

The pledges given by Murray and Green right after Pearl Harbor that there would be no strikes for the duration of the war were probably honestly given and well meant but the most charitable thing that can be said for this promise is that leaders have not been ablit to deliver the goods

Congress has passed an anti-strike law but inasmuch as a plant where it can be op rative must be practically a Government controlled establishment a lot of strikes can occur that will not be reached by this law

The President who has done more on the surface at least for the working people of the country than any of his predecessors seems pathetically unable to cope with the su uation. In the coal strike mess the best he has been able to obtain after weeks of himilating delays and dickerings has been a postponement of the showd wan until October.


