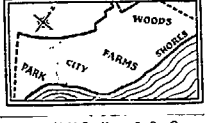


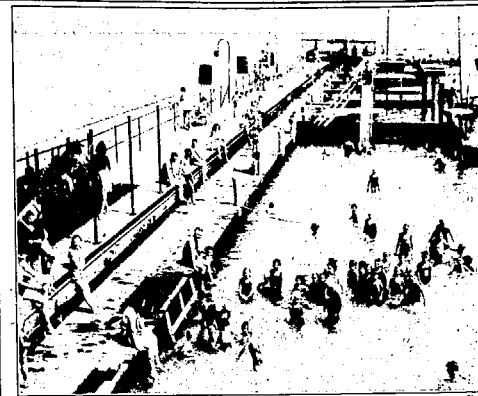

Grosse Pointe Farms Beach Affords Haven to 125,000 in Season

Back in 1921 residents of Grosse Pointe Farms decided that it was about time there was some sort of public accommodation for bathers and owners of canoes or other boats. After a year of public planning and discussion it was decided that a wood and concrete type pier be built at an estimated cost of about \$45,000. This original design was later changed for a pier constructed wholly of wood.

First planned to provide accommodations for 75 canoes and small boats, the pier has been gradually increased so that more than 1000 boats of all types are now housed there. The harbor is about 200 by 300 feet.

Attendee on Duty
 Lockers and dressing rooms have been built on the dock for men and women while quarters are provided for an attendant who has the duty of 24 hours a day and who is responsible for the conduct of the people and the safety of all private property on the dock.

Each life guard is employed by the village during the swimming season. During winter the beach house is kept open for life skaters and for boaters. Attendance at the pier varies greatly. On weekends as many as 5000 persons take advantage of the beach while the attendance is sometimes less than 200 persons.

Judge DeBaekle, who was one of the Justices of the Peace here, estimated that most of the accidents are caused by youths in their teens who are invested with over-enthusiasm and a show-off spirit.

110 Class Title Will Be Settled Off Yacht Club

Messitz, Pingree, Young and McPhee Among Painters Who Hope To Lash Championship To Mast Here Saturday and Sunday

The "110's", 24 foot sailing wonders are holding the class's first National Championship on Lake St. Clair August 23 and 24. Top boats of more than ten feet are coming to Detroit to fight with the local leaders for the Gellor-Strickland trophy, in a series of five races to be held through Saturday and Sunday off the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club.

The "110's", radically designed racing sloops, probably fastest sailboats for the sea area ever developed, were introduced here a year ago in Detroit by racing enthusiasts, John Hutchings, Jean Messitz, Clark Wormer. This was at the very start of the class itself, the first boat having been built from the plans of Ray Hunt in the fall of 1929. The Detroit fleet now counts twenty boats, including five belonging to the G.P.Y.C., and there are over 200 "110's" in the country, with other fleets in Mexico and Honolulu.

Local competition has attracted some of Detroit's best sailors and has been hotly contested. Season's top places have been taken by Jean Messitz, John Hutchings, Fred's HALE PINT and OSPREY, one of the G.P.Y.C. boats, sailed by two youngsters Tom Young and Ed McPhee, already so expert they have often shown their alert to the class's best.

Tore Franzen, chairman of the Race committee of the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club and head of the Detroit 110 Association is looking forward to some of the best competition seen on Lake Saint Clair in a long while. The East Coast is sending such sailing Genii as Mackey Derby, Walter Wood, J. T. T. sailing expert, Dick Fisher and Frank Gault, while Chicago's representation is headed by Hunt Schiager.

Jean Messitz, former 22 Square Meter skipper hopes to do well with his "DOTA", which carried local honors two years in row. Says he, "With my mast excellent work, Barney Hill, and my own falling back, I should have a chance at least to place."

Ernest Opintieck, Gilbert Pingree, who is remembered for his beautiful record with the 30 boat NORWIC was caught by Detroit sailors have proven their mettle. Several years ago Walter Hook cleared up at Kingston with the 22 Square Meters. Then Russ Alder beat the boat at Kingston in the International Race with his "BACCARATI". Powell Is Tops At Love Making

Styles Change with Scientific Improvements in Moviemaking, Says Star of Film Coming to Alger Friday

Styles in making love, like styles in clothes and automobiles, change with the years. That's the opinion of William Powell, the debonair actor who has wooed and been wooed so often on the screen he now thinks it wise to explain that the title of his latest picture, "Love Crazy," is NOT autobiographical.

"Of course the whole business of making love is founded on three little words—I love you," he says, then adds, "but the variations on that theme are limitless."

The people way up there in the gallery soon learned this meant a proposal, and though they couldn't hear what the actor was saying, they knew what was happening on the stage."
