In some cases immunization does not last but a few years and it is suggested that the parents have their doctors give their children a Schick test every three or four years at least.

"We must be prepared," he said, "for anything in the future and while we may never need all the protective measures we are taking, it does not pay to become efficient after the damage has been done."

"And most of all," Everhart continued, "we must not become lax in our attitude toward the defense of our community. Just because the possibility for a direct attack may seem remote this does not mean that we here in Grosse Pointe will never feel the brunt of the war."

Annapolis are admitted to marry for two years after graduation.

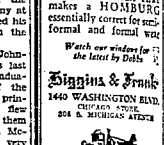
