Highland Park Asks Village To Cooperate in Tax Battle

At the meeting of the Park Village Commissioners Monday night a letter was read from the City Council of Highland Park dated July 28 requesting a copy of a resolution adopted by the Highland Park Council on July 26 on which they asked the cooperation and approval of the Park municipality.

The purpose of the resolution was to bring about an arrangement with the United States Government whereby the war munitions plants it owns or directly controls shall make a payment to the municipality in which they are located as a part of carrying charge in lieu of the local taxes which such privately owned properties would ordinarily pay.

The resolution has been submitted to the municipal governing bodies in Wayne county. It recites there are many plots of land in the county and through out the whole country for which no tax which have been taken or by continuation proceedings by the Government and the removal from the lists subject to taxation by local authorities.

At the same time these properties are subject to the same measures of police protection in respect and general servicing extended to private plants and impose an additional burden on the municipal taxpayers.

It is argued that in common sense these properties which through normally government operations are in effect plants privately managed and conducted for a profit and should make a direct monetary return to the community commensurate with taxes they would pay if privately owned as well as privately conducted.

No mention of the fact that the Congress of the United States immediately after the last war fearful of the uncounted hoards that were waiting to flood war torn Europe passed stringent quota immigration laws based upon the number of natives in this country according to the census of 1910 and then on second thought decided that it had not made the limitation as stringent as it should be, amended the law setting back the census basis twenty years to the figures of the 1890 census which left reasonably high admission from Great Britain and Ireland, Germany, Scandinavia, Holland and Belgium but cut it down from Italy and the countries of southeastern Europe. A mere dozen of the figures that came here from those countries between 1890 and 1910.

A fine instance of the fuzzy dreaming of the planners as against the practical, wise and purpose of the plain people of America as individuals, expressed through their representatives in the National Legislature.

On Guard!

When the war approaches its final stages and it becomes clear that the Axis nations are certain to be defeated the Allied countries must be on guard to see that the Nations and the Peoples who brought this holocaust upon the people but their studious and long sustained planning for a war of conquest shall not escape the just consequences of their crimes against humanity.

The Allied countries particularly America have made the grave mistake from the beginning, of building up their whole war psychology, on a sort of Get Hitler Hirohito and Mussolini head. This was the simplest expedient to arouse an immediate fighting spirit among the people but this war effort means more than its conduct as a game of hit it the biggest head in a country. It is the people's own particular shining mark as Der Schickselgruber fades into the background.

Meanwhile Mussolini's successors in Italy say they are going to continue the war and if Hitler should be eliminated within the week we may rest assured the military leaders would do their best to carry on the fight to a point at least where they would hope to obtain more favorable terms after causing Hitler out of the picture.

There never was a time in our history when it was so vitally important that the people keep their feet on the ground and the heads out of the clouds. We got into this war to protect our way of life. We are still in it for this reason and it is not yet over by a long long shot.

Our leaders on our side in this war whom we may briefly call off in 10 names Franklin D. Roosevelt and Winston Churchill have been so busy in their unrelenting objective the unconditional surrender of our enemies in the Atlantic, the Pacific and in subsequent expressions they have added a certain modicum of ethical window dressing but we may rest assured that at bottom these are the same terms of peace treaty that no one of the fine dreams they have suggested for a wounded world would be even faintly possible of realization unless preceded by an absolute victory.

With this in mind there are some rigid guarantees that Germany will not start another war within the lifetime of a person living in the world today for the simple and assuring reason that she is not to have any weapons left to her with which to fight nor is she to be permitted to make any.

This is about as far as we need to look into the future now. When it is over America and England and Russia and China and the other countries will do the best that they can first and a proper peace treaty and then look about to do the best that can be done for each other and then eventually pick a long way off in the uncertain future for the One World so dear to the heart of Mr. Willkie and his kindred thinkers.

To distract our thinking now with schemes and plans and things that are not yet even begun to do any large scale work in the world is the very terms of the peace treaty can only be guessed at or hoped for in mild idiosyncrasy.

It does nothing but edge the whole structure of modern civilization closer to the malstrom of international insanity.

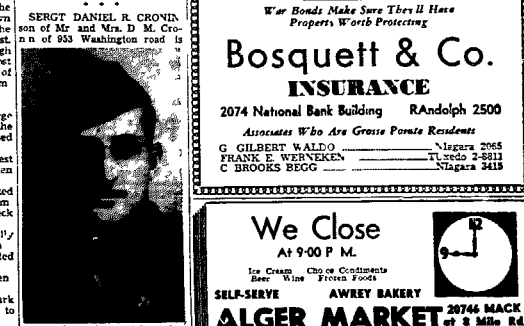
