## SEEK TO CONVERT PARK INTO CITY

### Group Starting Move to Change Village Status

Citizens' Association Makes Survey to Get Facts and Figures to Present to Residents for Referendum

The agitation that has been underway for some time looking towards the conversion of the municipal status of Grrosse Pointe Park from a village to a city form is rapidly shaping up towards a concrete submission of the question to the decision of the citizens.

While this subject has intrigued the interest of the people of the Park for a long time, it is not until the past few weeks that practical research and survey work has been consuming a large part of the time of the Citizens Association of the Park for an important part of a year. Much work has been done and a mass of information obtained and compiled preliminary to informing the Park residents of the outstanding facts of the issue which they must possess to pass upon intelligently. Not merely the facts which would be effected in the form of the official structure as a city but, of concrete importance to the citizens, the ways in which the scope and quality of the municipal services would be effected. Of supreme importance is the question whether or not by cost of local government would be reduced or increased.

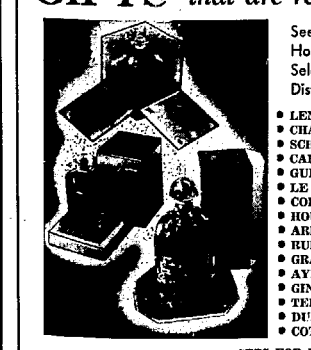

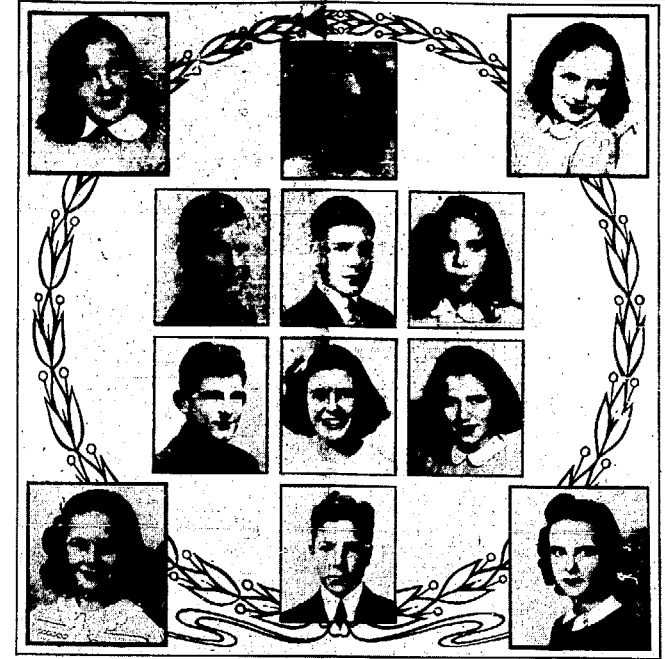

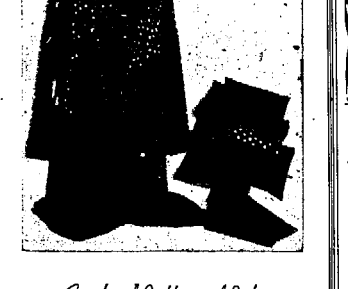

As another heavy snowfall made city streets slippery, and numerous fender smashings and other accidents caused by skidding and obscured vision were reported to police headquarters, Chief of Police Plaf today warned motorists to take practical precautions against prevailing weather conditions.

"Some of our citizens are mistaken," Chief Plaf declared, "that snow was predicted, and everyone saw it coming. Yet many collisions and other accidents are being reported. I date any half of these accidents as prevented by a little 'pre-emption' and a little more 'precaution'."

"When you stop to figure out the cost of getting out of a winter accident, you do not mention more serious accidents you run under which you don't receive a little more care in driving on hard-packed snow or ice."

# Alarm Of War Recalls Will Carleton's Poem

### Preparation for Defense of Nation Is Not New Thought in American Mind, Stanzas of Great Poem of the People Discloses

Preparation for the defense of the Nation is not a new thought in the American mind. Since the Father of his Country first admonished his fellow citizens, "in time of peace prepare for war" it has always been deeply rooted in the innermost consciousness of the people.

The present near hysteria has arisen because the movements in Europe have dramatically brought to the people a realization of the inadequacy of their preparedness for their own defense, much less their ability to assume the role of ultimate defenders of the world.

This intuitive sense of the need of constant readiness to defend their own way of life and freedom has been ever present but often emphasized over long periods of time. Sometimes this voice of warning has been raised in most unexpected quarters. Not always has it arisen in the halls of government or the conference of statesmen.

Sometimes it has come to us out of the mouths of dreamers or poets whose scientific patriotism has moved them to address their countrymen in living words of appeal.

An unusual instance of this is found in the stanzas of the late Will Carleton, a great poet of American life, a native of Michigan well loved by the older generation and known to the people of this region.

The sight moved Carleton to a midday reverie where, unperceived, he drew the picture of the following canvas on the beautiful slipper, carrying out merchandise to the far corners of the world in

"For the great Star ships now under sailings That were from the forest born, And boats that have birth in the mist of death Are laughing us all to scorn. The waves that beat upon the watchful wave Its swift and arrogant guest, With triumph he does and her ocean seen Stands low in the blushing West. Oh! World! Just made your grandeur is weighed Your treasures all men know, But why should you seek a wraith to weak your foe To guard you against a foe.

"You may gild your domes and adorn your homes Proud men of the rich new land. But what are they worth if half the Earth Is stirred by a war's red brand. The watchmen sleep off the banks that keep A continent's wealth in store; 'Rise! Where are your locks when an enemy knocks With clenched hand at the door. Your daughters and wives those winsome lives Make every land more fair What have you then Oh thoughtless men To guard them from despair.

"I see bright gold into tabrets rolled, I see sun leagues of ore; I see you with a zeal for the Nation's weal And carry them to the shore.

"And every one who holds many a friend, For all shows clear the right, The surest lease of comfort and peace Is a sturdy strength to fight. Let walls of iron your treasures guard As well as of heart and brain; And when the nations gull and the ship unwell May not have sung in vain."
