Hearing set on bagging **Park** leaves

Along with all the cider and candy apples fall brings, it also brings leaves-lots of them. Do you want to bag your own leaves this fall or would you prefer the city sweep them awav?

The Park Council would like the answer to that question when it meets for a public hearing Oct. 13 to consider amending the city's current garbage and rubbish ordinance.

BUT BEFORE residents raise their rakes in anger about the possibility of bagging their own leaves, city administrators point out an amended ordinance could save the community thousands of dollars each year.

Earlier this year, administrators warned of such a possibility when preparing the 1980-81 budget to cut down on escalating costs for city services, including leaf pickup.

Residents presently rake leaves to the curbside for later pickup by the city's vacuum machine. The leaves are then taken to Three Mile Park where they are stored usually until spring before disposal at the Grosse Pointe Refuse Authority in Clinton Township.

While bagging leaves may be a buden for older persons and the with large property lots, administrators also point out that the leaf problem in Grosse Pointe Park is getting to be as much operational as economic for the city.

Many of the channels offered by the cable firm originate in New York or Washington, D.C. and are sent as far as 22,500 miles to a stationary satellite over the equator and then bounced back and caught in this dish at the 7 - Mack shopping center in the Woods. The signals are then fine tuned and fed through coaxial cable to local viewers. See story below.

ONE SUCCESSFUL program threat ened with financial extinction is FLEC's Alcohol Awareness Program. Community residents and FLEC

The students then present drug awareness programs to fifth and sixta graders in local schools. "It's very successful, and typical of the type of services we provide," said Dir. Reedus. "Last year alone we educated 1,300 students this way. Programs like this will be missed if FLEC goes ander.

The new fund raising season for FLEC began Wednesday, Oct. 1. FLEC plans to approach various foundations for grants, plus will gear up to seek help from local city councils.

"Our juvenile counseling is up for review and evaluation in November," said Ms. Reedus. "We hope to approach the cities for help after that's taken care of."

On Oct. 1, plans to start "FLEC 66" will get under way. About 2,500 citizens will be contacted directly and asked to donate \$1 for every year since FLEC was formed. If successful, FLEC should raise \$35,000. All contributions are tax deductible.

"I don't think the people of the Pointe will let us down," said Dir. Reedus. "Any donation is an investment in the young adults of this



GP Cable finds bugs in lines

Revised census shows 12% drop

The U.S. census bureau released "final preliminary" pop-ulation statistics last week that show an overall loss of 7,123 people from four Grosse Pointes since 1970.

The 1980 population of the Pointes, according to the bureau, is 51,641 compared to the 1970 figure of 58,-764-a 12.1 percent loss.

The figures issued last week are slightly higher for the Pointes than a tentative count that was made public in July. The earlier count showed a 12.4 percent drop in the Pointes' population. Those figures were revised up, based on further information supplied by local city managers and extra field work by the census bureau.

ONLY ONE OF THE Pointes, the Shores, showed an increase in population during the last decade. According to the bureau, the Shores' population grew by 3.4 percent, to 3,005 people.

The remaining cities showed population losses, ranging from 9.8 per-cent in the Farms to 15 percent in the Park. The City is reported to show a 11 percent decline and the Woods a 14 percent drop.

The only city to formally dispute

• City, from 6,637 in 1970 to 5,910, an 11 percent drop.

• Farms from 11,701 to 10,556, 9.8 percent decrease.

• Park, from 15,641 to 13,297, a 15 percent decrease.

• Woods, from 21,878 to 18,812, a 14 percent decrease.

• Shores, from 2,907 to 3006, a 3.4 percent increase.

The loss in population in the Pointes is generally attributed to the decline in family size and the lack of open, developable land in the community.

Repair crews respond to complaints

It would take considerable less manhours to pick up bagged leaves than it would for the city to use its vacuum machine, says City Manager John Crawford

"SOMETIMES IT'S difficult to vacuum all the leaves in a reasonable period of time, especially if the leaves come down all at once," Crawford said.

Last year the Park paid \$6,000 to contract an outside company to help get leaves off street curbs. Another \$2.500 was spent on cleaning catch basins. In addition to those costs, the city's vacuum machine is on its last legs and would cost at least \$50,000 to replace.

"Our present process is very costly. Our tonnage is greatly increased at the incinerator because the leaves are wet. It costs more to burn water," Crawford said.

New principals appointed at **Defer and Richard schools**

The public schools announced organizational changes last Friday that sent new principals to two Grosse Pointe elementary schools.

Jay Flowers, principal at Richard Elementary for four years, took over duties at Defer Elementary on Monday He replaces Dr. Sally Bell who resigned her post last month to become curriculum director for the 1,-800-student Park County School District near Yellowstone National Park in Wyoming.

Taking over at Richard is Dr. Claire Basco who has been assistant principal at Pierce Middle School for six years No decision has been made yet about Dr. Basco's replacement, according to a school spokesman.

Flowers, 44, came to Richard from Kalamazon public schools in 1976 and had requested reassignment to a larger school, according to Deputy

Superintendent James Hoeh Defer's current enrollment is 472 students, Richard's is 361.

Flowers received his B.A. degree from Central Michigan University and M.A. at Western Michigan and is currently working toward a Ph.D. at University of Michigan. He is a former elementary school teacher.


Dr. Basco, 49, received her B.A. degree at Marygrove College, her M.A. and Ph.D. at Wayne State. She has been in school administration for six years and has worked as an elementary and special education teacher.

Dr. Basco and Flowers both live in Grosse Pointe.

The appointments were the result of an "internal search" for candidates. limited to current school system employes, according to Hoeh, Several teachers and other administrators also applied for the posts, he said.

SOME OF THE problems can be traced to "quality control" of cable installation done by firms sub-contracted by Grosse Pointe Cable TV, Reynolds said. Several cases of loose cable connections causing signal leakage have been discovered and corrected, Reynolds said.

Sometimes people themselves generate the problem by moving their sets and loosening the cable or reattaching their roof-top antenna to improve the picture. The latter actually makes the antenna a transmitter of the cable signal which can then distort reception on non-cable TV

the census bureau's findings i Woods, which showed a loss of 3,066 (from 21,878 to 18,812) persons during the last decade, according to the government.

But Woods City Administrator Chester Petersen has presented a challenge to those figures, documenting loss of only 100 to 200 people and a final count of close to 21,800 for 1980.

Petersen said he could back up his claim with voter registration, water bill, park permit and tax records.

Petersen mailed his formal challenge to the bureau last week-about eight weeks after the deadline for submitting such documents, according to census officials. Nevertheless, they

they had to enforce the city's marina "bumping" regulation for renewing boat well permits.

But a two-year wait for some 30 persons to dock their boats in the wells is long enough and has prompted administrators to put the 20-year-old regulation into effect.

LAST WEEK THE Grosse Pointe Park Council reluctantly gave the goahead for bumping to begin this week. The council also approved between a 25 to 50 percent rate increase for the wells. The new rate will take effect next April 15 when the boating scason begins.

When and who will be buinped out of the piers will depend solely on the number of persons wishing a particular size well, according to City Manager John Crawford.

At the moment, 30 applicants are on the waiting list and out of those three are eligible for a 28 foot well. 22 for a 35 foot well, three for a 45 foot well and two for a 55 foot well.

Those boaters presently docked in 29, 25 and 40 foot wells will not be affected in the bumping process.

Crawford said residents who have been docked in wells year after year since 1960 may very well be bumped.

"Many long-time residents in the community, having a boat in the marina as early as 1959, would be affected by the implementation of the marina rules and regulations," Craw-

The city is presently polling persens on the waiting list to determine who wants what size well. Anyone on the list who doesn't respond within 15 days after contact, may be dropped from the list, according to marina regulations.

The bumping provision plainly states that when there is not a sufficient number of wells available to accommodate all applicants, those who have been on the waiting list for two years or more are eligible for a boat well.

We really never had to enforce the provision before." Crawford said.

When the bumping process begins, the Park will be the first Grosse Pointe community to do so. Boaters in the City, Farms, Woods and Shores







Congressional candidates Caputo and Hertel meet in debate

Inflation, unemployment, and national defense were the main topics of last Tuesday's debate between 14th District Congressional candidates Vic Caputo and Dennis Hertel. But the candidates' most aggressive sparring was over Hertel's attendance and voting record in the state legislature.



A random phone survey by the Grosse Pointe News of 11 cable and non-cable viewers in the cable area showed that seven had experienced some reception problems in the last two weeks. Problems ranged from "funny lines" through the picture to the complete loss of signal in the middle of a movie.

Most said that picture quality was inconsistent - some said they had never seen such clear TV reception while others rated the images as poor. Some complained about slow service by Grosse Pointe Cable TV but most -seemed to believe that the company is making an effort to correct prob--lems

Reynolds said Grosse Pointe Cable currently has about 1,200 subscribers.



Republican Caputo wasted no time in criticizing Democrat State Rep. Hertel for missing roll call votes on the state budget issues in the Legislature that day. Caputo added that Hertel missed one third of the votes in the legislature's spring session and 67 percent of the votes so far in the fall session.

Hertel countered by citing his 94.64 percent average attendance record during his six years as a representative for the 12th District, Hertel said he's also voted in 87.77 percent of the roll calls

the odor of the stored leaves at the Three Mile park. There are also prob-lems with vandals who set fire to leaves awaiting pickup. The fire de-partment answered 179 such calls last year.

In 1969 the council did amend the rubbish ordinance and ordered residents to bag leaves. After considerable citizen protest, the city rescinded the amendment. At that time residents said they would be willing to pay higher taxes to have better city services.

"I'm proud of my record," Hertel said adding that it is one of the best voting records in the legislature.

In six years, he's voted on over 6,500 issues and missed 500 votes, Hertel said.

As House Judiciary Committee chairman, he's devoted much of his time to meetings off the House floor, Hertel added

CAPUTO SAID HERTEL was shrouding his record in a "lot of doubletalk" and added that Hertel's six year record in the legislature was an "abomination."

Hertel countered that out of 110 representatives he is one of three that have had their names on 10 bills passed this year.

Both candidates fended attacks but neither was able to out score the other by the debate's end.

If the amended ordinance is passed, the Park will join residents in the Farms who have been bagging their leaves since state law banned leaf burning.

Farms City Manager Andrew Bre-mer said while the process has been "extremely efficient," it has also cut costs by at least one-third.

Residents in the City, Woods and Shores currently have leaves picked up by the city.

"Actually, citizens are not satisfied with what the city is doing now in terms of leaf pickup. They could do a much better job than the city can," Crawford said.

Their responses were relatively low key, Hertel was cool and calmly responded to questions often citing his bills banning double bottom tankers and mandatory sentences for gun crimes as worthy accomplishments. Caputo's television broadcasting background showed in his animated and sometimes dramatic responses.

Hertel said his legislative experience directly relates to how he will work in Congress.

"I will fight for mandatory sentencing (for gun crimes) on the national level," said Hertel adding that crime is the biggest problem in his district.

The other big problems are unemployment and inflation, to which diversifying industry is a solution, Hertel said. The recently passed Port Authority Act bearing his name could provide that diversity by helping to develop Detroit's shipping industry, Hertel said.

Caputo said that in 22 years of broadcasting he has "seen little evidence that professional politicians see how much they've let people down."

His goals are to get people working again by helping industry create and keep jobs through giving tax breaks to new businesses, Caputo said,

Hertel said he was also concerned about industry and favored accelerating depreciation on industrial equipment to encourage its replacement and boost productivity. Increasing the interest rates can also help the economy by encouraging people to save, Hertel said.

BOTH CANDIDATES agreed that there is much waste in government spending that could be cut. That money could be used to bolster the social services, Caputo said.

Hertel said the key to improving national defense is to increase armed forces pay scales to attract more young people and keep experienced people.

Both candidates opposed reinstat ing the draft although Caputo said he could see some kind of national service which gave people the choice of working outside or within the U.S.

When asked how the U.S. should approach the relationship between foreign auto industries and free trade, both candidates favored different hard line approaches.

Hertel said the U.S. should retaliate for Japan's dumping of goods in our country. "We should have started talking tougher with Japan before," Hertel said

Caputo said he was intrigued by the "macho" attitude toward threatening Japanese auto makers and favored more "restraint, reason and appeal to common interests.'

"We provide for Japan's national defense . . . if they continue to dump (products in the U.S.) we can cut back on their national defense," Caputo said.

WHEN ASKED ABOUT his stance on taxation, Caputo said he supports an immediate 10 percent tax cut which is not inflationary but "removes dollars that the elitists in Washington can play with.'

Hertel said he has never voted for a tax increase on the state level and favors elimination of taxes on savings below \$50,000 He also favors tax indexing which can prevent inflation from overtaking pay increases, he said.

that he supports it while Caputo said he philosophically disagrees with extending ratification time for it. "Women, children and unborn children have equal rights under the law," Caputo said. Perhaps the most interesting question of the night came from a man in the audience who proposed a hypothetical situation in which the November presidential election is close enough to go to the House of Representatives for a decision. In this blessed age (think about that -any period of time is blessed if you're still around to enjoy it) when people are living longer and enjoying it more, it is not uncommon for some, for whom work is fun and leisure a drag, to opt for second careers.

However it is not every day that a woman retires at 73 and reenters the world of work at 75. This is what Dr. Olga Knopf, a practicing psychia-trist and teacher choose to do.

During her two years of retirement, she volunteered her services to the members of a large day-care center as a counselor. Because of her work there and her previous experience, she was invited to join the staff of the Institute of Psychiatry at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York as supervisor and instructor in geriatrics.

In her book "Successful Aging" (Viking) she writes:

"Staff members had observed that some of the aged patients were reluctant to talk to young residents, and they felt that these patients might prefer to talk to a contemporary. This is how I received my appointment, because of my age rather than in spite of it."

DR. KNOPF HAD never done this particular kind of work before but her experiences led her to conclude that much too little is known about the problems of what she calls the near-aged (65 to 75), who are in fairly good health and still functioning in life. She became anxious to evaluate her own life and others in the light of this new position and thus provide some answers to the problems that confront older citizens.

She discovered that as long as an older person is lucky enough not to be afflicted with illnesses that are painful, aging is not noticeable until it has become far advanced. That is why those fortunate ones say that they do not feel any different than when they were young.

"How one deals with the effects of passing years," says Dr. Knopf, "can make him old ahead of time or can keep him young and spry."

The first signs of aging," she goes "are often ignored; later on coson. metics, physical exercise, special diets are resorted to but if they are overdone, they accelerate aging because they demand the expenditure of more

physical and psychic energy than can be restored through rest and relaxation.

An important point in successful aging, Dr. Knopf contends, is to accept the limitations that come with years. She cites the philosophy of a 76-yearold woman as the sensible acceptance of reality. "I don't mind getting older. I have fewer responsibilities, and I don't have to prove anything any-more to anybody."

ANOTHER STEP IN self acceptance is the enjoyment of physical comfort. "Take a nap before going out in the evening," she advises. "Wear comfortable shoes. Don't do things you don't want to do. Make your motto: 'I do not have to.'"

According to her thinking, older people should exert themselves in proportion to their body's ability to restore energies that are spent from day to day. She insists that this is not self indulgence. It simply substitues one set of values for another that is more workable at this stage of life.

One value which is difficult to relinquish is independence yet everyone needs to lean on someone at some time in life. This need for seniors is not a new manifestation but only a new realization that this fact exists. Dr. Knopf believes that one of the signs of psychological maturity is the ability to depend on and be dependent upon in return.

"Dependency is more idealogical than real. We all know that in order to feel secure, we do not require actual assistance as the knowledge that help is there in case of need," she says.

Helping others as well as receiving help need not always be on an indi-vidual basis. Many older people find satisfaction and a sense of self-worth in worthwhile causes. Certainly there is no more worthy cause for older citizens than their own. There are many groups actively campaigning for better legislature, housing and nutrition where numbers make the difference in effectiveness. THE RELATIVE STRENGTH of

older citizens is large and growing. Politicians and leaders of special interest groups are paying attention to their voices especially since the interests of the aged are not altered by subcultures, political associations and (Continued on Page 15-A)

he time to place blame for the energy crisis is past. We must look ahead, and concentrate our efforts on the options available to us.

No single new source of energy can supply all our future needs. None will be easy or cheap. Yet we must focus our efforts on developing sources that will not soon run dry, and on sources that do not subject us to international political blackmail.

Solar power, bio-mass and synthetic fuels are such alternatives. They are technically feasible now, but continued research is necessary to resolve remaining engineering and economic problems. It is estimated that widespread use of gasohol, once considered impractical, may save the United States one million barrels of oil per day by 1985.

Our nation has vast coal reserves. Besides increased direct use of coal, incentives must be provided to encourage conversion of coal into natural gas. Fifty-five percent of America's

households now depend on diminishing natural gas resources for heating and cooking, and coal conversion research must be accelerated to meet that requirement.

Oil shale is another abundant source of energy that is presently under-utilized. Much of America's oil shale lies beneath land in the West already owned by the federal government. Further, providing capital for the huge start-up costs of oil shale mining and refining operations is one area where the government could effectively provide assistance to energy development.

While I am against oil companies reaping huge profits as a result of deregulation, I do feel that private industry is better qualified than government to develop new energy sources. They should be required to reinvest their profits into research, development and exploration. Whatever is not reinvested should then be taxed.

The American people have already lowered gasoline consumption more than 10% over the past year. Further emphasis on conservation is absolutely essential to our country's energy program.

One solution that clearly does not work is increased government interference in the energy industry. Virtually all of the legislation advanced by the Democratic majority in Congress creates more paperwork, more regulation, more bureaucracy, more taxes, and more disruption of the free market by the federal government. I do not believe those approaches create more energy.

By the end of 1979, the Department of Energy had spent about 20 billion dollars over its two year life, paying its 18,000 bureaucrats an average of \$22,000 apiece per year. I fail to see how you and I, as taxpayers and consumers, have been benefited. It's time for our government to help, not hinder. private development of new energy.



Down the drain with Tisch

Tax reform by popular referendum seldom achieves its purpose. The reason is that tax problems in a state such as Michigan are so complicated and have such far-reaching effects that they cannot be solved by any single proposal. Yet the claim made by sponsors of the Tisch Tax Cut Proposal is that if the public will adopt Proposal D in November the state's tax problem will be solved. That is simply nonsense.

The Tisch plan supposedly would roll back increases in home, farm and business property taxes to their 1978 levels and then cut property taxes in half while supposedly requiring continued funding of local government programs from taxes collected at the state level. But even if passage of Tisch would reduce property taxes, what would it do to essential services at the state and local levels?

It would, in brief, raise havoc with funding of most public services in the state. It would mean reductions in general health care, state police protection and mental health programs as well as higher education,

state parks and other public services. EVEN THE GROSSE POINTE communities, not among the least affluent in the state, would lose more than \$4 million in property tax revenue next year if the Tisch proposal were adopted. Local governments such as those in the Pointes would lose revenues for police protection, sewage treatment, road maintenance and other programs financed by the property taxes which would be sharply cut back under the Tisch

plan. d trim spending to aid Tisch

would another \$500 million or more in federal income taxes have to be sent to Washington. The state, which already receives less federal money than it pays to Washington and has one of the lowest ratios of return in the nation; would get even less federal money because of its inability to afford matching payments for federal grants.

The tax revolt has become nationwide and its popularity is understandable. People are especially hard pressed to pay increasing taxes during a period when the cost of living is outrunning increases in income. And it is easy to say that certain services and programs should be cut-when you are not the person benefitting from such programs and services. And yet cuts across the board and elimination of programs to aid the needy, the aged and the unfortunate would be required under the ham-handed effects of the Tisch proposal.

True enough, Michigan has been deep in a recession that has hurt almost every resident in one way or another. But the cure for the illness is not to amputate a good right arm but to make a diagnosis and then prescribe the medicine required to bring the patient back to health. 

A fair guess on the census

It is understandable that Mayor Young and Detroit city officials are pleased at the federal court ruling that in effect would require the U.S. Census Bureau to estimate the 1980 census undercount and add it to the final population figures. After all, the more residents that can be counted in Detroit, the greater will be the city's aid from state and federal governments and the better the chances will be the city will not lose representation in the state Legislature and in Congress when the state is reapportioned on the basis of the 1980 census.

Furthermore, it no doubt is true that there is a greater undercount of people in the inner cities than in the small towns, the suburbs and the farms of the country. The problem is that nobody really knows how much of an undercount occurs in each of the big cities or in all of them taken together. The number of people missed by the census depends on many factors, including the desire of people to be counted, the difficulty of reaching all the residents and the efficiency of the enumerators. Those factors, too, vary in importance from city to city,

YET IF AN ESTIMATE now has to be used to offset the undercount, it certainly is possible that the estimate will be too large in some cases.

So an undercount could become an overcount. Since there is just so much state and federal money available for grants to cities, and the number of legislative and congressional seats is fixed, that could mean more money and political power for the

big cities—and less for other areas, including small towns, suburban communities and farming areas.

So should the Pointes seek an estimate of their undercount, too? Well, the Woods has done so on the grounds the enumerators missed some of the Woods residents. And perhaps a few were missed in the other Pointes. But the population of the Pointes as a whole is declining because of the increasing age of many Pointe residents and the lower birthrate. So the census count in the Poinies probably is quite accurate even though it shows a 12.1 percent decline in the last decade.

"We call it the busy woman's cookbook. Face it: you could spend five hours a day cooking, or you could do other things." Some days, five hours of kitchen time is rather nice. Other enjoy their kitchen time both ways.

The Gift Department . . . at the Notre Dame Kamp Shanks Louis? All you need is foil to cover. Sprinkle 1-2 tablespoons of the dry onion soup mix over each shank. Wrap securely and place in a pan for easy handling. Bake at 325 degrees for two hours. Open foil, remove shank to plate, discard drip-

No longer active in the Grosse Pointe Braille Club ("I retired when Joe retired"), she earned both her literary and music certification.

She loves to cook. "If I have a hob-by, that's it." Among her personal recipe file contributions to "Gourmet Presto" is Ponder's Pie, named after the college roommate who introduced her to it. And it's as easy as pie: take one can Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk and combine thoroughly with ¼ cup lemon juice. Fold in one 8-oz. tub Cool Whip, thawed. Fold in one 20-oz. can crushed pineapple, welldrained, and three-fourths cup chopped pecans. Divide mixture and turn into two baked, frozen pie shells.

Pop the pies in the freezer or refrigerator overnight, eat them the next day. If you've popped them in the freezer, remember to take them out in time to defrost. The two pies will serve 12 to 16 people. "I always have one in the freezer and-one out," Charline says. The out one doesn't
