## Financial Obligations Of Draftees Are Problem

Local Board Member Explains Various Methods In Use For Helping Men Facing Induction Into Army

This is another in a series of articles being written expressly for the Grosse Pointe News by Judge Joseph Heinegar of the Local Selective Service Board.

A matter of more than passing interest to the financial obligations of registrants, especially at the time of or immediately prior to their induction under the Selective Training and Service Act, and there has been general complaint that selectees have either ignored their contractual financial obligations or have delayed contacting their creditors until the time of their contracts with the time remaining for disposition is too small to obtain an adequate solution. This procedure is detrimental to the registrant and the community. In the majority of cases, the company is not concerned in a fair and equitable solution, either by re-financing or re-purchasing articles so as to avoid inconvenience and unnecessary loss to the registrant and to the company.

**Solutions Suggested**

In most cases it is more advisable to all concerned if the articles purchased on contract, such as automobiles, radios, refrigerators, etc., are kept in use. Depreciation and obsolescence make stock of such articles expensive. To facilitate continued use of the articles purchased on contract, each case should be worked out individually and some solution sought out along one of the following lines:

- Reduction of the amount of the monthly installment so as to permit payments to be made out of the registrant's income as a soldier. This is the best solution.
- Transfer of selected equity of the member of his family, who will be the article and make the payments as they are due. The monthly payment can be charged as an income reduced by the amount of the purchaser's induction pay service. This is an equitable solution as it assures the family group that registered the purchase.
- Transfer of selected equity of a third party, who assumes responsibility for payment of the installment. In this way the registrant receives a part of his expenditure, the recovery depending upon the normal depreciation during the time retained possession and had use of the article. In working out this plan, most companies will waive the customary fee for transfer of equity and will assist the registrant in arranging the transfer.


