## Pigeon Enthusiasts Doing Great War Job With Birds

The pigeon enthusiasts of the Grosse Pointe are making no small contribution to the war work in converting the hobby into a valuable asset in the vital communications service for the fighting forces.

This group which is composed largely of Belgians or citizens of Belgian descent make their headquarters in the Union Home Club on Chateaufort near Lake Huron. Here the birds meet and "obey" the race in hearts content, stimulated with an occasional glass of beer served at the club bar.

The local Home Club is affiliated with the Detroit Pigeon Flying Association, being one of the 12 clubs that compose this organization. The Detroit group in turn is a part of the American Racing Pigeon Union. The whole fraternity is a highly organized group with a central office and the members' pigeons their tricks and virtues are one of the main themes of life.

**Claim Well Founded**  
The Belgians boast that their people know more about carrier pigeons than any other people in the world and from their own centuries old experience in the use of the bird is not questioned. Pigeon flying is almost as old as falconry which was one of the great sports of the Middle Ages.

Now however what was normally a sport has become a real war time job. The pigeons are carefully bred and a rigid form of selection and elimination is followed.

Louis Ghesquiere, who is one of the moving spirits of the group, says that about the middle of April the bird owners will begin to bring their birds to the club and the flights will start. The birds are sent out in crates to points as far distant as 500 miles and accurate time records are kept of the release and flight to the home lofts. This year's birds are called young birds and they are not entered in long flights beyond their strength. By the second year they are old birds and tough enough for the longest flights.

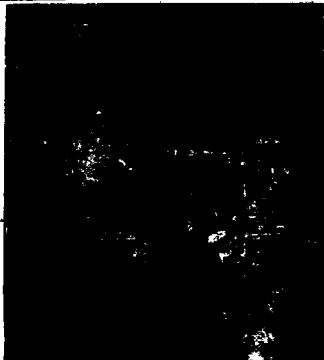

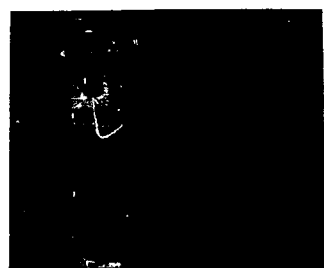

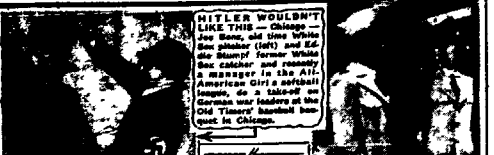

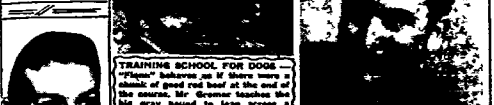

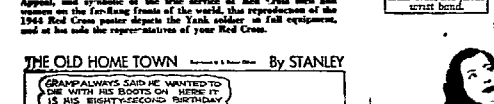
