With the final passe of the Lend-Lease bill and its approval by the President, the Congress of the United States and the Chief Executive did a good day's work for American Democracy and for the cause of Freedom throughout the world, They have lighted a great beacon for men who once were free and hope to be again free The United States Senators did a good day's work when they voted down auccessive proposals for amendments to the bill which were aimed at making ineffective the declared purpose of the measure The chief of the noutralising proposals was that there should be a declaration prohibility the employment of the armed forces of the nation any place outside of the Western Hemisphere.

The tergiversation of the American political mind is a thing fearful and wonderful to behold. A very short time ago, just prior to the outbreak of the war but after that event clearly loomed on the horison of Europe, Congress, at the behost of the administration, passed an inocaled set of neutrality intended as a complete assurance to the isolationists and pacifists of the country of our unalterable determination to keep out of any foreign involvements the instant effect of this measure was to kill at once the powerful voice which America might otherwise have raised in the councils of Europe towards Justice and the prevention of war By this act, among other effects, we foreswore the freedom of the seas, a policy to which we had adhered since the foundation of the Republic, and for the maintenance of which we had already fought one war in our heroic age when we were weak and the enemy was strong. This measure was intensly gratifying to the fearsoness and the patificials with whom tranquility is the greatest of earthly virtues, It was even more gratifying to the Lords of Force in Europe, who were thereby notified that they were free to proceed with their plans for the destruction of democracy, relieved of any anxiety as to the position of the slumbering giant across the Atlantic.

With the outbreak of war it was immediately recognized that the Neutrality act was a mistake, and to President Rosswelt's everlasting credit he was one of the first to awaken to this fact and take energetic steps to undo the damage. It took weeks of debate and harangue in Congress however, before supplies were made legally available to Britain. That country, which is as certainly fighing the battle for free men as those who stood at Bunker Hill or New Orleans, is now privileged to buy materials of war in this country, but must still arrange for their own transport and safe conduct. Every change and amendment that has been advanced during the progress of the Lease-Lend Bill in Congress has been aimed directly at making the measure as impotent as possible and to nullify its every major objective. The overwhelming majority of the people of this country favor aid to England. The time has come for us to employ common henesty and common sense in this matter it is rank hypocrisy for us to make an offer of help which we know cannot be received.

The time has also come for this country to make certain

know cannot be received.

The time has also come for this country to make certain decisions. We are going to help England in every practical way or we are not, in effect, going to help her at all. We are going to take our position as a forthright courageous people among the nations of the world conscious of our rights and of our duties and of our power or we are going to withdraw in sniveling fashion behind a wall of cowardly isolationism leaving to a smaller and weaker nation to fight our own ultimate battle. The American people must pult temselves together and look facts in the face. Britain with not our help can hardly survive. If she falls with her goes down a great world fluing Commonwealth of free men speak ing our tonget, largely of our blood and observing and pur suing in every essential detail our way of life. Inversely America sans Britain cannot be defeated. Let there be no mingivings on this score.


