The report includes information on the district's accreditation status, high school enrollment data, the number of special education students served both in district and sent to specialized schools within the intermediate school district, the district's school improvement plans, implementation of the state's core curriculum, scores on student achievement tests, and the district's progress in meeting national goals. The report also includes individual reports on each of the district's schools as well as the overall curriculum.

Parsons pointed out that the material in the book, including the various standardized test scores, are but a snapshot of a school system.

There are other factors not evident in a report - that make a school system what it is. Those things include the standards upheld in the schools, in the classrooms, by teachers on a daily basis.

The first report, dealing with traffic areas in the city and did the Brys traffic situation, stated that no new traffic control measures, such as stop lights or stop signs, be erected. But Brys Drive and the Cook and the report did suggest the painting of a yellow centerline down the middle of Brys to better define safe lanes of traffic. Also placing a "Slow curve" sign to warn drivers about the turning nature of Brys.

Cpl. Joseph Cardosi, who wrote the reports and is the city's traffic expert, further suggested that strong enforcement of present traffic laws would act as a deterrent against unsafe driving.

This response did not please several Brys residents. Beau Burton, who approached the council a few weeks ago with a demand for reduced traffic on the street, said that his sister, traffic expert working in California, was able to come up with four suggestions after reviewing the situation for a couple of hours. He said he expected the city to do better when it had 20 years to review the situation.

Elena Hunt, another Brys resident, asked why the city couldn't put up "no thru" signs like it did at Allard a few years ago. Cardosi responded, saying that when the city did that, Harper Woods reacted by placing "no right turn" signs at every street on Harper between Allard and Vernier. This has resulted in a lot of Woods residents having to take much longer alternative routes home.


Cardosi added that improperly placed devices often cause more accidents instead of preventing them, which is why consultants over the years, but the state adopted criteria for placing traffic control devices in the first place.





Chance made Park doctor creator of a new medical speciality

For Dr. William Beierwaltes, becoming the creator of the medical specialty called nuclear medicine was more of a happy accident than a planned

Beierwaltes, 80, attended the University of Michigan medical school and during the middle of his internship in Ohio, he was diagnosed as having tuberculosis. So from Feb. 20, 1942 to Feb. 1, 1943, he was kept in a hospital for TB patients.

"My wife, Mary Martha, had a relative in the law school who had us to dinner," said Beierwaltes. "This guy knew someone in the medical text book publishing business. Trio of women face 3 men in Woods vote

n Grosse Pointe Woods' municipal election Nov. 4, three women are challenging three male incumbents for city council seats, but the women are running as individuals without citing

But obviously the gender issue is present. If you recall, President Clinton's reelection was directly attributed to his success in winning women voters. But who knows how such an issue will affect a municipal election of this kind?

In the Woods, the male incumbents are Thomas Fahrner, 67; Al Dickinson, 66; and William Wilson, 63. Fahrner is the senior member with 20 years of service, Wilson has served for 16 years, and Dickinson was appointed in 1995.

The challengers are three women who have their own records of service to the Woods community, although not in the

council seats that they are now seeking.

They are Vicki Granger, 48, a member of the planning commission and formerly on the city parks and recreation commission; Lisa Pinkos Howe, 40, an owner of a small business who became involved in politics partly through the influence of her father, once mayor of the Woods; and Patricia Kukulka-Chylinski, 41, who based her campaign chiefly on the city's slow reaction to the Aug. 20 storm that flooded many Woods' basements.

In our interviews with all the candidates, we were impressed by the fact that they were united on one subject: The Woods is a good place to live and they want to make it even better.

Overall, we think Woods residents have an excellent slate of candidates for

the council, and we recommend that our readers review the lengthy coverage of their views in our news department today.

In the following paragraphs we offer samples of those views, which include some questions about the future.

Dickinson, for example, feels the council must develop a long-range plan, which would include expansion of parking, which he believes could best be done by buying property on Mack.

Fahrner, too, believes the most important issue facing Woods residents is the maintenance of city services generally, but he emphsized the expansion of available parking space.

Wilson wants the city to complete the closing of the Clinton Refuse Authority's incinerator and negotiate a new contract with City Disposal. He also would like to see the Woods encourage more recycling.

Each of the women candidates also has her own views about what she would like to see done in the Woods.

Granger, through her work on various city commissions, cited the importance of preserving the quality of life through maintenance of excellent city services while not raising taxes.

Howle sees the Woods municipal government as somewhat similar to her own small business operation. She understands the dilemmas of the small business owner, but concedes that the quality of life cannot be sacrificed for business.

Kukula-Chylinski believes the council should cooperate more with the business community and the residents. She, too, favors, a long-term city plan, especially for the business community, that would include more parking.

After our interviews and viewing their records, we recommend two of the three incumbents, Wilson and Dickinson, and Granger from the trio of challengers, with Howle also deserving voter consideration.

Mayor John E. Danaher is running for re-election to the council which will pick a new mayor, or return Danaher to office under the Farms' unique method of electing the council's presiding officer.

In interviewing the council candidates, we were impressed by the views of the incumbents, and also by those of their challengers, which made our recommendations as difficult to make as the votes the residents will cast Nov. 4.

In addition to Danaher, the incumbents running for the council are Elizabeth M. Gandelot and Edward Wilberding II, while the challengers are Fran Schonenberg, Martin West and Sue Vogel.

In our interviews with all six of the candidates, we centered our attention on two major problems for the Farms: what to do about the Mack-Moross property, and how to cooperate with area-wide efforts to lessen the pollution of Lake St. Clair.

All had ideas about both subjects as well as other matters of interest to the Farms. Their comments will be reported in detail in John Lundberg's coverage in the news section of next week's issue of the Grosse Pointe News.

In a sampling of candidates' opinions, Danaher said he believes the future of the use of the Mack-Moross property will depend on the cooperation the Farms gets from the other Pointe communities. His feeling is that it could be best used as a recreation center.

As for the lake, he feels that the Farms should seek a multi-county plan with all lake communities represented to coordi-

Elizabeth (Lisa) Gandelot, seeking reelection, proposes mixed use for the Mack-Moross property. It would include recreation, 40 to 60 units of senior congregate care, and possibly other uses.

As for the lake, she says the city will be soon required to provide separate storm and sanitary sewer systems and is now preparing for that eventuality.

Edward Wilberding II, seeking another term, would like to see the Mack-Moross property used primarily to benefit Farms residents but is not endorsing any specific use or activity at this time.

He points out the Farms still must prepare to fund the sewer separation project, but it is already moving to curb pollution by requiring properties that are sold to have disconnected downspouts.

Fran Schonenberg, who has been a leader in many Pointe civic activities, thinks multi-use was the general reaction when people were asked about the use of Mack-Moross, but she would also like to see a community center to accommodate SOC and other community activities.

She recommends cooperation of the three counties affected in order to build a hammer (a strong organization) to get broad cooperation on curbing lake pollu-

Martin West, another challenger, wants the city to control future use of the Mack-Moross land, but says it's more important to make the right decision than to make it speedily.

He also sees a multi-county approach to battling pollution of Lake St. Clair, but wants our own community to control any problems with our drinking water.

Sue Vogel, the third challenger, favors the community recreation plan as a more practical alternative to the use of Mack-Moross than senior housing. But she would prefer to see SOC located in the community center along with other community organizations providing activities

for Farms residents. She thinks the Pointe community could cooperate in a five-county organization to named to the Wayne County circuit bench.





Beierwaltes, resulted in the creation of a new medical speciality with its own separate medical society to help educate doctors in the latest techniques.

These education efforts took Beierwaltes all over the world, but in the end he returned to U-M, which always managed to offer him what he wanted and needed.

Beierwaltes retired when he was 70. But because of a technical problem with his pension plan, he retired a couple of months before the checks arrived. Also his neighbor, a certain pizza magnate, had done some work on his property that adversely affected Beierwaltes. So when a couple of his former students, now in charge of the nuclear medicine programs in Detroit area hospitals, offered him consulting positions, he moved to Grosse Pointe Park.

He stopped seeing patients in 1994, and during the past few years wrote a book titled, "Love of Life." It's been an experience he's enjoyed greatly.

But Beierwaltes' life hasn't been all work and no play. An avid sailor since he was 5, he counts as one of his favorite memories the Newport, R.I., to Bermuda race of 1960. During that race he was crewing for John Pierpont and the boat experienced the strongest winds ever recorded for the

"There was a five-hour period where the winds did not drop below 60 knots," said Beierwaltes. "We didn't lose our mast or rudder like a lot of boats. One of the crew likened the experience to being on the front lines during a war.'

Beierwaltes hasn't let retirement slow him down. He still swims 20 laps a day at the Detroit Yacht Club.

Those up for reelection are Mayor Susan Wheeler, and council members Joseph Jennings Jr., Patrick Petz and Dale Scrace.



not have crossing guards. When Patterson was asked why, he said that the school had never asked for them. One member of the audience said that she wasn't trying to be funny, but it was her observation that almost no one walks to the school, they are driven.

Councilman Eric Steiner said in the name of fairness the city should offer the use of crossing guards to the school even if they have never asked for such a service.




"To Be Fond of Learning is to be near to knowledge."

We start counting in our first year at school when our mentor beseeches us to tally two plus two. From that tender age on we spend many waking hours engaging in that intellectual exercise. If you count sheep to get to sleep, even more.

The legendary Ozzie Jacoby once told me if you don't count in bridge, you can't win, and this drill isn't singular. In the earliest stage of learning you count HCP to determine hand value. As your technique progresses you count out card probabilities, winners and losers, the shape of partner's and the opponents' hands from the bidding and play. Then when you've finally become some kind of an expert, you learn phenomena like correcting the count in accomplishing the glamorous squeeze coup.

It's no wonder that Joan Dewitt McKean spends substantial time emphasizing this requirement.

Here's 52 she told me about from a recent Grosse Pointe game that is as pretty a picture of effective defensive technique as I've seen in some time. The contributors were a couple of Anns named Hudson and Roberts, who've been two of our long-standing duplicate devotees. To succeed in scuttling this enterprising, but makeable slam, they employed skill, chicanery and count most effectively.



Roberts Hudson 3∳ 6NT P.O.

Ann Roberts got off to a fine lead, declarer winning east's queen with his ace. There were 11 obvious winners: four spades, two hearts, three diamonds and two clubs. A twelfth might be developed with repeated finesses in hearts or finding that suit dividing evenly, dropping the diamond jack or finding it with west. There was also a long-shot possibility of end playing east in clubs at trick 11.

First though, declarer had to unblock dummy's spade honors so the queen, jack were disposed with as both defenders followed. At trick 4, a diamond to declarer's ace and a heart to dummy's queen which Ann Hudson played low to in tempo with nary a thought of concern.

Ah, thought south with a hidden appreciation for his expertise, I've found my twelfth winner. At trick 6, a diamond to his king. (Note that to this point south hadn't played his ace, king of spades because he wasn't sure what to discard from

At trick 7, a heart to the jack and east king, to the noted consternation of declarer who was obviously becoming

Now Madame Hudson made a wonderful play. If south wouldn't play spades, she would and see what he would discard from dummy. A heart return would have been given up as declarer would have had to revert to the successful diamond finesse. Heavens, anything but that.

At trick 9 after oh-so-long, declarer went wrong and played a diamond to the queen, giving up on the 50-50 finesse.

The mistake left him in the untenable position of totally relying on hearts breaking 3-3, only a 36% probability. At 10, a club to his king and his high spade. At 12, a heart to dummy's ace and a show of confessed displeasure when the suit didn't





The Pastor's Corner You can work miracles

We all love the magical and we have a hunger for miracles. Miracles are God's magic, signs of power that make bread appear in the wilderness or disease disappear from someone who is ill.

Among the many apocryphal stories from the life of Jesus is one that speaks of the miraculous. It tells how an 8-year-old Jesus asked for permission to go see a holy man turn stones into bread.

His mother whispered something into his ear and he stayed home. Again, at the age of 11, he asked to go see a prophet who could foretell the future and make fire descend from the sky. His mother asked if he had forgotten what she had taught him and again she whispered in his ear.

The fibroid uterus

You may have overheard isolated conversations whispered among friends in the ladies' room or at a social gathering. But do you really know what it means to you or one of the thousands of women in our community to have a fibroid uterus?

Fibroids are generally benign muscle tumors of the uterus or womb. Presumably one smooth muscle cell grows and duplicates itself into a mass of similar-looking cells. The usual pear-shaped uterus then becomes distorted and enlarged with firm white lumps that look like small white potatoes.

Who gets fibroid tumors?

As many as 20 to 50 perent of women have fibroids, but because the condition may not be accompanied by any symp toms, many women will not even be aware that they have them. Women in their reproductive years, ages 20 to 50, have the highest incidence of fibroids. Older women in this group tend to have a greater number. In addition, African American women seem to have a disproportionately higher incidence and a faster growth rate of fibroids although researchers can-

What symptoms should I look for and discuss with my doctor? The most common complaint is abnormal uterine bleeding; usually heavier and longer menstrual periods. Some women will pass large clots and may become anemic (extremely weak, tired and lacking energy) while others have severe cramping due to strong contractions of the

misshapen uterus. Occasionally a fibroid begins to break down, causing acute pelvic pain or a chronic dull pain and pressure sensations. Due to their space-occupying effect, some fibroids can cause an increase in abdominal girth and compromise the bowel or bladder. Some women experience an involuntary loss of urine or constipation due to these compression effects. In some rare cases, a woman may have difficulty conceiving or carrying a pregnancy to full term due to

How can I be sure that I have a fibroid uterus? Diagnosis for all age groups is generally based on a careful history and pelvic examination. Pelvic ultrasound, a painless relatively inexpensive imaging tool, is often used to confirm a pelvic mass as a fibroid uterus

What are my options? Will I need a hysterectomy? While uterine fibroids do represent the most common reason for a hysterectomy, it is important to remember that surgery is not always mandatory.

Conservative nonsurgical management is a viable option

chosen by many physicianpatient partners. For many women, menopause may offer welcome relief from symptoms because the decrease in estrogen production causes fibroids to shrink. For those who wish to preserve fertility or avoid surgery, education and close observation are often successful.

When nonsurgical approaches have not worked, your doctor may recommend surgery. Reasons for surgery include heavy bleeding that causes progressive anemia or decline in your blood count, persistent pelvic pain or compromise to nearby organ systems. Some women may be preoperative candidates for Depo Lupron injections which shrink the fibroid tumors, allowing for a shorter, safer surgery.

For a very small group of women with infertility or a complex obstetrical history, a myomectomy, a major surgical procedure to remove isolated fibroids, may be an option. A myomectomy requires a minimum three day hospital stay and a sixweek recovery period. Newer outpatient surgical techniques, hysteroscopic or laparoscopic myomectomies allow selective removal of fibroids, but they are an option for very few.

At present fibroids remain a major health concern for women. It is true fibroids are not contagious but their effects are pervasive and invade into the lives of many. Yes, some will need surgery, but it is my hope that greater knowledge and awareness will empower women to seek answers and treatmen





mastiff, reddish-brown with black nose and eyes, who wore a padded cotton escaupil (body cover) in battle. His worth was deemed so great that his share of spoils amounted to 1 1/2 times that awarded a crossbowman. It was, in fact, common for the war dogs to receive a share of the bounty exceeding that of foot soldiers and often equal to junior officers. Of course, that booty helped fill the coffers of the owner. Becerrillo eventually ran into a flight of arrows while swimming clear of an attack, dying like his master before him.

The author has another chapter dealing harshly with the utter recklessness of indiscriminate breeding practices. He really lambastes the notorious puppy mills as well as the unbelievably snobbish attitudes of American Kennel Club mavens who continually persist in refining breed characteristics to an absurd degree.

The definition of breed as something with a registry and a standard dates from the second half of the 19th century. To be officially purebred, then, was to possess a certificate of pedigree --- papers --- certifying the dog's genealogy, and of course to look like its fellow breed members.

Their mixed blood often combines the best characteristics of different breeds, and these dogs are more likely to be more intelligent and adaptable than many of those pitiful creatures, the purebreds, who have had most of their senses diminished by indiscriminate overbreeding due to exploitive breeders.

While "Dog's Best Friend" is a serious-minded tome, full of important information regarding every aspect of the dog, on the other hand, "Mutts: America's Dogs" is a lighthearted romp through dogdom by way of those fabulous mutts who entertain us and share our lives in companionable comfort, far from the intrusive spotlights of the showring. Eminently qualified to discuss this subject are its authors - Brian Kilcommons, a veterinarian, and Michael Capuzzo, a syndicated animal columnist.

Their book is an absolute must for all true dog lovers. Almost each page has photographs of adorable mutts

their irrepressible doggy personalities fairly leaping out. In fact, my favorite shot is of a mixed-terrier that I swear is a close replica of my own Pudge.

As an extensive guide to selecting, loving, training, and living with our popular canine, this book simply cannot be beat. The introduction claims "Mutts are simply the greatest dogs in the world. Most of the beloved pet dogs in America are, in fact, mixed breeds. Most dogs in all the world are mutts. Yet this is the first book devoted entirely to mixed breeds . . . their magical place in our homes and hearts

The authors are firm in their beliefs that most people "would be better off with a mutt. Mixed-breed dogs are what nature intended of dogs and are on the whole healthier, often more intelligent, of more even disposition, and live longer lives than many purebred dogs. This is due to what geneticistats call hybrid vigor. Mixed-breed dogs are often the superior, economical

moral, and ethical choice. Sage advice is offered: "Go to your local animal shelter Trust that nature and the miracle of hybrid vigor that created our American democracy. produces better stock than faulty human-controlled breeding, which produced the

British royal family." There are absorbing chapters about all the various types of mixed-breeds, along with helpful instructions on the care and feeding of those fortunate creatures who lodge in our homes as full-fledged members of the family.

Training methods are explained along with pictures illustrating varying techniques. For an example, the popular choke-collar system is much deplored, and another method is suggested, more humane and successful.

Q. My dad saved my old marble collection. It includes some painted china marbles. Are they valuable?

A. China marbles can be expensive. It depends on the condition of the paint, the decoration and the size.

The most rare china marbles are painted with scenic designs. A one-inch diameter scenic marble in mint condition might sell for \$1,000. A one-inch china marble with lines painted on it, in comparison, is worth about \$5; with an intricate floral decoration, \$100.

Q. My sister paid \$45 for a cobalt-blue covered butter dish at an antique shop. The pattern

looks like the caramel-colored Holly Amber pieces. Did they make that pattern in cobalt?

A. Holly Amber was first made in 1903 by the Indiana Tumbler and Goblet Co. of Greentown, Ind. The pattern of holly leaves was molded into amber glass.

It also was made in clear glass and called "Holly Clear."


In the 1970s, several companies began making Holly pattern reproductions. The covered butter dish was one of the first. It was made in cobalt, chocolate and red amber slag glass.

Fall is an ageless, busy, beautiful time of year

October, beside being one of the most beautiful months of the year, is also one of the busiest, with plant exchanges, chrysanthemum sales, apple and pumpkin sales, trips to the cider mill and planting bulbs for next spring's flowering; not to forget old-fashioned fall housecleaning chores, making jams and jellies, potpourris and pomanders.

Color tours abound to scenic sites where the trees are in festive splendor and we all look ahead to Halloween and the holiday season

Chrysanthemums are traditionally the symbols of optimism and, in the Chinese flower language, of rest and ease. They are the flower for October in the Chinese flower calendar and were the badge of the old Chinese army.

In Japan, the chrysanthemum is the flower for September, the symbol for long life and happiness, and appears in the imperial crest of Japan.

The fruits and vegetables of the autumn harvest are legion. Grapes and rose hips make wonderful jam. Roadside stands are heaped with decorative and delectable squashes, pumpkins and ornamental gourds. Apples seem to be in endless variety in every shade of green, red and gold. Harvest festivals and county fairs are awarding prize ribbons for the best of these all across the coun-

There is a great deal of confusion in most people's minds as to whether tomatoes are fruits or vegetables. And it's all the fault of the United States Supreme Court. Botanically speaking, the tomato is a fruit but in 1893, after an importer claimed that tomatoes were fruits and therefore not subject to duty, the court, apparently realizing that the government was more interested in collecting duty than in accuracy, ruled that it was a vegetable. People have been debating the point ever

Incidentally, did you know that one mature tomato plant gives off one gallon of water on a dry day?


In one growing season, a single tomato plant requires 349 gallons of water; one corn plant, 54 gallons; and one sunflower plant, 130 gallons. No wonder farmers are upset during a dry summer!

The Native Americans ate many varieties of vegetables and fruits along with meat or fish, but because of the religious beliefs, would not touch certain foods. The Navajo and Apache Indians would not touch fish or the meat of beavers or bears. Some Indians would not eat turkey because they believed it to be a cowardly bird and if they ate turkey they would become cowardly too.

The most important cultivated vegetable was maize, or corn. Next in importance were beans, peas, root vegetables, squashes, melons, pumpkins and wild foods such as seeds, nuts, wild rice and flowers of various kinds.

Leaves and parts of plants used for greens or for flavorings were gathered and eaten. In the Southwest, cactus and yucca fruits, mesquite beans and agave were enjoyed. Most tribes ate



Q. Several years ago, we bought a brand-name, frost-free refrigerator. We purchased a one-year extended warranty and did not continue it any further. The refrigerator was trouble-free and worked perfectly. However, we recently started having problems, such as mild to warm temperatures in the refrigerator compartment. We were fortunate enough to have an extra large refrigerator/freezer in the basement and moved all the food there.

We have always maintained the appliance, such as vacuuming the condenser coils and cleaning other parts too. Can you explain what the problem could be?

A. Of course, without an actual hands-on troubleshooting test of your refrigerator, I can't pinpoint the exact problem. However, mild to warm temperatures in the refrigerator compartment narrow it down.

I also must ask you to be sure that some overlooked causes aren't the culprit. Things such as a faulty temperature control dial or even having it set too high can be problems. Also, check the door gasket around the entire door and see if it has a tight seal. Place a piece of loose-leaf paper between the gasket and door and see if you can pull out the paper. If you can, then you don't have a tight seal and you must replace the door gasket.


A major cause of the lack of cold air flow to the refrigerator is clogged evaporator coils. Ice will block the metal "fins" and prevent any air flow. If you can carefully remove the evaporator cover on the floor of your freezer, the job is half done. Next, remove the Styrofoam insulation shield and then turn on the temperature control dial. If the evaporator fan does operate, you are closer to the solution.

Now, use your household hair dryer on the solid ice and carefully melt it down to the evaporator coils. You must empty the drain pan under your refrigerator after you are done.

Return the parts to their proper place and check on the interior temperature after 12 hours. If all is well, you have succeeded. If not, you may need to call in a professional.

These characteristics occur naturally in hardwoods, such as cherry, oak, maple, ash, poplar and walnut. As they grow, trees absorb minerals and other essential elements that help to develop their unique qualities. These natural characteristics authenticate hardwoods, and ensure that what you're buying is not an artificial wood imitation.

The following are several types of character marks found in hardwoods:

- Bird's-eye A decorative natural marking with small circular or elliptical figures occasionally found in maple, but rare in other hardwood species.
- Burl A curly, irregular, decorative woodgrain figure. Also a natural swelling on a tree trunk that produces such a figure.
- Knots Hard, cylindrical regions marking locations of

branches encased by later growth of the tree.

- Fiddleback grain A fine, wavy pattern found in some maples and other hardwoods; traditionally used for the backs of violins.
- Figure The pattern or design seen in wood, caused by variation in color and arrangement of grain, rays and contours around knots.
- Grain The direction, size, appearance and quality of the fibers that give hardwoods strength and distinctive patterns.
- Growth rings Layers of wood added to a tree during a single growing season.
- Pitch pocket A small decorative spot or character mark sometimes found in cherry surfaces.



acorns.

Many herbs were used for seasoning. Wild thyme and wild onion especially. Some tribes used salt, but it was taboo in others. It was obtained by evaporating water from salt springs, the ocean or by trade. Some tribes used lye as a salt substitute and some used wood ashes, which are high in mineral salts.

The early explorers of this country found corn cultivated from Canada to Chile, and the Spaniards introduced it into Europe from where it spread all over the world. It is estimated today that more people around the world are nourished by corn than by any other grain except

Columbus spoke of the Indians making an intoxication beverage from corn. Champlain left the first record of the cultivation of corn in New England. The Pilgrims, soon after arriving on these shores, were taught to cultivate it by chief Massassoit.

The Indians have many legends about the origin of corn. Some believed it was the gift of their gods. Some termed it "mother corn," the giver of life. The

Pawnees thought that corn had visited the Earth first as a beautiful fair-haired woman, whose locks were still preserved in the corn silk. The six nations held a corn festival every year, and the Greeks held a Green Corn Dance.

The times of planting and harvesting corn were times of festival among the Indians. Corn has been used for food for a very long time. Recent excavations in New Mexico have shown that corn was grown in that area several centuries before the birth of Christ.

Flowers as well as fruits and vegetables are prolific in our gardens in the fall. Cosmos and chrysanthemums and marigolds and zinnias abound, and yet we can look forward to the perennials we plant in the fall for spring flowering. One of the most popular of these is the peony.

Many Greek legends mention this flower and the peony has been deeply revered since ancient times all over the world.

In pre-Homeric times there was a nation called "Paeonia," the only country ever known to bear the name of a flower.

Pliny gave a detailed account of the uses of the peony "herb" as a medicinal plant. Centuries later, in England and in Siberia, the peony was used as a seasoning and condiment.

In Europe, in the 18th and 19th

centuries, the peony was often the subject of paintings by prominent artists, either by itself or as embellishments to portraits.

Peonies have always been a leading motif in oriental art and

poetry and as the traditional "flower of prosperity" prized for its symbolism as well as its beauty.

Peonies planted on the south

A. There is most likely some hard food substance caught in the blades. Try the reset button on the under side of the unit. If that doesn't work, make sure the unit is turned off, insert a broom handle and give the blades a counterclockwise turn. There's also an Allen wrench on the bottom of some units that can be turned to release the clogged blades. One of these remedies will probably correct the problem.





It's that time to start thinking of feeding the birds



With the onset of cooler nights, we humans begin to think of the birds that visit our yards, singing to us throughout the spring and summer. Snug and warm in our houses, we wonder what will keep them warm in the colder months ahead.

Fall is the perfect time to begin feeding the birds. Even though there is a plentiful supply of natural foods during this time of year, birds begin to look for places that they will include in their daily scheduled stops.

If you plan to travel in the winter and wonder whether you should feed the birds while you are here, you can be assured that the birds will not depend solely on one source of food. In natural circumstances, birds have to adapt to changes in food sources. One of the skills that they learn is to con-

stantly look for additional sources of food.

If trees are available to you in your yard, tube feeders are the best way to offer seeds to those birds that prefer to travel among the branches as they approach the feeder. Their bodies are built for clinging to branches and they feel uncomfortable on the ground. The exception is the cardinal, adaptable enough to come to tube feeders that have a tray or ledge to accommodate this larger-bodied bird. Cardinals can also be welcomed to wooden feeders and will make themselves at home feeding on the ground.

Those birds that commonly rely on tube feeders would include chickadees, nuthatches, tufted titmice, house finch and house sparrows. Tube feeders should be filled with their favorites, either mixed or offered separately. The seeds that these birds prefer include black oil sunflower, striped sunflower, sunflower chips and safflower.


There are also tube feeders that are made specifically for thistle seed. With smaller openings for this tiny imported seed, the thistle feeders are a favorite of goldfinches as well as being

enjoyed by house finches. Winter visitors that are attracted to thistle include purple finch, pine siskin and redpoll. These birds reward our efforts by adding color and variety to our feeding stations, as well as amusing us in typical finch-like fashion.

For many, a wooden feeder is still the preferred way to feed birds. Some of the advantages of a wooden feeder are its greater seed holding capacity, the old fashioned appeal of its looks and the fact that it can accommodate more birds at one time. With an abundance of squirrels in this area, it is advisable to use safflower in any wooden feeder that is accessible to squirrels. If your yard-space allows, mount the feeder on a pole with a squirrel baffle underneath the feeder to keep the squirrels away from the bird seed.

Offer the same variety of seeds mentioned above, adding white proso millet for those ground feed-





Peeling paint may indicate a moisture problem

Q. I have paint peeling from my front room ceiling. I had my roof replaced two months ago; why is it peeling now and how do I repair it? Flaked of Harper Woods.

A. Moisture from the rain, although your roof was tarped, dampened your insulation and plaster. Now with the first heating cycles of your furnace, your house is drying out. Moisture being what it is, is trying to equalize itself and being greater in the attic, it's trying to come in.

A good indicator of this is when



the paint peels clean down to the bare plaster.

Usually the moisture comes from the lack of circulation in the

attic, or too few roof vents. What happens is the moisture trapped in the attic condenses when the temperature outside drops. More vents in the attic help prevent this

So before you work on the ceiling, correct the source of the problem, or at least prepare to do so.

Patching the peeling on the ceiling can be easy if you keep your patience. A rushed or skipped step here may make it very difficult to repair later.

Peel all the lose paint off the area using a scraper, putty knife, or even a small pocketknife.

Wash the area with a mild solution of T.S.P. (trisodium phosphate) and water. About one tablespoon per gallon of water. Then rinse well. Let dry.

Prime the bare area with plaster bonder or a shellac primer, like Bin Primer.

Using a 6-inch putty knife, the wider the better, apply a layer of drywall joint compound around the peeled area. Keeping one edge of the knife on the paint you can

feather the compound to the bare plaster. A professional will need two coats to do a good job, you will need three. Don't try to do this in one coat, rushing this will only leave the repair visible. My favorite trick here is: 1) keep the coats of compound thin and 2) use a sponge to clean up excess compound in between coats eliminating sanding.

Now you have a smooth spot in a ceiling with a slight orange peel texture from years of painting. Take the sponge, used for cleaning in between coats, and lightly dip it in the compound. Now tap the repaired area (it should look good by now) with the sponge until you emulate the texture of the old ceiling. The thinner the better.

Prime and paint your ceiling and move on to the next project.

A good job done, is a job done for good.

side of the house will bloom first and give beautiful flowers year after year. There is an old saying that the best way to grow peonies is to plant them and then leave them alone for 50 years.

This is a good time, too, to pot mint, chives, parsley, tarragon and basil for your kitchen windowsill. After about six weeks give them a plant food watering about once a month and you will have fresh herbs to use all winter.

Many other things can be plant-

ed in the fall for spring and summer blooming. Many roses, varied perennials — to be grown from seed, most lilies, many shrubs and trees.

Fall is a busy time. Leaf raking becomes a recurring task, but the scent of burning leaves, once a fall trademark, is now forbidden to city dwellers, but is still a country experience. Soon it will be pumpkin-carving time. October is a time for treats, not tricks, and it is perhaps appropriate that it ends with Halloween.

Choose plants for fall color when color's at its peak



What better time of year could there be to select landscape plants with good fall color than fall itself? Though fall color from foliage and fruits isn't as impor-

tant a trait as hardiness, ability to survive transplanting, mature size and freedom from serious pest problems, it is another characteristic to consider, suggests Sandra Goeddeke-Richards, home horticulturist at Macomb County's MSU Extension office.

"Once you've narrowed your selection of plants to several that will meet your top priority needs, why not select for fall color," Richards says. "And fall is obviously the best time to do that because you can see what the tree or shrub looks like at that time of year."

Another approach is to check your local nurseries and green-houses for attractive plants, then research their other characteristics to see if they match your needs. You can keep an eye out for outstanding plants in residential, commercial and park areas, too, Richards notes, but it may be difficult to identify them precisely.

Trees frequently recommended

for fall color in the landscape include the red maples "Autumn Blaze," "October Glory" and "Red Sunset," which turn orange-red, rich golden yellow and flaming red, respectively.

Sugar maples provide shades of yellow, orange and red. For reddish purple, consider Japanese maple or callery pear; for deep red, red or white oak; for yellow, honey locust, hornbeam and poplar; for lemon yellow, larch; and for purple, ash.

Colorful shrubs include the viburnums, some of which are known as "burning bush" because of their bright red fall foliage. Chokeberries' glossy green foliage turns purplish red in the fall, and the dwarf fothergilla ranges in color from yellow, orange to scarlet.

Another plant for autumn interest in the landscape is the common witchhazel, hamamelis virginiana. It flowers in late October to early November, just as its foliage turns golden yellow, and perfumes the air with its distinctive sweet fragrance.

Ground covers and vines can also add splashes of color to the landscape, Richards points out. Ivy and some other creeping plants will stay green long after deciduous landscape plants have lost their leaves. Virginia creeper and Boston ivy both turn red in the fall.

Colorful fruits on plants not only add color to the landscape but provide a winter food source for birds and other wildlife.

Some of these plants have other traits that are not so desirable, Richards notes. Some crabapple varieties have serious disease problems, particularly scab; and mountain ash has both disease and insect problems that tend to make them short-lived in the landscape. If you know this, you can choose another plant with fewer problems, or you can choose to plant the problem-prone tree or shrub for its desirable traits with the knowledge that trouble may occur.

ing birds such as doves and sparrows. There is also the option of using a low platform feeder to offer seeds specifically for ground feeding birds. If you choose this . option, a combination of white proso millet, cracked corn, and oil sunflower will satisfy your ground

Specialty feeders can attract a whole new spectrum of birds to your yard that you may not otherwise be able to enjoy. Try suet feeding in order to attract chickadees, woodpeckers and nuthatches. Suet can be placed in an onion or orange bag or a commercial suet cage made of plastic coated

Suet comes in many varieties in addition to plain — there are added peanuts, seed, and raisins in different combinations. The same birds that enjoy suet will also enjoy shelled peanuts which can be hung in close proximity to the suet in a feeder made specifically for peanuts. Keep in mind that the birds that prefer these foods do not prefer to be out of reach of tree branches. Situate suet and peanut feeders from tree branches with a baffle over them if squirrels get to be a problem. Alternatively, hang these feeders from a pole with a baffle, placing

the pole close to trees so the birds can easily return to their safety net of the tree branches once they are done feeding.

Window feeders are another great option to bring the birds close to you. A window feeder does not hold as much seed as other feeders but can be easily reached for refilling. It gives children, pets and shut-ins a form of entertainment. Window feeders can even be placed on second story windows. Safflower would also be the seed of choice in a window feeder that could be reached by a squirrel. If squirrels are not a problem, try sunflower out of the shell for ease of maintenance.

For those of you who already own tube, thistle or window feeders, now is a great time to clean them and check them for good repair. Most feeders can be taken apart for thorough cleaning in a solution of warm water and detergent. Let them soak to loosen caked on dirt, cleaning afterward with a brush designed for that purpose. If the feeders need disinfecting, a weak bleach solution (10 percent) is recommended.


Let feeders dry thoroughly before reassembling and filling. The same steps can be followed when cleaning wooden feeders with the exception of soaking. Once dry, treat them with an appropriate water based stain.

Make sure that you use non toxic treatments on feeders as they will come in contact with seed.

Take a moment to review how your feeders are hung. Are they easy to reach and fill? If not, check out some of the newest hardware that will make this aspect of feeding more enjoyable. Check out your existing hardware touch up paint where needed, adding lubricant to bolts, replace screws where necessary, and check any hanging lines or wires for sturdi-


Make sure your seed, especially thistle, is fresh and kept cool. If seed is placed in the house where it can get warm, the cereal grain moths that have laid eggs in sunflower while it was growing in the fields may hatch and cause an infestation in your house. Keep "pantry pests" on hand, a commercial moth trap that works by using moth pheromones instead of sprays that can be harmful to humans. If you store seed outside, invest in an aluminum trash can to hold seed in and keep mice and squirrels out.

Now that you have the basics of feeder type, seed and placement, use this time before winter sets in to get your yard ready to attract a variety of birds. Their bright plumage and colorful personalities will warm your heart in the cooler months ahead.



Dust off cleaning supplies for a feathery faux finish

Remember the feather duster your grandmother used? That same cleaning aid is being put to work these days to add texture and softness to ordinary walls.

The novice who has wanted to attempt faux painting but hasn't built up the courage to do so will find this technique both simple and inexpensive compared to other processes.

Vickie McCann, an interior designer with The Home Depot, says the technique produces a soft, arbitrary and random look which is great for a powder room.

"You can easily go with trendy in the powder room because it's usually easy to change if you get tired of it," says McCann. "The feather dusting look is different, dressy and unique all at the same time and will really impress your guests."

McCann suggests using a minimum of two paint colors, but that you can bring in as many as four. If your powder room has no natural light she suggests using three paint finishes — semigloss, satin and flat paint — to add texture.

"The first thing to do is determine your colors and style. Do you want a traditional look? Does your powder room lead to a formal din-



ing room or is it adjacent to your kitchen? Look at those colors and pick the ones which are dominant because you will want to maintain continuity," says McCann.

Before you start on the walls, test your technique and color scheme on a poster board, making sure to paint it first with the base coat you plan to use so that you feel comfortable.

After you have determined your color scheme, choose a semigloss latex paint as your base coat. Although this will lend the least amount of color to the room, the semigloss will create dimension and perspective once the light hits it. Use a paint brush to cut in and

a roller to cover the entire surface with your base coat.

Choose a satin finish latex paint for your second color. Put the roller and paint brush away and get out your feather duster. Pour a minimal amount of paint into a paper plate because you won't need much.

Always use "V" or "W" strokes up and down the wall in a random fashion, rather than painting in strips or panels.

When your second coat is dry, you're ready to finish with your

darkest color, which should be a flat latex paint. It will be the least amount of paint used and will tone down the previous layers. Use the same feather dusting technique in the second step, using a fresh paper plate and new duster.

"After you're finished, you should be amazed at how much dimension you have added to a small space using color, texture and your creativity," says McCann.


with cold water to set the fat, so I could skim it off. Soon the sink water was tepid, so I decided to put ice cubes into the water.





Misconceptions about need and cost of renter's insurance

When a tornado slammed into Detroit last spring, many victims who rent apartments were shocked to find out that their landlords wouldn't pay for replacing their property. Like many other renters, they mistakenly believed that landlords are responsible for their tenants' belongings.

That misconception is one reason why it's estimated that only 41 percent of renters nationally have renter's insurance, according to the Insurance Information Institute.

"Every renter needs insurance," says Terri Miller, vice president of personal insurance with Citizens Insurance Company of America in Howell. "It's inexpensive, and if you don't have it, you could have to pay out-of-pocket to replace everything you own."

Before consumer electronics became popular, young people in their first apartment often owned a beanbag chair, a cheap stereo, some used furniture — and little

Today, insurance is more important because renters of all ages usually own a great deal — a color TV, a VCR, a CD player, perhaps a computer, a microwave, recreational equipment and expensive clothing. Replacing it all could easily exceed \$10,000.

Renters face higher risks for fire and theft than home owners because they can't control the behavior of other tenants, Miller points out. "If your neighbor likes to smoke cigarettes in bed, there's not much you can do about it," she says. And, unlike many home owners, most apartment dwellers don't have alarm systems to deter burglars.

A renter's policy covers your property for fire, theft, vandalism or windstorm —no matter where it's located. For instance, it would cover you if someone stole your camera from your car.

Miller recommends buying a replacement-cost policy, which pays for the cost of replacing your belongings, instead of the old-style policy, which pays "actual cash value." With a replacement-cost policy, if your 5-year-old television is stolen, the insurer will pay for a brand new one (after you meet your deductible). With an actual-cash-value policy, you'd get what your used TV is worth today — usually a fraction of the replacement cost if it's a few years old. A replacement-cost policy

costs a small amount more than the older-type policy.

Additionally, a renter's policy provides \$ 100,000 of personal liability insurance, with up to \$500,000 available. This is valuable protection in case you're sued. If, for example, your dog bites and injures a child, you could be hit with a big lawsuit.

Prices for renter's policies vary

depending on how much property insurance you choose (\$10,000 is the minimum) and where you live. In Michigan, the most basic \$10,000 policy with a standard \$250 deductible can cost as little as about \$40 a year. More coverage costs only a little more.

In Lansing, for example,




Solid, warm and substantial, brick is in, and the Hearthside glories in it. A full coat of bricks covers its entire exterior. Columns, keystone arches and corner quoins add to the dignified appearance.

But the floor plan is far from stuffy. Family living areas dominate, with a swath of informal rooms cutting right down the center. The 18-foot ceiling in the foyer carries over into the street-facing, richly windowed eating nook.

The Grosse Pointe Real Estate market remains a strong Sellers' market with limited inventory compared to the healthy demand. 

to three berries.

Other reproduced pieces include compotes, creamers, cruets, mugs, plates, sauce dishes, sugar bowls, toothpick holders and tumblers.

TIP: In about three-quarters of all home burglaries, the burglar enters through a door, and most of those doors are unlocked.

Q. I have an old 7.5-inch silver fork with two times that point out. It is useless to stab pickles or olives. I was told it is actually a baked potato fork. How was it used?

A. Victorian dinner parties were more elaborate than some of our state dinners. There were about 12 courses. Each course had special utensils for serving and eating. A complete silver tableware set for 12 could have as many as 1,900 different pieces.

There was an asparagus fork, an ice cream fork, a pickle fork, a lemon fork and many more, including a baked potato fork.

Your fork was used to puncture the potato and place it on a dinner plate. Some experts call it a "sandwich fork," although how it might have been used to serve a sandwich is a mystery.

Eating out in Victorian times was an important social event. Those who had been brought up with "old money" and experience at large parties knew the correct fork to use. If you didn't know the proper silver piece to use, it indicated that you were not well-bred.

Today a fashionable table might be set with some of the odd serving pieces, but it is considered clever to use the server any way that works. A sugar sifter could be used for grated cheese, for example, or an asparagus server for small rounds of pizza bread.

A pair of sterling silver baked potato forks sold recently for \$225.

Tip: Moving can be a collector's nightmare, but you can use some common items to protect your fragile pieces. Rolls of paper that schools use to cover lunch tables are ideal for protecting plates and other items. Wrap the plates individually and then use paper plates to cushion them further. Put paper napkins between the cover of a teapot and the upsidedown lid. Toilet-paper tubes and disposable diapers can protect other pieces.

Q. Are rhinestones clear stones made to resemble diamonds? I've heard people refer to colored gems as rhinestones. Who's right?

A. Most dictionaries define rhinestones as colorless stones made from glass, paste or gem quarts.

Collectors consider facetedglass artificial gems of all colors to be rhinestones. Rhinestones come in every color, plus clear and black



Track lighting helps to accent points of interest

One of the best ways to create a cheery environment is with appropriate direct and indirect lighting. Like other design considerations, light influences the emotional response of the people who are in Look around the the room. rooms in your home and check traffic patterns. Is a functional space too dimly lit? Is an area meant for relaxing too bright? Fixtures should provide needed light as well as enhance basic architectural and decorative elements in the room.

"Many people are looking to change their lighting. We are also finding more and more people who are looking at track lighting

because it's versatile and relatively easy to install," says Scott Webb, an associate in the Home Depot electrical department.

Track lighting helps accent points of interest, such as artwork or sculptures. Mini tracks are available with 40-watt reflector bulbs to show off objects such as a small wall hanging or a curio shelf.

There are a variety of globe styles and finishes available in track lighting. The rounded-back globe, which resembles a softball in shape and size, is one of the most popular, says Webb. For a more contemporary look, you'll

want to use the step cylinder, which is more tapered toward the back.

The energy-conscious home owner may want to look at lowvoltage lighting, called the "gimbal ring" style, which is more expensive to purchase than the other models, but saves money in the long run.

Most fixtures are available in black, white and polished brass. although Webb says white is the most popular because it seems to fit into most surroundings.

If the do-it-yourselfer is familiar with the principles of electricity, track lighting is not difficult to install, particularly if an existing fixture is being replaced. Attaching the wires is easy if you know which colors to hook up to which.

If you are installing lighting in a new area, you must add an electrical box in the wall or ceiling __ and run cable to it.

value policy; a similar replacement-cost policy costs \$102 a year.

Some insurers offer discounts. Citizens, for instance, gives a 10 percent discount to nonsmokers and a 5 percent discount to customers who buy both renter's and

auto insurance from it. The 5 percent discount applies to both the automobile and renter's policy so the savings on auto insurance can sometimes offset the cost of renter's insurance.
