Gandelot is reelected school board president

At its annual organizational meeting Monday night, the Board of Education reelected president Jon Gandelot to a second term and welcomed Grosse Pointe's new superintendent of schools into office.

Attorney Gandelot, a board member since 1978, has served as the board's treasurer and vice-president. Serving as vice-president over the seven-member board in the 1981-82 school year will be Trustee Ronald Dalby, who failed to capture the president post from Gandelot after his name was placed in nomination by Trustee Joan Hanpeter.

Reelected to their posts as board secretary and treasurer were Catherine Brierly and Mrs. Hanpeter, respectively.

IT WAS THE first board meeting for incoming superintendent Kenneth Brummel, who remarked that although he had only been in office for 10 days, he could see that "this is clearly a quality school system."

Brummel, 46, was former superintendent of schools in Westport, Conn., and was the board's choice of more than 100 applicants to replace outgoing superintendent William Coats, who accepted a post with University of Michigan's School of Education.

It was also the first meeting for new trustee Ernest Buechler, an elementary principal with the Detroit Public School System. He ran unopposed in the school's June 8 election to fill the seat of retiring trustee Laurence Harwood, who decided to step down after eight years on the board.

After he was sworn in Monday

night, Buechler said jokingly, "I'd like to thank the 317 people who supported me."

Buechler was a unsuccessful board candidate in 1979.

Welcomed to her first four-year term on the board was incumbent Mrs. Brierly, who was appointed to her seat in 1979 to fill the vacancy left by Trustee Ann Ardussi. She was subsequently voted into office for one year last June and won her four-year seat running unopposed in the June 8 election.

Other annual organization items for the board Monday included the reappointment of law firm Hill, Lewis, Adams, Goodrich & Tait to serve as the board's legal counsel for the 1981-82 school year. The board also approved a number of financial arrangements at the lightly attended meeting in the administration building at 389 St. Clair.

Under regular action items, the new board approved memberships in the Michigan Association of School Boards, the National School Boards Association—Direct Affiliate Program, the Metropolitan Detroit Bureau of School Studies, Inc. and the Michigan High School Athletic Association.

Bids to restore the tennis courts and all-weather track at North High School were also approved. As part of Phase Five of the Building and Site Fund, the board accepted a bid of \$54,690 to reconstruct the 13-year-old tennis court and a bid of \$31,420 to repair and reconstruct the track's pole vault and long jump runways.

Slain teen's father offers \$1,000 reward

Any father would be understandably distraught over the death of his son. But the circumstances around the fatal shooting of 17-year-old Todd Poole on June 21 have his father and police perplexed by what is the second and most mysterious homicide in Grosse Pointe Woods' 30-year-history.

"Up until this happened he was a typical boy," said Albert Poole talking about his son in a desperate voice that betrayed his emotionless, 67-year-old face. "He had a girlfriend and a passion for his car. The way this happened is just not normal."

Even Exec. Lieutenant Jack Patterson who has led the investigation of the shooting admits it's not a typical homicide.

"It's not a 'who dunnit' but how and why did this happen," Patterson said.

Patterson says police have almost exhausted their leads and expect to wrap up the case in about a week. No charges have been filed against Roger Stevens, 40, of 1039 Sunningdale Drive who told police he shot Poole four times after the boy allegedly kicked in two doors at his home.

The boy's father is offering a \$1,000 reward to anyone who can provide accurate information about where his boy was during the four hours before the shooting.

The mystery began about 2 a.m. on June 21 when three friends dropped the boy off at Mack Avenue and Lennon after a graduation party. The driver who tended bar at the party said the boy had very little if anything to drink, the father said.

ABOUT FOUR hours later, Poole was heard pounding and yelling to be let in Stevens' back door, police said. Stevens took a .38 caliber handgun he kept in his bedroom and went to investigate, according to Stevens' statement to police.

Kercheval Phase III okayed

The Park council Monday approved the third—and final—stage of construction work in a federal revitalization program for its Kercheval Avenue shopping strip.

The council unanimously approved a \$65,500 contract with Morrison Construction of Trenton, to complete work to the east end of the business district — adding some items that were earlier deleted because of budget over runs and holding off on two proposals to study further improvements.

The basic, phase three program will cost \$46,700 and will continue the general improvements started at the west end of the shopping area. From Lakepointe to the east end near Beaconsfield sidewalks will be widened and decorative brick installed, along with new trees, colonial-style light posts, street furniture and cross walks.

In addition, the council voted to restore three small projects that were deleted from phases one and two because of cost limitations. The added projects include cast concrete litter

containers and bollards (\$5,280), additional trees (\$1,440), and improvement of unsightly right-of-way areas at a Mobil Gas station and Cable TV garage (\$12,050).

Deleted from the list of new projects were two studies aimed at future improvements on the shopping/service strip — an architectural survey of present building facades and improvements (\$5,990) and similar study of signs in the area (\$1,800).

Those two items were deleted from the contract at the request of Councilman Douglas Graham, who questioned the advisability of spending city money to design new storefronts for businesses when there is no guarantee the business owners will implement the designs.

Similar studies were conducted on Mack Avenue in the Park and, according to City Manager John Crawford, they inspired several businesses to improve their facades with private funds.

The two items may be reconsidered by the council at a later date, after they are reviewed by the city's plan commission.

All funds for the Kercheval im-

provement project come from Community Development Block Grants to the city from HUD. The three-phase project was originally approved by the council in 1979 to encourage economic reinvestment in the commercial strip that is just across the border from Detroit.

Since work has begun, city officials say several new businesses have moved in or expanded and general business activity has picked up in the Kercheval area.

Dale Ehresman, of Stevens and Associates, designers of the improvement project, said he considered the project a success.

"There's no question there's much more traffic and pedestrians in the area," Ehresman said. "The numbers of businesses that have moved in and expanded proves its success."

The final phase of the project was approved unanimously by the council July 13. Councilman Roger McNeill was absent from the meeting.

The Morrison Company was low bidder out of seven companies seeking the contract. Work will be completed with 120 days, according to the Morrison bid.

number," the father said.

Poole said his reward offer has generated some information that may be helpful in solving the mystery of his son's last hours. But he admits that nothing will bring Todd back and he said he hopes to prevent similar tragedies from occurring.

"THE FACT that this happened to my boy doesn't mean it isn't going to happen to another boy or girl . . . Everyone of these kids are exposed to the same thing that happened to this boy," Poole said.

Police will not speculate about what brought the boy to Stevens' home. Based on the facts they have, Stevens' story is sound, Patterson said. The latest information from the State Police Crime Lab shows that the imprint on the kicked-in door to Stevens' home is that of Poole's shoe. It was a typical forced entry with the door bolt broken through the door jamb, Patterson said.

Patterson admits there has been a lot of speculation about the case but says no one has offered any solid evidence that can be investigated.

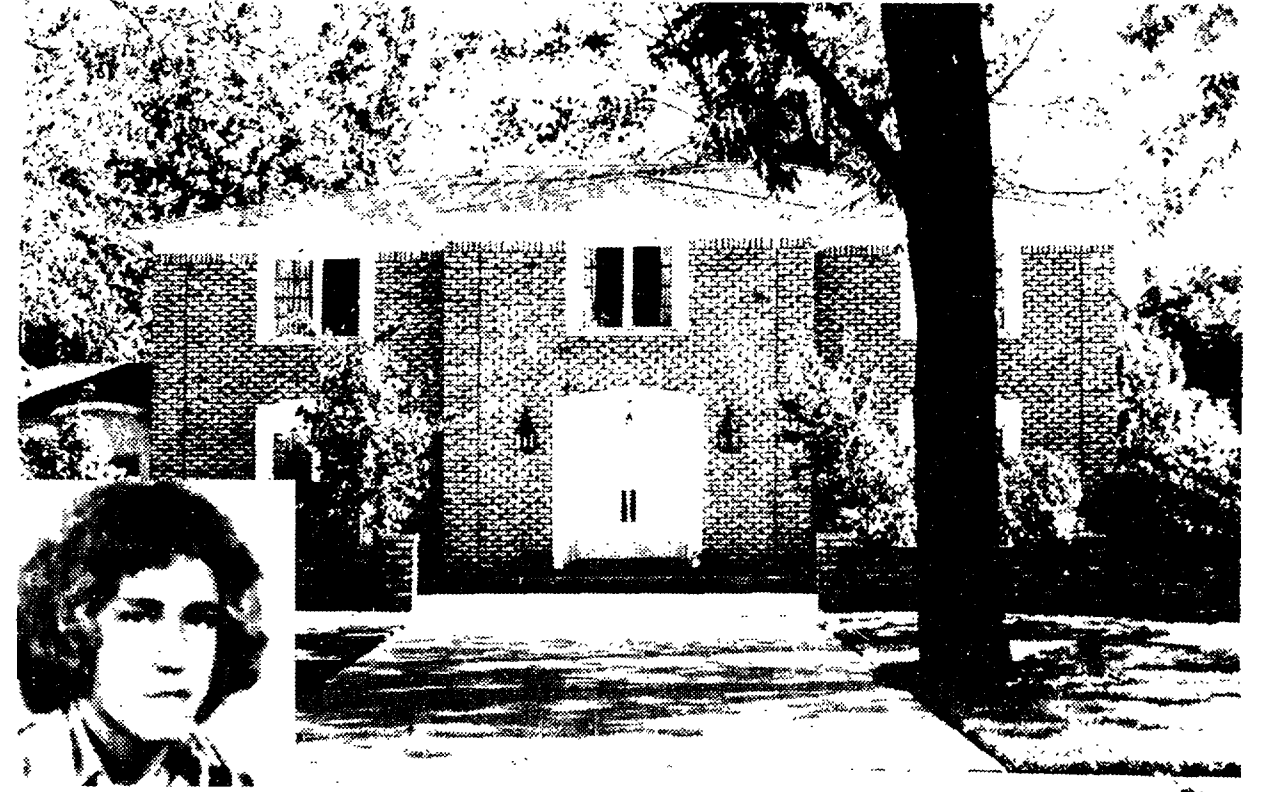
"I get all these people saying something's going on here but no one tells me what," Patterson said.

Police expect this week to take all the evidence to the Wayne County Prosecutor who will decide whether charges against Stevens are warranted, Patterson said.

In the meantime, the boy's father said he is satisfied with Patterson's handling of the investigation and realizes that the police can only react to the facts gathered so far.

"We're all in the same position," said Poole. "But when you look at this from a sensible, reasonable angle, it doesn't make sense."

Nickelodeon features Bolshoi, Beethoven, Bach

The lives and work of Tolstoy, Frederica Von Stade, Anthony, Dowell, Benjamin Britten, musical performances by the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra, French National Orchestra, John Lewis, The Bolshoi Ballet, The New York City Ballet and the art of Degas, Picasso, Breughel, Bonnard, Toulouse-Lautrec, Macke and Stubbs are part of the program offered by "ARTS," the Alpha Repertory Television Service in July.

Each week of "ARTS" programming has a general theme and weekly host.

Among the programming highlights of "English Music Reborn," hosted by Philip Anglim:

"All The Superlatives" (Monday, July 20)—A documentary profile of the ballet star Anthony Dowell, considered by many critics and his fellow dancers to be the number one dancer in the world today. The program follows Dowell as he prepares for the Royal Ballet's 1976 trip to New York, rehearsing for the first time after a neck injury prevented him from performing. Dowell is also seen in his most famous roles in such ballets as "Sleeping Beauty," "Shadowplay," "The Dream," "Monotones" and "Four Schumann Pieces." The dancer's observations on his career are supplemented by interviews with Dame Margot Fonteyn, Sir Frederick Ashton, Antoinette Sibley, Michael Somes, Rudolph Nureyev and others.

"A Time There Was" ... A Portrait of Benjamin Britten" (Wednesday, July 22)—A visual chronicle of the life and times of the great English composer from his childhood beginnings in music up to his death in 1976.

Highlights include the creation of "Peter Grimes," his first full-length opera, the inception of the Aldeburgh Music Festival, excerpts from "Billy Budd," "Death in Venice" recording sessions, concerts and rehearsals. Interviews with Britten himself, tenor Peter Pears (Britten's lifelong friend and principal creative partner), Leonard Bernstein, Julian Bream, Sir Rudolf Bing, Britten's brother, sisters and household staff complete the portrait.

Handel's "Messiah" (Saturday, July 25) — The stirring oratorio by George Frederic Handel, the German born composer who lived in England for much of his life is performed at the church of St. Ignatius in Rome. Solo performances by Irene Sanford (soprano), Bernadette Greevey (alto), Frank Patterson (tenor), and William Young (bass). The orchestra is conducted by Andre Prieur.

Other programs to be featured during the week of "English Music Reborn" include the Royal Ballet's production of Edward Elgar's "Enigma Variations," choreographed by Sir Frederick Ashton and featuring Anthony Dowell (Monday, July 20); a visualization of Vaughn Williams' "Sea Symphony" (Monday, July 20); "A Life In The Country," a portrait of guitarist Julian Bream (Wednesday, July 22); and a brief appreciation of the Stubbs painting "The Grosvenor Hunt" by John Jacob (Saturday, July 25).

After visits to Paris, Vienna and London, ARTS comes home to the U.S. and New York for "Point: Counterpoint," a week celebrating American literature, art and photography, plus ballet and

music performances by America's greatest musicians and dancers, beginning Monday, July 27.

Highlights of "Point: Counterpoint" (host to be announced) include:

"Norman Mailer By Norman Mailer" (Monday, July 27)—Novelist, political essayist, former mayoral candidate, biographer, filmmaker and New Journalist, Norman Mailer is the subject and narrator of this autobiographical profile. Mailer discusses his writing habits, career milestones such as "The Naked and The Dead" and "The Executioner's Song," his love of boxing and his feelings of making the transition from literature's angry young man to late middle age.

"Robert Service — 'Songs Of A Sourdough'" (Wednesday, July 29)—A docudrama of Robert Service, the Scotsman who emigrated to the Canadian Yukon in the early 1900s and became Canada's most popular poet. The program depicts Service's arrival in the Yukon and the story behind the writing of his first success, "The Shooting of Dan McGrew" and other poems chronicling the excitement and color of the Yukon Gold Rush. Fulton Mackay stars as Robert Service.

"Naive Painters Of The World—North America Part II" (Wednesday, July 29)—A visit with several of America's most notable primitive painters. Featured are Sister Gertrude Morgan and her autobiographical religious sketches, Bruce Bryce's murals of black New Orleans life and Morris Hirschfeld of New York, who began painting at 65.

"The Romantic Age" (Saturday, Aug. 1)—Videotaped

at the 1980 Festival Internacional Cervantino in Guanajuato, Mexico. "The Romantic Age" brings together four legendary ballerinas Alicia Alonso, Carla Fracci, Ghislaine Thesmar and Eva Evdokimova to recreate famous ballets of the mid-19th Century. Each ballerina is featured in a world premiere pas de deux based on an old ballet. In addition, the four ballerinas perform together in the 1845 masterpiece "Pas de Quatre" recreated by Sir Anton Dolin. The Danish "danseur noble" Erik Bruhn, narrates.

The first programs in Arts' "Visions And Images: American Photographers On Photography" will be presented during the week of "Point: Counterpoint." Talking about their lives and work with award-winning writer and cultural historian Barbara Lee Diamondstein will be Aaron Siskind (Monday, July 27)—one of the first American photographers to emphasize design and form over subject matter; and Barbara Morgan (Saturday, Aug. 1 — the photographer noted for her skill photographing children as well as

her dance photography, photomontages and photograms. Musical programs to be featured during "Point: Counterpoint" include the ragtime works of Scott Joplin (Monday, July 27), and Tchaikovsky's "Serenade for Strings in C" and violinist Isaac Stern, pianist Eugene Istomin and cellist Leonard Rose playing Brahms Opus 101 (Monday, July 27).

Arts will also present brief profiles of the lives of author Joseph Conrad (Wednesday, July 29) and naturalist-essayist Henry Thoreau (Saturday, Aug. 1).

State cracks down on hub cap thefts

Fourteen persons were arrested last week on charges of evading state income taxes initiated by Atty. Gen. Frank J. Kelley and State Treasurer Loren E. Monroe.

Possible criminal charges are pending against 32 other persons.

The arrests are the culmination of an investigation by the Treasury Department into lost tax revenue from the sale of stolen hub caps — a lucrative business with an

estimated volume of \$500,000 annually in the Detroit area.

While there are no reliable statistics on the scope of the illegal hub cap business, there have been 286 hub cap thefts reported in the City of Livonia alone so far this year with a loss of more than \$100,000.

A set of four hub caps for a luxury car may retail for as much as \$450. Auto supply stores routinely pay about \$100 over the counter for a set of four to customers who claim to be the rightful owners.

According to investigators, the hub caps were stolen from individual cars or from railroad boxcars in the Detroit area for subsequent sale to auto supply stores.

Based on actual checks issued by one auto supply

store, the 14 persons scheduled for arrest today received \$180,719 in 1977, 1978 and 1979. Treasury Department experts estimate that the defendants collectively made nearly \$750,000 in those three years, none of which was reported for tax purposes.

The revenue lost to the State of Michigan is estimated at \$55,000 including interest and penalties.

While none of the 14 persons arrested have been charged with theft, eight have been charged with felony counts of income tax evasion carrying a maximum penalty of two years in jail and/or a \$5,000 fine. The other six defendants are charged with misdemeanor charges of income tax evasion carrying a maximum penalty of one year in jail and/or a \$1,000 fine.

Need help relocating?

A guide to help people who are considering relocation to other job markets outside Michigan has just been published by United Community Services of Metropolitan Detroit (UCS).

Entitled "The Grass May Be Greener . . . Check it out Before You Leap," the pamphlet-size guide offers tips on where to begin, what to consider, before making the move, where to get counseling, how to gain information about benefits, and how to gather facts about other communities where job opportunities might be greater.

"The idea of relocating to another area is very appealing to some unemployed families right now," said Richard F. Huegill, UCS executive vice-president. "But such a move can be traumatic if it isn't handled with care. Most families and individuals contemplating such a tremendous change in their lives need help in assessing their situations before making the final decision. Through this special publication, we hope to provide important information which

can help them arrive at a rational decision about relocating."

Publication of the guide is part of a special UCS project to reach out into the community to assist families and individuals who, because of economic hardships, are undergoing considerable stress. In order to help such persons resolve immediate problems, UCS has enlisted the efforts of seven family agencies in the tri-county area to provide crisis intervention counseling, including assistance on relocation to other job markets.

The project was made possible by a special grant from United Foundation.

Thousands of copies of this free guide are being distributed throughout the tri-county area. They are also available by calling or writing United Community Services 51 West Warren, Detroit 48201 or by calling 833-0622.

Gas use declines sharply in state

Michigan motorists are using less gasoline for the third straight year and consumption in the state is now at its lowest point since 1970, according to the Automobile Club of Michigan.

"Through April, state drivers used approximately 1.26 billion gallons of gasoline, or 9 percent below the same period in 1980," stated Auto Club Touring Manager Joseph Ratke.

"This year's consumption also is 17 percent less than in the record gas use year of 1978, and only 1.5 percent

more than was used during the same period in 1970," he continued.

This February was the first month since February 1970 that motorists used less than 300 million gallons of fuel.

"The drop in consumption is especially noteworthy since it is estimated that tourism in Michigan is up about 6 percent over last year," said Ratke, who added that Michigan tourism activity may eclipse record 1978 totals.

Last year, Michigan motorists cut gas consumption 10.7 percent from 1979. The reduction was the second highest in the nation, with the District of Columbia posting

a 15.7 percent drop in gasoline usage.

Gas prices nearly 10 percent higher than last year, more fuel-efficient cars on the road and the state's economic problems were cited by Auto Club as major reasons for the decline.

"Michigan motorists also should be lauded for their efforts to conserve gasoline," Ratke said. "Indications are that while vacation travel in the state is up, driving near home, where most mileage is accumulated, is down."

Through April, motorists in Michigan have driven 1.4 percent fewer miles than in the first four months of 1980.

Local clinics join eye study

If you have had diabetes for several years, you may be eligible to participate in a nationwide study of diabetic eye disease and its treatment, for which two eye clinics in the Detroit area are now recruiting patients.

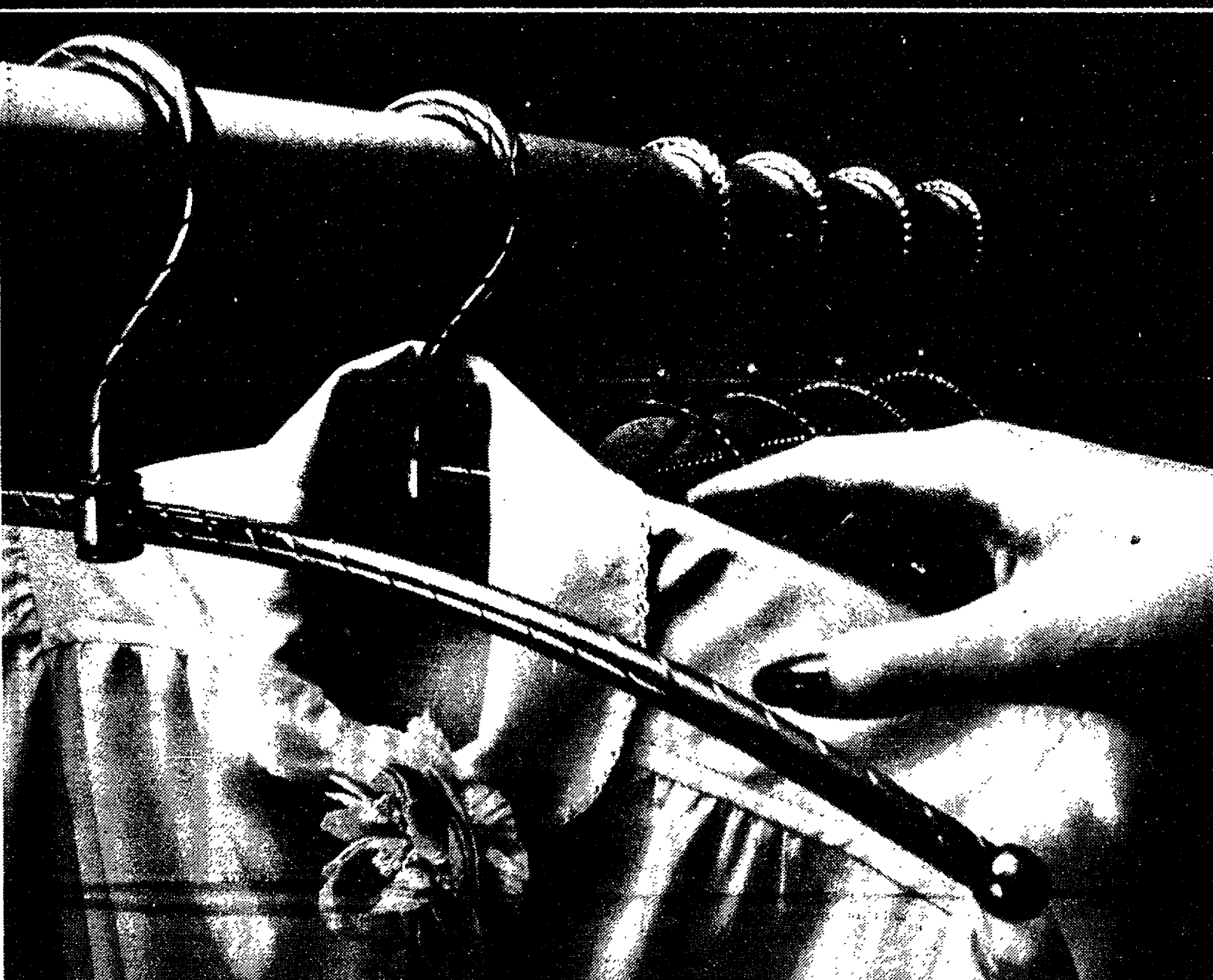
The research project, which will involve 4,000 patients and 19 medical centers across the country, is called the Early Treatment Diabetic Retinopathy Study, or ETDRS for short.

It is sponsored by the National Eye Institute (NEI), a branch of the Federal Government's National Institutes of Health. Recruiting for the study in this area are the Kresge Eye Institute of Wayne State University School of Medicine in Detroit and Associated Retinal Consultants in Royal Oak.

Each of the medical centers involved in the ETDRS is seeking people for the study who have early signs of diabetic retinopathy, an eye disease that is one of the commonest complications of diabetes. Diabetic retinopathy is a disease of the retina, the light-sensitive tissue that lines the inside of the eye. The disorder is the third leading cause of new cases of blindness in the United States, and is present to at least a mild degree in about 40 percent of the nation's eight million diabetics.

People with diabetes who are interested in participating in the ETDRS should contact their eye care specialist or the physician who is treating their diabetes for advice about entering the study. Doctors interested in referring patients to the study should contact one of the two nearby ETDRS clinics for further information.

Tocco charms festival with Chopin, Joplin

It was a glowing opening for the Grosse Pointe Summer Music Festival's 24th season on Wednesday, July 8. The concert, held in the Fries Auditorium of the Grosse Pointe War Memorial Center, featured the renowned pianist James Tocco, a native Detroit. Tocco's playing brought the packed house audience to its feet as he ended his recital, and rightfully so.

Alexander C. Sucek, Festival founder and artistic director, first greeted the audience, and in behalf of the festival committee extended his appreciation for the great support received from everyone.

"The music festival is an all-out community project, and that's what makes it even more exciting," he said. Sucek also spoke of its beginnings and how now, the festival is considered as one of the leading music festivals in Michigan. He also related the function of the newly established Festival Piano Competition event.

Tocco opened his program with a clear and impressive reading of Beethoven's Sonata in D Major, Op. 28, the "Pastoral." Before his next selection, Sonata No. 4 in E minor, Op. 59, the "Keltic," by the American composer MacDowell, Tocco narrated on the significance of MacDowell's works saying it merits more attention and a

more prominent place in American music literature. And then Tocco played the "Keltic" — emphasizing its beautiful melody, its majestic color and technicality, as throughout the evening, his playing was flawless. He also proved his earlier oral statement.

For the second half, Tocco programmed the complete 12 Chopin Etudes, Op. 10. The beauty of the Etudes, played by the expert hands of Tocco, held the audience spellbound. He kept the melodic lines strong and meaningful, as written by a man's pen, still not eluding any tenderness—Chopin is so frequently over-romanticized. Tocco claims having no favorites in his repertoire, but, certainly, his evident love and understanding of Chopin's music could not be overlooked.

After numerous curtain calls, Tocco returned to the keyboard, taking off his white jacket because of the heat (arousing another round of applause), he announced "Here is another American composer—Scott Joplin." "The Maple Leaf Rag" played on a Steinway concert grand piano is quite a switch from the tinny out-of-tune upright pianos used by Joplin way back in 1899. The audience clamored for more and got "The Wall Street Rag" and "New Rag."

When asked about his choice of the Joplin encores, Tocco replied, "It was a little

more relaxed good music for a hot summer evening." Would he ever consider doing Joplin encores abroad? Smilingly, he responded, "I might."

After just completing a June concert tour in Italy, Tocco is scheduled for a return trip, with performances at the Rome Festival with the Santa Cecilia Orchestra, in Michelangelo Piazza on Capitol Hill and at the Sardinia Festival.

Tocco received his earlier training with Boris Maximovich and later he studied with teachers Magda Tagliaferro in Paris and Claudio Arrau in New York.

After the War Memorial concert, festival guests gathered in the Fries Crystal Ballroom for a reception honoring Tocco. Reception chairman Mrs. Lyndie R. Martin and her committee were in charge of the setting.

Of Tocco's performance, Grosse Pointe Philip Leon said, "I'm crazy about him. He's a very elegant patrician pianist—one of the very, very best. His reference to MacDowell was well advised and well articulated." Leon recommended James Tocco to the festival committee last year after hearing him play in an Orchestra Hall benefit.

"He's terrific—very good," said Francesco Di Blasi, conductor of the Oakway Symphony Orchestra.

"It was a most triumphant

evening," said Mrs. Sterling S. Sanford the festival's general chairman for the fourth year. Also, pleased with the full house success, ticket chairman Mrs. William O. Bradley, Jr., urges everyone to purchase tickets early for the remaining concerts.

Featured at the July 15 concert were Broadway stars Barbara Meister and David Bender (more on the singing husband and wife team in the next issue).

The festival's third concert of the 1981 season will feature Mischa Kottler, Detroit's pianist laureate, and the Fontana Ensemble in recital. It will be held on Wednesday, July 22, at 8:15 p.m., in the Fries Auditorium of the Grosse Pointe War Memorial Center, 32 Lakeshore Road.

Kottler's program opens with the Beethoven Sonata No. 30, Op. 109, and closes with five Chopin selections: Barcarolle, Op. 60; a Mazurka; Nocturne in E Major, No. 2, Op. 62; Impromptu in A Flat Major, Op. 69, and Ballade in F minor, No. 4, Op. 52.

Kottler was born in Kiev, Russia. His rich musical life began with violin studies at the early age of three and a half. However, his violin study ended abruptly when his mother caught his teacher beating him. Perhaps it was a fortunate incident; Mischa, then age four, took to studying the piano. At age seven he entered the Imperial

Conservatory of Kiev, and two years later was ready for a concert tour of the major cities of the Ukraine. He continued his studies in Paris with Alfred Cortot and in Vienna with Emil von Sauer, one of the famous pupils of Franz Liszt.

Kottler has concertized extensively both in the United States and abroad. While in New York, Kottler did the accompanying for students of the great violinist and teacher Professor Leopold Auer. Jascha Heifitz, Mischa Elman and Nathan Milstein were all pupils of Auer. It was Auer who had Kottler play for Sergei Rachmaninoff. And it was Rachmaninoff who told Kottler to go back to Europe to study.

Kottler retired from the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in 1970 after holding the post of official pianist for 22 years. He appeared as soloist with the orchestra four times with conductor Paul Paray, six times with Sixten Ehring and in 1979, playing the Tchaikovsky Concerto No. 1, with Antal Dorati. He also served as director of music at WWJ radio station for 33 years.

Kottler and his colleagues Joseph Gingold, violinist, and the late Georges Miquelle cellist, broadcasted regularly as a trio. On occasions, the late Mischa Mischa-koff would join them.

Kottler is presently professor and chairman of the

piano division at Wayne State University where he was awarded the Distinguished Faculty Service Award by the Board of Governors in 1976. Its inscription reads "Along with the many hours and effort in developing his own personal career, Mr. Kottler has given generously of himself in guiding young musicians in fulfilling their ambitions in music."

Some of his students who have established themselves in the world of music are Ruth Laredo, who was soloist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra at this summer's Meadow Brook Music Festival opening, Seymour Lipkin, a Rachmaninoff Award winner, Margaret Barthel and

Neal Stuiberg. Also Cynthia Raim, who played in recital at the 1978 Grosse Pointe Summer Music Festival, and recently made her Detroit Symphony Orchestra debut and Elizabeth Lesens, who last summer, made her Grosse Pointe debut with the festival as a recitalist in the Young Artist Debut Concert.

This gentleman of music is now approaching his 80th birthday. For the occasion, the evening's concert pays tribute to Mischa Kottler.

The Fontana Ensemble is a group of 11 musicians, each of whom is an accomplished soloist in his or her own right. The players come from such acclaimed sources as the Melos Ensemble of

London, the Philharmonia, Dallas, Minnesota and Cleveland Orchestras, the Boston and San Francisco Symphonies, the Israel Philharmonic, London and BBC Symphonies, the Amsterdam Concertgebouw, and the Casals Festival Orchestra.

The Fontana Ensemble, at home or on tour, is truly an experience for music lovers. Its unique structure permits blending of instruments in a variety of combinations to offer well known favorites as well as rarely heard classics from the chamber music repertoire.

The second half of the program will be devoted to chamber music by four members (Continued on Page 7A)

Greg sketches plans for future

It had to happen. Even the Pope has gone preppy. Poised beneath his pointy hat, John Paul II sports an alligator shirt, whale belt, sailboat bedecked trousers and tasseled loafers. Perfect for that casual get together at the seminary after a tough day at the Vatican.

His Holiness in shades of pink and green? Not hard to imagine if you're 14-year-old Greg Gersch and have a talent for caricature.

Forced to quit his paper route because of early morning rowing prac-

tion, Greg, of University Place, decided to recoup lost revenues by putting pen to paper.

"I'm into art and Mr. Robert Rathbone, my art instructor at South, recommended me to a woman who wanted a caricature of her boyfriend to give him on his birthday," said Greg.

"She liked it so much she paid me \$25. Now I figured it's a good way to pay for rowing and save money for college."

The winner of a Gold Key Blue Ribbon award in a state art competi-

tion, Greg credits his parents with passing their artistic talents onto him. "My dad, Richard Gersch, is Senior Industrial Designer at Bell Northern Research," said Greg. "My mother, Regina, is a teacher at Ferry School. Any talent I have I got from them."

A sophomore at South, Greg has worked on the staff of the Tower, the school newspaper, as an artist and cartoonist. He hopes to serve on the paper again in the fall.

Neatly dressed, friendly and almost painfully polite, Greg admits he has to set the "proper mood" before he can work.

"I usually put on some music. My favorites are Simon and Garfunkle or the Doors," said Greg. "Then I take my shoes and socks off and get comfortable. It just makes things easier."

Working from a photograph, Greg will use about 20 different pens and pencils over a two hour period, more if the portrait is difficult to work from.

"Sketching a caricature of someone is a lot like drawing their portrait," said Greg with a smile. "The major difference is that I work quicker and with exaggerated movements. Prominent features are enlarged and emphasized to try to capture their personalities."

Greg usually charges \$10 to \$15 for his work, more if the drawing is very involved. "I use the money to help pay for trips our rowing team takes," he said.

"We practice at 4:30 in the morning, and as the coxswain I make sure everyone is on time, set the speeds and strokes and help direct the boat. I love it because we travel so much."

According to Greg the team has met with much success, and hopes to win the Junior Olympics held in Syracuse, N.Y. "If we win there, we receive a gold medal and a trip to compete in Bulgaria," said Greg. "There is a lot of similarity between drawing and rowing. It takes discipline, practice and hard work. Plus I get to meet a lot of people."

Greg currently advertises his talents in the Grosse Pointe News, but business hasn't been too good. "Not too many people are calling," he said. "Guess it's the economy."

While he loves art, future plans lie in another direction. "It would be nice to earn a living as an artist, or cartoonist for a newspaper," he said. "But the competition is terribly tough. I think I'd like to be a doctor. I've thought it over and I'd like to specialize in pediatrics."

Prime Time
 For Senior Citizens

Women everywhere are cheering President Reagan's appointment of Sandra Day O'Connor to the United States Supreme Court. What a victory and not just from a feminist's point of view. Everyone agrees that we should have a woman in the highest court of the land because women today, more than ever, need an interpreter of the law who will not only be cognizant of women's needs but one who empathizes with them as only a woman can.

No one expects her to make decisions solely on the basis of representing women's views. She is too professional for that. But the feeling pervades that at long last any momentous decision affecting women's rights under the Constitution will be carefully considered.

We know that she is a fighter. When she was a state senator accused of trying to weaken our pollution laws because her husband's law firm represented Kennot Copper Co. she countered:

"The amendments I have proposed are my own amendments because they represent my own thinking and judgment."

SHE IS KNOWN for her independence, inner strength and dedication to the law. But Sandra O'Connor is not just an intellectual. She is an all-around person who well represents the many activities of women's role in society. Besides her brilliant career as a lawyer and lawmaker, she enjoys cooking, skiing and tennis. She is the mother of three sons and the wife of a prominent attorney.

On the matter of sex discrimination Sandra O'Connor has had first hand experience. Although she had an excellent record at Stanford Law School, she was unable to get a job in a law firm after her graduation. Later as a state senator, she pushed through bills to eliminate discriminatory language from Arizona laws, to provide equal pay for equal work and to remove an eight-hour a day restriction on working hours for women.

"Let's give the women a chance for a better life and a bigger pocket-book," she told her senate colleagues.

These are cheering words for younger women but for older women also. Women in the 65-and-older age group are the fastest growing segment of the United States population. Women are living longer than men. (Sorry about that gentlemen. We really need you around. It's not much fun without you).

While the prospect of a long life for ladies is a happy one, it does carry with it special problems which will understandably become issues that will need resolution, if not in the highest courts than in legislation. Inspired by Sandra O'Connor's appointment, more women will seek and gain

high offices. With that event, hopefully, laws will be enacted that will reflect the concerns of all women and the special concerns of older women. And they are many.

Her life is marked by the discontinuities of an interrupted career as a homemaker and often the combination of career woman and homemaker. She faces a large number of losses in her life — the departure of children and the likelihood of outliving her husband. She is assaulted by unflattering stereotypes and by reduced income plus poor access to transportation, loneliness and isolation.

DESPITE THE problems older women face, they also possess great strength and potential. Given the opportunity to exercise these qualities of life for women in their later years will be more than just surviving. It will also be rewarding.

One issue that will affect them and one that is becoming increasingly controversial is social security benefits. While it does concern both men and women recipients, there are discrepancies in the system of particular concern to women.

In recent years social security has been the object of increasing scrutiny with regard to how it affects women.

In part, this scrutiny reflects changes that have occurred in our society. The extent to which women participate in the labor force, the impact of employment discrimination and other factors (including child bearing) that have restricted women's average earning and therefore social security benefits; increases in divorce rates, leaving more women with less than adequate social security protection; growing recognition of the economic value of women's work in the home and growing dissatisfaction with eligibility for benefits that is based on dependence status.

Such concerns as these indicate that a number of changes can and should be made to improve the way the program works for women.

The adage that unless you have walked in someone else's shoes you cannot know how rough the road can be is apropos when it comes to needed reform in social security benefits for women. Women legislators will bring to their decision an understanding for those problems that male legislators may not fully appreciate.

To alleviate some of the inequities in the social security system benefits should be increased for among others, single women and widows who generally get the lowest benefits and are the least well off.

Another possible adjustment would be to increase the two-earners as against the one-earner couples. A divorced spouse would then receive 45 percent of the increased primary (Continued on Page 12A)

benefit or about 50 percent (as now) of the present primary benefit.

A special benefit should be paid for one year to assist widows in entering or reentering the work force. Additional "drop out" years should be allowed in figuring the benefits of persons who drop out of the work force while they have young children in their care.

The ultimate goal of these reforms and others in the assurance of benefits at least sufficient to keep recipients above the poverty level.

Although the social security is severely taxed now to deliver present benefits and is under attack by younger workers who are becoming increasingly resentful of the necessary deductions from their paychecks to finance the system, there are reforms which should be considered by both young and old.

Though words such as "insurance" and "trust funds" are sometimes used to characterize the workings of Social Security, it has always been a pay-as-you-go program. The taxes paid into the system are almost immediately paid out in benefits. They are not set aside and invested the way pension funds are.

IT APPEARS that part of the cost of the social security system, as much as one-third in the long run, should be met from general revenues, that is, primarily from graduated taxes that extend to the upper levels of income and are delivered from sources beyond wages, salaries and self-employment incomes.

Economic security has always been a big problem for women and particularly for older women for many of the reasons stated. Granted there are other factors that contribute to a better life and merit consideration, such as good medical care, comfortable housing, proper nutrition, protection against crime, companionship and leisure time activities, but even these are somewhat dependent on economic sustenance.

Hopefully as more women follow in Sandra O'Connor's footsteps in courts and the legislature (this is bound to happen, one third of those entering law schools this year will be women) there will be a gentler view of all their constituents' needs with special attention to women in general and older women in particular.

State museums offer look into past

Michiganians can peer into the future at the Space Center in Jackson or review the past by visiting any of the state's other fine museums, according to the Automobile Club of Michigan.

Located on the Jackson Community College campus, the Michigan Space Center is housed on a gold geodesic dome with a \$7-million, 83-foot-long Redstone rocket outside. Inside, an open, 83-foot orange and white parachute used to bring one of the Apollo spacecraft safely down to sea forms a ceiling for the Astro-Theatre, where daily space movies describe the U.S. space program in detail.

The Michigan Historical Museum in Lansing features a "Walk Through Time" exhibit which traces the state's historic and prehistoric periods to the geological era which created Michigan's two peninsulas. The exhibit includes artifacts, photographs, maps and audiovisual materials.

Automobiles have played a major role in Michigan, and at least three museums in the state have excellent collections.

The Alfred P. Sloan Museum in Flint is named for a former president of General Motors Corp. Its 30 famous vehicles of the past include a Flint Road Cart, 1886-1895;

a 1900 Durant-Dort Buggy; a 1914 Marr; 1917 Stanley Steamer, and C.S. Mott's Corvair.

The Gilmore Car Museum at Hickory Corners near Kalamazoo boasts a collection of more than 50 antique and classic cars, including a Hupmobile, Duesenberg, Stutz and Pierce Arrow.

World-renowned Henry Ford Museum at Dearborn has a series of "firsts" — America's first automobile offered for public sale, an 1896 Duryea motor wagon; Henry Ford's first vehicle, the 1896 quadricycle, and Ford's first mass-produced car, the 1903 Model A.

Michigan's lumbering era is highlighted at the Lumbering Museum in Hartwick Pines State Park at Grayling. The story of the "White Pine Era" is told through exhibits which include scenes of a restored lumber camp.

Two restorations in the Upper Peninsula — Fort Wilkins at Copper Harbor and Fayette Townsite near Garden — recall the days when copper and iron ore brought settlers from afar.

Fort Wilkins at the tip of the Keweenaw Peninsula is the last original wood fort east of the Mississippi River. It was built in 1844 to protect copper miners from Indian attack. Fayette on the Garden Peninsula is a cen-

tury-old village of 19 historic structures where the famed Jackson Iron Company smelted iron ore from 1867 to 1891.

The history of Great Lakes shipping is told at Detroit's Dossin Museum on Belle Isle in the Detroit River and the Museum of Arts and History at Port Huron.

The Dossin Museum's observation deck and a window-paneled wall provide glimpses of giant freighters.

Rivers vital links in Michigan's history

Michigan's rivers and streams have played a vital role in the nation's and the state's historical, industrial and recreational development, according to the Automobile Club of Michigan.

Some of the state's more than 36,000 miles of streams are named after the region's famous explorers.

One such river is the Pere Marquette near Ludington. Father Jacques Marquette, founder of Sault Ste. Marie and St. Ignace, died on a bluff overlooking the river in 1675 and the spot is marked with an illuminated white cross.

In Southeast Michigan, the Raisin River flows serenely through the rich farmlands of Monroe County, but it was the site of a major battle between American and British and Indian forces in the War of 1812. The site is commemorated by a stone monument at Elm and Winchester Streets in Monroe.

Many rivers became natural highways in the mid-1800s as white pine lumber became the state's principal product.

East Michigan's most famous logging stream is the Saginaw River, which once had more than 100 mills along its banks between Bay City and Saginaw. The mills are gone, but the river still is heavily used by pleasure craft and by Great Lakes freighters serving the area's auto plants and grain elevators.

The Au Sable, another famous logging river, is among the most canoe streams in the state, with thousands of families floating its gentle course each summer between Grayling and Oscoda. It also is site of the 240-mile annual non-stop Marathon Canoe Race, which takes place July 24-25.

In the last century, the Muskegon River became one of the state's most important logging streams. Because of fall salmon and spring steelhead runs, it now is the most-fished river in the state, with more than 143,000 angler-days spent on the stream annually.

The Grand River, the state's longest waterway, also is one of Michigan's most popular fishing streams. Fish ladders at dams near Lyons, Portland, Grand Ledge and in northern Lansing will allow anglers to fish for spawning salmon beneath the shadow of the state Capitol.

Michigan's sparkling trout streams are some of the best east of the Mississippi, and one of the better brook and brown trout rivers is the Boardman near Kalkaska. That city is site of the National Trout Festival each April.

Another is the Jordan River, near East Jordan, now preserved as a wilderness stream after it was named the state's first wild-scenic river in 1972.

More than 150 waterfalls grace rivers of the Upper Peninsula, but none is more famous than Tahquamenon Falls on the Tahquamenon River near Newberry. It has a drop of more than 40 feet, the largest east of the Mississippi, next to Niagara.

Some 70 miles east, the St. Marys River flows past Sault Ste. Marie, site of the Soo Locks, the world's busiest. The locks are part of the famous St. Lawrence Seaway, which also takes in the St. Clair River, nicknamed the "blue water route" connecting Lakes Huron and St. Clair River, Detroit River. It is the state's deepest river, measuring 46 feet to the bottom near the Ambassador Bridge.

The Rouge River, a Detroit River tributary which passes by the site where Henry Ford began his auto empire, also receives heavy traffic in its lower reaches from iron ore and limestone ships stopping at Ford's mammoth Rouge Complex.

Michigan's most southerly stream is the St. Joseph River, south of Hillsdale. It connects with the Maumee River system in Ohio and is not to be confused with the state's other St. Joseph River, which flows west to Lake Michigan from the same area.

Gallery hours are 9 to 5 Monday through Friday and 10 to 4 on Saturday.

High Water

The nation's five largest rivers averaged 220 billion gallons a day above normal in 1979, reports the U.S. Geological Survey. Only the Columbia suffered a dry year. The Mississippi at Vicksburg flowed 47 percent above normal; the St. Lawrence at Massena, N.Y., 14 percent above normal; the Ohio at Louisville, Ky., 66 percent up; the Missouri at Hermann, 17 percent above; and the Columbia at The Dalles, Or., 25 percent below normal. Those five rivers, which drain about half of the contiguous states, carried an average of 933 billion gallons a day during 1979.

Team studies disease at WSU medical school

A study of a chemical found in patients with anorexia nervosa, currently under way at Wayne State University, may lead to a better understanding of this psychiatric disease. Anorexia nervosa, a disease characterized by a refusal to eat and a severe loss in body weight, affects as many as 500,000 people each year in the United States.

The Wayne State scientists will isolate and test this chemical which has been found in the urine of anorexia nervosa patients. Co-investigators for the study are Mary Ann Marazzi, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Pharmacology at the School of Medicine and a Grosse Pointe Woods resident, and Elliot Luby, M.D., Chief of Psychiatry at Harper-Grace Hospitals and Professor of Psychiatry at the School of Medicine and a Birmingham resident.

"The anorexic factor was isolated in 1979 by a group

in Norway from the urine of 10 girls considered to have severe anorexia nervosa," says Dr. Marazzi. "When the chemical was injected into laboratory rats, it caused a decreased food intake and a loss in body weight."

"The immediate goal of our study is to confirm the isolation of the anorexic factor in the urine of anorexia nervosa patients, and to simplify the purification and testing procedures of this factor," she explains.

"We expect that the identification and characterization of the anorexic factor will help in diagnosing and monitoring the course of treatment for the disease," Dr. Marazzi says. "This may also lead to the development of drugs to treat or control the disorder."

The researchers will seek answers to such questions as: Does the level of the anorexic urine factor change with the course of clinical treatment? Can the anorexic fac-

tor be found in blood as well as urine? What are the levels of anorexic factors in the urine of patients with other disorders having similar psychiatric, anorexic, metabolic and reproductive aspects of the disease?

The study involves 20 anorexia nervosa patients in the Metropolitan Detroit area between the ages of 16 and 30. The patients are undergoing clinical treatment as well as the chemical testing.

Anorexia nervosa often is complicated by underlying emotional problems. The patient often suffers withdrawal from family and friends, depression and guilt. Clinical treatment for the disease includes psychotherapy, family therapy and behavior modification.

"Anorexia nervosa is 10 times more prevalent in females than in males," Dr. Luby explains. "It usually occurs during or just after puberty. The typical patient is a very good child, com-

pliant and neat." Anorexic patients rarely seek treatment and are usually brought to a doctor by a concerned parent. "The disease is much more common than we realize," Dr. Luby says, "and seems to be on the rise in our weight-conscious society," he says.

About half the patients get completely well and begin to gain weight, according to Dr. Luby. "For the other half, the disease becomes a chronic condition they need to fight all their life. A small percentage die."

The one and one-half year study is funded by the State of Michigan Department of Mental Health.

Seniors eligible for lower gas bills

Persons 65 years of age and older who have a utility account with Michigan Consolidated Gas Company are eligible for a senior citizen rate on the gas they use at their principal address.

The special application form may be filled out in the office of Senior Citizen Information of Seniors Onward for Change, Inc. (SOC) at Ferry Elementary School, 748 Roslyn Road in Grosse Pointe Woods.

Special facilities to take the applications will be set up for Thursday and Friday, July 16 and 17, and Monday through Friday, July 20 through 24, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Applications may be filled out any day in the Senior Information Office, although these days have been set aside to give special attention to those eligible and desiring to register for the rate.

The only restrictions to the rate are use of gas for heating a swimming pool, for running an air conditioner, or for an outside light. There are no income restrictions, according to SOC's Senior Citizen Information coordinator, Virginia Downing.

Those making application must bring proof of age, proof of address, social security number and account number with Michigan Consolidated Gas. Persons 65 years or older must be head of the household where the rate will be established. The gas company defines head of household to be that individual whose name appears on the monthly gas bill and who furnishes the primary financial support for the family at the account address.

This is a voluntary rate and when requested the senior agrees to remain on this rate for a minimum of 12 months providing they continue gas service at the address stated.

Information on other locations where the forms may be filled out is available by calling the Michigan Consolidated Gas Co.

Any questions about making application at the Senior Citizen Information office will be answered from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. by calling 882-9600. Ferry Elementary School is at the corner of Morningside and Roslyn Road.

"Gone fishin'" is not on a sign on our front door as summer's warm, vacation days come. Operation LINC (Linking Individuals to Needs in the Community) still keeps its regular hours—9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Friday—makes pickups of donated goods and works to bring together goods and services with the needs of Wayne County agencies.

Those needs don't take a summer break, and we still try to be there to help.

Items we have recently received and placed include a 1974 Buick station wagon, to INDEPENDENT YOUTH OF GREATER DETROIT; an offset printing press and duplicating machine, to CAREER DEVELOPMENT CENTER, a job training facility; two sewing machines, to DETROIT RUBICON ODYSSEY HOUSE, a rehabilitation agency; and craft items to LUTHER HAVEN NURSING HOME. All are in Detroit.

We gave a Minolta 101 copier to FIRST STEP, a Westland organization for battered wives.

Operation LINC also forwarded donated funds to NORTHEAST GUIDANCE CENTER, in Detroit, for its annual Community Baby Shower. Educational workshops, lunch and prizes were provided for more than 75 expectant mothers and 50 children. Operation LINC funds covered the cost of thermometers and baby clothing given out in gift packs as well as other miscellaneous child care expenses for the day.

In recent weeks we've also taken care of a few real challenges to our "linking" ability. A caller with a pet rooster in need of a new home was referred to Belle Isle, then finally to Kensington Metro Park, where the bird now lives. Another donor with an artificial leg, as well as crutches and cane, was linked with CALVARY SENIOR CENTER in Detroit.

Rather than feature specific agencies and their needs this month, we would like to mention again items most frequently requested.

Calls still come throughout the summer for the basics: furniture, especially beds and infant cribs, and household items. Draperies and curtains can be used by families that have been fire victims. Pots and pans are requested for families and by agencies which have fund raising food sales and need the items for cooking and baking.

The Health Education Council of Grosse Pointe, Inc., was founded in 1945 to serve as a link between the home and school in providing programs of health education and service.

The Council consists of school delegates (representatives from each of the public and non-public schools in the Grosse Pointe School District) as well as individual members, including teachers, school administrators, doctors, nurses, dentists and parents.

Current council programs include the Dental Health Workshop, begun this year to offer information on dental disease, oral hygiene, nutrition, fluoride, professional care in disease prevention and methods and materials which can be used to teach dental health in the classroom. This program is staffed by Grosse Pointe teachers on a voluntary basis.

The Welfare Committee donates food and clothing to needy persons on a confidential basis. The Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation Program teaches the life-saving CPR technique to students in local high schools. There is complete orientation and training in CPR by volunteers certified as instructors.

The Nutrition Program aids parents, teachers and students in their awareness of good nutrition. The Elementary Health Education Program provides sex education by qualified volunteer leaders from the community; their presentations stress the primary role of the family in sex education, providing examples of dialogue parents may use in fulfilling this responsibility.

The Breast Self-Examination Program, in conjunction with the American Cancer Society, teaches high school girls the correct method of breast self-examination through a film presentation.

The School Health Clinic Program recruits and trains volunteers to direct school clinics in the middle and high schools, as well as in a few elementary schools.

The Health Education Council also conducts a lecture-discussion series throughout the school year, to which the public is cordially invited.

Looking forward to Salvation!

First there was Monopoly with financial acquisition and power its basic motivations. Next came Scrabble, Communication and language formed the basis of its appeal.

Now there is Salvation! Its premise is, at once, the simplest and most profound of all: the working out of one's long-range destiny.

Salvation! is the brainchild of a Michigan-based company called Omni House. But to hear **CATHERINE GRIMSHAW**, its president, talk about the game, the whole idea was not really theirs at all.

"It sounds strange, but we really see ourselves as being only the 'carriers' of the idea," Ms. Grimshaw, of The Pointe, insists. "After all, real Salvation is a gift from God. All we can take credit for is trying to translate the teachings of Christ into as constructive and enjoyable a game format as we could. We hope we've succeeded."

Designed for people of all ages and sects, Salvation! The Game of Saints and Sinners, as it is officially titled, is simple to learn and easy to play. "straight-and-narrow" where little kindnesses like "giving up your seat on the bus" and singing in the church choir" will gain them single merits OR they may choose the more hazardous route "out in the world" where temptation and material rewards from such misdeeds as "shady real estate deals" and "political payoffs" are rampant.

There is also ample opportunity to do greater good along this path such as "raising funds to build a hospital wing" or "adopting an orphan" for considerably more merits in one's "eternal bank account."

As a player makes illegal money, he collects it from the stack on the gameboard. The bills, in \$1 million denominations, feature such telling phrases as "Almighty Buck" and "Root of All Evil" as well as a note that states emphatically: "You can't take it with you."

During the course of the game, a player can count his money but cannot keep tabs on his spiritual worth, since all "merit stamps" must be stored in small mailboxes labeled "Air Mail to Heaven" that may not be opened until Final Judgment at game's end. As a result, it is usually impossible to predict the winner of the game.

At the conclusion of each complete circuit of the gameboard, players draw from the "Signs in the Heavens" card deck. When the three main (or "wild") Sign cards have been drawn, with the sun, moon and meteor imprinted on their face sides, Judgment Day has arrived for all players.

The "Signs in the Heavens" reference is derived from New Testament scripture foretelling the end of the world (Luke 21). All key playing



points of the game, in fact, are based on passages from the New Testament including the entire underlying premise, paraphrased from Matthew 6: "Do not save riches for yourselves on earth . . . Instead, save riches for yourselves in Heaven . . . for your heart will always be where your riches are."

As Ms. Grimshaw asserts, the principle concern in devising the game was to make it fun, but it is her hope that, in some small way, playing Salvation! will be for its players "a reminder of the importance of maintaining a sound perspective of spiritual and temporal values."

To attest to their belief that they are only "carriers" of the concept, Omni House will make a donation to charity from the proceeds of each game sold.

In The Pointe area, Salvation! is currently available at Punch and Judy Toyland, The School Bell and Krieg's.
