| The late Henry Ford bought 161 acres of land in Grosse Pointe and had plans to build his "Fairlane" here but when he attended a froperty owners association meeting he changed his mind. |
| The land on Gaulkler Point which is now Mrs. Edsel Ford's home was bought by the late Mr. Ford, her father-in-law, before World War I. The isolated site appealed to him and he was interested in enlarging and changing the Milk River which flowed through the property: |
| According to his biographer, Allan Nevins, he changed his mind about a Pointe home because he felt his privacy would be invaded and he would be impelled to take a great part in community affairs. He always took a dim view of the Pointe as the home of the well born and aristocratic and the property owners' meeting did nothing to change his mind. |
| However, his son, Edsel, who had attended Detroit University school had many friends among the Chapin Macauley and Caulkins families here, wanted to build on Gaulkler Point. His father had torn down Matt Kramer's roadhouse which was on the land and changed the route of the Shore line cars, building a new road. More land was bought from the John estate, the Hurley estate and from Mrs. J. M. Brady. |
| Work on the lavish English stone mansion began in 1926. The Edsel Fords had been living in Indian Village after their wedding in 1916. Albert Kahn was the architect and the house featured a two story gallery in which the Fords hung their collection of fine paintings. There is a gate house, recreation house, power house, boat house, greenhouse and a 40 by 132 foot swimming pool. |
| While Ford was visiting the estate during the building he narrowly escaped death from a fire which started in a speedboat just as he stepped from the craft. |
| After Mr. Ford's death in 1943 the house was sought for several organizations. A. veterans' hospital, an airport, a lakeside park, these were some of the suggested uses. The estate was on the market in 1944 for $\$ 500,000$ but there were no buyers although this represented a fraction of the original cost. |
| Gaulkler Point was the site of Indian burying grounds and during the excavation for the house several Indian relics were found including a silver bracelet. |
| Forty-six of the acres of the Ford estate were included in Lake Township, which lay within the boundaries of Macomb and Wayne County. There were 13 registered voters in the township and the board of review was headed by Mrs. Ford for some years. |
| The property was withdrawn from sale in 1947 and today Mrs. Edsel Ford lives in the home that she and her husband built together. |
