Ten Commandments For the Home Front

I will hav War Bonds to the limit of my ability.

I will make my country's welfare the first objective of my own private life and thought each day and every day until the war ends and will refuse to cheat her in either act

I will if physically acceptable and within the prescribed age limits donate blood to the American Red Cross Blood Bank.

I will practice economy in the use of all things that there may be an equitable division and that others may have enough to carry on

I will be sparing in my criticism of what others ing and as generous in my praise as facts permit.

I will faithfully observe all the instructions of the Gov eriment in the procurement and use of all rationed articles

I will not be responsible by my own acts for any inter-uption of the flow of material of war to the boys in the firing ine who are fighting the battle for my country and for me

I will give information to the proper authorities when facts come to my knowledge of matters which the Govern ment should know and will not spread fact or rumor which might be valuable to the enemy and harmful to my country

I will always speak boldly of my country as the best and most successful unit of human society and government eve-created that with all its errors past and present it is and must remain a land of freedom, of opportunity and of equal

I will insist that the war end only with the complete vic-tory of America and her allies and that with this victory gained our Government shall use all its great powers to as sure that another war will not start again within any appre-ciable range of time and that this be guaranteed only by the complete and continued disarmament of those countries which were responsible for this one.

Speech From the Citadel

The Churchill speech from the Citadel in Quebec was insuring as have been all of his speeches during the war Since the dark days after Dunkirk which he described as Englands Great Hour all along the laboring uphill trail which is only now affording the first glumpse of the light shining on the hills of victory his public addresses have always been uplifting and unswervingly dedicated to the destruction of tyranny and the defense of human dignity

Speaking from French Quebee he appropriately ad dressed his first encouragements to France France is to be restored to her ancient high place in the community of nations as one of the great leaders of civilization

Much of his talk was devoted to an explanation of the absence of Russia from the several Allied conferences Obsousily he felt compelled to treat this subject at some length and apparently made a rather good job of it in telling why Stalin was not at Quebec without mention of his earlier failure to appear at Casablanca

The Quebec conference was called primarily to discuss Pacific theater of the war and an invitation to Russia who has a five year non aggression pact still in force with Japan might have been equally embarrassing to Stalin and the Anglo American allies

His hearers are left to speculate whether or not had Stalin been invited and had come the agenda of the con ference might have been changed to more fittingly accommo-date his presence to the whole global scene

Mr Churchill stoutly maintained that the stra egy of the war as planned and executed by the Britis and American leaders and as acquiesced in by Presider Roosevelt and myself had proved successful and wise

He insisted the time would come when great Anglo-American armies would cross the channel and carry the war direct! into Germany s homeland but this would only happen when the prosy ects of success were certain enough to warrant the attempt Even now the German war policy of arranging that all of the fighting should be carried on on the soil of her enemies that had obtained for more than a century had been ruthlessly upset by the devastating bombings to which she is being subjected

He gave scant attention to Italy further than to blast the corr; pt lasent leaders and to observe with respect to her Germ in taskmasters that it is much easier to join bad companions than to shake them off

He unswered the growing world query as to the probable end of the war in the only was that a sensible realist such as Mr Churchill eternalls is could answer it by saying that speculation on when the war will end was vain and unprofitable.

He paid high tribute to the heroism and unconquerable spirit of the Yugo-Silaxs and the Greeks. In his assurance to them of reaction and freedom however he admitted into his speech the one disappointing note that is apt to be pointed out by critics friendly and otherwise. He failed completely to make a single mention of Poland whose violation by Germans was the spark that touched off the war exactly four vears ago. war exactly four years ago

The Coming Light

Neither nations or individuals will long remain camp fol-lowers in a failing cause. As the war fortunes of the Allied powers have arisen the hold of Germany on the conquered peoples has loosened.

For the first year of the war she had easy going in riding rough shod over her weak neighbors. The quick fall of France in June 1840 was a great military tragedy for the allied countries. The battle in the clouds over Britain in the fall of that year historians of the future will refer to as com parable to the First Battle of the Marne in the First World war The crest of the German tide came nearly a year later when she drove almost within hailing distance of Moscow tide began to recede when the Russians stopped her

Then comes the present year when the mighty latent power for war possessed by the United States is just round ing into development and efficiency. The power of the Brit ish Empire and the United States is welded into a closely coordinated unit for waging war on a total basis for an uncon ditional victory

The victories in Northern Atrica and Sicily and the sudo-ping of the Japanese in the Pacific is only the prelude of thirgs to come. This is quickly sensed by the small European states that have been hixing under the German held for more than three years. So keen are the outraged peoples in these courtires to arise against their oppressors that they must be constantly warned by the Albes not to stage a premature eruption but must await the authentic signal.

Norway France Holland Belgium and even little Den mark until just now the least oppressed, are smouldering magazines of hatred that must be a constant terror to every red handed Nazi leader

The terrible day of reckoning walks as a perpetual night-mare with the people of German; but particularly those who must know that their names are entered on the rolls of the International Committee that has been investigating their records since the first bruild foray into Poland four years ago

records since the first brutal fora; into Poland four years ago Neutral Sweden has taken courage to deny German troops and supplies transit across her territory. Italy has been all but eliminated as a factor in the war Hungarv and Ru mania are trying to ease themselves out of the German picture. Spain has been told in no uncertain language that she must change her attitude of recordly neutrally toward Germany and she will heed the mans nurse their wrath for the day of reckoning and mean while gain such consolation as they can by enlisting by the tens of thousands in the fighting forces of the Allies.




