

Grosse Pointe Bank Will Formally Open New Quarters Jan. 4

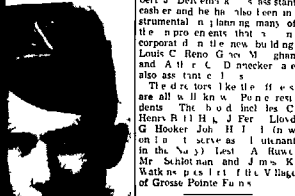
Local Institution Has Increased Its Resources from \$1,000,000 to \$11,000,000 Since Reorganization Ten Years Ago

The Grosse Pointe Bank will formally open its greatly enlarged and completely redecorated quarters on East 14th avenue at Rivard boulevard on Thursday, January 4. The public has been cordially invited to visit the building since 1910 the bank was founded and it has since grown from a capital of \$1,000,000 to one of \$11,000,000. The new quarters are of slightly less than 100,000 sq. ft. and its steady growth has required an enlargement of its quarters for some time. The completion of the new structure is now in a final stage and many added facilities are being completed.

At the time the bank is opening its new quarters, the former quarters in the building at 14th and Rivard have been completely renovated and redecorated. The new quarters are a modern building with a large open space. The exterior of the building has been extensively renovated.

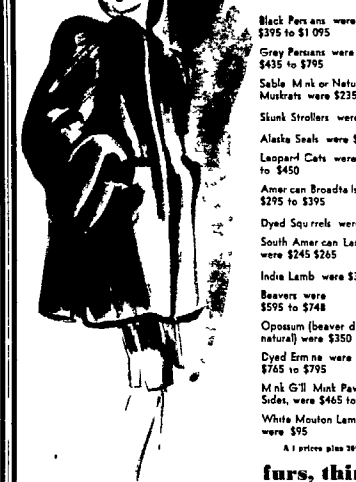

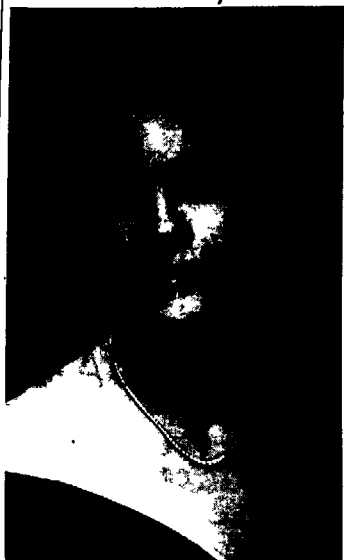

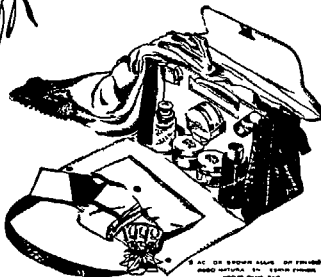
