No Silk Shirt Era

The tremendous industrial activity which will inevitably accompany the national defense undertaking now just fairly under way will result in the amployment of large numbers of persons in practically every line of manufacturing industry. Naturally and properly the skilled craftsmen in these industries will receive good wages and the concerns engaged in war industries will make reasonable profits.

engaged in war industries will make reasonable profits.

If the National administration is wise enough to take a
let out of the last similiar experience, less than a generation back, it will early see to it that neither manufacture
nor workman shall be permitted to make inordinate profits
out of this work. There is no permanent economic value to
war industry. The money spent in this effort is in the saidstaggory as the fire insurance premium. It is protection,
pure and simple. The machines we create for war are for
festruction alone, not for the creation of more wealth. Their
sole justification is our defense.

In such an undertaking it is unjust that those permitted emain at home in safety and comfort should exact from to remain at home in safety and comfort should exact from the nation enormous profits, either in wages or dividends, while hundreds of thousands of our young men are taken, willy nilly, and forced into compulsory military training, or even war, for \$21.00 per month and found.

even war, for \$21.00 per month and found.

It was the relative injustices of this course in the last war which led to enormous profits by the war materials industries among the favored few capitalists, and to the long and bitter struggle by the soldiers for adjusted compensations and bonuses. It was also directly the cause of our winding up that adventure with a national debt of \$25,000,-000,000, when a more reasonable rate of profits and wages would have left it many billions less. The personal extravagances of that era also so seriously undermined our habits of thrist and frugality that it left the people open to the industrial tragedy which overwhelmed the country a flecade later.

flecade later.

That canny Yankee, President Calvin Coolidge, who incidentally paid off the National debt at the rate of a billion a year during his administration, accompanied by a steady reduction of federal taxes, once made a speech before an American Legion convention in Kansas City, in which he stressed the point that one of the most certain methods of building up the national defense was for the country to say its debt; that when the time of war came, with its enormous expenditures, the country with its credit high and its financial sinews tough and strong was prepared for the ordeal.

The picture offers a melancholy comparison with the cituation the country faces today, after doubling the national debt during the eight years of profound peace and finding itself under the necessity of undertaking vast unavoidable outlays for defense against a world in flames.

Nations are only individuals in the mass and the sa Nations are cally individuals in the mass and the same bid-fashioned, unchanging laws of economics which apply to fiations, apply with equal force to its individual component parts. The people need not depart from their relatively high standard of living, but, if they have the wit of rabbits, they will begin paying off the mortgage on the home or building up a backlog of security against the rainy day, before they start buying fifteen dollar slik shirts. The security created by individual effort is more satisfying to the soul than dependence upon the indefinible and tenuous security offered by a government which might go broke.

He Has A Job

Wendell L. Willkie, in his declaration of future political policy given out to the country in his address on Armistice day evening, voiced in exact terms at hough that has been strongly in the minds of some 22,000,000 of the most intelligent citizens of this country. The point which he makes, that to accept o. 'cial posi-tion under President Roosevelt's administration would neu-tralize his position as national political critic for the next four years, will be instantly recognized. A wholesome op-position, speaking always in terms of the common welfare, so of the very essence of a workable democracy. Its necessity is so completely acknowledged on the other side that the 'Leader of Ris Majesty's Opposition' is a duly accredited Tactor, supported by government, in the legislative machin-ery of Parliament. The absence of opposition is single party government, identical with that of Russia, Germany and 'taly, and o slight further accretion of power in the party described by the presence of the position of the party Ages, of which America will have no part, now or hereafter. Wendell Wilkie has a duty to perform not to be next.

Wendell Willkie has a duty to perform, not to his party plone, but to his country. His is the task for the next four years for which his record for the last four months has so amply demonstrated his superb qualifications.
