## "North West Mounted" Stars Cooper, Carroll

It moves along quickly after the Metis, led by Riel, Duror and his men, and the Mounted Police, led by Inspector Cabot (Montagu Love) at Fort Carlton, taking for an answer in twenty-four hours.
