Grosse Pointe's marrying mayors enjoy uniting couples

Besides presiding at council meetings and representing their respective cities at official functions, mayors are called upon to cut a few ribbons, make a speech or two and occasionally — do some marrying.

According to Michigan law, mayors can perform marriages and charge for their services. City councils determine the fee that may be charged for the ceremony.

"It's a very moving experience to join two people in marriage," said Park Mayor Palmer Heenan. "It's a privilege to perform a service and to be present on one of the happiest days of people's lives. It's a joyful experience."

Heenan said he gives a brief sermon and does some advance counseling for those he marries.

"I'm an elder in my church and it's important to me that people be aware of the religious significance of marriage," he said. Heenan has married about six couples during his four years as mayor.

"One was a personal friend, an elderly lady," he said. "They were both in their

70s. It's the nicest thing that ever happened to me. I did it in my own backyard." He said the \$10 fee for the ceremony goes to the city, but sometimes people give

him more than \$10. He turns it over to the Grosse Pointe Park Foundation. Woods Mayor George Freeman said he performs about two marriages a year. He's

been mayor for nine years. "Most are situations where people can't be married in a church or don't have a

church. Sometimes they want the judge,

but she's not available, so I do it."

Freeman said he usually sits down and gets to know the couple before he marries

"I put time into it," he said. "I believe it's a serious thing."

Freeman has performed marriages at City Hall, at the Grosse Pointe Hunt Club, at Lochmoor Club, in people's backyards.

"One wedding I did this year," he said, "the young man married a girl from Brazil. When I did the ceremony, there was an interpreter for the guests from South America."

Grosse Pointe Mayor Lorenzo Browning said during his five years as mayor, he's never been asked to perform a marriage ceremony.

"If I am asked," he said, "I'd try to talk

them into going to a church. If I couldn't talk them out of it, I'd do it."

Shores President Gerald Schroeder does not have the authority to perform marriage ceremonies, since he is not a mayor.

Farms Mayor Joseph Fromm said that during his two years as mayor, he's performed about four marriages. He said they were generally second marriages - for people he assumes have no religious affiliation or who prefer not to be married in church.

"I like to make sure one of the two is a Farms resident — or their parents are. The marriage must be performed within the city limits, of course."

He did one at the War Memorial, he said, two in people's homes, and one in his backyard.

Kolt said they are making checks with other states to make sure that what boat owners say about where and how much tax they paid agrees with records in other states.

"We have reciprocal agreements with other states and we are making those checks," Kolt

State officials estimate that the state loses about \$20 million in revenue as a result of tax evasion and fraud. Michigan, says Kolt, leads the nation in boat registrations.

Another way boat owners try to avoid paying the full amount owed is by understating the value of the vessel when they go to register it with the Secretary of State. This is a common practice with automobiles as well, Kolt said.

The treasury does have ways of checking the sale price of a car with fair market values, and has been sending out letters to verify the sale price. The letter also contains information about fines for failing to pay the actual tax and penalties for fraud and tax evasion.

"We sent out 6,000 letters and received about \$1.5 million from people who had not properly claimed the relative exemption,' Kolt said.


Scott Gregory, owner of two Detroit marinas and a retail boat sales store, said that he has had no problems with people not paying sales tax.
"On the retail end, we make a

sale and collect the sales tax at the time of purchase," Gregory said. "There is no way you can get out of paying the sales tax. We record our monthly sales and then those reports are audited by the state.'

Gregory, a Grosse Pointe Shores resident, said he wouldn't ever try to put something over on the Michigan sales tax department.

"Those guys are like the Gestapo," Gregory said.

On-street parking in Village to be banned for one month

Shoppers in the Village will find on-street parking on Kercheval temporarily removed beginning Monday, Aug. 8 through Labor Dav.

The 62-year old water main servicing Kercheval from Cadieux to Neff will be replaced and from Neff to Lakeland, it will be abandoned.

Two-way traffic will continue through the Village area during construction, with the traffic lanes located from the center of the street to the curb at the north side parking lane. All parking lots and sidewalks will be accessible during construction. Signs will direct drivers around the construction area.

The existing six-inch water main is being replaced by a new

12-inch main, according to Chris Mathew, administrative assistant for the city. The old main has been a problem, she said. There have been 12 main breaks during the last seven years in the four-block stretch.

Mathew said that several of the associated valves are worn and deteriorated, making it difficult to shut down the main for repairs. The valves will also be replaced or renovated.

City engineer George Jerome anticipates the main will provide trouble-free service and improved water volumes and pressure for the commercial district, particularly for firefighting purposes.

The cost of the project, Mathew said, is \$175,000.

August 4, 1988 Rosse Pointe News Blood donations down in area; drives cancelled

A blood drive is taking place today at Georgian East Nursing Center, 21401 Mack, Grosse Pointe Woods, from 11 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Blood is scarce. Especially in southeastern Michigan.

That should be enough incentive to attract donors.

But blood drives are not popu-

The American Red Cross Blood Services, Southeastern Michigan Region, reports that blood drives at industrial and business sites are collecting a disappointing number of donations. Many such blood drives have recently been cancelled.

"We can't understand it," said Bob Batcher, director of Donor Resources Development for the American Red Cross in Detroit. "Collections at our donor centers have picked up, but they're bombing at blood drives.'

For instance, according to the Red Cross, a major Detroit business cancelled a scheduled blood drive last month. The projected collection was 450 pints of blood. At an auto plant drive last July, 20 pints were collected — from a projected 110 pints.

The American Red Cross, Batcher urged blood drive coordiencourage donors to keep their appointments, and to seek supworkers time off from their jobs to give blood.

According to a Red Cross Blood Services publication, 1,000 pints a day are needed to meet the needs of hospital patients in the five-county region of southeastern Michigan.

Elinor Barnowski, director of admissions and social services at Georgian East Nursing Center, said her goal is to collect 20 pints of blood today. "But we need more," she said. "My goal is to set a pattern: a community blood drive twice a year at Georgian East. It's part of our interest in the development of the community.

The American Red Cross regional blood services are financed by recovering expenses from the users of their services. The Red Cross charges hospitals a processing fee to cover expenses of recruiting, collecting, testing, processing and distributing blood and blood products. The fee is directly related to costs. Hospitals pass the charges on to the patient whose health insurance plan usually covers the expense.

The blood itself is never charged for, because it is a volunteer's free gift. The Red Cross collects blood only from voluntary donors.

Volunteers must be healthy. therefore, is sending out the Needles used to collect blood are message - is seeking volunteers new and sterile; they're used - is bending over backwards to once and discarded. The Red Cross emphasizes: Volunteers CANNOT get AIDS by donating blood.

According to a brochure put out by the American Red Cross, the average adult's body contains 10 to 12 pints of blood, which is continuously being replaced. Within a few hours, the volunteer's body has replaced the fluid loss from a donation, and the red cells are completely replaced within a few weeks. Healthy individuals can donate every eight weeks, up to a maximum of five times a year.

The blood is drawn from a vein in the volunteer's arm. The whole process takes about 45 minutes from start to finish, although the actual donation takes about 10 minutes.

The procedure consists of registration; a medical history; a check of the volunteer's temperature, pulse, blood pressure and iron level; the donation itself; a 15-minute relaxation period; and light refreshments.

There is a slight stinging sensation when the needle is inserted in the vein. This discomfort is minimal, according to the brochure, and no pain is involved after the needle is inserted, during the donation.

After the procedure, most volunteers can resume regular activities, but are advised to avoid using the donation arm to lift heavy objects for about four hours.

The newly donated blood is transported to a Red Cross laboratory where it is typed, tested and processed. It may be used as whole blood or it may be separated into various components (red cells, white cells, plasma and platelets.) One unit of blood can be used by up to four patients.

Today's blood drive at Georgian East Nursing Center is being held in the first floor lounge and library. Volunteer donors may call for an appointment if they wish.

Another drive is being held today at St. Sylvester Catholic Church, 11200 12 Mile Road. Warren. Blood drives will be held tomorrow at Meadowbrook Village Mall, 82 North Adams, Rochester, from 1 to 7 p.m. and at the VFW Harris-Kehrer, 1055 South Wayne Road, Westland, from 3 to 9 p.m.

Air-conditioned Red Cross blood donor centers are also located in Bloomfield Hills, Dearborn, Detroit, Livonia, Oak Park, Southgate, Sterling Heights, Roseville, Ann Arbor and Port Huron. Hours vary. Call 494-2800 for the nearest center and to schedule an appointment.






North counselor sues school district Former Grosse Pointe North

Counselor Judith A. Nearhood is suing the Grosse Pointe Board of Education as a result of the board accepting her resignation following hearings on the matter this spring.

Nearhood's suit in Wayne County Circuit Court seeks reinstatement, compensatory damages including back pay, punitive damages and attorneys' fees all in excess of \$10,000.

Tim Hefferon, an attorney handling the case with the district's law firm, Hill Lewis, said that it is too early in this case, which was filed in circuit court June 24, for him to comment. He said that there has been no written response as yet from the school district, nor has there been a trial date set.

"We will be contesting this case," Hefferon said.

The school board held several closed sessions dealing with the Nearhood hearing this spring. At the hearing's conclusion, the board determined Nearhood's resignation should be accepted and her employment terminated, Hefferon said.

Nearhood was first employed with the district as a North High School counselor in the 1986-87 school year. She had served 11 years at the Woodhaven School District.





In the county **Democrats** not so democratic

Tt apparently is up to Grosse Pointe and a few other Republican enclaves to Lkeep alive the spirit of political competition in Democratic Wayne County.

That comment is made after a review of the number of county officials who were in effect elected last Tuesday because they will have no opposition in November. Some incumbents got a completely free ride having had no opposition in the primary and facing none in the fall, either.

The worst example of lack of competition is in the contests for the 15 members of the board of county commissioners. In 11 districts, the Democratic nominee lacks Republican opposition in November and in the one district having a Republican member there is no Democratic foe.

True, there were Democratic primary contests in five of the 14 districts served by Democratic incumbents, the results of which were not available as these words were written. But nine commissioners



faced no opposition from either Democratic or Republican foes this year.

However, in the 1st District, which includes Grosse Pointe, Democrat David P. Cavanagh of Grosse Pointe Woods, who is completing his first term, will face Republican David Pochmara of Harper Woods in November.

In other county offices, there will be little competition in the fall. County Treasurer Raymond Wojtowicz and Register of Deeds Forest Youngblood faced no opposition in the primary and will face none in November. Neither Sheriff Robert A. Ficano nor County Clerk James R. Killeen will have GOP competition in the fall, assuming they won their primary contests. But Prosecutor John D. O'Hair will face competition from a Republican, Donnelly Wright Hadden, in November.

In the contests for the 38 House seats in Wayne County that will be filled in November, the Republicans did better. They have provided competition in all but four of the 38 districts and, in fact, are almost a cinch to elect several since three GOP incumbents are seeking re-election.

In the 13th District, Republican Rep. William R. Bryant Jr. of Grosse Pointe, who is seeking his 10th term in the Legislature, will have opposition from Katherine L. Barnhart, the Democratic candidate who was nominated without opposition on

The other two Republican incumbents seeking re-election in Wayne County are Reps. Lyn R. Banks of Livonia and Gerald Law of Plymouth. Assuming Banks won against primary opposition, both will have Democratic opposition in the fall.

Only five of 18 Michigan congressional districts had contested primaries. One was in the 13th District, which covers Grosse Pointe Park and the City of Grosse Pointe,

with the winner facing unopposed Republican John Savage II of Detroit. In the 14th District, neither party had a primary but Democrat Rep. Dennis Hertel faces no opposition in November, either.

It is true that lack of competition for an incumbent can mean that the public is satisfied with the official's performance. But when an incumbent is not challenged either in the primary or the general election, the public has little opportunity to review the official's record, aside from his own self-serving statements and advertising, which usually aren't much help.

Republicans, of course, do not want to waste their campaign money in districts in which they have little chance of winning. Instead, they prefer to use their funds where it will do more good. So they at least have an excuse for not waging political war on all fronts.

However, since the Democratic Partv maintains such firm control over the county, it owes the public more than subservience to office holders. It ought to make sure that it endorses only able and competent officials and challenges those who do not serve the public well. Unfortunately, there isn't much evidence the Democrats accept that kind of responsibility in Wayne County.

School financing still in limbo

ven though voters faced a number of ren though voters race a management issues involving Wayne County and its municipalities in Tuesday's primary, one proposal that had aroused statewide controversy didn't make it to the ballot and probably will miss the November election, too.

It is, of course, the proposal to revamp and reform Michigan's school finance laws which was studied by a special commission as well as both houses of the Legislature but failed to get the legislative support needed to put it on the ballot.

Now there is talk that a six-man conference committee representing the two houses will work during the summer in order to have a plan ready when the Legislature reconvenes in early September. But the Sept. 9 deadline for getting an issue on the November ballot apparently means that if the issue is to come to a popular vote in the near future, it will have to be t a special election early next year.

Even if the Legislature could quickly agree and the required two-thirds of the members voted to put it on the ballot, it would be difficult to put on the necessary statewide campaign in such a short time. Even buying the amount of television and radio time required would be difficult on short notice after Labor Day.

Press accounts indicated that before the conferees abandoned their effort to achieve agreement, they had agreed on the outlines of a plan to raise the sales tax from 4 cents to 6 cents, cut property taxes by \$1.2

billion and provide another \$500 million a year for K-12 schools. Under this plan, homeowners would be exempt from paying school taxes on the first \$20,000 of the market value of their homes.

The conferees apparently had reached basic agreement as well on requiring a "core curriculum" of basic courses, an annual report and a school improvement plan. But they reportedly bogged down on a proposal to require skills tests of pupils in order to get an endorsed diploma.

Another factor of critical importance to the Grosse Pointe district is the possibility of a cap on millage that would curtail spending in wealthier districts such as the Pointes. One plan calling for an absolute limit of 28 mills on local school property taxes would not reimburse wealthier districts for all of their property tax losses. The Michigan Education Association, which is supporting many elements in the tinancing reform, does not favor such a limitation and neither does the Grosse Pointe school board.

While it is disappointing that the legislators have been unable to come up with a plan that could be put on the ballot at least in November, approval of any proposal for such a massive tax shift to support public education in Michigan will be difficult to obtain. So no doubt it is better for the conferees to continue their studies and try to work out a compromise that could satisfy not only a majority of school people but the wealthier districts as well.

ticket geographically and ideologically.

In making that choice, the 27 of the 50 delegates who responded ignored the fact that the Midwest will not be represented on either ticket if Bush takes Kemp. In fact, supporters of Sen. Robert Dole of Kansas believe the GOP needs a Midwesterner on the ticket to offset the unhappiness of the farm belt with the Reagan administration's farm policies.

Kemp has other disadvantages as a vice presidential candidate. Kemp is a New York congressman and while Bush votes in Texas, he is a New England native. Does the GOP really want two Easterners on its ticket? In addition, Kemp is often viewed as a right-wing ideologue who would be unacceptable to middle-of-theroad Republicans.

The list of possible candidates is long but in Michigan Kemp ran well ahead of anyone else in the delegate poll. Howard Baker, the former Tennessee senator and White House aide, got five votes and so did Jeane Kirkpatrick, the former U.S. ambassador to the UN. Dole won only four votes and the rest on the list even fewer.

But will Kemp really be the choice? He did run second in the Michigan caucuses and his supporters feel he will appeal to the religious fundamentalists who backed the Rev. Pat Robertson. But a more important question is whether he would be acceptable to more moderate Republicans. And just how far does Bush think he has to go to appeal to the right wing of the

We apparently won't know until Aug. 17.

were watching CNN, the Cubs, 24-hour weather radar and HBO.


There was one cable into the house and into a small imitation was one, count 'em, one, cable to the television and that was it.

American proposals for international inspection of atomic energy developments were again rejected by Andrei A. Gromyko, the Soviet delegate. It was believed by the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission that Gromyko was serving notice that Russia would not accept any form of outside inspection within national frontiers. The Soviet delegate declared that the inspection was an infringement and that "no inspection as such can guarantee peace and secu-

In Rome Pope Pius XII advocated "just and durable" peace for Italy. The pope made his statement in his speech welcoming Enrico de Nicola, provisional president of the Italian Republic, and Premier Alcide de Gasperi, who paid an official visit to the Vatican. The Pope's appeal echoed the feeling of disillusion and the criticism that was then sweeping Italy after the publication of the draft peace treaty. His plea was based on moral grounds rather than political

considerations. In Berlin, the Soviet secret police, who detained two American officers 26 days after they had entered the Russian zone with out passes, accused the pair of being spies. The two were freed to American authorities, each having lost five to eight pounds. The two Americans, Cobin and Wyatt, stated that they had gone to Russia to visit Sachsenhausen, a former concentration camp, without the slightest idea that the Russians had reopened the camp and were using it to

Peridot is the traditional birthstone for the month of August. It is sometimes called "evening emerald" because it glows a brilliant green under artificial light. Gem peridot is transparent, ranging in color from pale yellowish green to deep intense green. Peridots of larger size are seldom found free of some kind of inclusion. One characteristic peridot inclusion is called a "lilli pad" because of it's resemblance of one.

Peridot has a background of legends. Ancient people called peridot "the gem of the sun" and believed that wearing a peridot would dispell evil spirits and chase away any nightmares. When crushed and inhaled it was used as a remedy for asthma

One of the earliest sources for peridot was Zabargad, an island in the Red Sea. The deposits were discovered there around 1500 b.c. The island was called "The Island of Serpents" because it was infested with poisonous snakes, making mining very difficult. The King of Egypt finally had all the snakes removed and forced the island natives to mine peridot for him. Today, very little gem peridot comes from Zabargad. The largest producer of gem peridot comes from the San Carlos Apache Indian Reservation in Arizona. Other sources include Norway, Brazil,

Because peridot is one of the softer gem stones, care should be taken when worn. Peridot should be kept away from heat of any kind and protected from sharp blows. Your jewelry should be taken to a jeweler every six months to be checked and professionally cleaned.



Presidential yacht

Sequoia, the 104-foot yacht that served eight presidents, will be in Detroit Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 5-7, as part of a fundraising tour of 120 U.S. cities. Free public tours will be available at Hart Plaza from 1-4 p.m., Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 6 and 7.

The yacht was designed by John A. Trumpy and built in 1925 for a private citizen. It was purchased by the Department of Commerce in 1931. It became the official presidential yacht in 1933 and was used by Presidents Hoover, Roosevelt, Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson, Nixon and Ford. President Carter sold the yacht in 1977.

The Presidential Yacht Trust acquired the Sequoia in 1981 and renovated it with privately donated funds. It was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1988 and will be returned to presidential service on Nov. 15.

A welcoming ceremony will be held at noon, Friday, Aug. 5, at Hart Plaza. The sevenmonth long 24-state tour is part of a fundraising campaign to pay for future maintenance and operation of the yacht.



Screeeech! Thud! Crunch! Those were a few of the sounds when 40 public safety

and fire officers from the Pointes and nearby communities descended on the Shores last week for an eight-hour rescue/extrication seminar held in the munici-

pal parking lot July 23.
Shores Public Safety Officer David Younk, who is also the department's emergency medical services coordinator, said that response from local communities was "just great."

The Shores is a state-recognized Southeastern Michigan Regional Training Center. Younk provides continuing education for emergency medical technicians, who must garner 30 credit hours in three years to renew their EMT licenses.

of classroom instruction and four hours of hands-on practical instruction," he said.

Only three of the five Pointes were represented at this seminar - the Shores, Woods and Park. Also represented were the Clinton Township, East Detroit, Ray Township and Warren fire departments.

Five junk vehicles were provided by Official Towing of St. Clair Shores. The cars proffered the officers with the chance to cut off roofs, bust out windows and use a variety of rescue tools in a training situation but close to actual conditions.

Woods Officer Sally Beghin and advanced medical techinican James Vowell provided the class-


"We provided about four hours room instruction. They led classes in administering to head injuries, spinal injuries, fractures and spinal injuries.

Younk and other officers led the practical instruction.

"We used all the various extricating tools and practiced removing people from cars," Younk

The tools include the Hurst Tool, commonly known as the Jaws of Life, a Hurst cutter, 4ton come-alongs and glass center punches and about two dozen other tools.

Though the need for these tools in the Pointes isn't as great as in some communities, Younk said it is imperative that local officers are skilled in their opera-



He feels that this crackdown may push people buying used boats back to dealers.

"When they buy a boat from a dealer, they know the tax has been paid and they also get a warranty," Gregory said.

Vincent LoCicero, a Park resident, lawyer and member of the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, said that some people try to avoid paying the Michigan use tax by claiming the boat is registered in Florida or another state, such as North Carolina where sales tax is minimal.

"Florida actually has a five percent sales tax," LoCicero said. "North Carolina, however, has a maximum tax that does not exceed \$300 or \$350."

LoCicero said that when one is considering the purchase of a \$500,000 boat, there is an incentive to avoid paying a four percent (\$20,000) Michigan use tax. Kolt said that the state is well

aware of this. Boats often carry the name of the port in which they are registered on the stern. "When we see a boat with a

Boca Raton, Fla. or Wilmington,

Del., on it, it's like seeing a red flag," Kolt said. Fred Schriever, vice commodore at the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, said he feels there will be

no effect on the club as a result of the state crackdown. "This shouldn't affect the yacht clubs," Schriever said. "This would only affect the boats

that come in for the summer for a short period." Schriever said the state does request a limited amount of information from the yacht club from time to time, and that in-

formation is readily available. "As long as you have paid the taxes and have an MC number, there is nothing to worry about," Schriever said. "I have four boats and pay \$150 to \$12 in taxes. There is no correlation between the numbers on the sticker and the registration slip. I think that the state has to tighten up its control here."

Children's Home hearing set

The Woods planning commission has again set a public hearing on an ordinance amendment which would allow an aftercare evaluation and counseling program at the Children's Home located at 900 Cook Road.

The home would like to incorporate an aftercare treatment facility for children in the Grosse Pointe school district. It is designed to be an aftercare counseling program used after a child has been in an inpatient treatment center for a chemical dependency.

It would not be a drying-out facility and would only treat those of high school age.

Representatives from the Children's Home board have been working with the planning commission and the city attorney trying to tighten the language for the proposed amendment to the zoning ordinance so only the Children's Home would be allowed to operate a program such as the one planned.

At the commission's June meeting, the proposed amendment was rejected due to the sweeping nature of the wording. The wording was such it would have allowed any building zoned as community facility to operate a similar program without going to the commission for approval.

Lawyers for the home and the city have been hammering out something agreeable to both parties, but they are getting closer.

The new wording would allow an outpatient chemical dependency program which would perform evaluation interviews and counseling programs, but not to include the dispensing of medication and when offered in conjunction with an existing residential treatment program administered at the same location by the same

midair. Miming, however, works with gravity and has weight in time and space.

Johnson said that much of the public's dislike for mimes is the result of seeing so many bad ones. The mime in the street is often nothing more than an actor. He follows somebody and imitates him, he said.

"Get the bad mimes off the streets and the good ones in the theater," he said.

Johnson's interest in acting began in elementary school. He grew up in Bloomfield Hills. His mother was an actress, his father a singer.

"I acted in the usual school plays," he said, "like "Lil' Abner" and "Music Man," but in high school we had a section on mime and it interested me.'

He graduated from Lahser High School in Bloomfield Hills and instead of attending Michigan State University as he had planned, Johnson decided to accept a scholarship offer at Wayne State University. He graduated from WSU four years later with a bachelor of fine arts. He also spent one year at L'-Ecole Internationale de Mimodrame de Paris, also known as Marcel Marceau's International School for Mime.

"We went to class six days a week with three mime teachers." he said. "We took classes in mime, ballet, modern dance, gymnastics, fencing, swimming and stage combat.'

Stage combat, he explained, is

staged fencing, working with batons and epees.

Johnson has also attended Marceau's two-week workshop every summer in Ann Arbor since it began in 1984.

In addition to doing commercials, print advertisements and industrial films, Johnson gives performances of his own oneman show called "Toma Mime Time." The show is booked in Michigan schools through the Attic Theater's Educational Outreach program and through

Johnson also does some of his Memories; The Hunter; and so own bookings.

He adapts the 35-minute performance to the age of his audiences. "I have one version for preschoolers to third graders, another for junior high kids, another for high schools, and one for adults."

The show includes seven or eight vignettes. He introduces some basic mime techniques, then does several skits that involve more character develop-

"In The Hunter," he said, "The hunter kills a bird, then becomes hunted."

Then he has a 10 to 15 minute question and answer session with the kids. "They ask me everything, including how much money I make."

Johnson did a show at Grosse Pointe North last year and he's planning a one-week residency at Trombly School in October.

The commercials and advertising work help pay the bills, he said. He is currently appearing in a public service announcement for the Michigan Department of Health for AIDS prevention. A woman dances from partner to partner, ending her dance with the Grim Reaper. Johnson is her second dance partner.

He recently did a print ad for the Chevy S-10 pickup, which will appear in automotive maga-

Johnson said he prefers working as a mime because he can be his own writer, director and actor. "I have total artistic freedom. I can comment on society." He said he's always working on a new vignette.

The art form, he said is a sort of international body language. "It's difficult to lie in mime. There's a lot you can't say, in mime," he said. "For instance, you can't say, 'My mother's brother is my friend.' But you can say, 'He is my friend."

Busses Child's play is serious and big business

On the Hill

...for more than 30 years, Punch & Judy Toyland counts among its clientele the children dren of the children it once served.

Fourth owner Kathleen Burke Harness, who bought the business two years ago, bubbles over with enthusiasm when she talks about the psychology of toys. A former teacher of the gifted and talented, Harness feels she has the best of both worlds.

"It's like being in teaching without all the homework. I'm still mixing with children and still mixing with adults."

Born and raised in Grosse Pointe, Harness taught at University Liggett School, St. Joan of Arc and in Pinckney, when her husband's job took them there. When he was transferred back to Detroit, she was hired to manage the store.

A year later, the owner asked her if she wanted to buy the business at 97 Kercheval and Harness said she began to laugh, because she felt she was too young. She bought it, however, and says, "It's the best thing that ever happened to me."

She says selling toys is "fabulous. People always buy for children."

Her store, she says, is unique because she carries toys that will challenge a child, not frustrate him or her.

can't compete with the prices and I don't have the space. It's not worth it. Most of them are not real quality or durable."

She cites several fad toys as examples of advertising overkill Cabbage Patch dolls, Teddy and, in some cases, grandchil- Ruxpin and Laser Tag. All are in different degrees of bankruptcy today, she said.

"What happened is they couldn't produce enough and the merchants said they didn't want them if they couldn't get enough and there were too many re-

That's the difference, Harness says. "We pride ourselves on our service and we know our customers and they know us."

The toy industry changed with the introduction of plastic, Harness said. She lists Little Tikes, a division of Rubbermaid, as an example of quality.

"They have a day care center next to the factory, so the employees' children are test marketing the products. The adults develop the products and the allow a child to sit down and crechildren are expanding them."

Harness caters to the purists who want wooden toys, classics like the ones they grew up with. Most of them are imports, she said, mainly because labor is cheaper in other countries.

One of the better wooden lines is Brio, Harness said, which uses the concept of building and adding. "Children have to use their imagination."

Lego is another company that's been around "forever and ever. They keep coming out with

"I stay away from TV toys. I $\;\;$ new ideas, like the space theme and castles and knights theme."

Dolls are always popular, Harness said. One of the best lines, Madame Alexander, is still overseen by its 93-year-old owner and chief executive officer, who continues to design dolls with six years advance production, Harness said.

She also carries Crolle, Pauline and Gotz dolls.

Harness said Punch & Judy Toyland offers service to customers, such as suggesting appropriate toys for a child and gift wrapping.

"Twenty years ago, we didn't have the mass merchants. People shopped in small specialty stores.'

Harness, who does all of the buying for the business also changes the window display. And she more than likely can be found on the floor waiting on people. "I like the sales end of the business," she said.

She believes in back-to-basic toys, like wooden blocks. "They

Georgette Asher Velez, who has worked in the Production Department since November, has packed in more living in a short time than most people will experience in a lifetime.

Velez began to get more involved with music and started taking voice lessons. She sang with the Houston Symphony Chorale and won a two-year scholarship to study music. She earned a certificate of music from San Jacinto College North and also had her first child dur-

ing this time. She was teaching piano at home. Through a friend from Argentina, Velez got involved with Spanish music. The two wrote a song which they performed on several radio stations. Under the name, Monica and Georgette, they performed locally Friday and Saturday nights.

When her husband, who worked for the oil industry, was without a job when the industry bottomed out in 1983, the couple decided to start a newspaper. They hought a Macintosh and

Baytown Local in Baytown, Texas. The staff was her and her husband "and whoever else we could get." They published for three months and had just begun to break even.

Then her husband was called back to work, she learned she was pregnant and they sold the business. After her husband's company closed, he returned to finish his degree at Texas A & M and they moved to Michigan where he is now working for the auto industry.







Once a farmer, always a farmer

Agricultural science is route to fulfillment

It's a long way from Sierra Leone to Iowa, but it's a trip that Kabba Jalloh is determined to make. The young man is getting some help from a friend.

The latest phase of Kabba Jalloh's story began when Grosse Pointer Kenneth Van Dellen got on the phone and started lining up promises of financial aid so Jalloh could study agricultural science. So far, he's come up with enough to get Jalloh out to Dordt College in Sioux Center, Iowa. Now he needs enough to keep him there.

Let's back up.

Kabba Jalloh is a student at Macomb Community College, a place he first heard of when he met Steve Ritter of Fraser, a Peace Corps volunteer in Jalloh's village. The two came home to Fraser to spend the Christmas holiday three years ago - and Jalloh stayed to study, living the whole time with Ritter's parents. Kenneth Van Dellen is a geology professor at Macomb.

Kabba Jalloh wants more than anything to learn modern agricultural techniques so he can go back to Sierra Leone and help improve farming there. "Agriculture is something I like," he said. "Most of the people in my country are subsistence farmers. using hoes and machetes. It's one of the easiest ways to make a living there, as there are not other jobs. This is a way to do something for my country."

Van Dellen, as an active member of the Christian Reformed Church, has taken an interest in Third World hunger problems. "Training their people is one way to help them with those problems," he said.

call led to the establishment of a fund to aid foreign students studying agriculture, with Kabba Jalloh to be the first recipient.

The fund already contains more than \$3,000, but at a private college, that doesn't go far. Jalloh has promises of part-time farm employment and a ride out to Iowa, but will still need help with tuition for the coming vears.

But he has already come a long way.

Times have been a-changing since Sierra Leone became an independent member of the British Commonwealth in 1960, and Kabba Jalloh's life has illustrated that. Centuries-old traditions have been falling in the face of modernity.

Jalloh is one of 200 children of the paramount chief of the Karanko tribe, one of 12 tribes in the tiny west African nation of Sierra Leone. He grew up living in a compound of clay brick and galvanized steel houses, his father's house in the center, the wives' houses around the periphery. Each wife had a piece of land to farm and his father took care of all of them.

But Kabba Jalloh's father was born in 1867. Muslim tradition then called for many wives, all from within the tribe. His sons, especially the younger ones, are turning to modern ways. Although many of them have three or four wives, Jalloh says his intent is to have only one.

"To have many wives, you must be able to feed them and clothe the children," he said.

When he was young, Jalloh helped his mother with the farming. His parents expected him to spend the rest of his life at it. But his older sister had other ideas.

A teacher, she wanted her

education is neither universal paid his tuition, bought his uniforms and his books.

Jalloh went to a primary school run by a missionary church, then to an Islamic high school. When he graduated in 1974, he couldn't afford to go to college, so he stayed in the same town, coincidentally living next door to a Peace Corps rest house, where he eventually met Ritter.

It would be stating the obvious to say that life in Michigan is nothing like life in Sierra Leone. The capital city of Freetown, where Jalloh lived for a year,

though it has some hotels and nor free. Kabba Jalloh's sister high rises, is only about the size of Sterling Heights. Located near the equator, most of the country is devoted to semi-tropical crops like rice, cassava, mangoes, guava, yams and peanuts.

> So why study corn and hogs in Iowa?

"Knowledge of the chemistry of plants can be applied when I go back home," Jalloh said.

"The college is willing to work with him on specific crops," Van Dellen added. "This is partly a matter of going where he could go. We believe the basic princi-

ples of agriculture will apply.

"During his senior year, Kabba will have to do a practicum. Then he can go with his direct interests. Maybe the college can connect him with a program in Louisiana."

Whatever the focus of his studies, Kabba Jalloh is certain that he wants to go back to his country. His friends and family are there, the culture is familiar. Going to college in the United States is occasionally a lonely

"Sometimes I feel isolated because of cultural differences," he

said. "I'm not complaining, but maybe Americans find it difficult to open themselves to people of other cultures. Making friends is hard because the life pace is so fast. Ours is more laid back."

So far, the fund for foreign students at Dordt has raised about \$1,000 from faculty and students at Macomb and \$2,500 from the DeVos family foundation. It is the time to harvest potatoes when the tops of the plants turn dark. Even though the potato is a staple food in a great part of the world it is a native of South America and was develtook for a potato to cook.

It was the Incas, too, who invented freeze-dried potatoes, and in South America the Indians still prepare them by laying potatoes outside on freezing nights and walking over them the next morning to squeeze out the water. By the time the Spaniards arrived in the 16th century, the Indians were cultivating several hundred varieties of potatoes, including some in shades of yellow, blue, red and purple.

By 1596 potatoes were all over Europe. The frontispiece of English botanist John Gerard's famous "Herbal" published in 1597 shows him proudly holding a potato plant. He called them "potatoes of America", but the first potatoes in North America were planted in Derry, New Hampshire, in 1719.

In 1630 there was a theory that eating potatoes caused leprosy, and their popularity understandably declined, but by the end of the century this had been forgotten and they were well on their way to becoming the food staple they are today.

In 1787 Marie Antoinette wore potato blossoms in her hair, and all the courtiers ordered china sets with potato blossoms painted on them.

Potatoes are related to eggplants, peppers and tomatoes, but the French name for potatoes translates to apples of the earth. Apples are quite different, but eties. A few years ago a man in Oregon decided to see how many varieties of apples he could graft on one tree. Since he lived in a city and had only a city lot on which to plant apple trees instead of the several acres he really wanted, he began collecting different varieties of rare, unique, heirloom and new apples and grafting them on a single

standard apple tree. When he stopped, after several years, his tree was bearing 175 different varieties, some very

old, from 15 different countries. Nearly all of them have flowered and produced fruit. In the spring the flower colors range from deep rose pink to purest white, and the apples themselves are of several colors.

In the Chinese flower calendar the flower for August is the pear blossom, symbol of purity and longevity, and in Japan the flower calendar departs from using a single flower and shows the crest of a hill with a full moon rising behind it, the symbol of midsummer.



The Pastor's Corner

Reach out for spiritual life

"Do any human beings ever realize life while they live it - every, every minute?" asks a young woman in Wilder's play "Our Town." Do you?

Spirituality is again "in," a rising interest of many folks - both the traditionally religious and untraditional or non-religious. This should not surprise anyone. In our secular age and a culture committed so feverishly to "selfism," to pragmatism ("what works") and to indulgence of our senses, many experience a gnawing emptiness and deepening cravings to "realize life" beyond the narrow confines of superficial living.

A recent phone conversation with a mid-30's single man dramatizes this need. He sounded troubled, pained "I've gotta talk to a pastor," he exclaimed. To paraphrase his story in brief, the young man shared: "I'm a yuppie; I've made it; I've got position, status and more money than I need; but I'm empty inside, confused, scared.

"What's it all about? It's so meaningless; I used to be religious as a kid, but dropped out in my teens. I've gone to counselors, but they haven't helped; I know the answer is at a deeper, religious level. That's why I called

Some two hours later, having explored the key deeper themes of his life's journey, the man ended our conversation in a hopeful spirit and with a commitment to search for and to find a meaningful spiritual life. Hurray!

"I must grasp life at its depth," wrote Van Gogh, the great artist. Indeed! Humans are created with an inevitable need for depth, for a life richly steeped in meaning and firmly centered in authenticity. We are emotional creatures, but can choose to repress and not understand our feelings. We are rational creatures, but can choose not to use our brains. We are physical creatures but can choose to not be bodily aware and unwittingly ruin our health. We are behavioral creatures, but can be defensive and not take responsibility for our actions. We are spiritual creatures, but can choose to be "faith-dead" and not "realize life."

Secular age or not, God persistently calls to every human soul and lovingly yearns to touch us each with a penetrating vibrancy. Spiritual life is the sum total of responses one makes to what is perceived as the inner vision, voice, or touch of God. It is not about being "religious," as such, but about living The Way, the integrative force affecting all one's daily choices and actions. Again, it is immensely practical.

Father Groeschel, in his recently published superb book, "Spiritual Passages, the Psychology of Spiritual Development," describes the "four voices of God" by which we begin our spiritual journeying: God as the One, the True, the Good, and the Beautiful. In order to realize life in its depth, we indeed need to satisfy our embedded spiritual craving for unity, truth, goodness and beauty. Christian faith community, when it is alive to spirituality, offers resources for satisfying these needs. Christian faith community helps people to "realize life - every, every minute."

Are you realizing life? Like the young man, commit yourself to practical spirituality.

Notes in a garden By Lymp 7

By Lynn Zwickey

From September 1959 to December 1972, Grosse Pointe artist, gardener, teacher and writer Lynn Zwickey served as editor of "Garden Pointers," the monthly bulletin of the Men's Garden Club of Grosse Pointe. Occasionally, those pieces were reprinted in "The Gardener," the national magazine for the Men's Garden Club of America.

The Grosse Pointe News is reprinting samples of Zwickey's "Garden Pointers," on an occasional basis. This one is titled "Reflections in a Garden":

I believe that in a temperate zone garden, the emotional impacts of time and time-awareness are potent conditioners of our reactions. Crocus in the spring is much more than crocus in the spring. It is a personification of spring itself, and by extension, of all experiences which belong to spring.

Some of these experiences are cultural ones; the emotional content of Easter, for example, becomes inextricable from our conditionings to spring flowers. It is easy to move from Easter egg to shape of tulips, or from thrusting spear of monocot to notions of birth, rebirth and resurrection.

Phlox and the ebullient annuals mean high summer, when the earth seems to lag and rest from the events of the swifter spinning calendar of spring. And fall holds back with anemones and late mums and lingering annuals against the inception of winter. Where there is witch hazel and Christmas Rose, even the winter months are spaced and measured toward snowdrop and vernal equinox.

There is thus ever the transitory against the permanent, the fading blossoms of lilac against the permanent root, and against the gardener's memory and the gardener's faith, which say "So it has been, again and again. So it will be yet another spring, and another and another . . .'

Nor does this exquisite time measurement stop at months and weeks. Days too are measured, and hours. There are the hours when dew is still wet and there is the curious hush before the first song sparrow sings, and the sudden explosion of the new sun. Then there is the lifting of the leaflets of oxalis. And the opening of morning glories. Day blooming water lilies, hemerocallis, catenanche and sundrops mark their special hours. And the closing of each of these marks its own hour. This is also the hour when the hummingbird visits the monarda. And later there is the moment when nicotiana opens and delivers its scent for the delight, most explicitly, of night-flying moths, but incidentally of man.

Perhaps one could make a time system for a garden that would serve almost as well as a watch. True, there would be days when one or another pointer would swing too fast or too slow. On a cloudy day, the morning glory waits until adequate light triggers the opening of its exquisitely tender trumpets. But might we not say that this is real time and that the other, the mechanical time of the impersonal watch, is an illusion only. Which system would the bee choose, or the butterfly, or the hummingbird?

When contemplating the possibility of relocation, review all the financial implications of such factors as state income tax rates, utility costs, property tax and even climate. In addition, find out if the community offers retired individuals discounts on transportation, heating oil, pro-

pety taxes or entertainment. Another way to stretch your fixed income is by being aware of and planning to minimize

your tax liability. Retiring usually results in a substantially lower income and, thus, lower tax rates. But don't forget that pension income and IRA withdrawals are taxable. Take out too much money in one year and you may end up paying more taxes than you anticipated.

If you are a middle or lowerincome retirce who does not itemize, you may find some relief in tax reform. The new law has replaced the extra personal exemption for individuals who are 65 or older, or blind, with an extra standard deduction of \$750. for single individuals and \$900. for married individuals. The amount of the additional deduction doubles for those people meeting both age and blindress requirements

A game for the kids

Little League baseball is a great way for many kids to spend the summer.

They get ready by pounding a ball into the mitt, oiling the glove, buying new batting gloves and polishing the spikes. Many of them are too innocent to understand the winning and losing aspect of it, but in the long run the game is for the kids' wellbeing - not winning or losing.

Winning and losing can distort a young child's mind. They shouldn't be told that winning is great, but that losing is just as important. A lesson can be learned through both routes, but possibly a bigger lesson is learned through competing.

Some coaches enforce winning, while others stress fundamentals, while others simply want the kids to play. PLAY. Nothing more but play and make sure you are giving "your all."

I learned early on that giving it 100 percent was vital, not winning. I was educated quickly that going 0-for-3 was OK if you knew you gave it your best shot. Nowadays, the theory of having fun seems to be avoided. Last week I watched a little league game in which the coach pulled a kid off the field after committing his third straight error. For one, the kid was embarrassed. Two, he was probably frustrated as to why he came off the field. And three, why would a coach do that?

Learning by example is what these kids need. They need to make mistakes in a world that dictates perfection. They need to discover faults, and work on them. They need to be disciplined, sure, but not embarrassed to the point of tears.

It was very frustrating for me to watch that boy pull his glove off, take his hat and stick it into his mitt, and then sit and watch the game from the end of the bench. I don't think the coach realized what was going on, because winning seemed to be all he had on his mind.

At the end of the bench sat a very intimidated boy. A boy who looked forward to playing, with the risk of embarrassing himself. But, a coach mentoring 9-10 year-olds shouldn't let learning stand in the way of winning. Band-Aids were made to cover cuts, casts to imobilize broken bones, but what do we have to cover the humiliation that boy now feels?

It's a shame that boy didn't finish the game. As he sat bewildered, I wanted to walk over to him and tell him he did fine something the coach should have done. I wanted to give him a hug and tell him that perfection is something we can only strive for, but yet it's intangible. Learning by mistakes is a positive route to learning; whether it applies to sports or life.

That's the same type of confidence which lifted Challenge '88 into the Cup to begin with.

"You need confidence and a good crew," said Uznis. "We are fortunate to have both."

Detwiler isn't racing, but he is faithfully backing Challenge '88's bid to strip the Canadians of the Cup.

"I feel confident the Cup can be won by them," he said. "I think we pushed them very hard. They were up to the challenge, and more."

There is an observation platform at the top offering a spectacular view of the islands and Lake Erie. On a clear day you can even see De-

Europe has soccer, history flavor

Soccer players from the Pointes invaded France and England for 16 days of glory

Sixteen days of glory is synonvmous with the Olympic Games, but it may also be tagged to the Grosse Pointe soccer players who traveled France and England this summer.

Led by Coach David Backhurst, who coaches both the girls' and boys' soccer teams at University Liggett School, 19 players and one manager headed for the wilds of Europe on July 8 and didn't return until July 23.

"It was a great 16 days," said Backhurst, who organized the trip for the second time since 1985. "The kids really experienced a lot of things and overall we did plenty in two weeks."

What they did in two weeks was adhere to a very busy schedule. One day it was a bus tour of London. Another day it was a 4 a.m. trip to Abbey Row. And on Bastille Day, they watched firecrackers being launched from under the Eiffel Tower. In between avoiding firecrackers the size of dynamite, and watching Englanders drive from "the wrong side of the car," the congregation played in seven soccer games.

"The intent to go over there and play soccer was not foremost for us," said Backhurst. "We wanted to experience the culture, history and then the soc-

Not only did Team Michigan have to break language barriers throughout France, and decipher some English dialects, they had to learn a new style of soccer from the hometown roughies.

"Their brand of soccer is so much different from ours," said John Karabetsos, who will be a junior at North this fall. "We had trouble adjusting to their more physical way of playing."

Many lessons were learned during the games, and for Larry Ayuyu, a different style of play from the Britons was most impressive.

"Most of the time they tackled cars; enabling a 10-year-old and they came up with the ball," he a 13-year-old to see some action. said. "Here (United States) when a person attacks a player with the ball, chances are the attacker doesn't end up in control of the ball."

Roughhousing wouldn't properly define the play Team Michigan saw, however.

"They were very well schooled in fundamentals," said Mike Niccolini. "They were very sound fundamentally.'

Frank Karabetsos, who will attend the University of Michideal from the abrasive play, but he wouldn't say it was a game filled with cheap tricks.

Everything they did was good, clean and hard," he said. 'There were no cheap shots. It's just a different game.

After adjusting to a brand of game unfound in the States, Team Michigan settled in and played to a record of four wins and three ties, including a 3-3 tie with the London champs of the 19-and-under division.

They did it by playing a finesse game, but when the irregular style was needed, they changed gears. The caliber of teams they faced was undoubtedly some of the best, but for every six tough teams there has

In a game in France, Team Michigan scored goals as quickly as the assembly line pumps out

Berc Backhurst, the youngest player on the trip, scored a goal, and Jeff Backhurst, 13, stopped an attacker with a heady tackle. (The score was so bad, that the players never revealed it).

'You hear so much about how big and how good these teams are," said John Karabetsos, "that you really start to worry a bit. But after a while, you see that they are no bigger, or better than you are."

Culturally, the players experigan this fall, learned a great enced complicated subway systems, they tried to see each cathedral and building with a unique eye. Numerous photographs were taken, and a barn dance made its way into the hectic schedule.

"It was a great opportunity to go to Europe and see what we did, and do what we did," said Niccolini. "You never know if you'll see it again or not."

Just look in a history book. "They (sights) were things I see in my history book," said John Karabetsos. His brother Frank, who went on the trip in '85 to West Germany, Switzerland, Austria and France, agreed.

"If you missed something you may not get another opportunity to see it or experience it again," he said. "Culturally, I believe we got a lot out of it."

The history books covering France and England cover Eiffel Towers, Big Ben, Paris and Bobbies, but in comic books and newstands soccer fills the pages from cover to cover.

"We went around with some English kids and they were entirely engrossed in professional soccer," said Backhurst. "If you were to take all the energy put into the Tigers, Pistons, Lions and Red Wings, and combine it for one sport (soccer) that should give you a great indication of how much energy the fans put into their soccer."

In the United States, professional soccer leagues are virtually unheard of. In England, not having soccer leagues is unheard of.

"Throughout England we saw young kids outside playing soccer, not just kicking a ball like you see here," said Niccolini. "Over there there is a lot more support. We saw some die-hard pro fans, and around here you can't even get the scores of

"There's several levels of pro soccer out there that you really don't have to a superstar to play at a professional level," said Frank Karabetsos.

Each player funded his own trip, which cost \$1,400. Included in the package was travel, two meals a day and lodging. Lodging, while done at "two-star" hotels and several bread and breakfast places, enabled the Americans to get a vintage look at how the other half lives.

"Really they do the same as we do," said Frank Karabetsos. "The English have big breakfasts like we do and their lifestyles aren't different. Just their

A memorable trip, to say the least, is something these players will start putting together an album. They will recall the beautiful sights, the wonderful soccer fields and magnificent ambiance that France and England emit, but more vividly will be the bumps and bruises.

"We learned plenty," said Niccolini, "but what I think we'll all try to remember is the style of play they showed us. We'll have to adopt that sort of play around

Either that, or update the passport and return to Europe. Don't think that's not possible: Backhurst is already in the planning stages of a third trip.

"I've got five ideas, but we'll just have to wait and see," he concluded.

Mackinac race challenges singlehanded sailors

This year's 10th annual Port Huron to Mackinac Singlehanded Challenge ended up being a 10-second knockout for most of the fleet. Although the previous nine challenges have seen nearly all of the weather and sea conditions that Lake Huron has to offer in mid-June, there has never been a sustained on the nose beat for almost the entire event.

The first 40 miles toward Goderich were dead down wind in 15 to 20 knot southwest winds. When the leading boats were approximately 10 miles from the turning point, the predicted cold front came through and the winds shifted to the north.

As the spinnakers came down and head sails set for the anticipated 15-25 knot headwinds, beats started to become overwhelmed as the winds continued to increase into the 35-knot range with gusts up to 45 knots. Seas started to build up to seven feet, with an occasional nine or

During the first eight hours, most of the fleet was encountering mechanical problems and for a few skippers, some deep anxiety. Many boats dropped out by Goderich, including Dave Evans' Ratso, which lost her mast.

Approximately 20 of the 31 starters rounded Goderich and continued on a starboard tack back across the lake in the direction of Harbor Beach. The winds were dead on the nose out of the north-northwest and continued to blow all of the first night at 30-35 knots.

Some of the skippers were unable to fly headsails because of mechanical problems or reluctance to being out on the foredeck with seas frequently breaking over the bows. Just before sunrise the next morning, the winds settled down to about 20 knots, but stayed in the north. After crossing the lake, more yachts that were nursing damaged riggings, sails or serious skipper fatigue, dropped out of the race at Harbor Beach.

Twelve or 13 yachts were still size boat Michigan Division slugging it out and were now for long. Around mid-morning, the winds were back up to 30-35

Ten or 15 miles northeast of Harbor Beach, the top of Blair Arden's Otis B Driftwood's mast struck the side of a freighter, dismasting the boat.

For the remaining yachts, the beat went on into the second day and night and the third days, up past Thunder Bay, Presque Isle and into northern Lake Huron. 'The Dead Pool' is fifth Dirty Harry

In his fifth turn as Dirty Harry Callahan, Clint Eastwood is as slick and as stonefaced as he ever was. With an arsenal of one-liners to complement his 45-magnum, there's nary a villain who's a match for Mr. Homicide on the San Francisco beat.

For sheer enjoyment and vicarious satisfaction of one's sense of justice, there's nothing like a "Dirty Harry" movie. Indeed, "The Dead Pool" is full of good guy vs. bad guy, and Harry vs. The Establishment confrontations. That's what viewers want, expect, and get from each of the films in this corius

Viewers also expect a little more, however. They expect a solid storvline and a believable conflict for the lead figure. In each of the first three films but most especially in the fourth - Harry was in conflict with a part of himself and the world, to say nothing about the scum he was hunting down.

In "The Dead Pool," much of Harry's inner conflicts and personal politics are gone. What's left is an almost comic-book approach to the character; an approach that was used much more appropriately — and successfully in "The Gauntlet," a parody of Dirty Harry pictures. If this picture is any indication - and it obviously is - the original intent of the series is receding from view as quickly as the star's hairline.

Here, Harry is trapped in the middle of a macabre game; the winner being the participant who predicts the most deaths of famous people. Harry's name is these films.

There's not much suspense here, only the question in the back of the viewers' minds about who the shadowy killer really is. Viewers who have seen even one of the previous films will have a pretty good idea of how Harry will finally track the killer down, and what will happen when he does. There's something reassuring about the methodic structure of the solutions in

Much of that comfort with the plot is undermined though, with the treatment of Harry. He no longer seems like the renegade noncomformist he was in the early days. By now, he's become

a media hero and a public relations tool for the department. He doesn't like it, but he doesn't do

much to run away from it either. There's a parallel here with how audiences at the theater

have begun to see Harry. Instead of cheering for him for his unique perspective to law enforcement, people are waiting to see what his "line" for this movie will be. There may be a certain enjoyment in doing, that but it's hardly as satisfying in the long run.

"The Dead Pool" is not a bad film in any sense. Those who've never seen another "Dirty Harry" picture before will be hard placed to find any glaring faults with the movie. But those who have seen any or all of the others will be somewhat disappointed with the shifted focus in priorities

Film classic 'Manchurian Candidate' enjoying revival

For the best movie around, don't miss John Frankenheimer's "The Manchurian Candidate," a riveting political thriller. Locked in Frank Sinatra's private vault for 25 years, it is now enjoying a nationwide revival.

Whether by chance or plan, much of the plot revolves around presidential election and convention, ironic timing, in this election year.

That is not the main thrust of the story, however. Basically it is about brainwashing by the enemy, among friends, in families and even between lovers.

Based on Richard Condon's novel of the same title, it tells the story of Raymond Shaw (Laurence Harvey) a Korean war hero. He is regarded by the men in his platoon as "the bravest, kindest, warmest and most wonderful man I've ever known" and they recommend him for the Medal of Honor.

Actually none of it is true. The truth is Shaw's platoon was captured and flown into Manchuria where they were programmed by

Chinese to give this answer whenever they are questioned about Shaw. Yet in each of their minds, there remains a nagging reservation about their former leader.

In a chilling scene, we see the platoon in a Manchurian amphitheater. It's a strange situation where the men think they're listening to a lecture on the care

and feeding of hydrangeas. What's really happening is Shaw is being trained to become a cold-blooded killer and top political assassin.

The shocking deeds performed by Shaw in the session are wiped clear from the men's minds and also from Shaws'. With no memory of what has transpired, he becomes a perfect tool of the enemy.

In his nightmares, Sgt. Marco (Frank Sinatra) keeps seeing the hydrangea lecture turn into an assassination briefing. When he
