The Babson Statistical organization of Wellesley Hills, Mass, has recently issued an article to the country which goes far beyond the scope of the relatively dry statistical matter which comprises the mass of its service.

Setting forth that the American people are a unit in their purpose to extend all possible help to England, and that the Nation is set to proceed on this course, we are bluntly told that we have assumed grave responsibilities. We are bluntly told that we have hurled a challenge "to the toughest and most carable of European political racketers the world has seen in centuries." Plainly speaking "our challenge is to produce more and better materials of war in less time than they can." The Babson organization expresses its complete confidence in our ability to perform this task under the system of free enterprise which is the warp and woof of the American economic plan, with the significant provision that this can be achieved only if all major groups practice the most complete cooperation, entered into equally in practical operation and in particle splrit by Capital, Labor and Government. Each and all have their direct responsibility in making the national producive machine function in a manner which will assure us of our ability to meet and overcome the most drastic competition ever presented in world history in a struggle for victory in production.

The urgency of the situation is realized by the people as a whole of the entire country and is well sensed by the leaders of industry. This is evidenced by their willing acquiescence in a basic corporate income tax which has been raised to 335° this year which is entirely apart from the Excess Peclits Tax which ranges from 20½ to 50%. This country has not been jarred out of its comfortable assumption that, come what will, no real danger can threaten us.


