

Woods has best crime record in tri-county area

the past few years, Grosse Pointe Woods had the fewest major crimes per capita than any city of 10,000 or more population in metro Detroit.

The Woods' top ranking is based on the FBI's 1989 Uniform Crime Report released last week.

"That's great news," said Woods Mayor George Freeman. "We've got a great public safety director. He's got to get the credit for it. We're lucky to have (Public Safety Director) Jack Patterson.'

Freeman also credited the "efficient" public safety officers.

In November 1988, the Woods was rated the safest among 40 metropolitan Detroit communities by a Detroit Monthly article, which was based on the 1987 Uniform Crime Report.

The Woods had 210.59 major crimes per 10,000 residents in For at least the second time in 1989, according to the Uniform Crime Report and population figures compiled by The Detroit News, published Aug. 5.

> The only other city in the Pointes with more than 10,000 residents - Grosse Pointe Park - ranked 18th among the 59 communities in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties listed in the FBI report.

The Park ranked 17th in 1987 among the 40 communities reported in the Detroit Monthly article.

According to more recent population estimates for 1989 obtained by the Grosse Pointe News, the Park actually ranked 17th with 383.67 crimes per 10,000 population. Also based on

School board, Farms council to meet Aug. 13 re: new library

On Monday, Aug. 13, at 7:30 p.m., the bell will ring signaling the second round of the Battle of the Library.

In one corner, the Grosse Pointe school board, armed with updated plans for a library on the grounds of Brownell Middle School.

In the other corner, the residents of the area around Brownell whose loud opposition swayed the Grosse Pointe Farms City Council to deny approval for the first site plan in March.

In the months since the rejection, the school board worked to answer the concerns voiced by the residents.

The new proposal calls for the 48,000 square-foot building to be placed 110 feet from the curb of

Chalfonte, an additional 48 feet ball diamonds and two soccer back from the original proposal, which residents said was too close to the street.

The access drive connecting the Brownell parking lot and the proposed library parking lot was eliminated, again because of residents' concerns. There will be 207 total parking spaces, the ma-traffic predictions from the first jority of which are behind the school.

oods burglar narrowly capture escapes

A burglar was almost caught by Woods police Aug. 5 after he had broken into three homes.

The thefts and near-capture occurred in the southwest section of the city which has been plagued by burglaries since April.

The thief was almost caught when a resident of a home in the 1700 block of Stanhope saw someone walk past her bedroom window twice at about 3:18 a.m. She thought it was the paperboy, but when she walked into the adjacent bedroom, she saw a man crawling out the bedroom

window. Police responded to the bur-

glary-in-progress report and saw the suspect running south on Eastbourne from Stanhope. All Grosse Pointe Woods cars and units from other nearby police departments joined in the running south through yards on Prestwick from Eastbourne. He

was not seen again. At the scene of the burglary on Stanhope, police found a purse on the ground outside the bedroom window the thief entered. The purse, however, did not belong to the Stanhope woman; rather, it belonged to a woman in the 1700 block of Littlestone.

A Woods officer went to the home on Littlestone and informed the resident that he had her purse and that she may have been the victim of a burglary. The resident discovered that her search. Homes in Pointes are blue chip

Psst. Looking for a good investment? Buy in Grosse Pointe. It's better than blue chip stock.

While rising home values are the bane of property owners come tax time, they are a windfall when it comes time to sell the house.

Many owners build up equity over the years and have a nice nest egg built up for retirement. Others buy and sell within a couple of years, realizing sometimes fantastic appreciation in home values.

Take for example the home in the 1000 block of Beaconsfield in Grosse Pointe Park: After just half a month the owner sold for \$32,000 more than he paid for the house, which worked out to be a 30.5 percent increase in value.

This case, taken from a computer printout of home sales in the Park during an 18-month period from March 1988 to September 1989, is a bit unusual and the circumstances of the quick resale are not known, but other examples from the Park are just as impressive.

More than 500 transactions were recorded during the 1 1/2year period in the Park. Other interesting sales were:

• After 3 1/2 months, a house in the 1300 block of Cadieux sold for \$96,300, resulting in a gain of \$18,300, or 23.5 percent.

• A house in the 1200 block of Yorkshire was purchased in January 1988 for \$170,000 and sold 15 1/2 months later for \$239,000, a gain of 40.6 percent.

• A home in the 1300 block of Balfour was sold after a year for \$180,000, an increase of \$34,000, or 23.3 percent.

• After 10 1/2 months, a home in the 500 block of Pemberton realized a 31.6 percent gain when it sold for \$125,000, an increase of \$30,000 over the original purchase price of \$95,000.

According to average home sales prices compiled by the Grosse Pointe Board of Realtors,

the average home selling price Kotzian said of investing in the in the Pointes in 1989 was the average price of \$170,591 in 1988.

Tom Kotzian, executive officer of the Grosse Pointe Board of Realtors, cautions that while the appreciation figures, such as those experienced in the Park, are impressive, they don't indicate whether the buyer originally got an exceptionally good price on the property to begin

Also, many owners may have to put a lot of money into fixing up the property, so the amount of profit made on a deal is less than the difference in the buying and selling prices.

Nevertheless, money can be

"There's probably no better market in all of Michigan,"

Grosse Pointes. "Grosse Pointe is \$188,466, up 10.5 percent from an excellent place to live, both for the amenities and appreciation of property values. I can't think of a better community around.'

He said there is a lot of investment activity in the Pointes. Investors get a good deal on a property, fix it up and sell it. While the buying/selling figures from the Park don't indicate how much profit each seller made, the figures are indicative of the general trend of rising home values in all the Pointes.

Kotzian further said that there's a lot of Grosse Pointers who are selling and buying else. where in the Pointes. "We get a lot of people who are moving up, not out," he said.

Concerning value appreciation, Kotzian said, "I don't think we've peaked out yet."

America was always in the back of Paul Brinkman's mind when he was growing up in New

Now, on a trip that has taken him across the country and will take him back around, Brinkman is rediscovering his roots and the country he considers his homeland.

"It's the big overseas experience all New Zealanders take when they're young," Brinkman said. "Most New Zealanders' idea of the overseas experience is to go somewhere and stay with friends or relatives and sponge for a while then go home. And most of them go to England, where their roots are. I'm doing it differently.'

Indeed he is.

He is traveling by van, going where his whims take him, with no set plan. Secondly, he is not planning to stay anywhere long enough to wear out his welcome.

And lastly, he is traveling alone, in the wheelchair that has been his constant companion since a rock-climbing accident 10

"I turned 30 and I had this big midlife crisis," he said, only halfjokingly. "I kind of wanted to get out.'

Other things were falling into place. He quit his job. Then to save money he sold his flat on one of the better streets in his city and moved in with a friend as he worked as a freelance accountant.

"I thought, 'I have no ties other than family, I'm fit now, I'm healthy, I may never get a chance to do this again," he said. So he packed up his stuff and took off for the United States.

After a week in Hawaii, Brinkman flew to California where he bought an old Volkswagen van, specially equipped with a sink, a stove, a refrigera-

tor - "everything but a toilet." Because Brinkman cannot use his legs, he had to have the van altered. After comparison shopping, he took the van to a garage where the mechanic — who was also in a wheelchair — refused to take any money for the parts or his labor.

"That was really nice of that guy, but my trip's been like that the whole way," he said. "Out of some of the worst situations I've

met some of the nicest people." There was the time when he had stopped to take pictures of some picturesque abandoned buildings in the middle of the Mojave Desert. When he was done with his roadside excursion. his van wouldn't start.

Miles from anywhere, at 8:30 in the evening, Brinkman decided he would stay the night, then set off first thing in the morning to get some help.

He didn't quite make it to morning. He was awakened by a bright light, when his eyes adjusted, he noticed the man holding the light was also holding a shotgun.

After explaining his predicament, the man helped Brinkman determine what was wrong with the van, then took him into town where they had breakfast and bought the necessary part. The man gave Brinkman a 12-hour tour of the area before returning to the van which he helped fix.

Then there was the blowout in South Dakota, which was made worse when he discovered his spare was flat, too. Two couples on motorcycles — whom he had said hello to at a gas station a few miles back — pulled over when they saw him stranded at the side of the road, took the

spare to the gas station where they filled it up with air and helped him change it.

"I don't think I've learned to relax yet," he said. "I'm particularly vulnerable as a tourist, because I'm aware that I'm not certain where I am. I'm either driving or I'm looking at the sights.

'I'm doing this alone because I wanted to show people - and myself - that I could. The minute I say I have a companion, people will automatically assume that he or she did everything for me. It's also a freedom of the mind thing, I can go whatever direction I want for however long I want."

Highlights of the trip so far have been the Hoover Dam, Devil's Mountain and Chicago, although he says he felt more alone in the middle of a crowded street in Chicago than he did alone on the middle of the interstate.

He has slept in his van in supermarket parking lots, camp-grounds and even on the side of the road, pointing out with pride that he hasn't spent one night in

"If everything was laid out in five-star hotels, this trip wouldn't mean as much," he

said. "I would not have the same

sense of accomplishment." The trip has been a dream since he read "Blue Highway," a book about William Least-Heat Moon's search for the real America in a similar trip. Moon, an

through the Midwest in search of a "poetic experience," Brinkman said, and his trip was a disappointment.

Brinkman's trip is anything but a disappointment.

"I'm almost certain I never would have been able to do this trip in New Zealand," he said. "The people here are just so open and so friendly. I love that. At home people are sort of cold and don't let you get to know them. I had always remembered Americans as being really nice, but I couldn't tell if that was how I remembered it or if it was just in my mind.'

Brinkman lived in Grosse Pointe until he was 10 years old when his parents decided to pack up the family and move to their native New Zealand.

He showed up at Curl and Ed Tutag's house in Grosse Pointe Farms one day last week, much to their surprise. The Tutags, his godparents, hadn't seen him in nearly 20 years, except for a short trip Curl had taken to New Zealand several years ago. They didn't even know he was in the country.

"It's very weird coming back," he said. "It's almost like a dream. The place really hasn't changed that much in 20 years. It's a lot like I remember it."

While in town he also stayed

at the home of Red and Anne Browning, the parents of his best friend during childhood.

"We never had friends in New Zealand like we had in Grosse Pointe," he said.

Brinkman has been in this country since May 13 and isn't planning on going back until the end of October, when he will be the best man at his brother's wedding. By then he may decide to settle in the States.

"This is a once-in-a-lifetime trip," Brinkman says. "I'm lucky to be able to do it. I've met a lot of people on this trip who say they would like to be able to do something like this, but they always have an excuse.


"I've determined that there are two types of people in the world - the realists who chase the dollar and the dreamers. I chased the dollar for a while and I didn't do it very well. I realized I'm a dreamer. And there's nothing wrong with that.

Some people go through life with no dreams at all, and that's sad. When I read that book, I tried to accept the Hopi Indian philosophy of life which is that people should try not to hurt each other and try to understand each other.

That's what I'm trying to do. I was sort of down when I started, but this trip has reignited the fire in my furnace.

Woods man arrested on drug charge, was subject of search

The Grosse Pointe Woods man living at the home on Lochmoor that was searched as part of a Los Angeles-Detroit drug investigation in June has been charged with drug trafficking.

Lloyd D. Russette, 49, of the 900 block of Lochmoor, was arraigned in Detroit federal court Aug. 6 on one count of selling one-half ounce of heroin to an undercover officer Nov. 1 at the school where he is employed. He is reported to be a boiler operator for Detroit Public Schools.

The house in which Russette

lives on Lochmoor was searched June 26 by agents from the Drug Enforcement Administration and the Internal Revenue Service, with assistance from Woods police.

As part of the same investigation, which is being conducted in Detroit and Los Angeles, a property in the 8300 block of Van Dyke was also searched. The Detroit property belongs to a man who is reported to also own several day care centers in Detroit.

The June searches resulted in the confiscation of \$145,000 in cash and a mountain of documentary evidence, according to

the DEA office in Detroit.

The U.S. Marshals Service issued a warrant July 31 for Russette's arrest. The charge was possession with intent to distribute heroin. He was arrested July 4 while at a Big Boy restaurant, according to a spokeswoman at the U.S. Marshals office in Detroit. She could not comment further on the case.

At his arraignment, Russette was released on \$100,000 personal bond. If convicted of the charge, he could get up to 20 years in prison.



Media agree 1990 primary was nasty one

he ugly portents that we saw early this year for the 1990 political season seemed to have been borne out by the performance of the state's top political leaders in the primary campaign.

The question now is whether or not the results of the primary, which weren't known as these words were written, show any measureable reaction against the low standards pursued by candidates in the

In January, the Grosse Pointe News editorially complained that the "State of the State" exchanges "between the Democratic governor and his Republican challenger" at the opening of the year "brought the state's political dialogue to a new low."

We compared Gov. James Blanchard's exaggerated "rhetoric of boosterism" with Sen. John Engler's "gloomy view of Michigan" and found them both wanting in fairness and perspective. We also accused both candidates of avoiding the hard issues of



policy, including the ways to pay for some worthy new programs they proposed.

In April, a News editorial said that Engler's "opening commercials and the quick rebuttals by Blanchard's committee offer new evidence that this year's campaign will be a nasty one." We added that "the TV commercials and the paper blizzard of charges and countercharges" do not bode well for the seven months left in the campaign year.

Even though in the primary Engler had only token opposition from Pointer John Lauve, and Blanchard had none at all, the first phase of the year-long campaign ended as it had begun with nasty attacks. That opinion by political columnists for both the Detroit Free Press and the News reflects our own judgment as well.

The headline on the column by Hugh McDiarmid of the Free Press said one Blanchard attack on Engler "stinks" and then the story added this explanation:

"The best that can be said of the Blanchard-for-governor campaign's snarling attack on John Engler on Tuesday-one that claimed Engler is 'weak' on crime and has a 'dangerous' record on law enforcementis that it's flat-out garbage.'

In the Detroit News, George Weeks' col-umn was headlined: "Nasty streak de-tracts from Blanchard ads." The column went on to say that "the low road is a strange place to start a bid to retain high office" and added Blanchard's "wacky TV ad asserting that Engler has a 'dangerous record on crime' deserves the knocks it has been getting."

Neither columist excused Engler from criticism, however. McDiarmid described as "garbage" Engler's charge that under Blanchard the state civil service is "a cynical system of spoils, patronage and questionable conduct." And Weeks said that

Engler "has been at least as shrill" as the governor.

We agree it is unusual for an incumbent to take the low road with the kind of attacks Blanchard has launched against Engler. Perhaps there is more personal animosity between the two men that we had realized.

We suspect, however, that the governor's attitude stems from a conscious decision to avoid becoming another Michael Dukakis who declined to answer George Bush's 1988 presidential campaign charges until it was too late. But instead of merely answering Engler's charges, Blanchard has dipped into the tar barrel himself to use data of questionable accuracy.

As election returns were awaited early this week, among those on the anxious seat were the primary pollsters. The problem with polling in any primary is that the traditional light turnout tends to distort the polling process. When too few people among those polled actually vote, the results are usually badly skewed.

At any rate, as attention now shifts to the November general election, the dismal outlook is for more nasty campaigning, especially if it proved to be successful in winning votes in specific contests in the primary. That's not a happy augury for the next three months.

oes the homing instinct that supposedly guides pigeons, cats, dogs and other birds and animals to return to their distant homes also lure men back to their early family roots?

Personally, I doubt it but when I discover unexplained links between my life and my early ancestors, I sometimes wonder if something more than mere coincidence is involved.

Let me explain. Six or seven years ago we began making annual pilgrimages to Maine to spend several weeks of vacation in an area easily accessible to children and grandchildren living in nearby Massachusetts and New Hampshire.

At first we rented a cottage in Wells but after further exploration of the Maine coastline we came across the marvelous beach at Biddeford Pool, on the outskirts of the twin cities of Saco and Biddeford, located just north of President Bush's summer home at Kennebunkport.

And so for the last three years we have rented the same beach cottage at Biddeford Pool for a two weeks of family reunion and vacation enjoyment.

Just recently, however, in re-reading parts of a genealogical study of "The Elston Family in America," I discovered that the first Elston referred to in the public prints in this country, one John Elston of Salem, Mass., also had lived for a time in the vicinity of Saco, the very area where we've been vacationing.

What brought that first Elston to public attention was a mishap that occurred when he and two companions sailed into the Boston harbor on July 26, 1631, in a "small bark of about 12 tons" which was "overset in a gust." That recorded incident became the first reference to an Elston in America, at least to the satisfaction of genealogist James Strode Elston.

John Elston was a fisherman who worked for one Matthew Cradock who hired men in Salem as well as Saco, according to the Elston book. Cradock was the first governor of the Massachusetts Bay Company in London before it was transferred to New England but apparently never came to the colonies himself.

Among the few facts known about John Elston, also called Elson and Helson in the early records, was his purchase of 100 acres of land on the west side of the Saco River "upwards unto the fresh water," according to a deed of Jan. 24, 1672.

Elston, his wife and a son, also named John, apparently lived there about four years but the family was driven from Saco by Indian fighting in King Philip's War. John Elston was listed among the refugees admitted to Salem as an inhabitant on Sept. 1, 1676, and an Oct. 12, 1676, list of soldiers who fought in that war included the name of John Elston, either the senior or junior of that name.

One of the early Elstons moved on to Woodbridge, N.J., and later Elstons moved to Newark. My paternal grandfather, born on July 4, 1837, in Hilton, N.J., near Newark, came West in 1855, first to Illinois and thence to Minnesota in 1857 or 1858, to start the Minnesota branch of the family.

But did the homing instinct have anything to do with our family vacations in the Saco-Biddeford area in which that first known Elston lived more than 300 years

Not really. For on second thought, I realize my son-in-law, James Dealing of Mount Pleasant, Mich., deserves most of the credit for locating Biddeford Pool as a vacation spot. His interest was aroused not only by the marvelous beach but the nearby bird sanctuary and other environmental attrac-

But he seems to remember reading that some of his early ancestors also came from Maine. So . . .

Tyrant imperils peace hopes

raq's greedy conquest of Kuwait threatens the free world's supply of oil, causes a big jump in gasoline prices and raises the possibility of a Mideast war.

In the United States, it also imperils the prospects for the success of the economic summit in Washington, endangers the hopes for a U.S. peace dividend from scheduled cuts in defense spending and prompts fears of a recession.

In short, the tyrannical Iraqi president, Saddam Hussein, has put a severe damper on the political and economic optimism raised in the Western world over the recent collapse of communism in Eastern

The prospects for agreement on federal debt reduction at the economic summit already had been dimmed by the politicking by both sides, by reaction against state tax increases in New Jersey and Massachusetts and by local and state government criticism of a GOP plan to boost federal revenues by cutting deductions for state income taxes.

Republicans, especially those running for office this year, have sharply protested the loss of their favorite campaign issue. Reactions against state tax hikes recommended by Democratic governors have tended to support GOP complaints over Bush's reversal of his pledge, "Read my lips - no new

However, unless war and new aggression are averted in the Middle East, any U.S. peace dividend from defense cuts is likely to be postponed and even the aim of the economic summit — to reduce the massive federal debt - may be put on hold.

In fact, there's even the prospect of increased tax revenues to help pay for the cost of preparations to defend Saudi Arabia or wage war against Iraq's President Hussein.

Those are just some of the possibilities raised by the Iraqi dictator's naked aggression against neighboring Kuwait and the additional threats he now poses to Saudi Arabia's contribution to the world's oil supply.

When your roof leaks, remove that too. Simply wrap the entire house with a blue tarp and cut holes so you can see through the windows.


Then again, never mind. Better to be conservative. After all, you want to make a good impression on your new neighbors. Better to play it straight and use an earti-tone tarp instead.

To the Editor: We are writing in regard

to the article of July 26, by John Minnis about the juvenile disposition hearing relating to a 15-year-old who is apparently involved in some manner with the killing of Benjamin K. Gravel. This hearing is being conducted before Chief Judge Dalton A. Roberson of the Recorder's Court for the City of Detroit.

As attorneys who regularly practice in that court and as Grosse Pointe residents, we are very concerned because the article contains several inaccuracies or distortions regarding the nature of this type of hearing, the law governing these matters, and how this particular

hearing is being conducted. Although this case involves a horrible and senseless killing, and emotions are understandably running high, we feel that it is important for us to respond because we do not want the community to be left with the wrong impression regarding these proceedings.

Whenever a youngster commits specific enumerated capital offenses, such as murder, and he or she is 15 or 16 years old at the time of the offense, the prosecutor's office may elect to automatically waive him or her over for further proceedings within the adult system. The matter then proceeds essen-

tially as a normal criminal case within the adult system. However, if there is a conviction, either by trial or by plea of guilty, the judge is then required by law to conduct a disposition hearing to determine whether the youngster should be sentenced as a juvenile or as an adult.

Mr. Minnis in his article states, "The judge bases his decisions on internal social worker's reports, arguments presented by the prosecution and defense during pre-sentencing hearings, and the youth's criminal records, if they have them." This is an incomplete short summary of what normally takes place.

At the time the conviction is entered, and prior to the actual hearing, the judge refers the juvenile to various specialists to obtain detailed background information regarding him or her. Refer-rals are normally made to the Recorder's Court Probation Department, the Recorder's Court Psychiatric Clinic, the Department of Social Services, and to an independent psychologist or psychia-

Reports are prepared by each of these specialists and submitted to the judge, the prosecutor and the defense attorney with their recommendation of whether the youngster should be sentenced within the juvenile system or the adult system. Furthermore, these reports also contain detailed information regarding the police version of the alleged involvement of the juvenile in the criminal offense, the juvenile's version of what happened, the family background, educational background, employment background, and whether there is any prior juvenile record.

The reports also normally contain the results of the psychological clinical interviews, as well as the results from the various psychological and educational tests administered. Unless the prosecutor and the defense attorney agree to submit the matter on the basis of the reports, a disposition hearing must be conducted.

At this hearing the legal burden rests on the prosecutor to prove by a preponderence of the evidence that the juvenile should be treated as an adult. Mr. Minnis in his article states "Before the sentencing hearing began, Roberson said it is the prosecution's job to convince him that the juvenile should be sentenced as an adult even though they were charged as adults and pleaded guilty to the charges." We think this is an unfair distortion of the requirements of the law and we feel that your readers might be left with the implication that Judge Roberson was applying an unreasona-



ble standard when in fact he was merely stating what the law required the prosecutor to prove.

After all the evidence is presented at the disposition hearing, the law requires the judge to apply certain criteria and determine whether the juvenile is amenable to treatment within the juvenile system, whether he or she will be a disruptive influence in that system, and whether he or she is likely to be dangerous to the public if released by age 21.

The following criteria must be considered by the judge. The juvenile's past record and character, his or her physical and mental maturity, the juvenile's pattern of living, the seriousness and circumstances of the offense, and whether the offense is

part of a repetitive pattern.

If sentenced within the juvenile system on this offense, this young man will be sent to a maximum security facility where he will receive therapy, both individual and group, receive an education, but still be removed from society until he is 21 years old. He will not be released for any purpose without first obtaining permission from Judge Roberson after another hearing is conducted regarding his release. Again, Mr. Minnis in his article states that "As wards of DSS, the youths can be let free any time from the date of their sentencing to their 21st birthday, when they must be let go." This is simply not true and leaves the public with the impression that youngsters sentenced on serious offenses within the juvenile system are simply

going to be released back into the community before a meaningful determination has been made that that is

appropriate. Furthermore, the general tenor of Mr. Minnis' article seems to suggest that Judge Roberson unreasonably restricted the prosecutor's presentation of this case. In fact it appears that the judge was merely making appropriate rulings to prevent delay of the proceedings and not to in any way interfere with the prosecution's proper presentation of evidence. Also, Mr. Minnis stated in his article that the disposition hearing had to be adjourned after only two hours, again seeming to imply that not enough time was being devoted to this matter or the judge wasn't working hard enough. This is terribly unfair and totally contrary to what we



the newer population figures, the Woods had 213.20 crimes per 10,000, which are still the fewest reported among the tri-county communities.

The rankings are based on the number of reported major crimes: murder or non-negligent homicide, rape (criminal sexual conduct), robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, auto theft and arson.

The top 10 cities with the fewest number of major crimes per 10,000 in increasing order - following Grosse Pointe Woods were Trenton, 235.86; West Bloomfield Township, 240.83; Riverview, 245.87; Beverly Hills, 263.55; Plymouth Township, 266.28; Sumpter Township,

284.81; Berkeley, 290.27; Clawson, 321.50; and Plymouth,

The Park's reported major crimes were fewer than Farmington Hills and St. Clair Shores, which ranked 22nd and 23rd, respectively.

Among the five Grosse Pointes, as reported by the state police Uniform Crime Report, which lists all cities regardless of population, Grosse Pointe Shores had the fewest crimes per 10,000 residents at 128.00. The Shores also has the fewest residents of the Pointes and no commercial district.

With the Shores and Woods first and second in the Pointes, the Park came third. Grosse Pointe City was fourth with 385.71, followed by the Farms

with 459.09.

The crimes per 10,000 population are not the actual number of major crimes reported. In 1989, the Shores had 32 major crimes; the City, 216; the Woods, 339; the Farms, 404; and the Park, 564.

Taken has a whole, the five Pointes had 1,555 major crimes reported in 1989, which equates to 327.37 major crimes per 10,000 population. If the Pointes were one city, they would have ranked 10th among the communites of 10,000 or more in the tri-county area.

While Grosse Pointe Woods had the least crime per capita, its neighbor, Harper Woods which has Eastland Mall in its jurisdiction — had the highest crime rate out of the 59 tri-communities. Harper Woods reported 1,477.30 major crimes per 10,000 residents. At the 58 spot was Hamtramck with 1,451.37, and 57th was Detroit with 1,227.00.



from 1650 up to the classical period.

"I had a great time doing that," he said. "It was like belonging to an expensive club, because I didn't make much money — in fact, I went into the hole."

He recently moved to a new office on the second floor of the Punch and Judy building. The books lining the shelves in his office are not all related to psychiatry and there are a number in different languages, another one of Graves' interests.

He said he has studied up to 40 languages on his own and he reads fiction and non-fiction in about a dozen languages.

He attributes his achievements and wide range of interests to his four older brothers and sisters. "They were an unusually bright lot and I benefited from that exposure," he said.

One sister earned a bachelor's degree when she was 17 and his brothers, who both started out to be psychiatrists, became theologians.

While they were in medical school, however, they exerted enormous influence on their younger brother and would bring home lab equipment. Graves said he worked through the first year of college chemistry when he was in the fourth grade.

"I owe much to my brothers and sisters," he said.

Graves was valedictorian of his class in his hometown of Herrin, Ill., and after graduation, he joined the U.S. Naval Reserve.

The Navy sent him to Indiana State Teachers College in Terre Haute. He completed two years of science in one year, which enabled him to apply for medical school. He was accepted at Northwestern University where he earned four degrees beginning with a bachelor of science in 1946 and ending with a medical degree in 1950.

Graves interned at the Charity Hospital of Louisiana in New Orleans and then transferred to the Air Force Reserve. He served as a captain from 1950 to 1953 in rural England "in a little village of thatched roof cottages" where he said he had some of his best times.

With his service obligation completed, Graves accepted a position as chief of women's services at Ypsilanti State Hospital, where he stayed until 1955.

From there he went to Detroit Receiving Hospital and after about a year, he was named chief of psychiatry. During this period, Graves served as mental health commissioner for the

state of Michigan.

He was also chief psychiatric consultant to the regional Veterans Administration and served on a number of committees.

Graves served on a task force appointed by President John F. Kennedy to create Medicare. When it became law, Lyndon Johnson was president and Graves was invited to the signing of the bill.

"Most physicians were opposed at that time to Medicare," he said. "They saw it as a start of socialized medicine." The concept of community mental health was forming about this time and Graves became the first director of the Detroit-Wayne Community Mental Health Services Board in 1965. After a year, Graves said he became disillusioned and left.

He continued with his private practice and taught. Since 1961, Graves has been clinical associate professor of psychiatry at Wayne State University College of Human Medicine. He is an adjunct associate professor of psychology at WSU College of Liberal Arts, adjunct professor of psychology at the University of Detroit and clinical associate professor of psychology at the University of Detroit and clinical associate professor of psychiatry at Michigan State University. He helped set up a master's program in pastoral counseling at U of D.

Graves, who has been a part of the national mental health program since the concept of getting patients out of the hospitals and into the community began, said, "Over the last 25 years, community mental health has developed very badly. It's been a disaster in terms of meeting the needs of the people."

Graves, who said he is basically an optimistic person, said, "I don't see the light at the end of the tunnel at this point."

As recent past-president of the Michigan Psychiatric Society, Graves said he will continue to pressure the governor and state Legislature to help those who depend on public sources. Graves believes that the chronically mentally ill will not be adequately served unless there is federal support.

"The pendulum will swing, but right now the needs are growing by the day and the resources are drying up," he said.

Graves most recently served as executive director of the Oakland County Community Mental Health Services Board.

Graves is proud of his three children, who attended Grosse Pointe schools. Adrienne is chief counsel to the utilities commission in Rhode Island. She and her husband, a heart surgeon, have two sons.

James is a musicologist working on his doctorate in ethnic music in Portland, Maine. He

His youngest son, John David Nicholas, is in graduate school in business administration at the University of California in San Diego. He and his wife have a daughter.



Fifty years ago three men met in a room above a Mack Avenue bar to discuss their problems new program called Alcoholics Anonymous.

"Anonymity is part of those 12 traditions," Doe said. "The members shouldn't get medals for getting sober and staying sober, or for helping someone else stay sober, and also, if a member falls flat, which we all do on the way to getting sober, people will point and say 'See, AA didn't help.





Its parts are impressive. The supercharged and intercooled 231-cubic-inch V-6 can put out 210 horsepower. This translates to near-muscle-car performance from a standstill despite the car's heavy luxury feel (achieved by being heavy). Zero-to 60 with automatic transmission is in the 7 to 8 second range. And because the T-bird SC is definitely a luxury car, most have automatic transmissions

The shape of the 1990 Thunderbird is clearly derived from its predecessor, the "jellybean" Bird introduced in 1983 to a mixed reception. It was certainly different and attractive in an odd mixed way, but there was plenty of apprehension at Ford that maybe it was too different, a modern day Chrysler Airflow. The gamble paid off and Ford became a style-setter, finally shedding the reputation it had earned of building the most boring cars on the market.

The 1990 shape is sleeker, more aerodynamic-looking and more in the mainstream of the latest luxury designs out of Europe and Japan. While the T-Bird shares its body with the Mercury Cougar and the Lincoln Continental Mark VII, it is clearly distinguished by its sleeker, sportier, less formal shape.

In fact the 35th anniversary T-Bird looks positively ominous with its special black and titanium finish and bright blue accent stripe, its distinctive black road wheels and squinty-eyed nogrille front styling. This is a shape you will not tire of.


Inside, there is no doubt that while the car is fast, it is primarily a personal luxury car. Seats are suede with leather bolsters. Analog instruments are attractive and easy to read. Everything is power - windows, door locks, radio antenna, outside mirrors. Very American, very well done.

And some of the best parts can't be seen without popping the hood or crawling under the car. Standard are anti-lock braking, Traction-Loc rear axle, dual exhaust, electronically fuel-injected engine and, of course, intercooled supercharger.

Ford decided to install a supercharger instead of the more widely used turbocharger to eliminate turbo lag. The supercharger is driven by the engine full-time and so is always immediately available. The turbocharger is driven by exhaust pressure and so there is a lag while increased exhaust flow builds up blower speed. But recent advances in turbo technology have greatly reduced the lag.

Ford's supercharger does not seem to have hurt fuel economy, which is pegged by EPA at 19 miles per gallon around the city and is just about what I experienced despite a rather leaden

'Presumed Innocent': Outstanding drama

Those who have read Scott Turow's galvanizing page-turner and best seller "Presumed Innocent" will be glad to hear that Director Alan Pakula has brought to the screen an intense, gripping adaptation of the novel.

Those who have not read the book won't be short-changed because they will be viewing a murder mystery of the highest caliber. It is intelligent. It conveys the story's suspense and underlying sobriety.

But "Presumed Innocent" is more than a spellbinding thriller. It delves into such weighty matters as the nature of guilt and innocence. It examines the intricate network of municipal corruption and it probes the intricacies of the legal system.

In the end it leaves the viewer with the questions that if the accused is not guilty, is he guilty of other malfeasance and if so, where is the justice if he is not punished?

In a tightly constructed plot that reaches out in many directions without breaking any of the strands of coherence, "Presumed Innocent" presents a legal, political an solidly sexual mystery gem.

The film begins, as did the book, with the main character's profound thoughts on the judicial system. Standing in the burnished glow of an empty courtroom, he is a distinguished presence, obviously a sincere and dedicated advocate of the sanctity of the law,



But rarely can we see them in ction, face to face, exposed with uch grim accuracy as here on stratford's stage.

While it might be more enteraining to play this script just for he action and emphasize the road issues of politics in ancient lome, Director Richard Monette as made this production interesting for today's audience by bringing out Shakespeare's insights into the inner workings of the figures involved - the concern of the aging Caesar with what the people will think and with his lack of an heir, the change of Mark Antony into an ambitious leader, the lofty jealousy and banal corruption of Cassius, and the self-centered, self-delusion of Brutus.

The design also emphasizes the play's modern relevance. This is flagged at once as the bacchanalian mob comes on in outfits ranging from jogging suits to costumes that you might see on Halloween or at a rock concert. Then the Roman Tribunes enter wearing team jackets with the legend "Tribune, SPQR" (Senatus Populus Qui Romanus) stenciled on the back, looking for all the world like the local bowling team.

This impact continues as other aspects of the set and costume design (credited on the program to "Ultz") appear in similar vein.

The thing about Spike Lee is







Sweet smell of success comes in colorful wrappers

Members of the board of directors of Garoto USA have one thing in common: They are all admitted chocoholics.

Good thing, because their business is chocolate, specifically chocolate candy from Brazil.

Formed a year ago by a group of mostly Grosse Pointe residents, the company began with a running start Jan. 1 and has been increasing sales since, or as Richard Shammas, chief executive officer, says: Tasting sweet success.

Sales the first month amounted to \$100,000, he said, and the market is wide open for their product.

"There are more than 5,300 supermarket chains and partnerships that represent hundreds of thousands of stores and we know that marketing a product this way, we will never run out of

customers," Shammas said.
Garoto USA's marketing approach focuses on retail and produce stores. Locally, Nino Salvaggio and Kroger's carry Garoto chocolate, selling at the rate of 1,000 pounds each month for each store, Shammas said.

That's a lot of candy, but Americans eat 12 pounds of chocolate a year, he said, compared to about 2.2 pounds a year consumed by Brazilians in whose country the main ingredient cocoa beans — is grown.

The history of Garoto chocolate began 60 years ago when Henrique Meyerfreund immigrated from Germany to the tropics of Brazil. He looked around and saw that the area, rich in cocoa beans, had no choc-

olate manufacturer.

Meyerfreund asked his parents to send him a confectionary machine and began building a company that is run today by his son, Helmut.

It's now the largest chocolate company in the southern hemisphere, employing 2,500 workers in a half-million-square-foot plant in Vitorio, Brazil. Located a few miles from a rain forest, the company's candy machines

run 24 hours a day, seven days a

It's a modern, high-tech plant where one specialized machine costs \$1 million, Shammas said. Cutting a piece of candy in half, he shows a visitor what the machine can do: The top layer is milk chocolate, a second layer is dark chocolate wrapped around a layer of wafer that encases a center of cashew butter.

Ron Cummings, president of Garoto USA and one of the company's originators, became enamored of Brazil on a visit. He approached the chocolate manufacturer for the right to sell its product in the United States.

He put together a team of owners and directors, each with a particular background, who could contribute to marketing the chocolate. The local company consists of a graphic artist, advertising people, an accountant, inventor, attorney and other business people.

There was a year of research, test marketing and package design before the first sale was made. Garoto makes 30 varieties of chocolate, some of the combinations unfamiliar to the American palate.

People shop for groceries every week or more, he said, while they may visit the gourmet section of a department store only occasionally.

"Our goal is to give the American public a gourmet, upscale chocolate at a working man's price," said Shammas, who has a wholesale food background.

The company has brokers throughout the United States and maintains five distribution points: two on the East Coast, one on the West Coast and two in the Midwest. The main distribution center is in Taylor.

What makes the candy unique, Shammas said, is that it contains more cocoa and cocoa butter than American chocolate. "It's not loaded up with sugar or preservatives or chemicals," he said. "It's all natural."

The size of each piece is generous and, he added: "No one in America makes a good-tasting, colorfully wrapped chocolate."

Grosse Pointe Celebrity Series 1990-1991

The mind reader was a no-show. Nobody can remember his name

Some who did show - and are remembered fondly: Barbara Walters; Irma Bombeck; Zsa Zsa Gabor's mother; The Amazing Kreskin; Sally Jesse Raphael; Jimmy the Greek; Jayne Meadows; George Plimpton; Dr. Joyce Brothers; Arthur Haily; Vincent Price; and

All these celebrities were in Grosse Pointe because of a few hundred hard-working women, members of the Bon Secours Assistance League. The Grosse Pointe Celebrity Series is going into its 37th year this fall with four more topnotch crowd-pleasers, according to

Joan Mossner, chairman.

"This is one of the few Town Hall presentations that has survived," said Pat Worrell, president.

The Bon Secours Assistance League is celebrating its 42nd birthday this year. It was founded in 1948, an offshoot of the Bon Secours Guild, which was formed to provide funding for the hospital's unbudgeted expenses. The Assistance League was also formed for the purposes of raising money and promoting good public relations for the hospital.

They still do. But according to Worrell and immediate past president Joan Bartoszewicz, friendship and fellowship are just as rewarding as fundraising.

The popular celebrity series, an annual Christmas fair and the hos-

pital's gift shop are the League's main fundraising projects.

Bon Secours Assistance League consists of about 350 women, divided into 14 sub-groups of 25 members each. Most of the sub-groups also have a modest fundraising project. For instance, Group XI makes keepsake bonnets for the gift shop from Irish lace handkerchiefs. The bonnet may be used later for a girl as a wedding handkerchief; for a boy as a gift to his bride-to-be.

Other sub-groups plan bridge marathons, cocktail parties, or other benefits to contribute to the collective fund.

The gift shop is a quarter-of-amillion-dollar business run by volunteers, Worrell said.

We have a large number of high-quality gifts. Unique gifts. A wide price range," she said. Buyers travel to Chicago twice a year. Customers are not only hospital visitors, she added, but also patients and members of the League. "I think we're our own best custom-

The annual Christmas Fair is held early in November and includes special purchases of lingerie, jewelry, toys, crystal, handmade craft items and Christmas decorations. This year's fair will be Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 3 and 4.

Bon Secours Assistance League recently passed along a check for \$140,000 to the hospital. They earmarked \$110,000 for an image intensifier and pledged an additional \$35,000. A portion of the money, \$15,000, is designated for the hospital's meals for the homebound program and \$15,000 is to add to a nursing scholarship fund.

The women of the League decide how they'd like to spend the money they raise. "We usually ask the

hospital for a shopping list," said Bartoszewicz, "but we make our own decisions. We're a feisty group of ladies who want to designate how we spend our money.

The League has financed a roof garden for the hospital, a day room in the Adolescent Mental Health Unit, contributions to the meals on wheels program, a variety of sophisticated medical equipment and a nursing school endowment fund.

The 37th Grosse Pointe Celebrity Series begins in October with a series of three daytime lectures and one evening concert.

"In the early years, the lectures took place at the Esquire Theater, followed by lunch at the Old Place," Worrell said. When the theater was remodeled, it wasn't big enough for the lectures. "We moved to the Eastland Theater and had lunch afterward at Stouffers. Then Eastland was divided into smaller theaters and we didn't have enough space again.

"We moved to the Woods Theater. Then they divided that theater. We've had our lectures at Parcells for about five years. It holds 880 people and it's a terrific place.

Parking is at St. Michael's Church and shuttles take people to and from Parcells.'

Membership in the Bon Secours Assistance League is by invitation, and is offered to women who are committed to working. That's what makes the group such a vital, hardworking organization, Worrell said. Members are required to attend three meetings a year, work in the gift shop and at the Christmas Fair, support the Celebrity Series and pay dues of \$10 a year.

A membership profile recently revealed that the group has 332 active members, 92 inactive members and 18 emeritus members. Most are college graduates. Most are professional women who are working or who anticipate returning to the workforce after raising families. Members have a wide range of talents. About 90 percent are Grosse Pointers. All are women, from about age 30 up to age 80. The average age is 45 to 55 years old.





The Pastor's Corner

Our scarcity of caring

After returning from a week of church camp, I thought I would dial up my friends at the Family Life Education Center (FLEC) to see if there were any new developments. At a board of directors meeting in June, it was decided that FLEC would have to shut its doors because of a lack of funding. As announced in the July 12 issue of the Grosse Pointe News, it seems as if the demise of FLEC is a cer-

Parker J. Palmer, a Quaker author, wrote about caring in his book, "The Company of Strangers." He wrote: "Within each of us there is a capacity to respond to people in need. For millenia, people have turned to each other for various sorts of aid, and as we do — and receive response — our common bond, our public life, is strengthened. But in our century caring has become increasingly professionalized and institutionalized."

Palmer concludes that caring is a human good which is becoming scarce. Our common public life is diminished by this scarcity in the same way it is diminished when individuals hoard food or fuel. The scarcity of caring caused by self-serving caring professionals is compounded by our intense consumerism - the idea that you get what you pay for and if you don't pay for it, it isn't worth much. Individuals would rather pay large amounts of money to a professional to solve a problem that could be resolved by communicating with a compassionate neighbor. I always found it interesting that FLEC was sometimes criticized because the staff was largely made up of volunteers.

Please do not think I am suggesting that all who serve in caring professions - psychologists and psychiatrists, counselors and social workers - take advantage of the less fortunate of our society. There are human hurts which run too deep for simple reflective conversation to solve and that require the knowledge and expertise of professional counselors and advisers to resolve. Indeed, I consider my calling as a Christian pastor as part of the spectrum of caring profes-

However, my particular vocation as a caring professional does not excuse others (Christian or not) from the tasks of caring for those who are less fortunate or who suffer in any

For this reason, I am saddened by the loss of a volunteer organization such as FLEC that has cared for people in need for more than 20 years. It is my understanding that other caring volunteer organizations in our community and in communities around the country are in crisis and are beginning to shut their doors.

It seems as if Parker Palmer is correct when he recognizes the scarcity of caring in a world of presumable abun-

I cannot help thinking of the words of Paul: "Above all, clothe yourself with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony."

For the sake of our community, our state, our nation, and our world, I pray that we may be bound together in perfect harmony. May we love one another and care for each other out of the abundance God has provided.

It also maintains the Anna Scripps Whitcomb Conservatory on Belle Isle, a Detroit landmark since 1904 and the site of many major flower

That is the annual Indian harvesting of wild rice, still done in the ancient manner in which a canoe or rowboat is guided among the rice plants and the stalks are rapped sharply on the edge of the boat so that the rice kernals fall into a container in the bottom of the boat.



HAVE A PLEASANT TRY AT PERFECTION **BRIDGE BY WOODY BOYD** THE PASTEBOARD PASTIME

Today's column will teach you more than you ever knew and as much as you wish to believe. You will immediately see that much of what is written here has doubtful foundation, but I am unable any longer to contain my beliefs relating to early American bridge mythology.

History tells me that the men of the west a century ago played poker, farro and dice. This has puzzled me greatly and for sometime preoccupied my logic to determine the facts. After all British aristocracy has been playing bridge (whist to be more accurate) for almost two centuries in the posh card rooms of London's environs. One wonders why hadn't cowboys, Indians and Custer's men too? Maybe they did and our research is just incomplete. Such a supposition may be absurd, paradoxically it may even be true. Today I am proceeding on the basis that western card game culture of the 1870 era included contract bridge. For sure you will never be able to accuse this columnist of letting the truth stand in the way of a good story. As Doctor Samuel Johnson once said, "Every man has the right to utter what he thinks the truth, and every other man has the right to knock him down for it!"

I believe that there was a bridge game played in places like Shawnee Stompin Pond, Oklahoma; Bustin Dust, Kansas; and Crazy Horse Haven, Wyoming. I'm within a thin thread of being somewhat sure that Preacher Deacon Demon directed the first Denver duplicate at the Old Church House on Horse Bones Blvd. and Corset Corners Causeway.

There are documents within the archives of The Early Prairie Twisted History Foundation that suggest the famous British erectionist and early world traveler Even Easily Edward Evans brought bridge to the western plains. Of course, it wasn't the sophisticated game we know today nor was any of the performers as sober as a judge. It was challenging and dangerously exciting. Card table confrontations usually ended in someone getting sawed off or shot down. Most of the newspaper clippings I've clammed on to say that Caribou Charlie Hardencarcass and the son of Sioux Chief Sitting Stiff, SippingStuff were the premiere partnership of the plains of that day. To preserve that birth they were constantly defending their honor in some of the most severe prairie stake play ever promoted. Here is a celebrated hand from one of their challenge matches of 1871. Supposedly the winners were to be crowned the western world prairie plains champions.

Scandal Sanction, South Dakota's Cloudy Clem Lemon was by all accounts nowhere near the equal of either Caribou Charlie Hardencarcass or Sioux Chief

Son, Sippin Stuff. On this occasion, though, he had laid upon the Britisher Even Easily Edward Evans a tidy sum to purchase a partnership. The expert erectionist's presence at the table made the match a portentous bridge incident and the outcome doubtful. Here we see the foursome fiercely competing in a fantastical hand from that match.

Obviously Caribou Charlie and Sippin Stuff loved to Que Bid. Six diamonds was intriguing and seven spades incomprehensible, but they must have known what they were doing because it could be achieved with careful Hardencarcass play. Can you put yourself in Caribou Charlie's chair and do so

Unfortunately the outcome of this clash remains in limbo as a fire in the archives charred most of the cards. 'Tis a pity though that players so great as those in this story only enjoyed a few moments of glory as the ones that have been allotted to them here.

Riley sees the world aboard Maiden ship

Phen Dawn Riley releases the annals of her nine-month voyage around the world, Jules Verne will have met his match.

Riley has slept in some of the finest oceans, eaten cold food while battling whales, and seen more ports of call than a naval

She completed a year's tour of the world May 28, when she and her 11 crew members on Maiden took second place in Division D of the Whitbread Round the World Race, the world's longest endurance yacht race.

Maiden was sponsored by England's Royal Jordanian.

Maiden is a 58-foot long Bruce Farr-designed boat, which sailed in the 1981-82 Round the World

The race covered more than

33,000 miles, with 22 competing yachts from 13 countries. Riley served as watch captain, engineer, diver and helmswoman on an all-women crew. She also was the only female among seven Americans in the race.

Maiden, skippered by Tracy Edwards, also won two of the six legs and captured the hearts of many around the world. Riley said most people laughed at the all female crew before the endurance race started, but in the end she and the others had earned respect.

The six legs of the race were: 1) Portsmouth, Great Britain to Punta Del Este, Uruguay; 2) Punta Del Este to Fremantle, Australia, 3) Fremantle to Auckland, New Zealand, 4) Auckland to Punta Del Este, 5) Punta Del Este to Fort Lauderdale, 6) Fort Lauderdale to Portsmouth.

The longest leg was Punta Del Este to Fremantle, which covered 7,650 miles.

With wins in legs two and more. I've also promised myself three, Maiden was a common word in national newspapers.

"The media, sorry, was just awful," said Riley, 26. "After we won the second leg there were articles quoting some people who said they'd eat their hats if we made it to England. Nobody, so it seemed, believed in us.'

The race started Sept. 2, 1989, and ended May 23, 1990. In that time, Riley's voyage was not all fun. She ate freeze-dried foods, spent Christmas on the ocean, lost the only bottle of New Year's Eve champagne in rough waters, and celebrated a birthday away from home.

When you look back on it and think of the race in respect to miles," she said, "it's a long way. But, when you're on the water you're in a different world. It was tough to not think about being homesick, but when you're competing like that you can't think of home. You need to concentrate continuously.

"I used to like mashed potatoes, but I've eaten so many of them that I don't like them any-

that instead of sailing this Christmas, I'd be home skiing."

Sailing the cold Southern Ocean in leg two was exhilarating for Riley, but because of her crew's skills there were no other boats in sight. Maiden raced to a huge lead and then began enjoying the ride.

The Southern Ocean was a very trying ocean," she said. "It was cold and miserable, yet in-

spiring. In that area, there were icebergs and high winds, but you don't have time to be scared until you're laying in your bunk and you know you have to go up and relieve someone four hours later. That, I was a little apprehensive about at times.'

On Dec. 23, 1989, Maiden, with a win in the second leg under its belt, took off for Auck-

land. A smooth race and plenty of "jokes, conversations and frustration" enabled the crew to take its second consecutive leg. All the skeptics were now turn-

ing into believers.
"When we finished in New Zealand it was about 1:30 in the morning," said Riley. "When we got into shore there were an estimated 10,000 people welcoming just us. It was like everyone suddenly knew who we were and wanted us to win the whole thing.'

After completing the fifth leg and landing in the States, Riley had had enough. Because she had lived in Fort Lauderdale previously, she felt as if she were home. But after a nine-day stay, Maiden embarked on the sixth and final leg.

"It was tough to get excited to leave again," she recalled. "I was home and after almost nine months on the water, it was hard to get motivated.

But, they finished the 3,837 mile run and again came home to an aroused crowd.

"There were 25,000 people cheering for us when we finished in England," said Riley. "By that time a few people were eating their hats and we were so excited to be there. We were tired, but the crowd gave us enough energy. It was a great race, but I think everyone felt happy to have it over with."

During the sixth leg, Maiden grazed a whale and battled a tornado. Riley said that when the tornado hit, the boat was spun 360 degrees, but didn't sustain any damage. The whale caused some damage to the aluminum hull, but that was easily fixed from the deck.

During the fourth leg, Maiden took on water and sent the crew scurrying for repairs.

"We had to empty the boat and put about 15 sails on deck just to find the hole where the water was coming from," Riley

said. "We hooked up pumps to the engine and it took about two days before it was all cleaned

They did all the work while the boat was skippered by Ed-

"The salt water shorted out our water maker and some other things," Riley added. "It was one of the most trying moments for us, because it happened with six days to go before that leg would be finished. When you look around and all you see is water, it's kind of frightening."

Even brushing a whale, taking on water, having to dive and repair the boat while it was cruising couldn't keep this Maiden voyage down. But, according to Riley, the most difficult process was trying to blend 12 personali-

"The biggest thing we had to do was make sure all 12 girls could get along," said Riley. "We had a few crew changes before the race started in September, but it all worked out. We all kept diaries and shared them, but when the race was completed, I think everyone was relieved to be able to get away from one another?

It's difficult for Riley to recall everything she saw, but without the help of a facsimile machine she would never have traveled past Africa, the Caribbean, South America and several bodies of water.

"I wasn't even sure I wanted to do it," said Riley, who started sailing "when I was born." "I was between jobs and I knew they were looking for a helmsman. I sent over my resume and within an hour they faxed me an acceptance letter and directions on what to do next."

Before she knew it she was off to England.


"I worked my way through college by working on sailboats and I've worked in the business," she said. "Sailing for us was a family commitment. Every free minute we had we'd sail, so I knew I'd be prepared to crew on Maiden."

Riley, who graduated from Michigan State where she captained the sailing team, is hoping the around-the-world experience will help her career as a sailor.

'It's turned out all right because I've been able to make a living out of a sport or hobby, Riley said. "While on Maiden, we got paid for the time we worked on the boat and all our expenses were paid when we docked, and now I'm looking to do some other things.'

And the most recent thing is uting her race on slides and a 26-minute film in preparation for her lecturing career. She's also trying to work out a deal to sail in the America's Cup with the Betsy Ross Syndicate.

"I've got a couple of options, but right now I've just got to check them all out," she said. "I'm sure I'll never get out of
