This Week in Washington

WASHINGTON, Nov. 14.—Some reliable facts are beginning to be available about the progress of the National revenue program, concerning which there has lately been much contradictory and sometimes malicious gossip in circulation.

It is true enough that the United States is trying to do in two years what Germany took seven years to do; that is to equip and train the greatest fighting force the world has ever dreamed of, on land, on the sea and in the air. But the members of the National Defense Commission, the high officers of the Army and the Navy and the "big wigs" of the air forces are now satisfied that it can be done and that the job has not yet started.

"About the only thing we're not sure of," said one of the men connected with the working out of the defense program a few days ago, "is who we are going to fight, and when."

The air preparations are considered the most immediately important, particularly as one of the major objectives is to furnish the aid to Britain as speedily as possible, and that can best be done by augmenting the British fleet.

Production of Army airplanes is not yet up to the announced schedule, but it is gaining. The program for the year called for 1,150 Army planes, and only 800 were produced. How many of those are combat planes and how many training planes are items which are regarded as military secrets.

Training Plans Needed
It is certain that a high proportion of the new planes must be for training purposes. How many of the present output of planes are for training is not known, but it is clear that there is a serious shortage of training planes. It is also clear that the present output of planes is not sufficient to meet the needs of the Army and Navy in training.

A year ago the total of military planes of all kinds produced per month was 120; now it is about 800 and increasing. From 700 airplane engines a month the manufacturers have increased production to 2,000 a month, and great new plants are under way to train that output in a year or less.

There has been a great deal of criticism of the methods of producing the new semi-automatic rifles. So long as the Government spends \$200 a month of the taxpayers' money in producing Government planes is close to 5,000 rifles a week and private manufacturers are about to begin making the same type of guns.

Production Schedule
