs; cleaning gutters, fall yard cleanup, etc. Minor home repairs and maintenance are stressed and no major home repairs are made.

Mary Evelyn Self, talking on health and home care, highlighted the need for drug and nutrition education. She mentioned such aids as the medical awareness slides, which may be borrowed from Bon Secours Hospital, and how inexpensive but nutritional meals may be provided.

She was followed by Frances Schonenberg, who chaired the information and referral group. Mrs. Schonenberg, president of the League of Women Voters in Grosse Pointe, saw a need for a directory that would inform seniors where to seek help. A directory now in print, and available at city halls and libraries, lists all the available agencies. Mrs. Schonenberg thought that a card catalog of such agencies might be housed in the library for reference.

Woodburn Ross, reporting on housing, focused on the need for community support and the futility of building housing for seniors where it would be resented. He also discussed the possibility of using existing buildings or making use of alternative

A transportation report was made by Jon Austin of the Neighborhood Club, who explained the feasibility of Dial-a-Van, which has been tried in other communities.

"It is a very expensive operation,' explained Mr. Austin, because of high insurance rates. "It has worked in Flint because the city pays for the insurance. Right now, the best system seems to be one of recruiting friends and neighbors who are willing to pro-





# Did GOP move too far right?

its choice of its presidential nominee and its platform moved too far to the right is one of the intriguing questions that emerged from the party's national convention now winding down in Detroit.

Two other actions still to come at the time of this writing could influence opinions as to whether the party moved too far to the right. One is the selection of the vice-presidential nominee. The other is the presidential nominee's own acceptance speech which is expected to set the tone for the fall campaign. In both cases, overtures to the moderate Republicans could serve to offset earlier reactions indicating that the hardline conservatives are insisting on having things all their own way.

Just by staging the convention in Detroit, the Republicans responded to the appeals by National Committee Chairman William Brock and Gov. William Milliken of Michigan for the party to broaden its base. By holding the convention in Detroit, the GOP demonstrated a desire to seek support from blacks and union members who make up such a large proportion of the population but who seldom vote Republican. GOP leaders also insist their platform planks on inflation, employment and minorities will benefit these groups.

YET THE REAGAN forces that were clearly in command of the convention did not appear to be greatly interested in following up the Brock and Milliken initiative to broaden the party's base. Instead, the platform committee reflected Reagan's own positions by refusing to renew party's long-standing endorsement of the equal rights amendment, by calling for a constitutional amendment banning abortion and by taking an unusually severe anti-Soviet line in its defense and foreign policy plank. Following a states' right line, the platform even came out against a national 55-mile-an-hour speed limit.

The controversial ERA and abortion issues were highly publicized last week in platform hearings but less was reported about the defense plank that called for "a sustained defense expenditure sufficient to close the gap with the Soviets and ultimately reach the position of military superiority that the American people demand." In recent years, the GOP administrations of Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford have been satisfied with military parity with the USSR or a defense "sufficiency." Now the Reagan forces are advocating superiority over the Soviets, ap-

parently regardless of the cost. Similarly, the defense plank calls for shelving the Strategic Arms Limitation Treaty talks until "the security of the United States (is) assured by the funding and deployment of strong military forces sufficient to deter conflict at any level or prevail in battle should aggression occur." That statement not only carries the GOP beyond the stance of the Nixon and Ford administrations which continued the SALT talks but points

Both of these candidates, we suspect, will try to carve out middle-of-the-road positions that will contrast sharply with the GOP on controversial issues. So if the Republicans continue to stress their conservative views and show little interest in wooing middle-of-the-road voters, Reagan still could lose, even to a highly unpopular and vulnerable

vide rides for those who can't drive.' Comments by Margheretta Allar-dice, Commissioner, Michigan Commission on Service to Aging, referred to the need for education, rather than information and referral.

ly assigned to them by society. If the findings of SOC are acted upon, and it is their purpose to do all that they can to see that they are, both the perspective and the role of senior citizens in the Grosse Pointe and Harper Woods areas should be enlarged and improved.

Most of the available building lots have been utilized and only a small number of estates remain to be subdivided. The population of the Pointes has been aging as older residents have remained here while their children have grown up and left for jobs and careers elsewhere.

Yet for those who remain in the Pointes the levelling off of population ought to contribute to a better appreciation of the quality of life available here. True, some merchants may be hurt, there may even be fewer commercial services for Pointe residents and there will be less state and federal aid for Pointe governments. But we ought use this opportunity to accentuate the positive in the Pointes: the quality of life.

WHAT IS happening here merely reflects what is happening nationally and internationally. Between 1950 and 1979, Africa was the only continent showing a steady increase in its growth rate. North America, Europe, the Soviet Union and Australia all showed steady declines. World population still increased at a 1.7 percent rate between 1975 and 1979 but that still is down from the 1.9 percent rate for 1970 to 1975. And the United States, which didn't achieve the 100 million mark in population until about 1917, now appears to be levelling off at about 222 million.

The quality of life everywhere is endangered by threats to the environment, by the economic recession, by social change and by other factors in our complex society. Yet the Pointes still offer unusual opportunities for pleasant and rewarding living. The decline in population merely means that fewer people will have those opportunities. It also means that those who remain will have more room and time to enjoy themselves without as much pressure from others who also are seeking a better quality of life.



of the Mackinac Bridge, all three men immediately said "Yes!" And thought themselves very lucky.

Later, all three agreed that if they'd known

what they were getting into, they'd probably have chickened out. Here is Gordon, describing the experience:

"First, we climbed through an opening, four Electrical Engineering at feet above the floor of the bridge, only two feet spring commencement cerehigh and a foot-and-a-half-wide, into the tower. In total darkness we threaded our way through another such opening, and finally into a tiny elevator. It was half the size of a phone booth and would only hold three people.

"Ed went with us, so our guide, Abraham, took Dale and me first. There was one small light (Continued on Page 14)







of the tower go down as we went up.

"Three-and-a-half minutes later, we climbed out near the top. I followed Abraham, who warned me to watch my step-the floor was a long way down. As I threaded my way through the opening, I cautiously reached out with one foot . . . but couldn't touch anything.

"I couldn't see anything, either, and it was a weird feeling. There was a manhole in the floor; I found out later that if the elevator doesn't work, you can go through this opening and climb down a steel ladder."

Offering up a prayer that the elevator would continue to work, Gordon followed instructions to step to the side. There was a spot on either side of the opening wide enough for a foot. Carefully, Gordon put the manhole behind him and proceeded through the next bulkhead.

About six feet farther on, a little light filtered through from the top deck. Abraham, who had gone ahead, called down to say he was going down to bring up the other two—how he did this, he didn't say, but I still had a steel ladder to climb, about 20 feet high, straight up, to get to the surface." So, as far as Gordon was concerned, how Abraham got down was Abraham's problem.

"Finally, I stuck my head out the top and saw the flat cap of the tower. It was a breath-taking experience—and at that point, I didn't have much

"I crawled out and sat down because I was afraid to stand up. Later, I did walk around a bit." For a few minutes, until Dale appeared, Gordon was all alone on top of the world. The tower seems to have a honeycomb steel interior, with cutouts to crawl through, he reports. The top is 550 feet above the water.

#### Recycling Waste Benefits Lakes

Recycling and reusing waste is one way to avoid pollution of the Great Lakes from hazardous materials, according to the Great Lakes

Basin Commission. The commission, a regional vater resources planning ag. ency, has recommended that the Great Lakes region's industries expand their recycling of waste products to help keep hazardous wastes

out of the .akes and tributaries. The recommendation is part of a regional strategy to manage hazardous materials Such materials "are the greatest environmental threat to the Great Lakes today and an enormous economic problem for the region," said Commission Chairman Lee

Botts. The commission's newsletter, the Great Lakes Comingnicator, reports this month that recovery is often profitable. For example, solvents, such as paint thinner and dry cleaning fluids, can be cleaned and reused repeatedly. Precious metals are recovered from industrial wastes.

The Eastman Kodak Co., for example, recovers silver from used developing solutions other photographic wastes. Non-precious metals could be recovered from waste sludges as metal prices increase. Such sludges include byproducts of manufacturing car bumpers, bathroom fixtures, and other electroplated goods made in the region. Motor oil can be re-refined

to its original purity for re-

use in engines, saving mil-

lions of gallons of oil a year.

Or it can be reprocessed into

lower-quality oil for fuel Already, seven of the eight Great Lakes states (excluding Pennsylvania; have at least one official to coordinate statewice oil recovery Resource recovery may even be a key to destroying PCBs (polychlorinated biphenyls), for years a serious and unsolved problem in the Great Lakes region.
