





The people in the Detroit area naturally rejoice in the bonus and advance in wages which the Chrysler and other automobile organizations have made to their employes. The greater flow of payroil money into any community is a sure index of increasing local prosperity. The same circumstance however again accents the growing anxiety throughout the nation over the effect of wages and hours in industry on the national penardness program. national preparedness program.

national preparedness program.

The people, not only in the Detroit area but throughout the entire country, are deeply concerned over the problem of the general employment of all available workers and the diminution of the relief rolls and unemployment. This question, it must not be forgotten, is no leas vitally with us during the present period of strenuous preparation for national defense than in the circumstances which have obtained in the recent past when we imagined ourselves free from any threat of imminent untional danger.

threat of imminent national danger.

Senator Walter F. George of Georgia, chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee of the Senate, urges that all industries manufacturing war materials be placed on a twenty-four hour basis, with three eight hour shifts. Not only would this policy hasten the elimination of labor slack, of such recent deep concern to representatives of labor in their quest for the diffusion of jobs, but would go far to relieve the country of the greatly increased cost of war work by cutting down overtime. It is now estimated that this practice, often unavoidable in a sparse labor market, will cause an increase of \$2,000,000,000 no government contracts originally figured to cost \$10,000,000,000. The people must extravally remember that the enormous expenses now being piled up are a debt which nust eventually be paid, and that this burden will fall relatively heavier upon those who are least able to bear it.
