In his will James mentions that he bequeaths to "his
beloced wife, Julie, all her paraphernalia, wearing ap...

domestic use or ornament ussally worn by her or re-
puted to belong to here and also all puted to belong to her; and also all my household fur-
niture, stores and supplies, books, silver, horses, vehicles harness saddlery, blankets, robes and personal effects
generally." His considerable property was left in trust to his
brothers, Philip and William (both Pointe lakeshore res dents) to be executed in favor of his wife and daughter and Son, James. Provision was made should Mrs. Mc-
Millan marry again, which she did to a Mr. Penrose. One
of the exceutors, William McMillan, died a few years of the exccutors, William McMillan, died a few years
after his brother and it was left to Philip to administer
the estate. Ircluded in the testament was land fronting the lake-
shore including a long dock which was shared by the shore including a long dock which was shared by the
McMillans and the Newberrys, their land adjoining.
Senator James McMillan and his partner, John Newberry had built twin estates "Lake Terrace" and built the ock for their steam yacht. John Newberry predeceased his partiner but the dock was left to his
B. Joy, John and Truman Newberry.
Philip McMillan finelly sold part of the 1and o
James Mcililan to Helen Snith Deming but it wa specifically stated in the sale that the new owner would
have no rights to the doct. In the final paragraph of James McMillan's will he
states: "I have made no bequests to my father or mother states: "I have made no bequests to my father or mother
but I desire to here solemnly recurd my appreciation of
their many kindinesses and benefactions," Young James, fo and chain seems not to have survived his father by many
years. William Charles McMillan his uncle who died in 1907 left two children, Doris, and James Thayer Mc
Millan, whose widow lives in Edgemont park today.
