It is no doubt true that the Milliken administration failed to foresee the extent of the depression when it came into view in this state. But we all have $20-20$ hindsight and few were pre-
dicting in the early days of the recession that it would be as long and deep as it has turned out to be. So estimates of state revenues turned out to be more optimistic than they should have been, with the result that sharp cutbacks in
state spending and state services became state spending and state services became necessary in order to balance the state budget.
It is also true that Democratic control of the Legislature kept the level of state spending at a higher level than Milliken's own budgets.
Milliken gave only a token endorsement of nominee until after the election. Then he called the GOP leader's campaign "negative" and "really appalling." and singled out Headlee's frequent slaps at the Equal Rights Amendment
