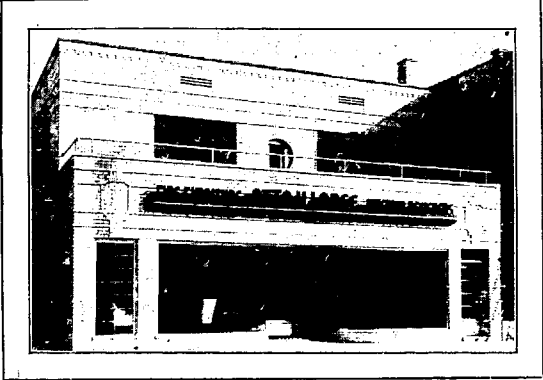

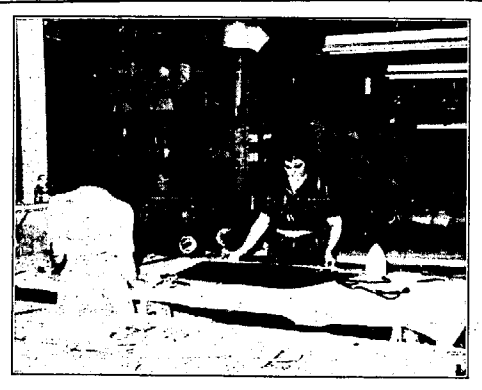

Highway Department to Build Causeway

WILL REDUCE TRAVEL DISTANCE OF FERRIES BY SIX MILES

The immediate construction of a causeway from the north shore of the Straits of Mackinac, designed to ultimately fit in with a bridge spanning the Straits, will be undertaken by the state highway department at a total estimated cost of \$1,700,000.

State Highway Commissioner G. Donald Kennedy said the causeway is expected to be completed by the end of the 1942 touring season and will be under way as an extension of the state highway system. It will reduce the travel distance for the Mackinac Island ferry from nine to three miles and will help up the capacity of the service by more than one-third.

The causeway will extend into the water a distance of 5,285 feet and its surface will be ample for 44-foot roadway and shoulders. The roadway will be constructed with ten-ton stones. Work will be taken soon on the first phase construction. This will be for some 600 feet and will include a second contract for dock facilities to be located on the pier.

Defends Title



End of the causeway will be awarded a little later.

The initial work will form the bulk of the project and will cost an estimated \$1,000,000. The dock facilities at the end of the causeway, which will provide two end-loading slips, will cost an estimated additional \$700,000.

Rapid mounting traffic on the state boats at the Straits makes drastic steps necessary if satisfactory service is to be maintained. This was taken upon by the Commissioner Kennedy and his staff for the first seven months of the year, with a total of nearly 34,000 cars about that period last year.

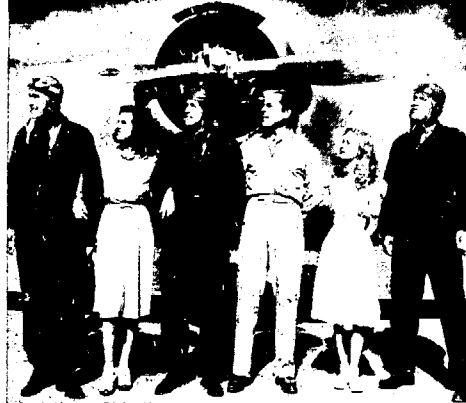
I found Ketter to be pleasant, intelligent, courteous, and peacefully quiet. He doesn't believe in wasting words, which proves again he is another "vanishing American."

Produced with Army Air Corps cooperation, "I Wanted Wings" was filmed at Randolph and Kelly Fields in Texas and March Field in California, a Flying Fortress base.

EDITOR'S NOTE: One of the most important films ever made, Paramount's epic story of the training and tactics of American youth for the Army Air Corps, "I Wanted Wings," comes to the Grandeur Theatre, Friday, in the article following, Mitchell Leisen, who directed the picture, tells some behind-the-scenes stories concerning its production.

When I was assigned to direct the Paramount picture, "I Wanted Wings," for Producer Arthur Hornblow, Jr., I admit I was somewhat self-conscious of the tremendous task that faced me. The problems were seemingly insurmountable and seemingly impossible to solve. But as each problem was reached, somehow the barriers began to crumble under the blows of clever technicians, and soon I realized that what had started out as a gigantic headache was turning out to be really lots of fun.

Location shooting was done at Randolph, Kelly and March Fields, with the complete cooperation of the Army Air Corps, and I have no doubt that "I Wanted Wings" could never have been produced so successfully were it not for the generous cooperation of the Army. Never before in the history of the motion picture industry has the War Department so closely cooperated in the making of a film.

At our disposal was placed twelve million dollars worth of planes and equipment, including fighters, pursuit ships, small bombers, medium bombers and even the famed Flying Fortress. And 1000 crews, their 400 officers and instructors and 2512 enlisted men to man the 1257 planes. Bringing civilians into an area where routine discipline and regulations prevail was a problem, but the many violations were tolerated or forgiven by courteous officers, as members of our picture troupe invaded sacred areas, charged into control rooms, out of the field, into class rooms and everywhere.

When problems of shooting scenes of squadrons in flight arose, the Air Corps would step into the breach, and in a few moments, a malpractice suit. Dr. Gillespie (Lionel Barrymore) aids his young protégé in discovering the obscure cause of the trouble, and in a dramatic speech to the jury, summarizes his "A Free State" solves the problem.

Agreeing to compete in his dramatic moment, Barrymore grips in the stirring climax. Miss Granville proves herself a skilled actress, and Laraine Day, as the young doc, a sweetheart, also acquits herself in dramatic sequences.

Comedy is contributed by Red Skelton, Alma Kruger and others, and Barrymore garners laughs when he sings "Marianne from Armentieres" as a lullaby for a baby. Also deserving special mention is the work of Diana Kruger, Paul Stanton, Alma Lewis, Walter Kingford, Ned Craig and Tom Conway.

Harold S. Bucquet turns in one of his most skillful jobs as a director, and excellent photography is contributed by Clyde DeVinna, whose "X-ray gun" lighting is spectacularly effective. David Shell composed the musical score.
