### City Defeats Damage Suit

Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Stevenson Also Absolved in Action

Grosse Pointe City has just won the suit which Etta Williams a colored maid living a Detroit who did day work in the Pointe city brought against the City and Ralph K. Stevenson and Martha Stevenson of 546 Waukegan road for negligence in not having been received when she slipped and fell on the ice in front of her home on February 21, 1939.

The suit was not started until May 28, 1941, two years after the alleged injury and not retried until July 8 of this year. The suit was for \$1,000 damages.

The case was tried before Circuit Judge Lila Neuenfeldt the only woman circuit judge in the city and she has absolved the City and Mr. and Mrs. Stevenson from liability.

Judge Neuenfeldt held in her opinion which was handed down on July 2 that not only was Grosse Pointe City not guilty of liability as charged in the case but that the Williams woman herself was guilty of contributory negligence in not realizing where she was going when she stepped on the ice in front of the Stevenson property.

### Standish Backus Taken by Death

Standish Backus Sr. 68 who returned last February after serving as president of the Burroughs Adding Machine Co. for 23 years died at 4:20 p.m. Tuesday at White Plains N. Y.

Suffering from a heart ailment which had been the reason for his retirement, Mr. Backus had gone to White Plains in March to recuperate. Death was caused by a heart attack.

A death came as a shock to relatives who had been encouraged greatly by the recent progress he had made in regaining his health.

Mr. Backus was a member of a farm identified with Detroit's progress for several generations and he was connected prominently with the city's manufacturing banking civic and social activities.

After attending Detroit public schools and the University of Michigan he began his active business career with the North Eastern Engineering Works of Detroit.

No action was called for and none taken although the Commissioners have already gone on record as favorably inclining on the chicken issue in the interest of increased home food production during the war.

### Rams Second Abusive Opinions of Youth Lead Him Before Park Judge

Mr. and Mrs. Edward Eisenberg Badly Hurt After Accident on Jefferson

Edward L. Eisenberg of 226 Kenwood court seems to have a penchant for running into parked cars. Several weeks ago he ran into one at an early hour Sunday morning on Jefferson avenue resulting in considerable damage to both cars and skidding bodily along the pavement.

Last Sunday morning about 2:30 o'clock he ran into another parked car on Jefferson about 60 feet east of Grand Marais belonging to Edward Van Hull of 383 Meadowbrook Detroit. Again both cars were badly damaged particularly Mr. Eisenberg's.

Mrs. Eisenberg was riding in the car with Mr. Eisenberg and both were seriously hurt. Mr. Eisenberg suffered lacerations on his lower lip in which stitches had to be taken. He also had several teeth knocked out and his left leg was badly bruised. Mrs. Eisenberg had cuts on the left side of her face and teeth knocked out of her lower jaw.

Both were brought to the Park police station for first aid treatment and examination into the causes of the accident.

A young lady who was in the car with Mr. Van Hull's insurance was not a delinquent received bruises on the head and leg. She refused to enter complaint against the Eisenbergs.

### Abusive Opinions of Youth Lead Him Before Park Judge

On Tuesday July 8 Patrolman Dillaway of the Park stopped a car for speeding that was driven by William G. Hintze of 8835 Sylvester Detroit. Mr. Hintze was agreeable enough about the interruption, but a youthful passenger he had aboard thought the occasion demanded his opinions and he became abusive and profane with the officer.

This was not according to police protocol as observed in the Park police department and Patrolman Dillaway took Master Frank Schultz aged 19 of 2529 Beak avenue into protective custody.

He was afforded a prompt opportunity that same day to air his further opinions before Judge

Belanger who not entirely satisfied with an rendition, continued it for further listening at the regular session of Park Police court on the 14th but, under \$60 cash bail.

If you notice a "snow man" forming inside—heavy frost on the cooling coils—it's time to get busy and defrost the refrigerator. That layer of frost is costing you money! It means that the refrigerator must work overtime to absorb heat through a blanket of frost around the cooling coils. And for economical operation, the motor should run as little as possible.

It's only common sense to keep "ice-berg" the cleanest of defrosters—especially in summer when ice cubes are in big demand and you hesitate to have your refrigerator out of commission even for a few hours.
