# Slain teen's father offers \$1,000 reward

Any father would be understandably distraught over the death of his son. But the circumstances around the fatal shooting of 17-year-old Todd Poole on June 21 have his father and police perplexed by what is the second and most mysterious homicide in Grosse Pointe Woods' 30-year-history.

"Up until this happened he was a typical buy," said Albert Poole talking about his son in a desperate voice that betrayed his emotionless, 67year-old face. "He had a girlfriend and a passion for his car. The way this happened is just not normal."

Even Exec, Lieutenant Jack Patterson who has led the investigation of the shooting admits it's not a typical homicide.

"It's not a 'who dunnit' but how and why did this happen," Patterson said.

Patterson says police have almost exhausted their leads and expect to wrap up the case in about a week. No charges have been filed against Roger Stevens, 40 of 1039 Sunningdale Drive who told police he shot Poole four times after the boy allegedly kicked in two doors at his home.

The boy's father is offering a \$1,000 reward to anyone who can provide accurate information about where his boy was during the four hours before the shooting.

The mystery began about 2 a.m. on June 21 when three friends dropped the boy off at Mack Avenue and Lennon after a graduation party. The driver who tended bar at the party said the boy had very little if any-thing to drink, the father said.

ABOUT FOUR hours later, Poole was heard pounding and yelling to be let in Stevens' back door, police said. Stevens took a .38 caliber handgun he kept in his bedroom and went to investigate, according to Stevens' statement to police.

He confronted Poole in the kitchen. The boy lunged at him in a threatening manner and Stevens shot four times hitting him in the head, chest, and twice in the back, police said,

Adding to the mystery about who or what brought Poole to Stevens' home is the medical examiners' report that shows a 0.25 percent alcohol level in the boy's body which is extremely intoxicated, police said.

"I can't understand how he became so intoxicated," the boy's father said. "He left the party and had very little to drink there. I don't understand how (the 0.25 percent alcohol level) happened. He couldn't buy it because he's not of age, so someone had to furnish it."

Police agree that Poole must have been drinking with someone shortly before the shooting. His system showed no trace of drugs, police said.

A few leads have come during the last week but nothing yet has solved the mystery of Poole's last four hours, Patterson said.

He also said they have no evidence to refute Stevens' story about the alleged break-in. Yet the father has many questions that he says need answers.

"The puzzling part about the whole damn situation is that he was screaming, yelling, and pounding on his house for admission . . . Surely you would not scream and yell if you were breaking in. It went on for five minutes and no one called the police. This puzzles me . . . If this had happened to my home the natural reaction would be to call police," the father said.

Police say there is nothing significant about the pattern of shots because Stevens was in a panic and shooting at close range. Stevens returned to his bedroom and called the police after the shooting, they said.

"I can't believe anyone would do this under panic and be that accurate . . . then have the presence of mind to remember the emergency

number," the father said.

Poole said his reward offer has generated some information that may be helpful in solving the mystery of his son's last hours. But he admits that nothing will bring Todd back and he said he hopes to prevent similar tragedies from occurring.

"THE FACT that this happened to my boy doesn't mean it isn't going to happen to another boy or girl . . Everyone of these kids are exposed to the same thing that happened to this boy," Poole said.

Police will not speculate about what brought the boy to Stevens' home. Based on the facts they have, Stevens' story is sound, Patterson said. The latest information from the State Police Crime Lab shows that the imprint on the kicked-in door to Stevens' home is that of Poole's shoe. It was a typical forced entry with the door bolt broken through the door jamb. Patterson said.

Patterson admits there has been a lot of speculation about the case but says no one has offered any solid evidence that can be investigated.

"I get all these people saying something's going on here but no one tells me what," Patterson said.

Police expect this week to take all the evidence to the Wayne County Prosecutor who will decide whether charges against Stevens are warranted. Patterson said.

In the meantime, the boy's father said he is satisfied with Patterson's handling of the investigation and realizes that the police can only react to the facts gathered so far,

"We're all in the same position," said Poole. "But when you look at this from a sensible, reasonable angle, it doesn't make sense.'

## The new guy at St. Clair

He's only been in his firstfloor office at 389 St. Clair for two weeks now. And so when asked what his plans are for improving the curriculum or handling enrollment declines, Ken Brummel points out he really can't say right now.

He's busy gotting acquainted with this new community and his new position as superintendent of schools in Grosse Pointe.

But that's not to say the papers haven't begun to be shuffled around on his desk or his shirt-sleeves rolled up to tackle those school matters familiar to the system's highest office holder

Brummel has this week been interviewing candidates to fill principal slots at Trombly and Poupard schools.

And yes, he admits, there are plans to look at the curriculum in the future and "it's possible, but not probable" that Grosse Pointe schools will be open to non-residents to compensate for a 4,000 drop in students since 1971

Brummel quickly adds that "I have been hired in Grosse Pointe not to close schools. I value the neighborhood school.

The 46-year-old Holland, Mich. native was the Board of Education's choice this spring over 100 applicants to fill the vacancy left by Dr. William Coats, who has accepted a professor post at the University of Michigan's School of Education.

Brummel, former superintendent of Westport, Conn. schools, says he was impressed with the "seriousness of purpose" of Grosse Pointe's Board

of Education, Apparently members thought the same of him, giving him the top job in the system and a threeyear, \$49,000 contract,

In his office last week, Brummel said he is beginning to remember again what it's like to be a superintendent. The Connecticut educator resigned almost a year ago from his former post knowing board members there would not renew his contract because some were politically on the opposite side of the fence.

He since has been consulting for the Connecticut Commission of Education.

Among his achievements during his superintendency in Westport are reducing administrative costs, negotiating long-term contracts with collective bargaining organizations, strengthening graduation requirements and establishing a program of curriculum revision.

Brummel said his aim here will be to focus on strengthening the health education department, particularly addressing the problem of drug and alcohol abuse. He was the originator of "We Can" (Westport Community Action Now) in Connecticut where community leaders, parents and youngsters worked together to understand the problems of substance abuse.

Brummel said there are plans for informal meetings with parents and the community so they may get to know him better-another idea patterned after a successful "Breakfast with Brummel" program in hometown Westport.

There are also goals of conferring with the school board on 1981-82 objectives. In the meantime, Brummel says he is sure of one thing: "I just want to be a good superintendent."



## Kercheval Phase III okayed

The Park council Monday approved the third-and finalstage of construction work in a federal revitalization program for its Kercheval Avenue shopping strip.

The council unanimously approved a \$65,500 contract with Morrison construction of Trenton, to complete work to the east end of the business district - adding some items that were earlier deleted because of budget over runs and holding off on two proposals to study further improvements,

The basic, phase three program will cost \$46,700 and will continue the general improvements started at the west end of the shopping area. From Lakepointe to the east end near Beaconsfield sidewalks will be widened and decorative brick installed, along with new trees, colonial-style light posts, street furniture and cross walks.

In addition, the council voted to restore three small projects that were deleted from phases one and two because of cost limitations. The added projects include cast concrete litter

containers and bollards (\$5,280), additional trees (\$1,440), and improvement of unsightly right-of-way areas at a Mobil Gas station and Cable TV garage (\$12,050).

Deleted from the list of new projects were two studies aimed at future improvements on the shopping/service strip — an architectural survey of present building facades and improvements (\$5,990) and similar study of signs in the area (\$1,800).

Those two items were deleted from the contract at the request of Councilman Douglas Graham, who questioned the advisability of spending city money to design new storefronts for businesses when there is no guarantee the business owners will implement the designs,

Similar studies were conducted on Mack Avenue in the Park and, according to City Manager John Crawford, they inspired several businesses to improve their facades with private funds

The two items may be reconsidered by the council at a later date, after they are reviewed by the city's plan commission.

All funds for the Kercheval im-

provement project come from Community Development Block Grants to the city from HUD. The three-phase project was originally approved by the council in 1979 to encourage economic reinvestment in the commercial strip that is just across the border from Detroit.

Since work has begun, city officials say several new businesses have moved in or expanded and general business activity has picked up in the Kercheval area.

Dale Ehresman, of Stevens and Associates designers of the improvement project, said he considered the project a success,

"There's no question there's much more traffic and pedistrians in the area," E'iresman said, "The numbers of businesses that have moved in and expanded proves its success."

The final phase of the project was approved unanimously by the council July 13. Councilman Roger McNeill was absent from the meeting.

The Morrison Company was low bidder out of seven companies seeking the contract. Work will be completed with 120 days, according to the Morrison bid

The only restrictions to the rate are use of gas for heating a swimming pool, for running an air conditioner, or for an outside light. There are no income restrictions, according to SOC's Senior Citizen Information coordinator, Virginia Downing. Those making application must bring proof of age, proof of address, social security number and account number with Michigan Consolidated Gas. Persons 65 years or older must be head of the household where the rate will be established. The gas company defines head of household to be that individual whose name appears on the monthly gas bill and who furnishes the primary financial support for the family at the account address.

This is a voluntary rate and when requested the senior agrees to remain on this rate for a minimum of 12 months providing they continue gas service at the address stated.

Information on other locations where the forms may be filled out is available by calling the Michigan Consolidated Gas Co.

## **Kudos for O'Connor**

In the 191 years since the Su-preme Court of the United States was organized, 100 white men and one black man have served on the highest court of the land. Now for the first time a woman has been nominated and soon will be confirmed unless the ultraconservatives can come up with evidence to sustain their objections. That is not a likely prospect.

In nominating Sandra Day O'Connor for the vacancy created by the retirement of Justice Potter Stewart, President Reagan not only lived up to a campaign promise but apparently has made an excellent choice. True, Judge O'Connor has not had as much experience on the bench as some of her predecessors but she has had a broad range of experience in public life which will stand her in good stead when she weighs the issues that come before the Supreme Court.

Known for excelling in whatever course she pursues, Judge O'Connor is a Stanford law school graduate. She served as an editor of the Stanford Law Review, was made a member of the Order of the Coif, an honorary legal organization, and graduated third in her class. She spent six years in private practice in Arizona, served as assistant attorney general of Ariz-ona for several years, and then was appointed to the Arizona State Senate. Subsequently, she was elected to two full terms and was elected majority leader. She left the Legislature to run for Superior Court judge and served in that capacity until she was appointed to her present post on the Arizona Court of Appeals in 1979. Significantly, she was appointed by a Democratic governor after she had been mentioned as his possible Re-publican challenger.

right wing has protested Judge O'Connor's nomination because it is not satisfied with her record on abortion and the equal rights amendment. Yet it is finding diffi-culty in persuading any U.S. sena-tor to take the lead in opposing the nomination and the consensus of Washington observers seems to be that she will be confirmed easily. Arizona Senator Barry Goldwater, an old friend and supporter of President Reagan, has made it crystal clear he favors the nomination and thinks the ultraconservatives are foolish to oppose her. That weakens the opposition's case,

As women's rights leaders remind us, it has been a long and taxing struggle and progress has come slowly. Yet is was only 61 years ago, in 1920, that American women finally won the right to vote in federal elections through adoption of the 19th Amendment, even though many states had awarded them the franchise much earlier. It is ironic that the early suffragettes who favored equality for all men and women first saw victory over slavery and suffrage for black men before they achieved the vote for women. Now women can exult in another notable achievement.

**PRESIDENT REAGAN** deserves the commendation he is getting but some activists are still doubtful about his administration's overall record in appointing women. To date, it has been less than satisfactory but the nomination of Judge O'Connor does prove that the President is no longer ignoring the great human resources found in America's women in making nominations for the highest appointive posts in the nation.

those in the Pointes, would welcome the failure of the city of Detroit's efforts to reach agreement with its employes on a wage freeze because that would jeopardize the fiscal bailout plan which includes a 1 percentage point increase in the city's income tax on residents and commuters alike. Such commuters see Detroit's problems only from their own viewpoint: The city won't meet all the conditions, the tax increase will not become effective and they won't have to pay the higher rate. Looking at the problem selfishly, they find it good. Indeed, the city's rescue plan is on the brink of defeat at this writing. The American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employes has voted down Mayor Coleman Young's proposed wage freeze, and, instead, has sued the city to win payment of a scheduled 3 percent pay increase. The city has responded by threatening to lay off enough employes to balance the city's budget. It hopes to get state officials to accept the layoffs in place of the wage concessions and thus trigger the approval of the income tax increase as well, if the city employes persist in their opposition to the wage freeze. WHILE THE position of the city employes with respect to a wage freeze is understandable, especially in a period when living costs still are going up almost 10 percent a year, residents of Detroit and commuters who work in Detroit are also being asked to make sacrifices for the good of the city. Their sacrifices are in the form of the tax increase - from 2 to 3 percent in the city and from one-half of 1 percent to 1.5 percent for the commuters — and so the city employes are not being singled out to carry the load. In addition, the Detroit Police Officers Association already has agreed to accept a wage freeze through 1983 in return for a one-

But many other residents of the Detroit metropolitan area also making sacrifices. They are the people who have been laid off, re-

quired to take early retirement, forced into lower paying jobs or simply fired because of the recession. They are not just the employes of the auto industry. They include employes of suppliers of the auto industry, and the em-ployes of hundreds of other businesses and industries, large and small, which have had to curtail production, close down or even go out of business because of the impact of the auto industry's troubles. Among those affected, of course, are the owners and highly paid executives as well as the hourly paid employes.

They have been cutting back on  $T\check{V}$ broadcasts of golf tournaments, because, they claimed, their audiences have been declining except for the major events. Yet here was one of the great golfers of all time recreating the golf of his youth and putting on a show that helped lure more than 42,000 people to Oakland Hills. And the networks passed it up.

Although the script didn't say so, the presentation must bear a direct relationship to Kelly's valiant efforts earlier this year to punch King George II's nose. A namesake of Kelly used to do this very effectively in Chicago years ago. It is good copy, brings in a few extra votes and-the Legislator of the Year Award.

In case you wonder why I refer to King George, Mr. Kelly earlier had his fellow solons in Lansing adopt the wise resolution that the British Consulate in Detroit should be a corporate non-grata, that is ought to be closed down.

Why, you ask? Because Mr. Kelly wants to again fight the Battle of the Boyne and nullify three centuries of British Northern Ireland. Imagine what the senator could do to rectify historical injustices once he were to make it to Washington on his second, third or fourth try. Maybe he could get Mr. O'Neill away from his entanglements with his fellow Irishman in the White House to back a simple


Mexico might not appreciate it, but as in the case of Northern Ireland who gives a hoot about the wishes of the majority when "justice" is involved.

If the senator were to fail in all these endeavors, I suggest that he quit his efforts in the U.S. and join the forces of King James at the Boyne River. He could be sent as a lobbyist to Libya to facilitate the flow of arms to the I.R.A.

If that doesn't work, he could ambush an occasional Tommy in Derry, colleague of the two beaming folks who presented him with the Legislator of the Year Award. And if that wouldn't do he could always join the adolescents who hurl rocks and bags of excretment at the modern redcoats.


This would be much safer and more in tune with what he had his brethern in Lansing do to the commercial representatives of a friendly nation.







We gave a Minolta 101 copier to FIRST STEP, a Westland organization for battered wives.



The Breast Self-Examination Program, in conjunction with the American Cancer Society, teaches high school girls the correct method of breast self-examination through a film presentation.

The School Health Clinic Program recruits and trains volunteers to direct school clinics in the middle and high schools, as well as in a few elementary schools.


