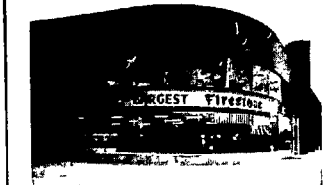

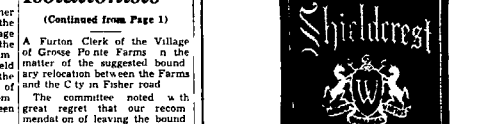

Adler Speaks To Rotarians

Writer Praises Russia's Part in War and Predicts Power Politics

The members of the Grosse Pointe Rotary Club listened to a most interesting and illuminating talk on Russia and its place in the war scene and its place in the post-war world by Philip Adler of The Detroit News at the meeting in the Whittier Monday noon.

Mr. Adler was born in Vilna, Poland. Russia but has been a resident of the United States for many years. His last actual contact with his homeland was on the occasion of an extended visit there in 1929 but he has been a close student of developments throughout Europe ever since.

He is an obvious admirer of the present Russian social, political and economic concepts, but forbore to predict how far these would impinge on the Anglo-American plan of democracy and free enterprise or how far he believed they should be permitted to encroach. He did, however, comfort his listeners with his belief that democracy had not yet run its course in human affairs.

He presented an impressive array of figures of Russia's tragic contributions in human life to the winning of the war as against the meagre corresponding sacrifices of Britain and America, whose offerings had been chiefly in materials and supplies. His estimates of the victims of Hitlerite brutality were largely those which have been published in the newspapers in recent weeks.

He frankly warns that Russia will insist on the territorial dispositions of her own liking in all those small countries which are bordering neighbors. His prediction there is of power politics, pure and unadulterated.

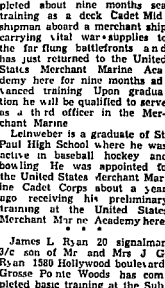

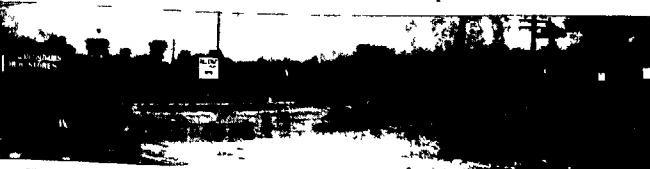
