

Park Raises Water Rates

However Charges for Meter Servicing of All Sizes Will Be Abolished

Amendments to the water service regulations in the Park village adopted by the Board of Commissioners Monday night provides that hereafter the water rental will be advanced from \$137 to \$180 per thousand cubic feet.

All charges for servicing meters however will be abolished. The smaller meters have been served free but a charge has been made for the larger size.

There was a lengthy discussion regarding the charges to be made for service connections between the water and the water on the property. Due to the fact that the water meter in the village are placed between the curb and the sidewalk it presents a difficult problem to arrange a charge which will be just in proportion to the service of the street.

Common sense then man urged that a uniform charge be arranged for owners on both sides of the street as is done in Detroit. In Detroit however it was pointed out the water mains are almost in the middle of the street where it is simple to make uniform charges. There the charges vary only with the width of the street but are uniform for all properties abutting on any given street. Final action was postponed.

Work Experience Program At High School Successful

Personnel representatives from many Detroit concerns have

interviewed students at Grosse Pointe high school during the last weeks to fill part time and permanent positions.

Approximately 40 students have obtained work through this program.

Interview between employer and student is only one feature of Grosse Pointe high school's Work Experience Program which was set up by the Board of Education in February, 1943.

Under this program it is possible for students 16 years of age or over to work half day and attend school half day.

Students working under this program receive five hours of school credit for the work experience.

Because students receive school credit for working it is necessary for the employers to be able to get along with the students on the attendance and the ability to get along with fellow employees.

Mr. Vincent Peterson, assistant principal and field counselor, facilitates the employers' reports of excellent, good average poor or very poor.

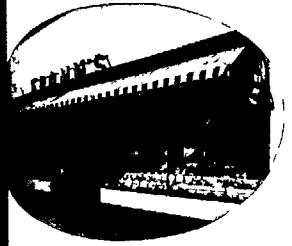

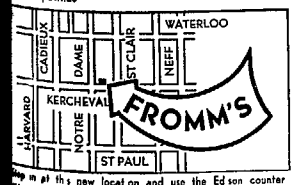

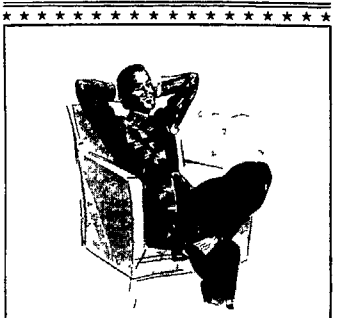
