LEROY C. SMITH IS ENDORSED BY FRANK C. ROGERS

Republican Candidate For Highway Commissioner Given High Praise

Leroy C. Smith, Republican candidate for State Highway Commissioner, has been strongly endorsed by Frank C. Rogers, Michigan's "father of good roads," who declared, "After 32 years' experience, no man in Michigan knows more about road building and management than Leroy C. Smith."

Rogers, who served as Michigan's third State Highway Commissioner from 1915 to 1929, recalled the circumstances that led to Mr. Smith's nine year service with the State Highway Department as engineer and deputy highway commissioner.

While Mr. Rogers was deputy highway commissioner, he needed an assistant. Mr. Rogers reported, "Our work was almost exclusively with farmers building gravel and macadam roads."

"I wrote Fred Vedder, head of the engineering department of Michigan State College, asking him to recommend a recent engineering graduate for the post and we found that a man born on the farm and accustomed to working with farmers was preferred."

"I hired Smith at \$50 a month and made him my deputy when I became Commissioner in 1931 and he remained in that capacity until 1938 when he became Wayne County's road engineer."






