### Ward Voters Put Approval on Bond Issue

Only 341 Out of Estimated 2300 Go to Polls 80 Per Cent Favor Program  
The ward voters turned out Monday in relatively small numbers to approve the \$265,000 bond issue.  
There were 341 votes cast for the issue and 77 against. The total vote cast 80.33 percent favored the issue and 19.67 voted against it.  
The measure required that for a bond issue to be adopted 75 percent of the vote cast at the specific election must approve it. The proportion of favoring voters Monday was well in excess of this required percentage. The measure stands adopted despite the small proportion of the whole body of qualified electors who voted.  
The measure adopted is merely a plan to limit on the amount of bonds that may be issued. Only such amount of bonds as will not exceed 20 percent of the total amount of bonds outstanding at the time of the election may be issued to complete the work of the city and to provide for the drainage problem. It was specifically approved by 80.33 percent of the voters who were qualified to vote on the issue.

position as a guard in the Park beach at a salary of \$100 per month with the strong hope that when his tour of duty ended in the Park in the late fall a place would be found for him in the police bureau suited to his physical and mental capacities.
