Pharmacist indicted for prescription fraud

Hasna Bashir Iwas, a 60-year-old New Baltimore woman and owner and operator of Beacon Pointe Pharmacy in the Park, was indicted for unlawful distribution of prescription drug conand unlawfully maintaining Rouge, among others.

Iwas is connected through this indictment to previous indictments charging Dr. Otis Crawford and three other defendants as operators of a prescription drug ring, spanning Detroit, trolled substances, conspiracy Grosse Pointe Park and River

drug-involved premises Iwas is alleged to have filled including prescriptions for oxyand promethazine with codeine lion. She further filled more part of a Detroit forgery ring, demanding cash from patrons to fulfill the prescription.
