

# Woods to use \$23,000 HUD grant to fund master plan along Mack

In an effort to better plan for the future, the Woods city council last week approved spending \$23,000 in federal community development block grant funds to pay for a master development plan for improvements along Mack.

"With a master plan, we can provide HUD with supporting documentation for future re-

quests for funding," said assistant city administrator Jane Bais-DiSessa. "Every year the city submits requests for funding to HUD, which administers CDBGs. Each year the city starts from scratch in proving that the funding requests meet federal criteria. With a master plan, the city will be able to show HUD officials what they want to do and why, and they can show that it's part of a long term project for city im-

provement."

The study will be conducted by the city's CDBG citizens advisory committee, said Bais-DiSessa. The committee will study the best ways to improve Mack, and then submit a Request For Proposal (RFP). Once the RFP is submitted the city will solicit bids from engineers and architects, who will determine how much the committee's recommendations will cost.

Improving Mack, with sidewalk replacements, streetscaping and new lights, the city will improve and enhance its business environment for merchants and citizens alike, said Bais-DiSessa.

The \$23,000 is just part of the \$100,500 the Woods received from HUD this year. The city will spend \$31,000 for its Services to Older Citizens program that provides funds to senior citizens for minor home

repairs.

The city will also provide \$10,000 as part of the Woods' contribution to the Pointe Area Assisted Transit System (PAATS), which provides transportation for seniors and the handicapped. The city will also spend \$25,200 on the removal of architectural barriers in they, as part of an effort to make sure that city buildings comply with the 1991 Americans with Disabilities Act.

## Owners plan to preserve 300-year-old historic elm



It started growing more than a century before the United States was formed. Today, it would take at least three people — holding hands and stretching — to encircle the elm tree near the Country Club of Detroit, according to the owners of the property on which the tree stands.

But the giant elm is a little smaller today. Early one morning last week the 300-year-old tree cracked and nearly one-third of it lay on the ground.

The owners removed the fallen branch and will have some of the weaker branches braced with wire cables. The remaining two-thirds is apparently disease-free. In the fall, the owners said, they plan to have the top of the tree trimmed.

"It's huge. There are no elm beetles, but the tree is full of holes, where the wood has rotted out," they said. A plaque attached to its trunk identifies the tree as "a historic landmark to be honored and preserved for future generations," by the Elm Research Institute of Harrisville, N.H.

They said they intend to do exactly that.

## Cities say 'no' to St. Clair property

It doesn't appear as though the Grosse Pointe Public School System will be needing change-of-address forms anytime soon.

For the last year, the school board has been considering what to do with the district's aging administration buildings at 389 St. Clair in the City of Grosse Pointe.

The board asked for bids on the buildings and property last fall and received one bid for \$278,000 — about a quarter of the projected costs for relocating.

The cities of Grosse Pointe and Grosse Pointe Farms expressed interest in the property and asked the school board to delay making any decisions while they conducted a land-use feasibility study.

A letter dated July 27 and signed by City Mayor Susan J. Wheeler and Farms Mayor Gregg L. Berendt indicates that neither municipality wishes to purchase the property at this time due to the "significant financial and management commitment on the part of our two communities in addition to other considerations which we would need to address."

The City and Farms had expressed an interest in the site for possible development of senior housing. The municipalities jointly paid for a feasibility study and were granted two delays in order to consider the results of the study. The school board gave the cities a final deadline of Aug. 1 to respond.

"Last August most of the school board and community discussion centered on two questions: 'Shall the buildings and property at 389 St. Clair be sold and the money from the proceeds of the sale be used to support a move to and renovation of Barnes school?' and, 'Shall the administrative offices

## Report: Park could have lessened basement flooding

At the request of angry residents whose basements were flooded after a heavy rain on July 6, Grosse Pointe Park officials released the results of an engineering study of the city's sewer system at Monday night's city council meeting.

"The engineers concluded that turning on the pumps at the city's retention basin would have probably lessened flooding in some areas," said city manager Dale Krajniak. "Would that have eliminated flooding

completely? Probably not."

Krajniak said several factors contributed to the flooding. He noted that the homes that were flooded are in the city's flood plain.

The report also said that several sewer lines in the upstream reaches of the system "have capacity, which under similar rainfalls may cause surcharging and basement flooding at lower elevations. These include certain residences between Barrington and Trombley Street between Fairfax Avenue and Windmill Pointe

Drive."

The report also said that the severity of the storm was a major contributing factor to flooding. The storm was rated as a five-year, one-hour storm. That means, said Krajniak, that residents can expect a storm of that severity — 1.5 inches of rain falling in the space of an hour, every five years.

The report offered several suggestions on how to correct the problems. One recommendation was to begin pumping water into Fox Creek when the water level in the retention ba-

sin reaches 20 feet. Water levels reached 28.5 feet before the pumps were activated last month.

The report also suggested that the city install additional sewer grate catch basins in areas where flooding is most likely to occur. The report said this will slow the rate of rainwater entering the sewer system from the streets.

The survey found sections of the sewer system that need repair and said the city should implement a regular sewer cleaning schedule to prevent partial clogs in the system.

Area residents can also disconnect the downspouts at their

# Farms man gets prison in sexual assault

Despite emotional pleas that he was innocent and the victim of circumstance, a 30-year-old Grosse Pointe Farms man was sentenced in Recorder's Court on Aug. 4 to serve at least 40 months in prison.

Robert K. Martindale, convicted by a jury on July 1 of third-degree criminal sexual conduct and unlawfully driving away an auto, was sentenced by Recorder's Judge Craig Strong to serve, concurrently, 60 to 180 months for sexual assault and 40 to 60 months for auto theft.

"I have been convicted of a crime I did not commit," said a tearful Martindale as he sat in a wheelchair, wearing a brace on his neck and a cast on his left arm. "There's no way I could have done anything like this; I don't deserve this."

But Strong said he was tired of hearing excuses.

"He has no respect for the law and no respect for people," said Wayne county assistant prosecutor Andrew Telek. "He has explained away everything in his past by saying he is a victim of circumstance."

Strong agreed. He said Martindale's pre-sentencing report indicates a history of trouble beginning at Grosse Pointe South High School and continuing with a string of charges, including illegal possession of a credit card.

Following his conviction, Martindale was released on bond by Strong, based on Martindale's request that his fam-

ily needed him to help take care of an ailing grandfather and, following the grandfather's death on July 16, to help settle the estate.

On July 27, while out on bond, Martindale was arrested in Huron County for malicious destruction of property. Martindale said he was trying to break up a fight and was jumped by three men. He said he suffered neck and arm injuries from the incident.

Martindale's attorney, Dean Metry, explained to the court that his client's injuries were such that he could not get around without a wheelchair.

A Huron County Sheriff's Department bulletin says Martindale went to a cottage in Bad Axe to visit a woman, got into an argument with her and kicked out three windows.

"What you did while out on bond was offensive to this court," Strong said. "Then I hear you were up north when you were supposed to be taking care of business. It was a lack of respect to this court that you even left the area."

Metry said he plans to appeal the verdict and to file a motion with the court asking for a new trial based on a lack of evidence in the first trial.

The 30-year-old City of Grosse Pointe woman (whose name is being withheld as part of the newspaper's policy) who accused Martindale of assaulting her on April 15, 1993, said she doesn't consider the case over.

"This is garbage," she said.

"This will never be over for me. And I will never do anything like this again — it just wasn't worth it. I just get victimized over and over again."

The woman said she plans on changing her name and moving to a different community in order to get on with her life.

The incident began when she and Martindale encountered each other at a Grosse Pointe Park bar. Their parents had been friends and they had known each other for many years, but had never socialized, she said.

When Martindale asked her for a ride to his grandfather's house, where he had been living for the last three years acting as caretaker, she said she thought nothing of doing a family friend a favor.

When they arrived at the house, Martindale asked her inside and she said she agreed, thinking there would be no harm in it. She said once inside the house, Martindale confronted her and forced himself on her. She said he then stole her car and left her stranded in the Vernier and Lakeshore neighborhood.

The woman said she walked to a pay phone at Mack and Moross and called a friend for help. Her friend encouraged her to contact the police, although she said she was reluctant to do so at first.

"I didn't want my father to

know about this," she said. "And I was afraid of him (Martindale)."

Metry said Martindale and the woman engaged in a consensual act, and if she objected to it, she never said so. Furthermore, he said, there is no physical evidence in the form of injuries to either person or signs of a struggle at the house to indicate an assault had taken place.

"If she thinks she was assaulted, I might have to agree. But what I think happened here is that she did not consent to the union, but she did not communicate this to him," said Metry, who thinks his client was accused of sexual assault because the woman was mad that he stole her car.

But the woman said the experience has turned her life upside down and left her with no faith in the court system.

"I still can't believe that (Strong) let a convicted rapist walk the streets for a month," she said.

On Aug. 1, Strong revoked Martindale's bond and remanded him to Wayne County Jail until his sentencing on Aug. 4.

"The court believes that you can be rehabilitated," Strong told Martindale after he delivered his sentence. "But it must begin with you improving yourself so that you can come out a productive citizen."

## Heart attack claims North booster Cooper

Grosse Pointe North High School and students elsewhere will notice someone missing from school activities this fall.

Richard A. "Dick" Cooper died of a heart attack Saturday, Aug. 6, at his furniture store in Sterling Heights. He was 62.

"In losing Dick, not only am I losing a close personal friend," said North athletic director Tom Gauerke, "but students of this school and all students are losing a wonderful friend."

Over the past 20 years, the Woods resident took some 80,000 shots of student activities as North's unofficial photographer.

Besides taking pictures of athletic events, Cooper also photographed plays, proms and other school functions.

"I believe it's just as important to be a member of the choir as it is to be on the baseball team," Cooper told the Grosse Pointe News in an interview last March. "I think it's important for kids to develop self-esteem, and by giving them pictures and hugs and encouragement, I hope I've created self-esteem."

Cooper felt that being involved in activities at the high school level was very important.

"He wanted kids to remember their high school experience as something positive," Gauerke said.

As North's biggest booster, Cooper joked that the reason Grosse Pointe South people sometimes appeared in his photographs was because they got in the way of his camera.

Last winter he was surprised to receive a framed letter and certificate from the Blue Devils. Students and coaches at both ends of Grosse Pointe appreciated his work.

"Dick was a super guy and the community will miss him terribly," said South baseball coach Dan Griesbaum. "Not only did he take the team pictures for the schools, but he took pictures for the Red Barons and Little League and Babe Ruth teams."

"He took thousands of pictures of Grosse Pointe kids and I have several of them myself with my kids in them. There's going to be a definite void in the community with Dick gone."

Eight years ago, a garden at North was dedicated as Cooper Square with the entire student body in attendance.

One of the last things Cooper did for North was advocate lights at the school's football field.

"It didn't make it," Gauerke said, "but he was there (at the Woods council meeting). All of the students came up to him after the meeting and gave him a hug."

Born in Detroit, Cooper graduated from Cooley High School and Wayne State University. He picked up photography as a hobby while in the Army during the Korean War.

Cooper, the owner of Pioneer Furniture in Sterling Heights, started taking pictures at North when his son Chuck was a student there. He continued

when his daughter, Karen, and youngest son, Scott, were involved in various school activities.

Services were held Wednesday, Aug. 10, at Christ the King Lutheran Church in Grosse Pointe Woods.

In addition to his children, he is survived by his wife, Marlene Hesse Cooper; three grandchildren; and a brother, Robert.

Interment is at Roseland Park Cemetery in Berkley.

From 1975 until coming to St. Clare of Montefalco, Fr. Lambert also served the Parish of Infant Jesus of Prague Church in Flossmoor, Ill., as Sunday celebrant. After his four years at St. Clare, Fr. Lambert was transferred to Providence High School in New Lenox, Ill., where he was a member of the guidance department and counselor to freshmen and sophomores.

From 1991-93, he was guidance counselor at Bishop McNamara High School in Kankakee, Ill. In 1993, he was appointed pastor of St. Mary Church in Gainesville. He was

a member of the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal of the Diocese of Fort Worth.

# AIDS policy for workers is good business for employees

Too often, said U-D Mercy business professor Mike Witty, small and medium-sized businesses wait until there is a problem before setting a policy. And in the case of AIDS, that can be a costly mistake.

"There's a lot to be said for preventive policies," said Witty. "Most businesses wait until confronted with a problem to come up with a policy, and that's when mistakes can be made. Managers shoot from the hip and end up doing something that can get them in legal trouble."

Witty said that it's important for owners and managers to understand that the 1991

Americans with Disabilities Act protects people with a disease from discrimination.

That means an employee with AIDS or any other disease has legal rights, and can sue an employer for violating those rights. That gets expensive, said Witty. Someone can't be fired for having AIDS. They have the same right to promotion that everyone else does and these rights are protected by law.

"The issue of AIDS cuts across a lot of American phobias," Witty said. "Sex phobia, drug phobia, homophobia. But over the course of this decade the odds of a medium-sized business having to deal with AIDS either by having an em-

ployee contract the disease or a close relative of an employee contracting the disease is very high. Sophisticated companies know this and have acted accordingly.

"That does not take into account the cost to the economy as a whole. In African nations, the cost is tremendous because the disease has ravaged the middle class there. Here it's not so bad, but we are losing a lot of workers in their most productive years."

The best way managers and employers can deal with AIDS and other serious diseases in the workplace, said Witty, is through communications and leadership.

"By adhering to a standard

of fairness, and by working with employees and their doctors, employers can protect their business from lawsuits and keep company morale up," Witty said. "As long as an employee is able and qualified to do the job, that employee can't be fired for being sick."

Education should be part of any AIDS policy. By educating workers about AIDS and its dangers, they will help keep instances of the disease down, said Witty.

By educating workers on the best way to deal with AIDS, they keep medical costs and productivity costs down. By dealing sensitively with the disease, they engender good will from their most valuable

resource, their employees, Witty said.

When asked about when the employer will know if an employee is too sick to work, Witty said that's not usually a problem. Most employers have more trouble with employees who are healthy and take sick days, he said.

"HIV, AIDS or many forms of cancer can often be classified as a chronic disease," said Witty. "That means people can work for many years before the disease incapacitates them. Having a policy in place and fairly enforced just makes good business sense. We all know someone who is angry at their company for the way they were treated during an illness or the

illness of a relative. That anger affects morale and productivity."

Getting a policy in place should not prove difficult for employers, said Witty. Most trade associations and business groups, like the local chapter of the American Society of Employers, can help companies establish a policy, he said.

"This is one issue where management and labor agree," Witty said. "Medicine, law, management and labor are in agreement. It's best not to run and hide. Employers should know it's not in their best interest to inflame employees. It encourages lawsuits and invites government intervention."

## Mid-year tax checkup can save grief later

Although some people think about tax issues only when April 15 draws near, effective tax planning is a year-round action. Summer is an excellent time for a mid-year tax review and an ideal time to initiate some tax-cutting strategies, reports the Michigan Association of CPAs (MACPA). Here's how to get started.

You, and not Uncle Sam or your employer, are responsible for making sure your tax payments keep pace with your tax liability. Make sure your withholding and estimated tax installment payments will add up to at least 90 percent of your 1994 tax bill. Pay too little and you'll be hit with a penalty. Pay too much and you're making an interest-free loan to the government.

To keep more of what you earn, contribute early in the year to your retirement plan, such as an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), SEP or Keogh. Retirement plan investment earnings accumulate tax-free until withdrawal. By contrast, money put in your regular investment portfolio is subject to current taxation.

Calculate the amount of money spent to-date on medical and miscellaneous expenses. Depending on your income,

both types of expenses are deductible within certain limits.

Medical expenses are deductible to the extent that they exceed 7.5 percent of your adjusted gross income. If you're getting close to this threshold, try to accelerate some deductible medical expenses into this year. For example, arrange for treatment before year-end and pay the bill by Dec. 31 to take the deduction. If you won't be over the limit, consider deferring postponable treatment until next year when you may qualify for a deduction.

The same logic holds true for miscellaneous itemized deductions. Generally, miscellaneous expenses that exceed 2 percent of your adjusted gross income are tax deductible. Numerous expenses qualify for the miscellaneous deduction, including tax preparation fees, union dues and job-hunting expenses. If it looks like you may reach the 2 percent threshold by year-end, it might make sense to speed up payments for qualified expenses.

Review your overall financial picture to determine whether you might benefit from investing in tax-free or tax-advantaged investments. Depending on your financial situation and tax bracket, the after-tax yield on these investments may be

higher than those of many taxable investments.

While you're at it, take inventory of your capital gains and losses for the year. Tax law allows you to offset your capital gains against your capital losses and permits you to use up to \$3,000 a year in losses to reduce other income. Plan ahead. Don't wait until December to take stock of your investments.

Summer is a good time to look around your house for items that you no longer need. Donate your unneeded treasures to charity and you can generally claim a deduction for their fair market value.

You may also want to consider donating appreciated securities to charity. If you've held onto the securities for more than that one year, you benefit in two ways. You are entitled to a deduction based on the fair market value of the securities and you avoid paying tax on the appreciation.

Keep in mind that if you

make a donation of \$250 or more, you must obtain a written acknowledgment of the contribution from the charitable organization. A canceled check no longer constitutes adequate substantiation.

Since the interest you pay on consumer debt, such as credit card balances and car loans, is no longer deductible, it's in your best tax interest to pay off such debt quickly. If that's not possible, think about taking out a home-equity loan or line of credit to replace nondeductible consumer debt. With qualifying interest 100 percent deductible in most states, a home equity loan is one of the last remaining tax write-offs. However, since such loans put your house on the line, be sure you don't overextend yourself.

Although taxes may not seem like a high priority on a lazy summer afternoon, the MACPA says that the time spent on a mid-year tax review will pay off when filing time comes around.

## Some winners didn't fare well in Pointes

Gubernatorial nominee Debbie Stabenow swept all five Pointes in the Democratic primary, but she won't be facing off against Gov. John Engler, who had no Republican opposition in the primary, in November.

State Senate candidate Francis Hathaway led the Democratic primary voting in all five Pointes, but will not be a candidate in the general election.

State Sen. John Kelly's bid for the U.S. Senate Democratic nomination fell short statewide, but was equally disappointing in the Pointes, his home district.

Kelly collected the most votes Pointes-wide of all Democratic candidates, but won only in the Woods, and finished second in the Park and Farms and third in the City and Shores.

Spencer Abraham won not only the statewide Republican nod for the U.S. Senate, but swept the Pointes as well.

Despite the endorsement of

of the school system remain at 389 St. Clair and a plan put into effect to renovate both buildings? It seems we are back to both of these questions again," said superintendent Ed Shine during a discussion with the school board at its Monday, Aug. 8 meeting.

The board did not take action but is expected next Monday, Aug. 15, to further discuss Shine's request to consider a bond issue to pay for necessary renovations to the aging structures.

"A lot has happened in the last year," Shine said. "I do not believe it is healthy for the school system to return to a full-blown debate of the (issues). There is too much to do during the 1994-95 school year. Educational and financial issues are the highest priority."

Since it appears that the administration will remain at its present location, Shine outlined some repairs which he has determined need immediate attention. They include repair or replacement of the front pillars on the Cadieux School; removal of the storage shed behind the building and transfer of paper storage to the auto shop area at South High; and repainting the windows.

Shine also advised the board that a long-term plan needs to be developed. If the administration is to remain in its present quarters, he said, the buildings will need extensive renovation.

Board members agreed that a bond issue would be necessary to pay for major renovations. Minor repairs could be paid for through the general fund, he said.

The Detroit News the Woods' Sue Radulovich ran second both in the Pointes and the entire 1st state Senate district to the Parks' Peter Ecklund for the Republican nomination.

Christopher Cavanagh, the Democratic winner in the Wayne County Commissioner's 1st District race won just in the Woods and the Shores. Jim Curran took the other three Pointes; however, Cavanagh will be the Democratic candidate in the fall. He will face Republican incumbent Andrew Richner of the Park, who did not have a primary opponent, on Nov. 8.

U.S. congressional candidate Melvin Hollowell had the endorsement of Woods Mayor Robert Novitke and Shores President John Huetteman III and won handily in both communities. Unfortunately for him, the rest of the 14th district picked U.S. Rep. John Conyers in the Democratic primary. Conyers will seek his 16th consecutive term in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Voter turnout in the Pointes last week was slightly higher than in the primary vote in 1992, when there were no gubernatorial or senate races.

The City led the way with 33 percent. The Woods and Farms

had 32 percent turnouts. The Shores had 31 percent of registered voters show up at the polls and the Park had 28 percent.

Pointes-wide in the governor's race, Engler collected 6,705 votes. He was followed by Stabenow with 1,420, Howard Wolpe with 1,158, Larry Owen with 909 and Lynn Johndahl with 703.

Abraham led all U.S. Senate candidates with 4,032 votes. Ronna Romney was next with 3,187. She was followed by John Kelly with 1,112, Bill Brodhead with 1,086, Lana Pollack with 921, Bob Carr with 427, Carl Marlinga 378 and Joel Ferguson with 280.

In the state Senate race, Peter Ecklund received 3,175 votes. Sue Radulovich was next with 2,123. She was followed by Francis Hathaway of the Shores with 1,189, Joe Young Jr. with 868, Neil Heffernan of the Shores with 817, Bob Cosgrove with 771, Annie Mae Dyer with 310, Daniel Miller of the Woods with 301, Ronald Landry with 213 and LaMar Lemmons III with 48.

Republican Richard Charles Fournier led all vote-getters in the U.S. House of Representatives 14th District race in the Woods and Shores with 2,648

votes. Democrat Melvin Hollowell was next with 903 votes, followed by Marie Farrell-Donaldson with 432 and Conyers with 296. Fournier faces Conyers in November.

Voters were not allowed to split their tickets. For example, a citizen who voted for Abraham or Romney was not permitted to vote for any of the six Democratic candidates.

The Nov. 8 election (with incumbents in bold) shapes up like this: Governor, **John Engler (R)** vs. Howard Wolpe (D); U.S. Senate, Spencer Abraham (R) vs. Bob Carr (D); U.S. House of Representatives 14th District (Woods and Shores), **John Conyers (D)** vs. Richard Charles Fournier (R); U.S. House of Representatives 15th District (City, Farms and Park), **Barbara Rose Collins (D)** vs. John W. Savage II (R); state Senator 1st District, Peter Ecklund (R) vs. Joe Young Jr. (D); state Representative, **William R. Bryant Jr. (R)** vs. Kerry Baitinger (D); Wayne County Executive, Paul D. McMaster (R) vs. Ed McNamara (D); Wayne County Commissioner, Christopher Cavanagh (D) vs. Andrew Richner (R); and the Wayne County Community College Board of Trustees, Patricia Kukula vs. Mary Ellen Stempfle (non-partisan seat).

This will also slow the rate at which water enters the sewer system. The city should also replace aging pump station monitoring equipment, the report said, to assure a more accurate reading of water levels.

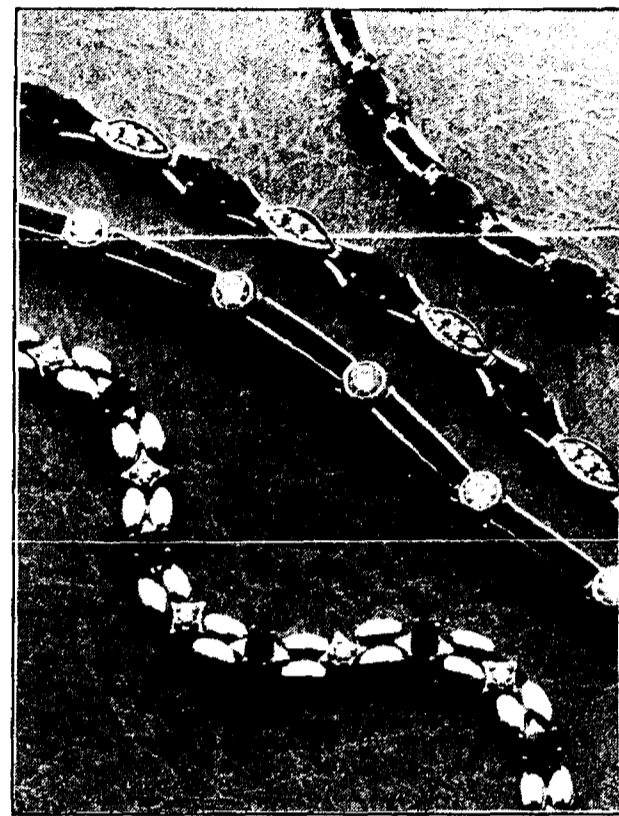
The report also suggested that the city seek additional sewer capacity from Detroit and explore developing a plan to provide additional sewer and

relief sewer capacity through other means as well.

Several residents were on hand to hear the report and they asked several questions, including whether the city will pay for damage resulting from the flood. Krajniak said that residents can contact the city's insurance agency and see if it will honor claims.

Mayor Palmer Heenan told those attending that the city would do everything possible to reduce flooding in the future.

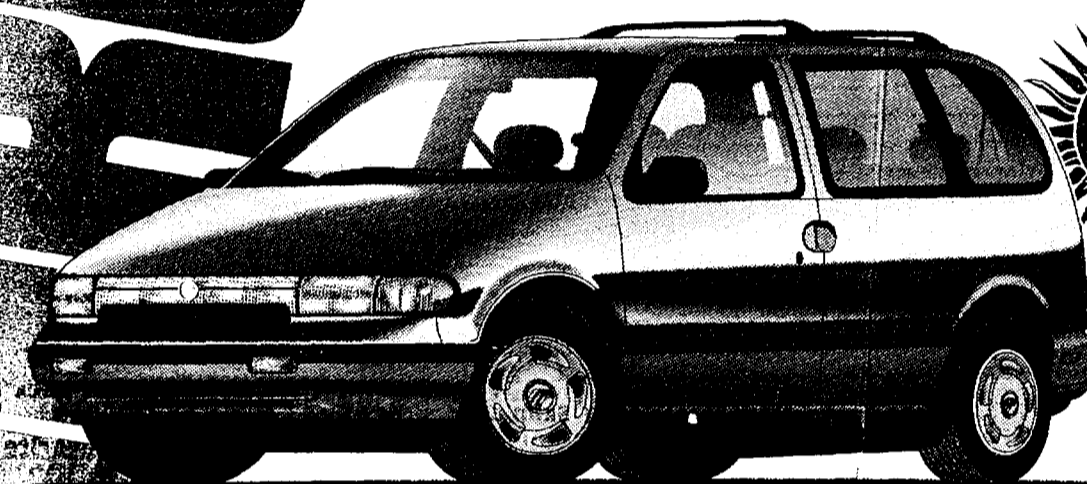

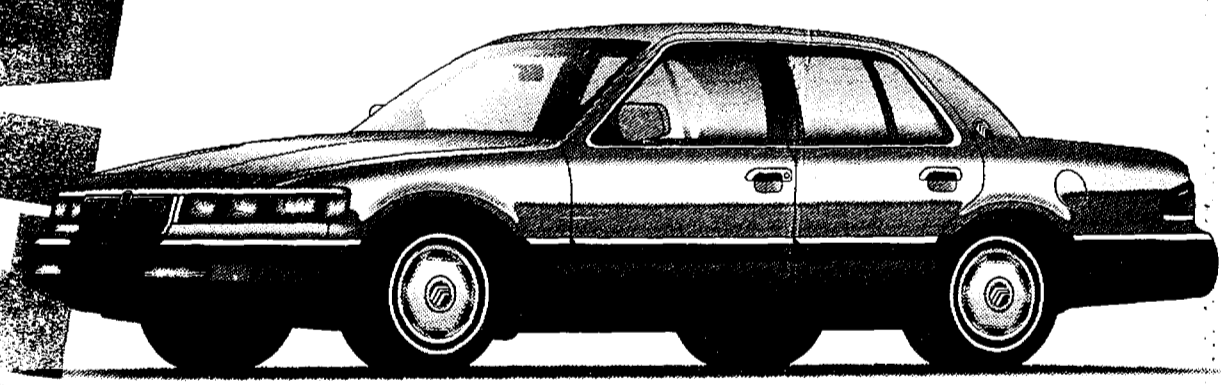

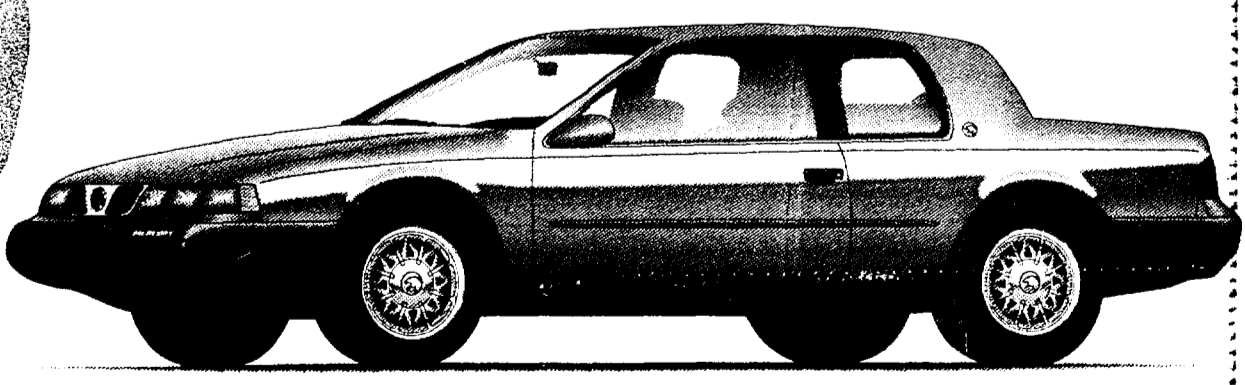

# Rugged Toyota Land Cruiser is an 'off-road' Lexus

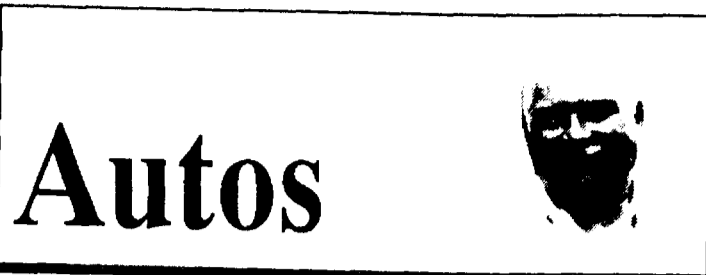
When you climb up into the cockpit of a Toyota Land Cruiser, you know immediately that you are piloting something special. This is clearly a truck, but it has the ambiance of a weird limousine.

For one thing, you really do have to climb because the Land Cruiser sits higher than most sports/utility vehicles — high enough that many older people and recalcitrant dogs will need help entering this vehicle.

But once in the Land Cruiser, you realize immediately that this vehicle stretches the concept of the sports/utility vehicle to cover both heavy-duty trucks and luxury sedans.

This Godzilla of sports/utilities — known affectionately by some of its fans as the "Land Bruiser" and called the "Lexus of sport-utility vehicles" by Four Wheeler magazine — weighs in at close to 2-1/2 tons (4,861 pounds with a third passenger seat, as our test vehicle had).

But you never have the feeling of wrestling with a monster. The vehicle is very respon-

sive, both to the accelerator pedal and to the steering wheel.

Its 4.5-liter six-cylinder 24-valve double-overhead-cam engine with aluminum alloy head churns out 212 horsepower and enough torque to make the Land Cruiser actually feel light and peppy.

The test vehicle had leather upholstery, extremely comfortable seats, an excellent sound system, anti-lock brakes on all four wheels. Full-time all-wheel drive is standard, front and rear locking differentials are

A four-speed automatic trans-

mission is standard. Options on the test vehicle included a power sunroof, aluminum wheels with big-foot P275/70 R16 tires and a premium sound system which features an electronically tuned AM/FM radio cassette player and CD player with nine speakers and a "Diversity Antenna" that selects the best signal from either the power antenna or a second antenna in the rear window. When you drive a Land Cruiser, you are not roughing it.

Toyota's optional locking differential system is activated by an instrument panel switch

while the transfer case is in low range.

The system allows the driver to lock only the rear differential or front and rear differentials simultaneously. In operation, all four wheels receive equal power and torque, turning at the same speed.

Few owners ever take their off-road vehicles off the road (not on purpose anyway), but if you do, the Land Cruiser is right at home. On a course near Sugar Loaf on the Leelanau Peninsula, the vehicle performed amazing feats of hill climbing and slogging through rough terrain.

It performs perhaps its most amazing feats on the concrete, however. It is the perfect car for driving on the Detroit area's ravaged roads. It seems oblivious to even Detroit's world-class potholes. The vehicle's weight is due in part to a bulletproof body structure and nothing rattles or squeaks, whether crossing rolling fields

or navigating Anthony Wayne Drive's washboard section on the Wayne State University campus.

The Land Cruiser's Shamu-sized cabin can accommodate as many as eight persons, or 91 cubic feet of cargo.

Full-time four-wheel-drive, with an easily selected low range and center differential lock, make the Toyota ideal for highway driving in fair weather or foul.

New all-disc ABS brakes and a superb suspension allow the Cruiser to stop abruptly and change lanes with a minimum of anxiety.

The Land Cruiser has a standard 5,000-pound towing capacity package, including a transmission oil cooler and trailer-towing wire harness. It requires addition of a Class III hitch.

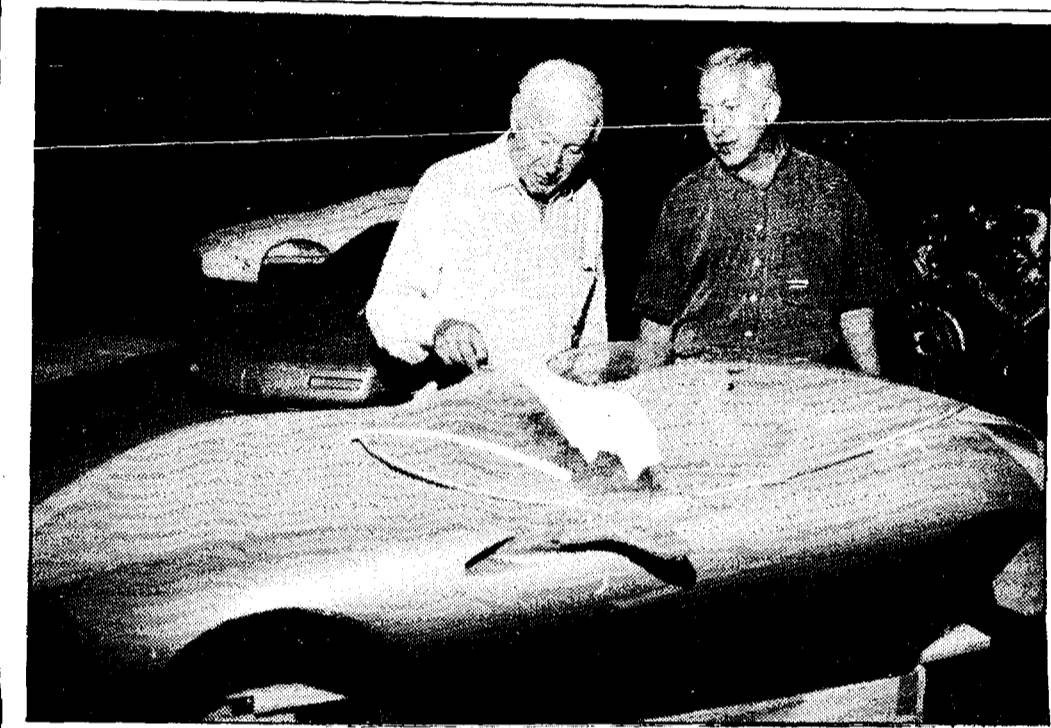
The test vehicle was finished in a very attractive two-tone metallic green. It is a vehicle equally at home at the country

club or in a swamp. It is an amazing vehicle, and that doesn't come cheap.

The Land Cruiser's sophistication and quality help justify its base price of \$41,623 (\$44,000-something sticker on the test vehicle). But compared with lesser sports/utility offerings, you really have to want to travel through the rough in style to shell out that kind of money.

The Land Cruiser is in the tradition of Toyota with its very high-assembly quality, excellent ergonomics (all gauges and controls are easily visible and where you expect to find them) and smooth, sophisticated drivetrain.

But its real soulmate is the now-extinct Jeep Grand Wagoneer, a huge, go-anywhere luxury car, disdainful of such mundane matters as fuel economy, intent on sumptuously civilized comfort mixed with brute force.

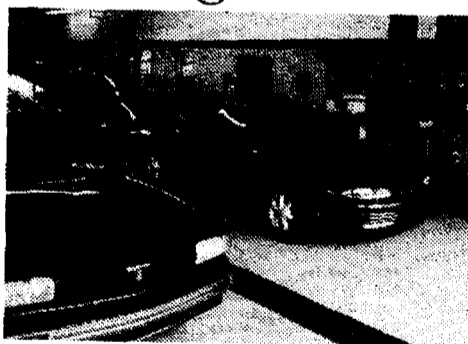

# Monkey bars a true test of a kid's mettle

It seems every time I turn around, a new playscape pops up somewhere in Grosse Pointe.

The municipal parks and some of the elementary schools have added multi-colored play apparatuses with twisting slides.

In the same way swamps have become "wetlands," playscape is a new term applied to something that has been around for a while.

I don't know where the term

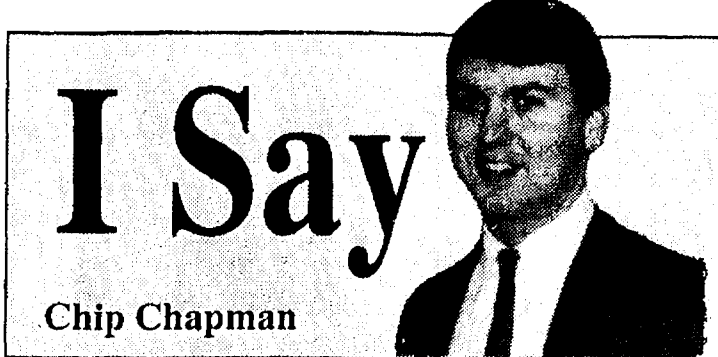
"playscape" originated. I remembered when they were called monkey bars or jungle-gyms. I also remember when they were made of iron, not plastic and wood. And when you fell, you landed on cement, not on woodchips or an asphalt/rubber surface.

Unfortunately, we now live in a more litigious society than when I was elementary-school age. City governments and school systems must protect themselves. (Note the disappearance of high diving boards at many parks and clubs over the last decade.)

Although the kids of today may prefer playing on colored plastic, I notice fewer physical challenges on the new playscapes.

There are few poles to climb. No horizontal bars to swing on from hand to hand.

Now, there are basically

slides, ladders and bridges. The "challenging" items are barely off the ground.

Maybe that's what kids like these days or maybe playscapes are aimed at younger kids, but I always felt monkey bars should be more intimidating. Something industrial-looking that dared you to climb on it.

Once you conquered it, you were ready to climb trees. Then taller trees. Playscapes don't

prepare kids to conquer anything other than other playscapes.

I've often heard the words "interactive" and "social development skills" associated with playscapes. Monkey bars, as I recall, promoted anti-social behavior.

Kids who reached the top of the monkey bars often would try to push other kids down.

More than 20 years ago, stu-

dents at Richard school were given the opportunity to chose among three iron monkey bar designs. The winner was constructed in the east playground across from the fire escape facing Kercheval. The design, as I remember, was nothing very creative. But it did pose some physical obstacles, like chin-up bars and vertical poles to climb.

When you reached the top and looked down, you saw a sea of gravel awaiting if you lost your grip.

Did I ever get hurt? Absolutely. Did I cry? Probably. But the next day, when I was comparing scars with friends the same way Robert Shaw and Richard Dreyfuss did in "Jaws," I couldn't remember pain or crying. I just remember how cool the scars looked.

This is not to make light of the fact that children do get hurt, some severely. But I do remember some kids going

from the hospital right back to the junglegym after being injured.

Part of having fun is the risk of getting hurt. A little Bactine on a scraped elbow and you're right back out there. I still have scars from my playground days.

The monkey bars have since come down and the gravel field on which it was situated is now a parking lot.

I'm glad Richard still has the concrete drainage tube sections (I'm not sure what they are actually called, but they probably have an updated name, like modular-interactive-tunnel segments).

I'm sure the twisty plastic slides are probably more fun than the conventional straight metal ones. But in the wintertime, try to trick one of your classmates into licking a plastic slide. His tongue won't stick.

the computer-generated "Poop Patrol Newsletter" that arrived at our office printed on hot pink paper.

Citing the Grosse Pointe Park municipal code, the unsigned broadside reminds presumably guilty recipients that:

"(a) No person having charge of any dog upon property other than that owned by such person shall allow such dog to defecate or create a nuisance upon any public or private property, unless such person shall promptly remove such droppings and dispose of same in the public sewer or on the property of such person in a sanitary manner; and every such person shall have in his possession an adequate container for such droppings and cause their removal in a sanitary manner."

"(b) Any person who is convicted of a violation of subsection (a) shall be fined not more than twenty-five dollars."

Flanked by a pair of militant-looking American eagles, the newsletter ends: "Your neighbors will take immediate action to enforce this ordinance if your dog poops on or in front of someone else's property. Clean up your dog poop. Common decency is good citizenship."

So, just watch it, dog owners. The Poop Patrol (whoever they are) has its eye on the ground.

### Basket case

Another special task force that always gets the goods is the City's new shopping cart patrol, which can be seen early in the morning scouring the Village around Arbor Drug, Damman Hardware and Kroger.

Whenever they spot a wheeled basket that has strayed too far from one of these stores, their truck swoops

down and hauls it away to the city pound, where the offending owner has to pay a \$5 fine to bail it out.

A strange way to cement city relations with its businesses? Building Inspector Paul Weitzel explains that as many as a dozen carts, usually from Kroger, have been left out on city sidewalks or lots overnight and can interfere with cleaning streets and lots and menace traffic if they roll into the street.

"We're not trying to be mean, we're just trying to maintain the city," says Paul, adding they just started enforcing an existing cart law a few months ago.

A disgruntled store manager who prefers not to give his name sees it differently. "I wish we could work as a community — why can't they just drop them off back at the store?" he asks.

Some of the carts (called "buggies" in the business) never return. "We lose 25 to 30 buggies a year, at about \$200 each," says the manager. Add to that the expense of paying for carts that people abandon blocks away rather than suffer the inconvenience of wheeling them back. "It's already resulting in higher costs to the customer," he says.

Currently our 911 calls are not being tape-recorded. This means that vital information may not be retained. Also, modern technology has provided the means for identifying the caller and the address instantly when the call is received by the dispatcher.

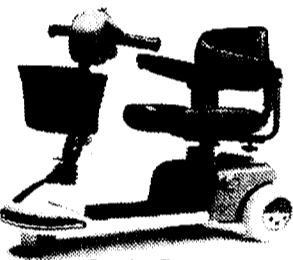
The cost to provide this service would be charged in the form of a user fee added to each resident's phone bill at the rate of 48 cents a month to go to each city and 6 cents per month service charge to Ameritech. This amounts to \$6.48 per household per year.

We belong to the Eastern Conference of Wayne County which includes the five Grosse Pointes and Harper Woods. So far, Harper Woods, Grosse Pointe Woods and Grosse Pointe Shores have adopted the resolution. The Farms and Park will be voting on it at their next meetings.

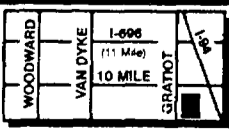

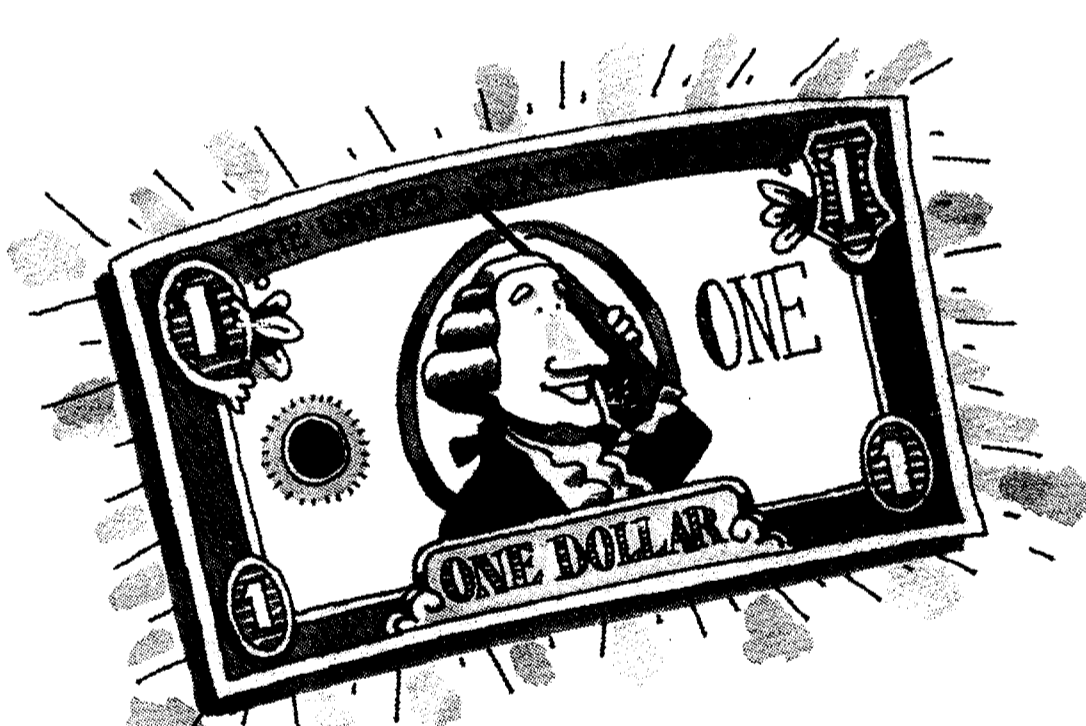

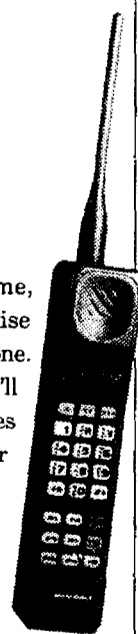

## Immunization fair is Aug. 21

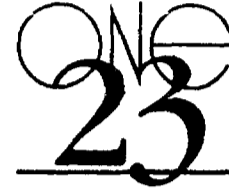

# Comic with a cause: Pointer will do stand-up for Gilda's Club benefit

Sheila Loveley earns money being funny.

The Grosse Pointe Park resident has been working part-time as a stand-up comedienne for three years. She has performed at local comedy clubs; she's appeared on WDIV-TV's "So You Think You're



Funny"; she was on Kelly & Co.; and she regularly works in comedy clubs in Ohio and Indiana.

Yes, Loveley is her real name. It's even part of the act.

"I'm from a family of 10 kids," she says. "We all got teased about our name while we were growing up. If you think 'Sheila Loveley' is bad — I have a brother named Dick.

"I heard 'Ugly Loveley' over and over when I was a kid. I was so sick of it," she says.

"Finally, I had to tell Mom to shut up."

Loveley grew up on Detroit's northwest side. She graduated from Cooley High School and attended Wayne State University. She toyed with the idea of becoming an English teacher.

She had always been attracted to theatrical pursuits — drama clubs, performance art and theater groups. She lived out of the state for awhile, then returned to Michigan, married Peter D'Angelo and settled in Grosse Pointe Park. They have two daughters, students at Pierce Middle School.

Sheila sang with some bands, wrote some songs, did some dinner theater and got involved with the Grosse Pointe Theatre.

"About four years ago, I saw an ad in the Grosse Pointe News," she said. "A local actor/director wanted

to start a star search program. He advertised for talent.

"I developed an act for the tryout. I built it around some songs I had written. A booking agent saw me and asked me to do a comedy show that weekend. For pay.

"I was thrilled. I drove all the way to South Lyon to do a five-minute routine."

Loveley described her brand of humor as personal.

"Joan Rivers does personal humor. Jerry Seinfeld does observational humor. Then there's political humor, like Mark Russell and Dennis Miller. There's prop humor,

like Howie Mandel. Impressionists; and musical acts; and skit humor — the kinds of things you see on 'Saturday Night Live,'" she said.

"And improvisational humor. That's the hardest of all, because you have to deal with other people."

Comedienne Gilda Radner, who died of ovarian cancer several years ago, was one of Loveley's idols. Radner was the inspiration for Gilda's Club, a New York City-based psychosocial support community for people with cancer, their families and friends.

Loveley will participate in a fundraiser for a new Gilda's Club to be located in the Detroit area.

"Motor City Women of Comedy,"

a benefit for Gilda's Club, will be held on Sunday, Aug. 28, at Mark Ridley's Comedy Castle, 269 E. Fourth in Royal Oak.

Gilda's Club provides support for people with cancer and their families; workshops on nutrition, exercise, biofeedback and stress reduction; lectures on medical research; social events; special support groups for children with cancer; and more.

"One of the reasons I'm happy to be involved with this benefit," Loveley said, "is because my sister-in-law, Joanie D'Angelo, died of ovarian cancer — the same kind of

told," Loveley said. "I was about 4 years old and I was in a car. I made everybody laugh. I loved it."

When she began doing stand-up comedy, Loveley was pleased when people laughed at a joke.

"Your expectations keep rising," she said. "Now I work for an applause break. It's hard. I'm never totally satisfied. And some nights are magic."

She explained the usual line-up for comedy acts.

"There's an opening act. Opening is hard because the audience is cold. They haven't relaxed yet. Some are still waiting for a drink. They're not really with you yet. Opening acts usually last about 10 to 15 minutes," she said.

Loveley has worked as an opener and a feature. She would love — some day — to do a guest spot on David Letterman's or Jay Leno's shows.

"Not yet," she said "I don't have the courage or the money. That's something you want to do right. You do it when you have your act perfected and down pat."

"Motor City Women of Comedy" will begin at 6 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 28, with a cash bar and light buffet. The show starts at 7:30 p.m., and will include about a dozen local comedienne: Karen Bell Havel, Stacey DuFord, Kathy Geha, Johnnie Getts, Lisa Goich, Gilda Hauser, Jenny McNulty and Jill Washburn. cancer Gilda Radner had — a year ago. I'm dedicating my performance to her. This is a cause especially dear to my heart."

Loveley works about two weekends a month — two stand-up comedy gigs. She writes all her own material, usually drawing on experiences from her own life.

"I pick on my husband," she said. "He doesn't mind. People who know him know that it's part of the act.

"I talk about being a mom; about coming from a family of 10 kids; about 'Ugly Loveley.'"

She often uses jokes about people in the news — O.J. Simpson, for instance, and John Wayne Bobbitt — in her routine.

"I remember the first joke I ever

"Then there's the feature — about a half hour routine.

"Then there's the headliner — usually someone with TV credits. The headliner gets about 45 minutes to an hour.

"Then the opener, who serves as an emcee, does the closing."

Alyce Faye will host and emcee the show.

Even though all performers are women, the show is planned as an evening of laughter for men and women, Loveley said.

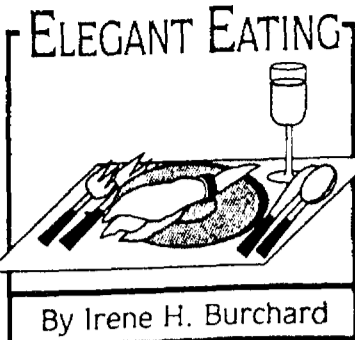

## An epic grows in Canada

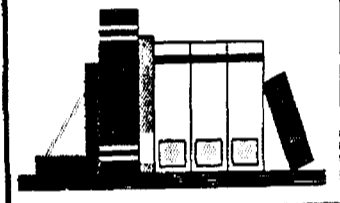
Away  
By Jane Urquhart  
Viking, 356 pages, \$21.95

Jane Urquhart, a Canadian writer, lives with her family in a small village in southwestern Ontario where she gathers inspiration for her lovely elegiac novels.

"Away" is her third novel, a truly marvelous blend of the exotic and the mundane. It is a moving tale of four generations of a family whose forbears immigrated to the promised land, Canada, from a starving Ireland during the mid-nineteenth century. In their various ways, the O'Malleys struggle to cope with their new frontier life in Ontario, some finding disaster and others hope.

saga. First, there is Mary O'Malley who is married to the erstwhile schoolmaster, Brian O'Malley; they are the ones who fled the harsh conditions of infertile Ireland only to find uncertain sanctuary in wild, unsettled Canada. The second woman is Eileen, the daughter of Mary and Brian, who is marked by her mother's tragedy.

While a teenager, Mary is noted for her odd, abstracted manner and fey air. When she comes upon a drowning, sea-tossed sailor who is washed upon the banks near her home,

Mary immediately plunges into the water and drags him to shore. But, in spite of her efforts to revive him, the stranger dies wrapped within her arms. This experience forever touches Mary who regards him as her demon lover, and she never ceases to yearn for his return.

Father Quinn, the local priest, makes it his business to introduce his friend, Brian O'Malley, the lanky school-teacher, to odd Mary, two lonely souls who need one another. Brian teaches his wife to read which opens a whole new world for her: "by the time the baby, Liam, was six months old, she had learned so many words that she carried on her studies on her own. The book she liked best was "Easy Lessons in General Geography." On its maps she was able to see the island of Ireland shrink in comparison to the other, larger land masses, and her own island, Bathlin, disappear altogether from some represen-

tations of the world. She examined, with astonishment, engravings of deserts, jungles, mountain ranges, exotic beasts that jumped or thundered through life in vast inland territories, birds too huge to fly, mice too huge to scamper, and strange human figures dressed as birds or beasts themselves."

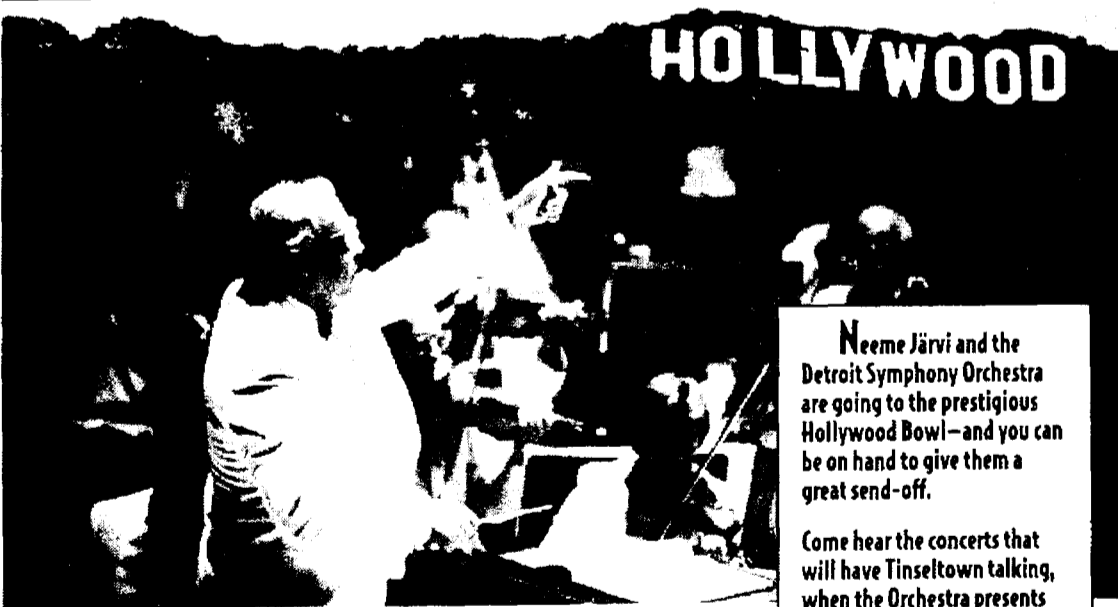
Urquhart's language is poetic and richly evocative. Her characters, their moods, are painted in vivid colors, so alive that we can instantly feel a sympathy and kinship with them.

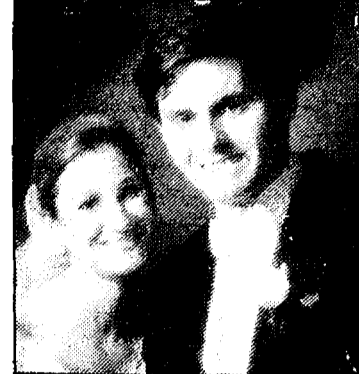

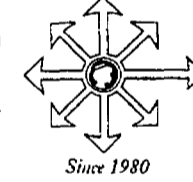

### My grand-boy

My only grandson lives far off in Texas. He is handsome. He is bright. He is 3. (Photos are available on request; sometimes even without request.)

A picture of Devin at the beach in Galveston rests on my desk where I can easily glance at him. The picture was taken while we were visiting him and his mom and dad back in April.

He is far away. It gives me pain from time to time that I get to see him so infrequently. Every time I am with him, or talk on the phone, or write a letter, or receive a letter, I learn something new about him: the way he laughs; the way he covers his mouth with his hands when he is worried or afraid; the kinds of toys he likes (things to build with).

I do so much want to know him better.

But something else is behind my deep desire to see him more. I am afraid he will not get to know me. Will he know how much his grandpa played in sports? Many have said to me: "When are you going to pay tribute to Michigan's greatest woman contract bridge player?" In answer, I've long been saying, "Tomorrow." That word (forgive me) is the greatest labor-saving excuse known to this columnist, especially when he hasn't created a way to contain her glory in the space available.

Sylvia Stein of Farmington Hills is that woman. The bridge playing duplicate legions of the world have long recognized her gifted validity. Seldom has my subject of the day been more braided. From 1957 to 1971, she was a star of the stars, winning two world titles, 15 national titles and ever so many regional and sectional events. Even today, some 23 years later, her play is on par with the country's best women contestants. The tournament circuit is tiring, however, and Sylvia's health has curbed this wonderful love of hers. Sylvia admits that the by-product of this curtailment has given her much more time with Harry, her devoted husband of some 52 years, and their wonderful son, Benjamin. Then there's Lisa, who in Grandpa and Grandmama's sentiment is the most adorable, prim little lady to grace the face of our nation.

Today, most of Sylvia's play is at club games in our area and this is exciting and stimulating to the participants. But be careful. I forewarn you. She plays like a beautiful western diamondback with a silencer on her rattlers.

For certain, there are moments of nostalgia, but the recollection upon crucial hands and great partners like Dorothy Hayden Truscott will remain. Harry and friends like Lynne Schaeffer have been wonderful. Lynne will tell you that a game with Sylvia is rewarding and an everlasting incredible experience. Take today's tour de force which was played last spring in a Friday evening match at The Bridge Connection. Lynne put Sylvia into an epic exercise, "The Grandy," once she realized her side had at least 90 percent of the high cards. Half the field was in six no trump, wishing they had played seven, until it became evident that diamonds weren't behaving. The rest were in seven and while each declarer played brilliantly, their lack of success was conspicuous. Sylvia's technique was even more glittering penning a plus 2,220, having almost instantly found the winning solution to the adverse location of the out cards.

You can see the problem looking at 52 pasteboards. No West in his or her right mind will ever throw a club under declarer's diamonds, so there are only two spades, three hearts, four diamonds and three clubs, one short of the fortune. Sylvia theorized that a squeeze might be possible if West had clubs and the spade lady, jack protected or if East had diamonds and the same spades. She won the heart ace and played four high diamonds, pitching her heart queen, five. Now dummy's heart king, jack, pitching her club 10, six. Next a club to her ace, queen and a spade to dummy's king and this dramatic ending.

## 'Beauty' is more than a child's film

"Black Beauty," Ann Sewell's well-loved, enduring 1877 children's classic, is aptly subtitled "The Autobiography of a Horse." The horse tells the story.

Director Caroline Thompson, who wrote the screenplay for "The Incredible Journey" in which two dogs and a cat narrate their adventures, has a flair for putting into words what animals might feel and think, a talent which allows the viewer to identify more closely with the characters.

Black Beauty's saga has been told before on the big screen, but not from the horse's point of view. In the 1946 American version and the 1971 British version, the tale was narrated by humans.

Letting the horse relate his own story allows the viewer to identify with the horse as a character; this is not someone interpreting what the horse sees and feels.

It helps that Thompson affords her four-legged hero extreme sensitivity. It helps also that the film, shot in England, is lush and beautiful. The cinematography and picture-perfect closeups present a lovely background.

Told in retrospect, the film spans two decades and takes

the viewer from the sprawling green English countryside to the cobblestoned streets of London.

It begins at the moment of Black Beauty's birth. We see him struggling to stand on his spindly legs. It is a precious

moment when the camera moves in to let us see the surprised and happy look on the colt's face. It sets the tone for many scenes that are a joy to watch.

We follow Beauty through his various owners, some cruel, others kind, and watch as he grows in stature and in maturity.

It is reassuring as we follow Beauty's sad partings, cruel owners, injuries and other perils that he is recalling his adversities in a grassy spot in the same pasture where he began life. Yet there is a poignant note injected as he tells us how he dreams of happier days with his mother, Ginger and the white pony.

"Black Beauty" is an engaging and powerful story that will enthrall horse lovers of all ages, but especially children.

Grosse Pointe North High School's choirs will sponsor an acting workshop with New York actor Michael Stratford Aug. 29-Sept. 1.

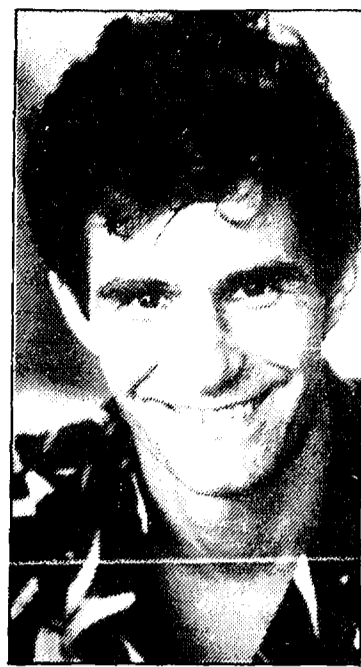
Stratford will work with actors of all ages on developing skills used in acting Shakespeare, use of actor's creativity, comedy and how to take risks when acting.

Jim Carrey is the next comedic genius to take over the big screen.

If you don't agree then you need a quick lesson. "The Mask" has had two months of pre-release publicity. Jim Carrey is all over the trade magazines and is said to be starring in the yet-to-be filmed "Batman 3" as the Riddler.

Once the comic centerpiece of television's "In Living Color," Carrey moves to the big screen playing Stanley Ipkiss, a bank clerk who has life thrown back into his face. He plays the role timidly at first, as if he's feeling out starring in a movie role.

However, he soon gets into the part with a vengeance.

While suffering through a night of low points, Ipkiss hap-

The movie itself and the storyline seem inconsequential at times. The filmmakers wanted to show Carrey as much as possible. The two musical numbers in the movie are indeed toe-tappers.

The movie's climax is in the gang's club with Ipkiss finding some courage and guts within him without the mask to do some superhero-type good. With the film's resident bad guy in

## 'Comedy of Errors' brings modern truths and laughs

In a season that is already remarkable for the excellence of its productions, Stratford director Richard Rose has just raised the standard.

His new production of "Comedy of Errors," — the fourth Shakespeare play to be offered in this summer's 10-show repertory — is an exceptionally successful, true-to-the-original modernization of a classic.

The age-old plot device of two sets of twins in mixed pairs, each of which doesn't know the other is in town, has been reworked endlessly with all the comic variations of mistaken identity. Even Shakespeare's delightful 400-year-old version has acquired a patina of standard slapstick tricks and routines. While still funny, they are fresh only to an audience that has not seen them before.

Rose, however, has achieved a remarkable synthesis of Shakespeare's Elizabethan wit with his own post-modern conception that puts new wine in the old bottle.

Visually, it is comparable to seeing an episode of "Star Trek." Theatrically, it is up-to-the-minute and there's not a comic cliché in it.

Moreover, while making the performance wholly contemporary in style, his actors also manage to make Shakespeare's text clearer and more forceful perhaps than it has been to any audience since Shakespeare's day.

Most impressively, Rose has his actors making the Elizabethan puns and jokes hilariously funny to modern listeners. It's a major achievement as these are puns and jokes traditionally either cut as outdated or delivered so fast, as accompaniment to sight gags and pratfalls, that no one ever gets more than the general idea.

There is also brilliantly executed stagecraft in which the actors create the illusion that see-through props, simple open frames, are actually walls, doors, mirrors, even an elevator. Adding whimsical bits of business and sound effects, they make it astonishingly convincing and entertaining.

Stephen Ouimette, as Dromio of Syracuse, does a masterful pantomime of entering one of the frames as though it's an elevator and knocks the audience out when he punctuates his lines with the "ding" as the elevator reaches his floor. The sequence has the sci-fi flair of being "beamed up" and an overwhelmingly funny, satirical silliness.

Philippa Domville, as Luciana, in her spandex, astrological exercise outfit and then in her metallic sunsuit complete with chrome neck reflector, is an original sight gag all by herself as she apes the fitness faddist while playing her part in the plot.

The amazing thing is that it all works and brings the show to a level of sophistication in its burlesque of contemporary

behavior that becomes archly witty and up-to-date, while doing full justice to the time-honored text.

The result is like discovering a new play where one might have thought there could be nothing new left to do. Much more than slapstick, Rose's comedy is a sophisticated dou-

ble send-up of Shakespeare's comic theater and our own cultural foibles.

If art targets the truths of its times, this piece of theatrical art hits a double bull's eye.

"Comedy of Errors" plays in repertory at the Tom Patterson Theater through Sept. 18.

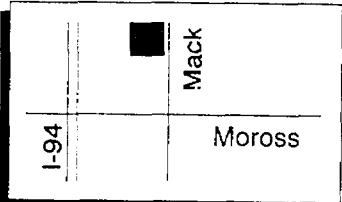

## Tourney pressure helps Woods-Shores team

The Grosse Pointe Woods-Shores 13-year-old Babe Ruth baseball team finished in the middle of the pack at the Ohio Valley regional last week with a 2-2 record, but coach Dan Griesbaum said the squad gained more from the tournament than just a couple of wins.

"They'll be better players for the experience," Griesbaum said. "They were in a ton of pressure situations and with each one they grew up a little more. A few breaks and we

could have been right in the thick of things."

As it was, the Grosse Pointe team finished fifth in the 10-team tournament in Lexington, Ky.

West Virginia took advantage of some Woods-Shores wildness to score five runs in the top of the second. Grosse

Pointe picked up a run in the bottom of the second, but West Virginia eventually pulled into a 9-9 tie.

Woods-Shores broke the deadlock in the sixth on RBI singles by Inger and Griesbaum and a run-scoring double by Sorgeloo, his third hit and third RBI of the game.

Matt Burns picked up the win with two innings of hitless relief.

"Matt isn't very big, but he has a big heart and he throws strikes," the coach said. "He did a fine job for us."

Woods-Shores made it two

wins in a row with a 5-0 victory over Southeast Kentucky as Legwand, who pitched the first six innings, and Burns combined on a six-hitter.

Legwand and Rick Pesta each had RBI singles and Sorgeloo and Ian Spencer drove in runs with sacrifice flies. Aubrey had two hits and scored twice.

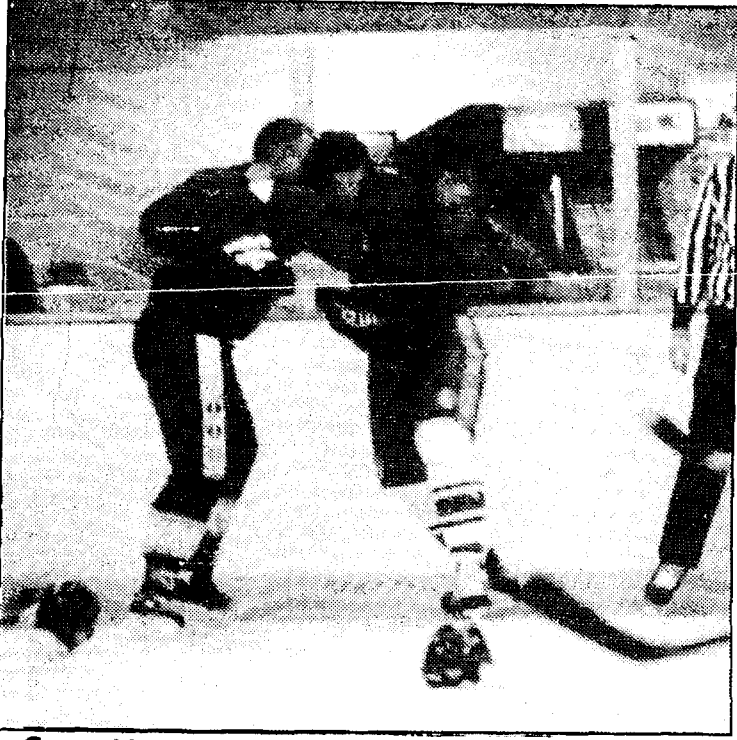

Costa Papista's hockey empire is expanding, but the Grosse Pointe Park resident isn't forgetting about the hockey school that got things going.

"We're looking forward to another outstanding year because we have a great staff of instructors," said Papista, director of the Jimmy Carson and Costa Papista Great Lakes Hockey Skills School of Grosse Pointe, which will be held Aug. 15-19 at the Grosse Pointe Community Rink.

Although Papista has been busy organizing the first Great Lakes Hockey Skills Free Agent exhibition camp, which was held last month, he and Carson, the on-ice coordinator, and associate director Jim DePuys have been working feverishly to finalize plans for the school, now in its fifth year.

"We didn't promote or market the school as much as we have in other years, but we're

# Forget the centerpiece — flowers can spice up a meal

Everyone has cookbooks discussing in tremendous detail the preparation of vegetables for the dinner table, but cooking with flowers, which in past centuries was an accepted culinary practice, is new to many of us.

Geranium petals add spice and color to a tossed salad, and candied violets can decorate a fancy dessert, for instance.

Daylilies have been eaten by the Chinese for centuries and they are grown as a cash crop by Chinese farmers. Dried daylilies are exported to Chinese grocery stores worldwide under the names Gumjum or Gumstoy. Many of us who have daylilies in our gardens consider the lovely colors and graceful shapes a feast for the eyes, but few people realize it is possible to feast upon them in any other way.

Daylilies are very hardy and have superior ability to withstand drought and compete with weeds. They require almost no care and are often regarded almost as wild plants. So prolific are their blooms that few people are aware that each one lasts only a single day.

The elegance of daylilies lends them to all flower arrangements from the Williamsburg-type massed blooms to the sophisticated simplicity of a Japanese arrangement. Their flavor is similar to lima beans or chestnuts but a trifle sweeter, and they have a high content of protein, vitamins and minerals.

Wash the blossoms gently and remove the stamens and pistils. Be

careful not to overcook them. Chop the flowers and add them to scrambled eggs or omelets. Marinate the buds in the juice from dill pickles and refrigerate overnight and serve with sliced cold meats. Torn blossoms are a nice addition to a salad. Or use the daylilies as cups in which to serve chicken salad. The flowers can be dipped in batter and french-fried. And they can be frozen.

Sunflowers, with blooms a foot or more across, are hard to miss as they tower over everything else in the garden. Their seeds, high in protein and vitamin C, are enjoyed equally by human beings and birds. Perhaps we should pay more attention to this showy plant that grows in 48 states and was known to the native Americans long before Columbus.

Francisco Pizarro, arriving in Peru in 1532, was amazed at the giant sunflowers he saw there, which were venerated by the Indians of the Inca empire as the sacred image of their

sun-god. The priestesses, the maidens of the sun, wore large disks of gleaming pure gold hung around their necks.

The North American Plains Indians considered sunflower seeds as sacred food. They placed ceremonial bowls of sunflower seeds on the graves of their dead for food to sustain them on their long and dangerous journey to the happy hunting grounds.

Sunflowers make wonderful natural bird feeders in your garden. The Russian Mammoth variety is a good one and produces flower heads more than a foot across growing on 10- to 12-foot stalks. During the growing season the sunflower's practice of turning its head toward the sun as the sun's position shifts in the sky makes it interesting to watch. And the bird population of your garden will markedly increase with cardinals, finches and sparrows feasting on the maturing seeds.

The birds are a great asset in your garden, not only for their songs and bright plumage, but for their immense value as insect-eaters. It's possible to plant herbs that repel insects. Mint will discourage bugs in vegetable gardens, especially near cabbage and broccoli, and basil will keep flies away. Garlic will keep marauding cats away from your roses.

But there are some plants which birds absolutely hate and will actually destroy. Anything the birds perceive as stringy will completely vanish in a matter of days. Spider plants,

ferns, palms, bamboo and asparagus fern are examples. Birds will eat most herbs but not rosemary or any of the mints.

If you have an elder bush in your garden which has red berries, let the birds have them as they are poisonous to humans. But treasure an elder that has blue-purple berries as these are wonderful in pies or jams and jellies and for making wine. However, when the berries are ripe, don't lose any time in harvesting them or the birds will beat you to it. They love the berries and can strip a bush completely in two or three hours.

Don't forget roses are edible, too. Candied rose petals are a sweet confection and rosewater, made by boiling roses to make a concentrated broth (much like making soup stock) has been used as a flavoring for food since ancient times, especially in the middle eastern countries. It was a staple in the kitchens of Europe in the middle ages and makes an interesting flavoring for pastries and cookies now.

It's important that you remember to allow your vacation to be just that — a time to rest and enjoy. Don't worry about trying to control every aspect of your time. Remember that sometimes the unscheduled events turn out to be the most memorable.

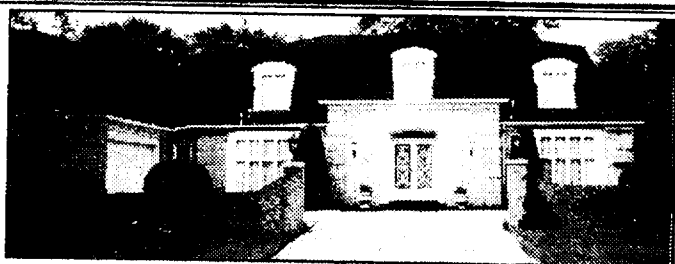

# How to select and improve your attic insulation

One of the most important functions of an attic is to prevent heat within the house from escaping through the roof in cold weather, and to block outside heat from radiating downward during hot weather. This is accomplished by insulating materials, which have millions of tiny air pockets that trap heat trying to pass through.

Unless your home was built in the last few years, it's probably underinsulated by today's standards. To evaluate the insulation in your home's attic you first need to understand how insulation is rated.

## R-VALUES:

In general, the more tiny air pockets in a material per inch of thickness, the higher its R-value, a rating of its ability to resist heat transfer. The higher the R-value, the greater heat resistance.

To determine the approximate R-value of mineral wool, fiberglass, or cellulose insulation, measure its thickness and multiply by three. For example, insulation 3 inches thick has an R-value of about nine.

## HOW MUCH INSULATION:

Your attic insulation needs depend on your climate, your heating and cooling needs, your heating system, and energy prices. In our area the recommended R-value for attics that place insulation between roof rafters or floor joists, is 38 providing you are using gas or oil heat.

## INSULATING MATERIALS:

Fiberglass is the most popular insulating material, but mineral wool and cellulose are also commonly used in attics. Fiberglass and mineral wool batts four to eight feet long come in various thicknesses and in 15- and 24-inch widths to fit between joists and studs with standard spacings. Fiberglass and mineral wool can come in continuous rolls. Loose fill insulation consists of small pellets of cellulose or other insulating material that can be poured or blown into floor or wall cavities. Rigid board insulation is rarely used in attics, and some building codes prohibit it.

Batts and blankets often have a heavy paper or foil facing on one side to retard the penetration of moisture, which could clog air pockets and render the insulation ineffective. A foil facing also reflects heat back into the rooms below. Loose-fill and unfaced batts and blankets require a separate vapor retarding barrier of polyethylene. Both integral facings and separate vapor barriers should be installed so that they face toward the warmed/cooled interior space. In an attic floor, for example, they must be on the bottom, against the heating ceiling underneath.

## ATTIC INSULATION:

An attic's insulation is directly proportional to the thickness of the materi-

al. In this area with an R-value of 38 you would need to put in 11 to 13 inches — thicker than most joists and rafters.

## DOUBLE LAYER INSULATION:

In attics that are unfloored bring the insulation up to the top of the joists, then lay the unfaced material across the joists. Don't forget to leave a space for the eaves to circulate air.

## RAISING A FLOOR:

If the attic has a floor you may be able to raise it to provide enough space for the insulation.

## INSULATING KNEE WALLS:

Knee walls are the short walls between the roof and the attic floor, usually are in usable attics with floors, and a standard stair case leads up to this area. The knee walls should be insulated on the back side of the wall between the studs with the paper side facing the usable room. The floor on

the back side of the knee walls also should be insulated.

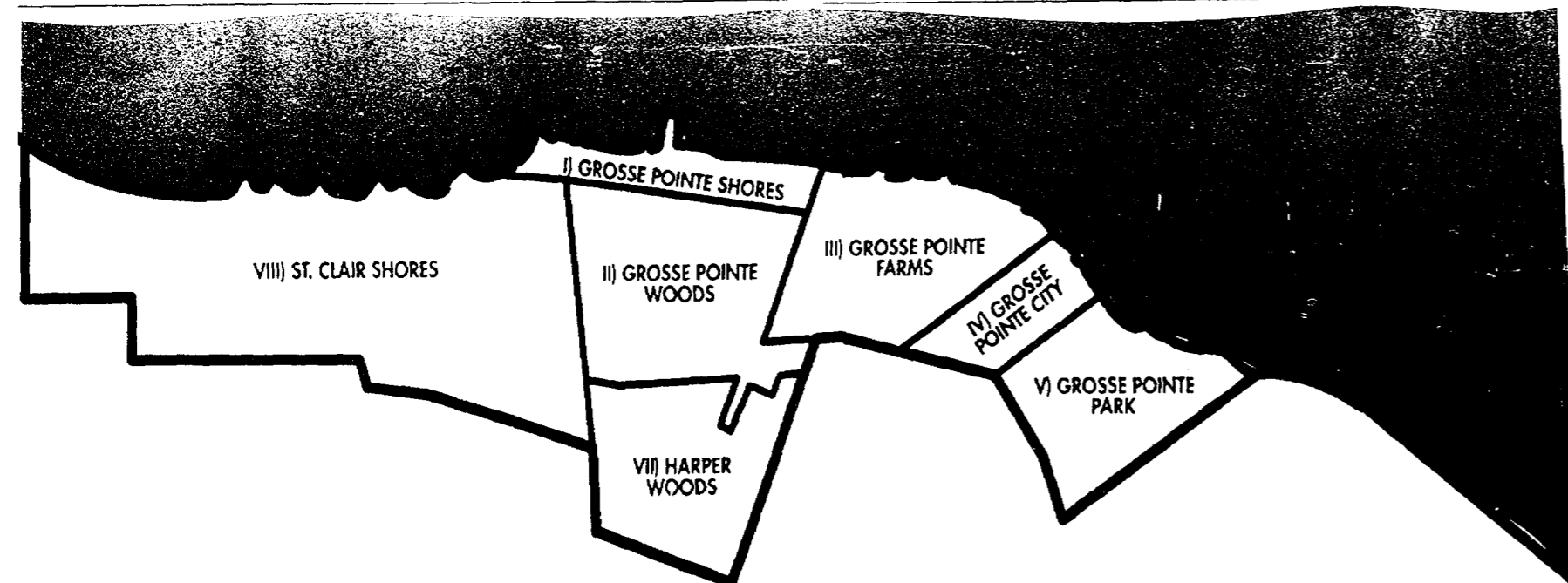

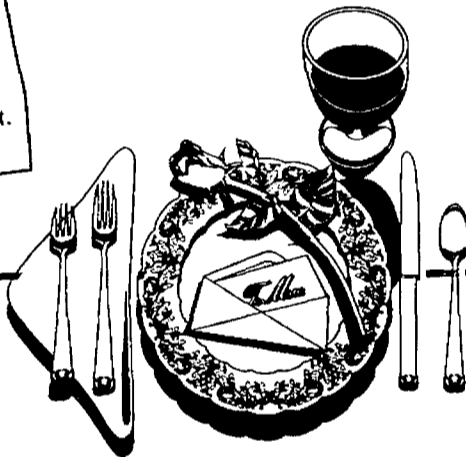
