Wildlife: Thriving, colorful part of urban community

Birds are king when it comes to citydwelling wildlife. Because Lake St. Clair is a major stop-over area for migrating waterfowl, songbirds and raptors, Grosse Pointers can see them by the hundreds as they fly north from their southern winter homes.

The open areas around Grosse Pointe are a perfect habitat for resident urban animals. The many trees are not only home to thousands of birds, but they also provide cover for numerous small mammals.

Raccoons, possum, rabbits and squirrels call Grosse Pointe their home. They

may burrow under trees or find more comfortable surroundings to have their voung in the spring.

These animals are a marvel to behold this time of year. They are vigorous and often colorful. Yard feeders not only attract birds, but squirrels and small rodents may pay a visit to the backyard as

While many residents may like the idea of having these small wild animals around, birds nesting in garages, possum making an attic their home and squirrels nesting under the back porch are more of a nuisance than guest.

Each day in the spring and fall, city officials are called upon to remove these

unwanted guests from a home. Traps are often provided at no cost to the resident, and the animal is removed and relocated without being harmed. Most people will do all they can to make animals more comfortable, but those who don't appreciate them can take a few simple precautions and avoid rodent run-ins.

Ernie Kafcas, a wildlife habitat biologist with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources at the Lake St. Clair Fisheries Station in Mount Clemens, discusses what people can do to encourage wildlife to come to their backyards, and also how to keep critters out of the garage and home.

Board will keep campuses open

While not taking any official action, the school board agreed Monday night with the Open/ Closed Campus Committee that there was no significant evidence presented to warrant closing campuses during the high schools' fourth-period lunch.

Board members heaped praise on the way students from both schools presented their arguments for keeping the two campuses open.

The board decided to look into the issue last year when the question of student safety was

The board took no official action since any move would be a change in policy. Board members agreed to accept the report as a first reading, and Superintendent John Whritner said he would be submitting the committee's report verbatim as his recommendation. The board will approve the policy change to accurately reflect the current condition at its May meeting.

A committee headed by Bob Welch, director of secondary cur-

riculum, wrote Whritner on March 21, stating that the committee was unanimous in support of keeping the campus open, but with several recommendations.

The recommendations from the committee called for changing the name of fourth hour to 'Open Campus - 4th Period Lunch" to accurately reflect the reality, since the period is the only time in which students may leave campus.

Continuous review of the policy was recommended by the committee as well. The committee views the open campus policy as a special privilege, and suggested that an annual report be made to the superintendent. It added that student associations should be actively involved in the review process and assist the administration in developing re-

"It should be well understood that if significant problems develop," the report stated, "the privilege may be placed on probation, suspended or terminat-

The committee also recommended that each high school develop procedures for dealing with students who abuse the open campus privilege and develop a system for monitoring students whose parents do not wish their children to excercise the open campus privilege.

Each board member commented positively on the Open/ Closed Campus Forum held on March 2 at North High School.

They said the students handled themselves as adults, presented their case very well and were a credit to the school sys-


The annual school election is set for Monday, June 13.



Park council approves Jefferson development

Staff Writer The Park council gave the green light Monday to a proposal by David G. Miles and Beachum & Roeser for development of property on Jefferson between Nottingham and Westchester. The development, to be started late this summer, will be two one-story office buildings totaling 11,000 square feet and costing \$1 million.

The Miles/Beachum/Roeser proposal was the second choice of the city's Downtown Development Authority. The DDA's first choice was a proposal by Hilberry & Bologna for a 30,000square-foot \$2.5 million develop-

DDA Chairman Mike Maher. at Monday's meeting, said that, because the Hilberry project could not be started as quickly as the Miles/Beachum project, the DDA had changed its recommendation.

"The DDA reviewed six development proposals," Maher said. These two met the criteria for parking, for conforming to the

master plan of the DDA, for compatibility to the neighborhood, for commitment of funds and for starting dates.

"When we take out the firm commitment to a construction date, we now recommend the Beachum/Roeser project as the best one," he said.

In a letter to the council, David G. Miles, president of David G. Miles, Inc. said that financing is firm and the developers are prepared to close on the purchase of the property as soon as the city grants a building permit and removes the underground storage tanks that remain on the property.

The council gave unanimous approval to the proposal, and the approximately 50 spectators at the council meeting applauded.

The council also approved a bid for \$6,350 by the Oscar W. Larson Co. for removal of fuel storage tanks located on the site. According to Administrative Assistant Jeff Mueller, the Larson Company indicated that they could complete the job of removing the fuel tanks by Friday

Dealership hit again

When spotting the car, the man, described as a black male in his door to the Grosse Pointe Park 20s, about 5 feet, 11 inches with a medium build, bailed out of the car and fled on foot.

The car was still in drive and continued south, though slowly,

and bumped into the patrol car. Police gave chase, and later called in tracking dogs, but were

unable to find the man. Caretti said neither car was damaged.

"It is probably the same person," Caretti said.

In the previous incident, a Beretta was driven through the large overhead door and extensively damaged and then abandoned. A Corvette was then driven through the same door, and later found being driven by two women in Pontiac.



Park activity center closer to reality

The Grosse Pointe Park Foundation has donated \$175,000 for the restoration of the old Windmill Pointe Park bathhouse. Plans are to make the historic building into a year-round activity center.

Groundbreaking could be as early as June 1, according to Robert J. Hutton, foundation president. He also said the work should take about 90 days and could be completed by late this summer.

The activity center is the first project of the foundation, a private organization.

"The foundation was founded late in 1984 under Mayor (Matt) Patterson," Hutton said. "It is intended as a permanent organization which we hope will accumulate money over the years to do things to add luster to Grosse tion of doors on the lake side Pointe Park and the communand a cement patio overlooking

John Stevens Associates, Inc., an architectural firm, has prepared plans for renovation of the building. The activity center will include new offices for park supervisory personnel as well as improvement of the existing

The historic building includes a walk-in fireplace and a twostory beamed ceiling.

"We will preserve the fireplace," Hutton said, "and the old beams will be touched up. The renovation will provide a good view of the park and visibility of the lake and boats. This is very important to foundation mem-

He said the old building has high windows and no view of the lake. The plans include the addi-

The plans also include a new heating plant, air-conditioning, new lavatories, a small kitchen, a new entrance, revised parking facilities, and offices for park employees.

Hutton said the foundation has solicited money for its projects through several direct mail campaigns. "During '85, '86 and '87, we made extensive efforts to get Park families to participate with anything from \$25 to \$1,000. Verheyden's Funeral Home gave us a lot of help by financing three direct mail campaigns.'

The center will be named the Jean and Charles Tompkins Activity Center in honor of the \$50,000 gift for the remodeling of the building that was donated Charles Tompkins.


Good news! Bryant to run for 10th term

or most Grosse Pointers, the announcement by Ren will Bryant Jr. of Grosse Pointe City that he will run for re-election to the state House of Representatives this year is good

The Grosse Pointe Republican, already the dean of House GOP members, will be seeking his 10th consecutive term of service to the people of this community and the state as a whole.

In our view, it is especially important that Bryant remain on the job in Lansing at this time. He has been one of the strongest foes of proposals to put a cap on spending by local school districts and has opposed other legislation that would be harmful to the Grosse Pointe district's efforts to maintain the excellence of its educational programs.

In his announcement, found elsewhere in today's Grosse Pointe News, Bryant raised for the second time the possibility that he might run for the Republican nomination for governor the next time around. Two years ago he took what he called "a seri-



ous look" at that possibility, but eventually ruled against it on the grounds that 1986 was not the best time.

He said then that after William Lucas switched parties, he saw difficulties for himself in any campaign for the GOP gubernatorial nomination in view of Lucas' all-star media status and the fact both he and Lucas were moderate Republicans from Wayne County.

Yet Bryant did play a role in the GOP gubernatorial contest in 1986 by endorsing then-Rep. Colleen Engler on the grounds that she was "the best qualified candidate" and the GOP challenger with "the best chance" of beating Democratic Gov. James Blanchard.

Well before he made his endorsement, Bryant had revealed that Engler had talked with him about the possibility of becoming her running mate as the GOP lieutenant governor candidate in the event she won the primary. That choice is made by the GOP convention and the nominee for governor after the primary. Lucas was nominated and Engler was selected as his running mate but they were overwhelmed by the Democratic ticket in November 1986.

But 1990 could offer better prospects for Bryant's candidacy, should he decide to pursue it. He is highly respected in the Legislature and his 18 years of service there have earned him positions as GOP leader, now GOP leader emeritus; vicechairman of the powerful House Taxation Committee, and member of the Education and Urban Affairs committees at various

In addition, as one of the acknowledged tax experts in the Legislature, Bryant proposed both the income tax rollback provision and the tax amnesty plan that were accepted in 1986 by the Democratic state administration and adopted by both houses of the Legislature.

But, as he says in his announcement, at this point he regards his possible candi-

dacy for governor in 1990 as a long shot that he will examine closely. He said he doesn't know if anyone would be interested in his candidacy nor does he know whether he could go through the grueling two-year campaign for the job.

Publicly, however, he has become increasingly critical of the governor's policies, especially in two areas in which he has long experience and great expertise, taxes and education. In view of the fact he speculated about running two years ago and now brings up a possible 1990 candidacy, we think he now is giving the race serious consideration and awaiting reaction to his hint that he might run.

For the Pointes, Bryant is a lonely Republican. He is the only elected Republican serving the traditionally Republican Pointes in county, state and national lawmaking bodies. He has seldom been challenged in party primaries and has consistently won re-election with large majorities. In 1986, he was re-elected by a 13,473 to 4,504 margin over his Democratic challenger, Nancy Resowski.

So for the present, Grosse Pointe's youthful legislative dean, who still is only 50, has offered himself for re-election and for continued service to the community that has sent him back to Lansing in nine straight elections. Even though the primary and the election are far distant, we believe he once again will win strong support in the Pointes.

Pointe forester a good idea

ver the years, the municipal governments in the five Pointes have learned to cooperate in many ways. Now the Grosse Pointe Shade Tree Council is proposing another worthwhile joint effort to benefit the entire community: the hiring of a forester to battle the tree problems that beset the Pointes.

In a letter to the mayors and councils of the five Pointes, the shade tree council proposed that the five municipal governments share in the cost of funding a full-time professional forester who could supervise current insect and disease control programs and also serve effectively in public relations and community coordination ef-

Overall, the cost of the service would be \$42.890 under the specific plan proposed by the shade tree council, with each community paying a percentage of the total based on its area. To date, the Shores is the only municipal government to have accepted the proposal and to agree to fund its share of the cost, just under 5 percent of the total, or \$2,100.

The other municipal governments are currently studying the proposal and their costs which would be \$15,900, or 37 percent of the total, for the Woods; \$10,892, or 25 percent, for the Park; \$10,721, or just under 25 percent, for the Farms, and \$10,721, or 8 percent, for the City.

Just a year ago the shade tree council alerted the Pointe governments to the new threat posed to Pointes trees by the invasion of the gypsy moth which has been tracked in small numbers over the entire Pointe area. At the same time it advocated a coordinated control program which, it claimed, would be much more effective than having each city or homeowner try to control individual infestations.

In this year's letter, the council warned against other infestations by insects and diseases and not only advocated hiring a single professional forester to direct control efforts, but recommended a specific firm for the job. It is Metropolitan Forestry Consul-

tants of Ann Arbor, which currently serves 45 clients in the area, including the cities of Dearborn, Ferndale, Huntington Woods, Plymouth, Southfield, Sterling Heights and West Bloomfield Township.

The widespread loss of trees in the Pointes and elsewhere in Michigan and the Midwest caused by Dutch elm disease offers sad evidence of what can happen to tree populations struck by such a devastating attack. Efforts by the municipal governments in the Pointes, as well as by individual property owners, have helped to alleviate the damage and spur needed reforestation, but community-wide efforts could do more to protect us from future onslaughts.

In its recent letter, the shade tree council said that many of the treatments for the new environmental problems are coming under strict control by the Environmental Protection Agency as well as the state government. It warned that the "end result will be that all communities must become very knowledgeable about pesticide safety in all manner of treatment, both public and private." In short, governments involved in such protective efforts will need professional advice.

True, municipal governments in the Pointes face many demands for public services and cannot meet them all. But surely efforts to protect our own environment ought to be high on each government's list of priorities for the future. So we hope each of the Pointe councils gives strong consideration to the shade tree council's request.

We lack the expertise as to what needs to be done or who should do it. But it makes sense to coordinate the entire Grosse Pointe community's efforts through one professional who would have the unofficial advice of the Grosse Pointe Shade Tree Council as well as the help of city officials in devising programs to protect all the trees in the Pointes insofar as that is possible.

Tthat we're down to the Final Four in the 1988 presidential derby, political experts are concentrating their gaze on the New York presidential primary next Tuesday.

Then we may learn whether Gov. Michael Dukakis of Massachusetts will continue to be the strong front-runner for the Democratic nomination or whether once again the Rev. Jesse Jackson will blunt Dukakis' revived hopes by a strong showing in the New York delegate contest.

Jackson's triumph in Michigan's caucuses had raised his followers' hopes that he might go all the way but the Wisconsin primary, while giving Jackson some white support, proved that he finds it difficult to win primaries when a large proportion of white voters participate.

However, Jackson still figures to be a convention factor, regardless of what happens from now on. Should he win in New York, as some of his supporters think he could do he would revive the Democratic dilemma. It is whether a ticket that includes Jackson can really win in Novem-

The third Democrat still in the race is Sen. Albert Gore Jr. of Tennessee, but many believe he now is running for the vice presidential nomination or getting an early start on 1992. Vice President George Bush rounds out the Final Four with the GOP nomination already in hand.

If the Democratic dilemma could be settled by a majority of Democratic leaders, Dukakis no doubt would emerge as the nominee. Unfortunately for them, however, the voters may well give Jackson enough support to enable him to make a legitimate claim to a place on the ticket. For the Democrats, there then would be no way out except to accept their inevitable





I am not expert on aesthetics or traffic safety, though some things are so elemental that it takes no special qualifications to comprehend them - like the need to keep automobiles that are out of control out of the lake. But I do know something about suicide, having specialized in that grim subject, and having directed a national study of physician suicide for the American Medical Association. I also have practiced psychiatry for 33 years in the Pointes, where I have treated more than a few would-be suicides who have been plucked from Lake St. Clair or pulled back from its edge by our vigilant police or concerned passers-by. Thus I feel qualified to comment on opinions quoted in the Grosse Pointe News proposing that, since suicidal people will manage to kill themselves eventually, there is no point in trying to stop them. Nothing could be farther from the truth.

Suicide is almost always an impulsive act generated by despair, usually regretted by the suicidal person who survives the attempt. A suicide method which does not allow time for intervention or second thoughts, such as a gun, a high building - or a drive into an inviting lake all facilitate the suicidal impulse. But a moment's hesitation may dissuade the attempter. Even the pause of parking and scaling a barrier might be enough. An obstacle that appears difficult to overcome may discourage the attempt, sparing not only the life of the would-be suicide but also those of bystanders who, your paper reports, are sometimes jeopardized by autos heading lakeward.

Once halted, the suicide may be persuaded to get professional help. Though it is no cure-all, psychiatric treatment almost always relieves, at least temporarily, the depressed mood which precipitated suicidal despair. While treatment does not guarantee that relapses will never occur, it often abates the mood disorder, giving time for other beneficial forces - the concern of friends and loved ones, improved circumstances, etc. to come into play. It is not only nihilistic but also dead wrong to advise "just letting them go.'

I have never forgotten one drowning about ten years ago. Early one morning a young physician, who had worked all night at a downtown hospital, was brought into Cottage Hospital's emergency room. Wet, and without pulse or respiration, he had driven, apparently intentionally, into Lake St. Clair at the foot of Newberry Place, just past the end of the barrier guarding the curve where Lakeshore Road begins. The doctors worked over him for a long time but finally had to quit since his heart could not be made to beat. My son, Hal (now a prosecutor in Denver, but then a college student working as a summer orderly at Cottage) helped in the lifesaving attempt, watching with growing despair as the young doctor's life slipped away. He told the sad tale when he came home late from the hospital, too distraught to eat breakfast. He could not understand the lack of a barrier to keep cars from plunging into the lake. Ten years later neither his incredulity nor mine has diminished.

I hope that a study will be done, and quickly, not a study to find out if a barrier is needed - that is obvious - but a study to determine what kind of barrier would best prevent other needless deaths, not only suicides but also accidental ones.

A final comment on aesthetics: it should be noted that a railing or other barrier would block a motorist's view of only a narrow strip of water at the seawall, hardly an inspiring sight at best, since it often is covered with flotsam. (Besides, the driver should be watching the road.) The more elevated viewpoint from houses along the lakeshore would be obscured even less. Pedestrians could easily see over any barrier even the most enthusiastic safety nut might place there. With a little planning (the Grosse Pointes' cadre of nationally respected architects and planners might help) it would be possible to develop a promenade that would enhance the attractiveness and usefulness of the lakeshore for all of our citizens, whose pleasure would surely be heightened by the knowledge that no one had to die to make it possible.

Living in the city with our furry and feathered friends

For most city dwellers, the song of a cardinal or gold finch early in the morning is much better with coffee than, say, J.P. McCarthy asking for winners and losers on his radio program.

Birdfeeders and a suet bag are a great way to attract songbirds. As long as there isn't a cat which can reach the feeder, bird lovers can enjoy their feathered friends year-round.

Ernie Kafcas, a wildlife habitat biologist with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, said that providing natural food for birds and wildlife can make any yard a haven for many animals.

"Birds are tops on everyone's list," Kafcas said, "especially in winter. As long as they are not creating problems, they are nice to listen to, beautifully colorful, and many people associate spring with the song of birds."

Many birds, including pheasants, do well around the Detroit metropolitan area, Kafcas said.

"If people are really interested in providing habitat and food for birds, they can leave a couple of rows of corn in their garden in the fall," he said. "Even sweet corn. People can plant fruit-bearing shrubs like the autumn olive, Siberian crab, honeysuckle or dogwood. All these are fruit-bearing and also have beautiful flowers and color throughout the year."

Kafcas recommends checking with a local nursery to find out which types of plants will do best in the light and soil conditions of your yard.

Shrubs are important in providing proper habitat for small animals. Shrub rows provide nesting areas and travel lanes.

"They can travel safely from food to their nest," Kafcas said. "The one thing that animals don't like is if they have to stay in the open for too long. Providing cover is the number-one thing people can do to attract animals."

Birds have different feeding levels, Kafcas notes. Mourning doves and juncos, for instance, are ground feeders. They will happily eat the remains of food knocked to the ground by chickadees, nuthatches and woodpeckers that like to feed above the ground.

"Thistle feeders are ideal for this," Kafcas said. "You can hang them from a branch or place them on a pole to keep the birds from coming in contact with a cat.

"It's nice to have a regular old box bird feeder too. Cardinals, chickadees and blue jays will use them all the time."

A resident must decide what his tolerance for wildlife is.

"One must also decide what his neighbor's tolerance is too," Kafcas said. "You may love the call of a blue jay first thing in the morning, but it may just drive your neighbor crazy."

While most bird lovers tend to despise cats because of their Sylvester and Tweety image, Kafcas said they are not always a threat.

"If strays aren't fed, they are potential threats," he said. "Pets that are taken care of and fed regularly are not usually a problem. Often they are declawed and don't pose a threat. If they do continue as a problem, you can scare them or chase them away."

Raccoons, possums and skunks are frequent city dwellers, along with a variety of rodents, such as the weasle-like vols, mice and rats.

"These can get into your garage, garbage or your home and really be pests," he said. "Raccoons like to get into cracks and crevices and bats and rabbits will too."

Kafcas recommends checking around the house every year to look for ways the animals can get in.

"Openings around windows will make a perfect place for wasps to get in," he said.

"Take the time to screen off an area or caulk seals, and they won't be a problem."

In the spring, animals are looking for a warm, dry place to have their young. Squirrels will try their best to get into an attic or under a porch.

"It just takes a little common sense and a little time and you can enjoy wildlife on the outside, and not have to worry about them coming in."

Using a bungee cord to keep the lid down on a garbage can or placing a couple of bricks on the lid will keep most persistent raccoons out.

Each spring, says Kafcas, his Mount Clemens office is flooded with calls from residents with wildlife problems.

"Usually they answer their own questions," he said. "I ask them how the animals are getting in, and they say, 'through a hole.'"

Because of a shortage in manpower, the DNR doesn't respond to animal complaints. They will field and answer questions. Kafcas notes that most municipalities have an animal control officer who responds to complaints. Cities also will provide traps to capture nuisance animals.

Most small animals and birds are peaceful throughout most of the year. They will become aggressive during mating and nesting periods to stake out a territory and protect their young. Most animal bites occur when the creatures are provoked or cornered.

"Figure it only takes a robin 20 days to hatch young and 20 days until the young leave the nest," Kafcas said. "This is a relatively short period in which one might be bothered by a mother robin bombarding someone for getting too close to the nest."

Though not usually permanent residents, hawks, owls and other raptors will visit this metropolitan area.

"They generally use the same major migration routes that waterfowl use, which brings them to the Lake St. Clair area. Coopershawks, sharpshin, kestrels and, occasionally, owls will come into this area. Screech owls may make an urban setting their home."

Kafcas reminds people that raptors are natural predators of rabbits and mice. They are the natural biological control on these smaller mammals and are friends of man for this reason.

For those along the lakeshore, muskrats can be a problem in the early spring. Kafcas said that they burrow into the banks and usually only come out at night to feed.

"In the early spring, they are anxious to eat some green vegetation. They are likely to come up on a lawn to nibble on some fresh green, tender grass. Once the aquatic plants start to grow, people aren't likely to see them again until next spring."

What most people who live along the lake love to see are the waterfowl. This area is a major migration route, so people can see herons, egrets, terns and black crowned night herons. Also any of a variety of ducks, cormorants and loons can be spotted, especially in the early spring and mid- to late fall.

"Loons will usually only stay for short visits," Kafcas said. "Almost every North American species of migratory bird will come through this area."

Those interested in learning more about wildife and its relationship to urban areas should check the libraries, Kafcas said. He recommends any of the Petersen or Golden Press identification guides for birds, mammals, amphibians, insects or wildflowers.


"You can learn a lot through these books and others about constructing bird boxes or planting the proper shrubs and bushes to attract wildlife," he said. "There are many ways to get involved. Grosse Pointe has its own Audubon Society chapter and there are many private organizations as well."



Johnny Adams volunteers in Jane Pattinson's first-grade class at Maire and in addition to helping children learn to tie their shoe laces and tell time, recently baked bread with her class.

She too, knows her students appreciate her work - "They hug me when I get there, and they hug me when I leave."

Like Munro, volunteerism is also in Adams' blood. Her parents were missionaries, and with five children, volunteerism is inevitable. She headed up Girl Scout troops, and chaperoned on field trips while her children were still in school.

"You can't just take things out," she says. "You have to give something back." Adams gets back a great deal, she said.

"You can't do it in one article on one page, but the feeling I get is wonderful. It's a great sense of satisfaction,"

Nixon also sees the program as being good for public relations, because when the schools need a millage vote, those involved with the system will see the need.

She said there is a need for more senior men, because only five of the 50 or so senior volunteers are men.

Adams' advice to anyone who is hesitant: "Try it, I think they would find a great satisfaction.'

line had been done successfully in Chicago." The distinctive line drawings with the whimsical big-nosed muse are done by Gary Holme, a commercial artist in California who works for a division of J.

Walter Thompson. "We sent him photos of everything and between the three of us, came up with the sayings," Holme said.

The first line has 24 designs geared to birthday and friend-

"We originally came up with 200 ideas, so we have quite a few at this point," he said.

Future cards will include get well, anniversary, congratulations and thank you greetings. Holme said cards will probably not be aimed at seasonal holidays, like Mother's Day, since cards that don't sell are returned to the manufacturer.

"The biggest problem we have is getting enough people out to sell it," Holme said. "We have two salesmen besides myself and we can't get to these stores fast enough. It's something the retailers were really waiting for."

Holme has also negotiated a deal with Detroit Metropolitan Airport to attract the tourist who doesn't want an ordinary postcard. But the biggest distributor of the cards will be Ludington News, which has about 2,300 outlets in the Greater Detroit area as well as Port Huron and

"We came up with this idea of having Ludington deliver," he said. "We had the wholesaler in place and we didn't want to compete with our clients for advertising dollars.'

The Holmes' main business is Rising Publications which they

started three years ago. They are newstand consultants and they sell magazines to Ludington.

Holme said that with so many magazines published today, the business is extremely competitive. He is, in effect, a magazine's agent.

"It was an untapped niche in the market," he said. "Regional magazines up to now had been dealing with the wholesaler."

Holme, who graduated from Florida Southern in Lakeland with a degree in business finance, went to work for a distributor that was a division of Hearst Magazines. He worked in Houston and Ohio and returned to Michigan to start a business and do regionally what he had been doing nationally.

He and his wife Diane are

both 1977 graduates of Grosse Pointe North. Diane, who is halfway through earning an MBA at University of Detroit, had to put her education on hold when the card business became an instant success.

"I have taken over a lot of responsibility (with the business)," she said. "It's very exciting. I have learned a lot more than I could learn in a classroom.

"It's changed my life a lot," she added.


The couple lives in Grosse Pointe Woods with two dogs and a house and garage filled with cards and card racks.

Come May 10, thousands of older Americans will descend on Detroit for the national convention, the first to be held in the Midwest. And we're not talking a few

thousand here. We mean 30,000. Something of that scope is monumental to organize. Staff for the American Association of Retired Persons has been hard at work signing up the likes of Sarah Vaughan, Sen. Donald Riegle and Dr. Ruth. They contracted for the use of Cobo

Join the organization? Ask a volunteer. Find your way around Cobo Hall? Ask a volunteer.

All the nitty-gritty details of the weekend are being handled by volunteers, signed up and whipped into shape by (volunteer) Alice Hak of St. Clair Shores.

Hak is the assistant state director for AARP, with direct jurisdiction over the 12 local chapters east of Woodward. She reached that point almost by accident.

"I planned my retirement for a long time," she said. "I was talking about doing a lot of traveling."

She and a friend joined AARP for the travel opportunities, but Hak soon found the chapter needed help. "They only had \$1.25 in their treasury," she said. She suggested they hold a bazaar; they suggested she be the chairman — and she was on her

"It kind of grew on me," she said. "Before I knew it, I was the assistant state

Hak is used to organizing things. She has been president of her chapter and continues to serve as chapter travel chair. But this convention is pretty big.

Convention organizers are doing their best to out-perform last year's convention in Anaheim. That means trying to attract more than 30,000 convention-goers. And that means hundreds of volunteers. In fact, Hak and her six sub-chairmen have attracted 400 willing helpers, so many that they are parceling them out to other committees.

The 30-year-old organization is pushing 30 million members, approximately 2,500 of whom live right here in the Grosse Pointes, Harper Woods and St. Clair Shores. Thousands of retirees have already signed up for the convention; organizers are asking people to register early to avoid the rush.

Almost all of the events are free. Many of the speakers have stood the test of time, having appeared in previous years at other AARP conventions. Dr. Ruth is always standing room only. Sarah Vaughan is already sold out.

Speakers will address the AARP's main issues: health care, insurance, finance, employment and other retirement issues. And organizers believe younger people caring for older family members will also be in-

Hak knows she's excited. She has already served as a delegate to an AARP convention, but the organization likes to spread participation around and has rules against being a delegate twice in a row.

Obviously, AARP has no trouble attracting activists. "Senior citizens are pretty willing workers," Hak said.

"I kinda like it. You meet so many wonderful people from all walks of life. Every one of the people I've met put their heart and soul in it. They work harder than they did when they were working.'






Special Writer Most of us have tried at one time or another with varying degrees of success to grow avocado or grapefruit trees from seeds we happened to have, but how about trying our greenthumbed hands at something a trifle more ambitious? Bananas and pineapples make very decorative houseplants with showy foliage and, with patience and luck, edible fruit.

It is really surprising that bananas seem to have escaped notice as houseplants, since they are very fast growers and have leaves anywhere from one to three feet long of a deep forest green sometimes edged with red. When you have a flourishing banana plant new leaves may emerge at the rate of six inches per day, or more, during the growing season, which is almost alarmingly fast, but should de- tough little stem in the center. light the more impatient grower. The rise and the glory of American black churches

By Susan G. Foster Smithsonian News Service

Until the late 1700s, religious worship for blacks in this country was restricted - by law and hy social custom — to either segregated sections of white churches or to separate black churches under the guidance of white ministers.

Despite untold numbers of gifted black preachers, both male and female, none could boast a two formed The Free American congregation or church to which he or she could minister.

For years, Colonial black Philadelphians had worshipped with whites in St. George's Methodist Church, enduring not only the indignities of racism from the community at large but similar treatment from fellow parishioners. Then in 1792, the catalyst for a complete break from St. George's Church and a victory for religious freedom came in one highly charged moment.

The change would have a profound impact on American society, from the founding of churchsupported schools and universities open to blacks, to

1960s offered by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., to the basic freedoms that blacks now share with other Americans.

Philadelphian Richard Allen, a black Methodist preacher, had often talked of a separate church with his colleague Absalom Jones, a former slave with a devotion to the black community. Yet their plan lacked support. As an alternative, in 1787 the Society, a non-sectarian group aimed at fostering moral character and helping fellow members in need. The Society also served to unify blacks against injustices at St. George's.

One Sunday morning, white parishioners tried to forcibly remove Allen, Jones and others from a restricted area during prayer services. Their resistance to moving to the rear of the church culminated in a mass walkout by black worshippers.

They never returned. Within two years, Allen was preaching regularly in his own church, Mother Bethel, located in a converted blacksmith shop. Althe civil rights leadership of the though Allen remained a Meth-

odist minister, Jones' disillusionment deepened. He never returned to Methodism, founding instead St. Thomas Episcopal Church for blacks.

What Allen and Jones accomplished through their simple act of protest soon reached black communities in other Eastern cities. In 1816, Allen and four other congregations formed the African Methodist Episcopal denomination based in Philadelphia; Allen was elected its first bishop. Mother Bethel Church. now known as the African Methodist Episcopal Church, is one of the oldest U.S. black churches.

The religious conviction shown by black Philadelphians seeking to exist in an otherwise hostile environment bears more than a passing resemblance to that of their ancestors. Brought to America as slaves, they, nonetheless, held on to elements of African spiritual tradition while adopting the religious teachings of slave owners.

"This new religion, a blend of African religious traditions and Euro-American Christianity, fulfilled spiritual needs and provided stability within the confines of slavery," historian Edward Smith says. Smith organized the exhibition, "Climbing Jacob's Ladder: The Rise of Black Churches in Eastern American Cities, 1740-1877," on view through March 20 at the Smithsonian's Anacostia Museum in Washington, D.C. In that era, large numbers of blacks became Christians as a result of an intense religious "awakening" sparked by Methodist, Presbyterian and Baptist ministers.

Spiritual revivals stressed a religion of the heart rather than of the mind. Such emotionalism appealed to blacks, many of whom became preachers, and racially mixed congregations were commonplace, often including newly licensed black ministers. The Baptist and Methodist denominations, which flourished simultaneously, seemed especially suited to the social and

Black religious activity did in fact facilitate a conspiracy between city and plantation slaves led in 1822 by Denmark Vesey, an ex-slave in Charleston, S.C. Though it did not develop into a rebellion, Vesey and 36 co-conspirators were hanged. Nine years later, in Southampton County, Va., a rebellion led by Nat Turner, who claimed that he had been called to deliver his people from the bondages of slavery, resulted in the death of 200 blacks and widespread fear of similar uprisings.

When we think of the development of the black church, we don't tend to look to the South," Smith said, citing the secrecy of black religious services. But researchers have found record that show the establishment of visible black congregations on plantations in Virginia and South Carolina as early as 1756.

By 1860, blacks were represented in every Christian denomination in the South. The growth in black membership came in part with a second surge of religious revivals and the promotion of formal religious instruction. Christianization of slaves was advocated through prayer services supervised by plantation

The movement was so successful that black membership far exceeded that of whites in many churches. As early as 1838, for instance, black membership at the First Baptist Church in Richmond was nearly three times the

number of white members.

The Civil War's disruption of normal social order prompted the invisible congregations in the South to worship openly and independently. Moreover, black and white missionaries from the major denominations in the North simply trailed the Union armies into the South spreading the gospel and recruiting black converts. A number of black ministers even served as chap lains to Northern black troops.

Black ministers and their con gregations had new options fol lowing the Civil War. With the passage of new civil rights laws, blacks were able to compete directly with whites for govern ment jobs.

As the oldest institution in this country controlled by blacks, the church today maintains great following in the black community, Smith says. "Almost all aspects of black history have been influenced by the role of the church.'



Vegetarian dishes are tasty and good for your heart

These vegetarian recipes are 1 clove garlic, minced healthy for everyone. They are of 3 medium zucchini, thinly special interest to cholesterolcounters and diabetics.

Macaroni-Nut Casserole

A delightful vegetarian dish that only needs a platter of assorted fresh, crunchy vegetables to make an outstanding dinner! 1-1/2 cups elbow macaroni,

- cooked and drained
- 1 cup chopped walnuts
- 4 Tblsp. magarine, divided
- 3 Tblsp. flour
- 2 tsp. dry mustard
- 1/4 tsp. salt 1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 1-1/2 cups skim milk 1 cup shredded cholesterol
- free cheese 1/2 cup fresh whole-wheat bread crumbs (1 slice bread)

Combine macaroni and walnuts; turn into well-oiled nineinch square baking dish. In small saucepan over low heat melt three tablespoons margarine. Stir in flour, mustard, salt and cayenne until smooth. Gradually stir in skimmed milk. Cool and stir until thickened. Add cheese; cook and stir only until cheese melts. Pour over macaroni. Thelander upsets unbeaten player

ULS heads south for tennis opener

For the first time since 1979, the University Liggett School tennis team reigns supreme in the state of Ohio.

ULS, a powerhouse in Michigan high school tennis, went south to Cleveland for its season

University School, which has a dynasty in Ohio similar to ULS' in Michigan, has ruled the Knights since the interstate rivalry was paved in 1979. But

this time around the Knights think, if you talk to the guys displayed "perfect tennis" to upend the Preppers.

"University School is the only school we haven't beaten since I started here," said ULS coach Bob Wood. "For the first time since we began playing them, we beat them. It's a great feeling to beat a team of that caliber."

Not only did the victory mark the first time ULS beat the allboys school, but it also put Frederick Thelander, ULS' No. 2 singles player, in the record book.

Thelander used a barrage of backhands and forehands to tag previously unbeaten Clinton Nossel, 6-0, 6-0.

"It was incredible," said Wood. "Nossel is a senior and he has never lost a high school match. Freddie just played a great match and knocked him off."

John Yancey, who signed a National Letter of Intent yesterday to play tennis at Kentucky next year, drilled Carlos Fleming 6-3, 6-4 in No. 1 singles action. Sean Byrne, playing at No. 3 singles for ULS, took Andrew Rueb the distance and split sets in an aborted match. He took the first one 7-6 with the tie breaker going his way, 18-16. In round two, Rueb got the better of Byrne, 6-1. Bill Schervish, checking in at No. 4 singles, was defeated 6-1, 7-5 by Sarat Nal-

Anthony Abiragi and Doug Wood teamed up to beat the Preppers' No. 1 doubles team, 6-1, 5-7, 7-6 (7-2). Frank Karabetsos and Mike Niccolini were victorious at No. 2 doubles, 6-4, 6-7 (7-5), 6-4. At No. 3 doubles, Dike Ajiri and Gordie Maitland were dropped, 3-6, 6-4, 5-7.

Wood credits his team with perfect match play, but without a preseason trip to Florida, the odds of beating University School might have favored the Preppers.

"We knew we had a shot at them this year," said Wood. "I who went on that Florida trip, that they'd tell you playing five hours a day for two weeks really

made the difference. "We had to play perfect tennis to beat them, and we did," Wood

After disposing of Ohio's top squad, ULS battled another topfive contender, Upper Arlington and the result was the same - a 4-2 win.

"It was a big thrill to beat University School, but to follow up with a win over Arlington was as big a thrill," said Wood.

The double-victory gave ULS a record of 2-0, but it also shines a new light on Wood's program.

"We have never come out of Ohio undefeated at the start of the season," said Wood. "Now we are going to do what we can to remain undefeated."

With the schedule they have, that will be tough.

Yancey took on nationally ranked Sam Sebastian at No. 1 singles and split two sets with a 7-6 win in the opener, and a 6-7 loss in the second match. Yancey won the tie-breaker in the first match 7-5, but was nipped 7-4 in the second match.

"We were playing indoors so we were under some time restrictions and that's why they couldn't play a third set," said Wood. "This was some match though. It was great tennis for two hours and 10 minutes.'

Thelander continued to impress the Ohioans as he won 6-0, 6-1. Byrne bounced back from a defeat to whip his opponent, 6-4, 2-6, 6-2. ULS also racked up wins at No. 1 and No. 2 doubles.

"Winning like that will really boost our confidence," said Wood. The kids deserve a lot of credit for the hard work they have put in so early in the season. I just hope we can continue to win.'

ULS is ranked No. 1 in the Class C-D preseason poll.





T'ai Chi Chu'an is a unique system of exercise developed hundreds of years ago in China by Taoist monks.

The 108 basic moves or forms of T'ai Chi use every part of the body in a continually flowing movement. The exercise is performed in a slow, leisurely manner and becase of this, anyone can practice T'ai Chi safely.

The value of Tai Chi seems to stem as much from its psychological form as from its physiological effects. The fact that modern medicine is finding more and more connections between mental attitudes and physical health may indeed help explain the value of T'ai Chi, which has a tranquilizing effect on the emotions.

Probably the most difficult T'ai Chi principle for a beginner to follow is the one of complete relaxation. T'ai Chi relaxes your facial muscles, shoulders, abdomen, thighs, etc. All movements are geared to encourage relaxation. The weight of the body shifts continuously from one foot to the other. The end of each movement becomes the beginning of the next one, which conserves energy and produces a feeeling of tranquility and emotional security. It is a natural exercise program to promote flexibility and stretching.

The inner strength of T'ai Chi

At the heart of T'ai Chi is the Chinese concept of chi, a word of many meanings: air, vitality, spirit, breath, atmosphere and circulation. One T'ai Chi expert calls it "biophysical energy generated by respiratory rhythm."

Vital force seems to be a good definition.

Martial art form

T'ai Chi is also a martial art and the rhythmic moves, when done slowly, will tone the muscles of the body.

The routine incorporates rhythmic control of the body, while also developing mental control. According to the Chinese, the practice of T'ai Chi for 20 minutes a day over a period of years, can prolong youthful vigor and rejuvenate the body.

If you have an opportunity to rejuvenate the body and mind, why not try it?

Local classes are held at the Grosse Pointe War Memorial and taught by Carol Yamasaki and also at the Vital Options Exercise Studio by Sijo (Master) John Dayonot.

I'm personally enthralled with it because it's nonstressful, helps to create harmony, as well as balances and tones the muscles.

Valuable tips for young'uns

Proper diet is crucial for children

From the very start toddlers and young children are prone to skinned knees and other bumps and bruises, but something more vital than stocking up on Band-Aids and gauze pads is needed.

From the onset, a child needs the proper diet to "grow up big and strong like daddy." Diet, in this case, doesn't mean losing weight or trying to control it it's defined by proper use of carbohydrates, protein and fat.

According to Dr. George Kouskoulas, a pediatrician who did his residency at St. John Hospital, an active child needs to be nurtured with proper percent- tent is too much, but skim milk ages of calories.

"In an active child, 45-50 percent of the calorie intake needs to be carbohydrates," said Kouskoulas, who operates a private practice. "Twelve to 15 percent of the calories should be protein and 30-40 percent should be fat.'

Fat in a child's diet?

"Yes," said Kouskoulas. "Muscles use fat and carbohydrates as a source of energy. It's important for proper development of the child's body."

Some parents don't want to feed their kid(s) whole milk because they assume the fat conis not advisable.

"That's not a good idea," said Kouskoulas. "It's important to give them milk that is no less than 2 percent because they need the fat for neurological development.

Kouskoulas says that the formulas most babies are fed during the first 12 months, is a fortified diet that has all the right ingredients.

"The formulas do very well for most babies." Kouskoulas said. "Parents really don't have to worry too much about the diet part if they are feeding their child a good, proper formula.'

If, in the judgment of the parent, a child is gaining or losing weight at a fast pace, it is advisable they consult a physician. In most cases, the doctor can provide the correct procedures to assure the parent that the child is not in danger.

"There's an ideal weight chart in most pediatric offices that the physician follows," said Kouskoulas. "They all list an average weight and if the child falls into the average, they are generally OK. When they go over that average weight, we have to talk diets with the parents and hope we can control it.'

Many factors determine the route that is taken to retard the weight increase.

"Based on the age, weight and length of the child, we plug them into various mathematical equations to assess the type of diet they should be put on," said Kouskoulas, a Woods resident.

An active child will burn more carbohydrates and fat than an inactive child. Therefore, it is important to replenish the child's necessary requirements.

"If you know your child is active, they will expend approximately 60-80 percent of the carbohydrates and fat they have stored in their body," said Kouskoulas. "When this is the case, the parents will have to make sure they really increase the basic requirements.'

On the other side of the table, you may have an overweight child who still needs the basic percentages of fat, protein and carbohydrates, so what do you

"You have got to decrease the food intake," Kouskoulas said. "But when doing this, you have to make sure you don't cut back too far and lose the basic requirements."

As young children develop, the diet is vital. But, when adulthood arrives it is too easy to fall off the diet wagon.

"As you get older, it's very easy to skip your usual routine and contact with the carbohydrates and fat content," said Kouskoulas. "When that happens, many people turn to vitamin supplementation and if taken too often, it could decrease athletic performances for some."

It's not important to put a child into a fitness regimen, but it is significant to remember that they are prone to common injuries. Most of them suffer some type of injury, whether it's a scrape or a broken bone, but Kouskoulas warns not to be wor-

"Injuries happen frequently in younger children," he said. "Toddlers are just beginning to learn things and begin to explore.

"They have a tendency to pull things off a table or stove, or fall down the stairs," Kouskoulas added. "It's not because they aren't developing properly (in most cases), but it's caused by intrigue and not knowing bet-

Eating well and being active is a great combination for shaping a child's body, and most kids get their activity through a level of curiousity, said Kouskoulas.

"Diet is important, but curiousity seems to keep most kids quite active," he concluded.




