


Bestselling author Phillip Margolin grew up in New York City and Levittown. New York. In 1965, he graduated from American University with a Bachelor's Degree in Government. For the next two years, he was a Peace Corps volunteer in Liberia and later graduated from New York University School of Law in 1970. After practicing law for 24 years, Margolin decided to become a full time writer. The idea for his first book came during his clerkship at the Oregon Court of Appeals, *Heartstone* was nominated for an Edgar Award for best original paperback mystery of 1978. By the time his third novel came out, he was balancing writing with a law practice. His latest book is *Proof Positive* (2006).

An avid chess player, Margolin has been the President and Chairman of the Board of Chess for Success since 1996. It is a nonprofit charity that uses chess to teach study skills to elementary and middle school children in Title I schools.
