

She writes many mystery stories and originated the famous plot of two men carrying a dead man, supposedly drunk, between them; the third man is found later in a subway station, and mystery tale begins.

She is the mother of three children . . her husband has an executive position with the United Datroit theaters. She sold her first writings when she was 18 years old . . splurged and took a taxi downtown to celebrate.

Coming to Grosse Pointe about a month ago from Milwaukea, she lives now on Rivard boulevard. She thinks a great deal of writings of the late John Monk Saunders and claims his "Single Lady" was one of the best books which she over read.

She has a great many friends in the literary field. She is probably one of Michigan's most published authors ... writes under three pen names, but only uses one now, her own, which is—
