

To The Parents

The tragic deaths by automobile accidents of five young persons in the Pointes recently, should shock the par-ents of this community into a realization that they have a ents of this community into a certain that in problem of tragic import here at home which demands their limit instant attention. A large proportion of such accidents are after result of the spirit of speed and daring which are the anti-characteristics of youth. These cannot be changed but their indulgence can be brought under a rigid parental control [see hear the control of the indulgence can be brught under a rigid parental control, which will go far to reduce such accidents. It is the person at the wheel of the car who is responsible for almost all of the accidents in automobiles today, in the early days of the law development of the automobile a great variety of mechanical defects took their toll of life and limb. Fourly steering devices, bad tires, inaffective brakes all figured in the re-life. sponsibility. Today this is seldom the case. Now it is the human equation which enters in the explanation of the street and highway accidents.

To say that police control is responsible for most of these accidents is not stating the truth. With the accidents in which children of High School age figure, a very large measure of responsibility on be justly lodged directly against the parents. Fathers or Mothers who move heaven and earth to save their children from merited punishment when they have been hailed by the traffic police for violation of highway laws, often pursue a near criminal disregard of the driving practices of these same children. It is inexcusable for a father to say that he does not know how his son or daughter drives. All such had best inform thomselves immediately. Stern control of driving habits reinforced by denial of the use of the car for substantial periods will teach a lot of these youngsters to have botter regard, not only for their own safety, but also for that of the general 12:blic who must constantly fice the menace of their presence on the highways of the state.

For those of maturer age who drive with cynical disregard of the safety of either themselves or their riding companions or the public whom they encounter, the highway police are competent to exercise an effective restraint. For these, punishment after the fact is small compensation for the injured victims. Quick and adequate penalties for reckless driving is the prescription.

This "New Order"

Ambassador Gerard's instant and unstudied reply, that we had eight million telephone poles in America to which to hang traitors, illustrated nicely his genius for cutting across the camouflage of diplomatic verbiage when occasion demanded.


