Poole was reported dead on arrival at 6 07 am, at St John Hospital after being shot four times with a 38 caliber revolver by Roger Stevens of 1039 Sunningdale. Wo od a Emergency Medical Technicians were called to the home around dawn by Stevens, who told police he shot Poole after the boy allegedly threatened him. No charges have been filed against

#### School Board okays '81 budget

The Board of Education wrapped up year-end business Monday evening, approving a new S33 million budget, without setting a new tax rate, selling one of its oldest buildings, and saying goodbye to its superintendent and one board memoer.

The June 22 meeting was the last for trustee Laurance Harwood, who's served on the board since 1973, and for Supt William Coats, who will assume a position at University of Michigan next month after five years in Grosse Pointe.

Harwood was replaced in the recent election by Dr Ernest Buechler, a Detroit elementary school principal, Harwood did not run for re election Coats' replacement is Dr Kenneth Brummel, from Weisport, Coan, who'll begin his new job next week.

Both Herwood and Coats were pre-sented with resolutions of apprecia-tion from board members.

Grosse Pointe Park officials are reviewing plans for a six-acre S9 million condominual development along East Jeffer-son Avenue at the site of the Morrison estate, between Bishop Road and Ellair Place





### Meet the 'Duke' of Earl

Every occupation has its unsung hero-the quiet guy who works hard, does his job correctly and goes unnoticed. That is, until something important pops up and only he can handle

For all the Pointe police and fire departments, and those in Harper Woods, that guy is Earl Perrine. Earl, 59, is chief radio technician for all six cities. His task is to keep all the radio equipment in perfect working order, and he's good at it.

Earl works in the rear of the Farms Police garage. From there, in a workshop straight out of "Star Wars," he keeps an electronic look-out for

"Our 1981 budget is \$73,000, plus we've easily got over \$200,000 worth of equipment in here," said Earl. we service 98 mobile radios, 85 portables and 16 remote consoles from here. This workshop includes two main base stations for the Pointes, plus a standby. It keeps me, and my assistant Ralph Binge, pretty busy."

The firemen nicknamed him "Duke," after the song "Duke of Earl," and he's been with the department since April, 1968. He accepted the position after retiring from 26 years as an officer in the Army, where he worked in the signal corps and in missile electronics.

children. Earl tries not to take any of his work home with him, "Besides, my workshop at home is such a mess. I just can't face it," he said. "I spend so much time here that it just doesn't pay to work in both locations."

"So much time here" is right. Earl often works two to three days straight in his shop, stopping only to eat and sleep. "Well, I live in Utica, and with the price of gas, it just doesn't make sense to drive back and forth. There's always so much work, and I'd often end up working late at night, so that it just made more sense to stay over. Now it's sort of a

It's one habit the cops and firemen appreciate. "Another reason I'm dedicated is because I have a responsibility to these guys," he said. "I like them all, and I'm just grateful I don't have to do their jobs.'

Earl's own day is difficult enough With advances in electronics breaking faster and faster, he finds it tough to keep abreast of the newest de-

"The latest radios are really com-plicated," he said. "With new cir-cuitry and micro-chip electronics. they're almost computers instead of

Earl foresees police radios of the future equipped with TV screens to help police and fire departments do their jobs. "I understand they already

larger cities, plus some Detroit cars already have radios that provide printed read outs. That's amazing," he said.

"As energy becomes more expensive, the police car of the future become smaller," he added. "And the radios will become smaller right along with them. It's the new

Earl also pulls double duty at the Farms with his silk screen designs. He manufactures the logos that appear on all Farms police cars, fire trucks and DPW vehicles.

"It's something I like to fool around with when I have the time," he said.



### Citizen help needed to prevent crime

When about 50 area residents were seated, three guest speakers, Farms Police Chief Robert Ferber, Detroit Police Inspector James Humphries and Farmington Hills Sgt. Dick Murphy took to the large semi-circular sofa, made themselves comfortable and began the informal, but informing discussion on suburban crime.

Chief Ferber got things rolling with some facts about crime in general and some figures he quoted from former U.S. Attorney General Ramsey Clark profiling the typical

According to Clark's figures for 1960 to 1969, arrests of persons 18 years old and under were up 100 percent with 16 year olds arrested most frequently. The figures also indicated that two thirds of all arrests for serious crimes in the U.S. involved persons under the age of 21 and that four out of five crimes are committed by repeaters whose first offense occurred during their teen years,

The old maxim that goes something like, "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure," was the general theme of last week's Third Thursday Forum on crime 28 percent of all arrests involved residents of the Farms and 32 percent residents of other Pointe communities,

In conclusion he said, "Crime is primarily a local problem," and then turned the floor over to Sgt. Dick Murphy of Farmington Hills.

Sgt. Murphy echoed Chief Ferber's point, saying, "crimes are committed by local residents." Referring to his Farmington Hills community, he said, "I've seen a steady incline in juvenile arrests, including females. If you want to cut crime in your neighborhood, know where your children are.'

"You, as a community, must say enough is enough," Murphy added. "We as police officers can't do the entire job. We need the help of the citizen."

Crime prevention programs he has seen implemented Farmington Hills include Neighborhood Watch and Operation Identification which have caused crime to drop there by 43 percent, he said. While some residents were taking steps to cut crime, others were not doing their part according to Murphy. He said some people fail to report crimes committed by juveniles, allowing them to get away with as many as a dozen offences in some cases before ever being arrested.

Detroit Police Inspector James Humphries picked up where Murphy left off, "In 1980, there were 13 million crimes reported in the U.S., but two or three times more than that went unreported," he said.

Humphries stressed the point that cohesiveness and communication between neighbors is the key to preventing crime. "People who stand up for themselves aren't afraid of youths committing crimes," he said.







Don't underestimate us, hear These are not bare and lean years We're better than we ever were Just call us "Super Seniors."

It's not Whitman or James Whitcomb Reilly or even Edgar Guest but it is a poetic expression of one person's pride in being an older citizen. This little verse came out of a

course called "Creative Expression" taught in Durham, N.C., and sponsored by the Durham Arts Council and Durham Technical Institute.

The class was made up of senior citizens who gathered under the leadership of Ellen Johnston-Hale twice a week. The members felt that the term senior citizens did not convey the vitality and energy they possessed and coined the designation "Super

Most of them, before joining the class, didn't know they could write poetry. They thought a poem had to rhyme or contain elegant phrases. They didn't know that some of the thoughts they expressed to the group were poetic. They didn't realize that as they shared their thoughts, feelings, experiences and memories sincerely and honestly, they were expressing themselves in a poetic manner. Patiently, Mrs. Johnston-Hale broke down the barriers and overcame the "I'm not a poet" syndrome. To establish a sense of openness, she

shared with them her own feelings about being a school teacher. She read them poems she had written about those feelings. She shared with them poems written about school children, how it felt to be 13, dumb in math, or the hurt of being the fattest girl in the fifth grade.

GRADUALLY THE class opened up and began to see what a poem can do. They found it could bring out in the open thoughts and memories long forgotten and how it would with you, and if you listen to or read poems how you could come to understand yourself and others better.

They discovered that writing poetry could be therapeutic and give you a sense of accomplishment. It could make you more observant and apcreative urge.

These Super-Seniors, these 70 and 80-year old people showed me what it is like to grow old with grace. They made us feel young and free again and encouraged us to let out the fun-loving child in us."

She tells how some hobbled down steps or were aided by a cane or a friend. Some could not see well. Some help people to understand how it is had trouble hearing. But through their joy, their inner vitality, their strength, they made everyone try a little harder to accept and like themselves, share feelings and spread joy about being alive.

Detroit also issued the highest total number of construction permits, 928; replacing Farmington Hills, which topped 1979 figures. Detroit ranked first with multiple family unit permits, issuing 915; while Avon Township issued the largest number of single family per-

Impact of the decline in regional issuance from 1979 to 1980 is most evident when net figures are examined. (The net total is derived by subtracting total demolition permits from total building permits issued.) A regional net total of 4,697 permits was recorded for 1980, compared to 15,847 in 1979, a decrease of 70 percent for the year. Detroit accounted for 74 percent of the 5,865 demolitions in 1980.

### Firms are experimenting with two-way cable

Imagine applauding or booing Johnny Carson's jokes with a button while watching TV in your living room. Or voting for the candidate of your choice in the 1988 presidential election-without leaving home.

These are only two of the fascinating possibilities opening up with the advent of two-way cable systems.

One-way cable systems offering a wide range of television programming are being installed throughout the Pointes. Yet, the same line that brings that clear picture into the living room can just as easily transmit information from the home to a receiver.

FOR EXAMPLE, a smoke detector can be connected to the cable line. In the event of a fire, the smoke detector would send a signal to the fire department. The same can be done with intrusion alarms to the police station and medical alarms to the

Grosse Pointe Cable plans to offer some of these services to Pointers as options to the regular cable service as early as 1982.

The first tests involved remote water meter reading using Bell Telephone lines. Once each month the water service of 24 homes in the City was automatically read by a computer at Datavision Inc. The computer then automatically billed the water customers The advantage of remote meter reading is that, in the long run, it is much less expensive than manually reading each meter. In theory, this cost reduction would be reflected in smaller water bills to the customer.

The first tests were successful according to Datavision Inc. President Maurice Hogan, of the Farms, Datavision, Inc. has since run tests reading meters in the City using the cable lines recently installed by Grosse Pointe Cable.

In addition to the remote meter reading tests, Datavision Inc. has begun testing fire, intrusion, and medical alert systems that are routed through the Grosse Pointe Cable lines to the Grosse Pointe Cable "head end" located at the main office at Mack and Seven Mile. TWO OPERATORS are on duty 24 hours monitoring the terminal printout that results from an alarm being tripped. The operators note the location and type of alarm that was sounded. The computer provides the operator with the telephone numbers of the local fire and police stations and hospital. Then, depending on the type of alarm, the operator immediately contacts the right people for

The current system also supplies the operator with two additional telephone numbers of the customer's choice, say, the customer's phone number at work or the phone number of a neighbor. The operators call these numbers and inform the parties that an alarm has sounded,

Each time the computer receives an alarm it prints out a copy of the time, location and type of alarm. This printout is then stored in a firenroof safe for a permanent record.

Hogan said that the monitor service is expected to cost the customer \$3 a month for each type of alarm beyond the cost of installation.

The meter reading, fire, intrusion, and medical alert monitoring systems are only the beginning.

According to Hogan, in a few years Datavision Inc. may be supplying softwear and data banks to consumers with home computer systems including, for example, programs to help determine correct income tax.
